


Welcome to Internet Station 100

While initialing, it will notify that WiFi is not configured. Press (to start WiFi configuration now.




Wi-Fi Setting









Switching Display Mode

Use direction keys to browse photos, press () to play or stop slideshow.




Clock and Calendar
