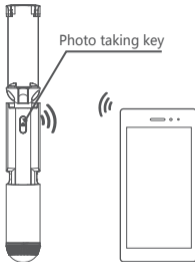


User Guide

Connect the smartphone

- 1 Press the photo taking key of the Selfie stick for 2s to enter the Bluetooth matching status;
- 2 Turn on the Bluetooth of the smartphone to enter the search status, touch "WS-18001-1" in the equipment searched; after successful connection, the green light of the Selfie stick will normally light up.

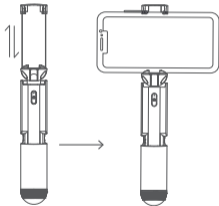


Use the Selfie stick

① Unfold the Selfie stick

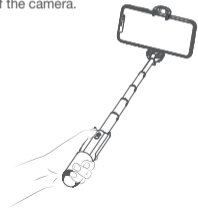


② Fix the smartphone



③ Take photos

Before taking photos, please ensure that the volume key of the smartphone has been preset as the shutter (photo taking) key of the camera.



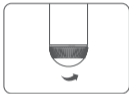
④ Turn-off

Press the photo taking key for 3s, and the green light will go out, which means that the Selfie stick has been turned off.



Replace the battery

Hold the tail cover of the Selfie stick, rotate it to the left to take it down, and take out the button battery for replacing the battery.

Tips:

- The Selfie stick will automatically switch to the dormant state if it is not used within 10min; it shall be reconnected if it is reused; it will enter the turn-off state if it is not used within 30min.
- If the battery level is less than 20%, when the Selfie stick is used and its green light slowly flashes, please immediately replace the battery.
