I have a few comments on this Application. Depending on your responses, kindly understand there may be additional comments.

- 1.) It is incorrect to cite DA00-1407 or its successor 15.212 when performing Licensed modular approvals. These Rule sections only work with Part 15 Unlicensed radio transmitters. Therefore, letters already supplied will be ignored. I am enclosing with this note summary guidance from FCC for how Licensed transmitter modules should be handled. It is important that you and your client read and understand these guidelines, and apply them carefully to this Application.
- 2.) Please review your Tune-Up document. I do not see any tolerance information for the RF Pout. Please provide information on how much the RF power is expected to vary from unit to unit as it is produced by the production line.
- 3.) Is user installation possible for this product? You are reminded that this is prohibited for this module under FCC rules. How will user installation be prohibited? How will this device be sold?
- 4.) Your Manual should clearly state that RF category "Portable" installation of this module is prohibited, and that should OEM integrators desire to install the antenna closer than 20cm to all persons, a new ID and SAR testing will be required.
- 5.) Please review Section 1.7 of the Manual. It is not clear what is the maximum permitted peak gain of the antenna.
- 6.) Please see Page 23 – this is the wrong 15.19 statement to use on any Licensed radio transmitter.
- 7.) Is this a complete manual? It appears to have many blank pages. Preliminary manuals are permitted, but final manuals must be presented to FCC before marketing of the device in USA.
