Attestation

We, Zebra Technologies Corporation, attest the followings for our device FCC ID: UZ7TC58A1.

a. The product does not support 6PP category and the maximum power does not exceed authorized values.

b. this device will only associate and connect with a low-power indoor Access Point, subordinate device, or standard access point and never directly link to any other client devices

c. this device will always initiate transmission under the control of a low power indoor AP or subordinate or standard client except access point for brief communications before joining a network. These quick messages will only occur if the 987594 D01 U-NII 6GHz General Requirements v01r02 20 client has detected an indoor AP, subordinate, or standard access point operating on a channel. These brief messages will have a time-out mechanism such that if it does not receive a response from an AP it will not continually repeat the request.

d. this device, when associated and connected with a low-power indoor access point, subordinate or standard access point device, will operate at a power lower as advertised by the indoor access point, subordinate, or standard access point:

i. lower than or equal to the power advertised by the low-power indoor access point or subordinate and never above the maximum output power allowed by the FCC grant for clients associated with indoor clients or subordinates.

ii. lower than or 6 dB below the power advertised by the standard access point.

e. We acknowledging the device is prohibited for control of or communications with unmanned aircraft systems, including drones.
