2.2 Test Mode

a. The EUT has been associated with peripherals and configuration operated in a manner tended to maximize its emission characteristics in a typical application. Frequency range investigated: conduction emission (150 kHz to 30 MHz), radiation emission (9 kHz to the 10th harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or to 40 GHz, whichever is lower). For radiated measurement, the measured emission level of the EUT was maximized by rotating the EUT on a turntable, adjusting the orientation of the EUT and EUT antenna in three orthogonal axis (X: flat, Y: portrait, Z: landscape) for Internal Antenna, two Antenna Degree, Ant. Horizontal and Ant. Vertical for External Antenna, and adjusting the measurement antenna orientation, following C63.10 exploratory test procedures and only the worst plane, and the worst mode of radiated spurious emissions is Bluetooth 1Mbps mode, and recorded in this report.





<AC Conducted Emission Mode>





2.6 Measurement Results Explanation Example

For all conducted test items:

The offset level is set in the spectrum analyzer to compensate the RF cable loss and attenuator factor between EUT conducted output port and spectrum analyzer. With the offset compensation, the spectrum analyzer reading level is exactly the EUT RF output level.

Example:

The spectrum analyzer offset is derived from RF cable loss and attenuator factor.

Offset = RF cable loss + attenuator factor.

Following shows an offset computation example with cable loss 4.2 dB and 10 dB attenuator.

 $Offset(dB) = RF \ cable \ loss(dB) + attenuator \ factor(dB).$ = 4.2 + 10 = 14.2 (dB)

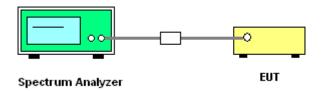
3.1.2 Measuring Instruments

3.1.3 Test Procedure

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.10-2013 clause 7.8.3.
- 2. The RF output of EUT is connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss is compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 3. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- 4. Enable the EUT hopping function.
- Use the following spectrum analyzer settings: Span = the frequency band of operation;
 RBW = 300 kHz; VBW ≥ RBW; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak; Trace = max hold.
- 6. The number of hopping frequency used is defined as the number of total channel.
- 7. Record the measurement data derived from spectrum analyzer.

For radiated test below 30MHz




For radiated test from 30MHz to 1GHz



Spectrum Analyzer / Receiver




Hopping Mode Band Edges

BT 2.4GHz 2400~2483.5MHz Harmonic @ 3m








