

# **MyPhone**

The B8 is a full-featured color PDA phone having full integration with other functions of the device, including applications from third-parties. Tap *Home > Phone* (fig.0.1) to enter mobile phone (fig.0.2).

# 1 Calling

You can only make a call when your B8 is turned on and you have coverage from a GSM Network.

- Press the *Power On* key Fig. for two to three seconds to turn on your B8.
- 2. Tap *Home > Phone* (fig.0.1) *> MyCall* (fig.0.2).


# 1.1 Dailing and operational instructions

The second line from the status indicator bar shows the service provider's name.

**Delete button:** Deleting the digits on the right of the cursor.

Backspace button: Deleting the digits on the left of the cursor.

Perform clear function during idle and hand up during a call. Press two to three seconds to turn on/off the B8.



# : Send and Action/Send key for dialing or answering a call.

Number keys: Input 1 to 9, \* and #.

0: Press 1.5 seconds to enter plus (+) sign for international calls.

\*: Press 1.5 seconds to enter "p" for pause. You can use it while dialing an extension number, e.g. 0226576883p123.

**SMS**: Tap this button to go to **SMS** message (as fig.2.2). **PBK**: Tap this button to go to **Contacts** (as fig.1.2). You can select a phone number in the Contacts. Setup: Tap this button to enter Setup (as fig.1.3). Press

The red-key to go back to the previous screen. Rec.: Tap this button to enter Call list (as fig.1.4) and check

your call history. Press the red-key to go back to the previous screen.

#### 1.2 Making a call

Tip: Your B8 allows you to making a call in several ways. It also keeps the most recent 100 call records.

#### I Making a domestic call

Please make sure your B8 is turned on and within Network coverage before making a call.

- 1. Tap the numeric keys to enter a phone number.
- 2. Press / to dial out the number. A dialogue window will show that it's dialing (as fig.1.5).
- 3. If the call is successfully connected, and during a call, you can see the **Phone** screen will show "Talking" (as fig.1.6).
- 4. To end a call, press *Hang up* / red-key











#### I Making an international call

- 1. Press *0* for 1.5 seconds to enter the plus (+) sign.
- 2. Enter the country code, area code and the phone number.
- 3. Press green-key to dial the number (as fig.1.7).
- 4. To end a call, press *Hang up* / red-key .

#### I Making an emergency call

The international emergency number is "112".

- 1. Enter "112".
- 2. Press green-key to dial the number. It is possible to make an emergency call without a SIM card (as fig.1.8).

#### I Making a call from Contacts

- 1. Tap *MyPhone* > *Contacts* to enter the Contacts. Select a contact to highlight it (as fig.1.9).
- 2. Tap the contact again to start dialing (as fig.1.10).

- 3. During dialing, you can press *Hang up* / red-key to cancel dialing.
- 4. To end a call, press *Hang up* / red-key


#### I Dialing an extension using Pause

For example, if you want to dial 0226576883 ext. 123, the process is as follows:

- 1. Enter "0226576883".
- 2. Press "\*" for 1.5 seconds until the display area shows a "p".
- 3. Enter "123" (as fig.1.11).
- 4. Press green-key to dial the number.
- Remark: Tap / 1 to delete errors or tap to clear all digits.







#### I Making a conference call

Connecting all existing calls if you have subscribed to this

- 1. Tap *Menu* during a call, you will see a pop-up menu as fig.1.12.
- 2. Select "Hold" if you want to make the second or the third call (as fig.1.14). You will see a display as fig.1.13. Or tap Menu > Call list to check the status of every outcalls as fia. 1.15.
- 3. Press **Phone** again to enter the **Phone** screen to start dialing (as fig.1.16). When the second call is connected, tap **Menu** > **Switch** (as fig.1.17) to talk to the first person and put the second call on hold (as fig.1.18). If you check the **Phone** screen, you will see a message telling you that there is a call on hold (as fig.1.19).













- 4. Tap **Phone** > **Conference** (as fig.1.20) and you can join all existing calls to make a conference call (as fig.1.21).
- If you go back to the *Phone* screen again, you will see a message showing "Conference" on the display area (as fig.1.22).
- If you want make the third call, select *Phone > Hold* (as fig.1.23) to put all the existing calls on hold (as fig.1.24). To release hold, simply tap *Phone > Reture* (as fig.1.25).
- 7. You can select *Handsfree on* anytime during a call.
- 8. To end a certain call, select the call on the call list and tap

Hang up / I or tap Hang up All to end the conference.



# 1.3 Answering a call

- 1. When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message (as fig.1.26 and fig.1.27).
- 2. Tap *Answer* or press green-key to answer the call, or tap *Hang up* or press to hang up the call.
- 3. If you did not answer the call, there will be a message on the **Phone** screen showing the number of answered calls as fig.1.28.







#### 2 SMS message

With B8 messages you can create, send, and receive the following types of messages: SMS (Short Message Service).

- 1. Tap *Home > MyPhone* (Fig.2.1) > *SMS* (Fig.2.2) •
- Or tap on the right side of the status indicator bar (Fig.2.1).

# 2.1 SMS message and operational instructions (Fig 2.2)

- Messaging accounts can have the following folders: Inbox, Sent and Draft.
- 2. Total number of unread messages.
- 3. Total number of saved messages in the B8 and SIM card.
- 4. Status:
- ": Unread messages
- ": Read messages
- ": Unread SIM card messages


- 5. From: The source of message or phone number.
- 6. The message content.
- 7. Exit. Exit SMS and go back to "MyPhone".
- Del: Delete one or all message. Please see "Deleting SMS messages".
- New: Add a new message. Please see "Adding/sending SMS messages".
- View. View the message. Please see "Reading SMS messages".

#### 2.2 Reading SMS messages

Select a message on the **SMS** screen and tap **View**, or tap the message twice to open the message (as fig.2.3).

#### 2.3 Delete SMS messages

- Delete one message: Select a message on the SMS screen and tap Del. Select "one" and you will see a dialogue window asking whether you want to delete this message (as fig.2.4). Tap O.K. to delete the message or tap Cancel to exit without deleting.
- Delete all: Tap **Del** and Select "all", you will see a dialogue window asking whether you want to delete all messages (as fig.2.5). Tap **O.K.** to delete all messages or tap **Cancel** to exit without deleting.



#### 2.4 Adding/sending SMS messages

Tap **New** and you will see an editing screen as fig.2.6. You can edit SMS here.




- 1. Make sure SMSC number is ok before sending.
- 2. You can send the same message to 10 recipients at a time.


#### 2.5 Quick access to a contact

Tap **Recipient** to enter the phone number (as fig.2.7), or tap **Recipient** on the recipient editing screen to display **Contacts** list as fig.2.8.

Tap *Group* and you will see a list of groups as fig.2.9.
 Select the group and find your contact to highlight it. Tap
 Add to add your contact to the list of recipients (as fig.2.10).

- You can tap **Del** to remove the unwanted recipient (as fig.2.11). After entering all the contact numbers, tap **Back** to go back to the recipient editing screen (as fig.2.12). Your B8 can send a message to multiple recipients.
- 3. You can send up to 10 recipients at a time. In case you enter more than 10 recipients, a dialogue window will appear and ask whether you want to choose the top10 recipients (as fig.2.14).
- 4. Tap **O.K.** to go back to the message editing screen (as fig.2.13) and edit the content.
- To delete a recipient, tap Recipient to enter the recipient screen, select a recipient and tap *Del* to remove it from the list (as fig.2.11).





#### 2.6 Sending

- 1. Tap **Send** to send out the message.
- Before sending, you will see a dialogue window asking whether you want to confirm sending or not Tap O.K. to start sending
- 3. No matter the message is successfully sent out or not, the screen will show the result with a dialogue window
- After sending the message, tap Back and the message will be automatically saved in the Backup folder.

### 2.7 Forwarding/replying SMS messages


You can forward or reply a message by using the messages stored in your SIM card or any read messages.

#### Forwarding:

- Select a message in any folder on the SMS screen (as fig.2.31) and tap View on the lower right hand side or tap a message directly to enter fig.2.32.
- Tap FW and tap Content to enter the message editing screen (as fig.2.33). After editing the message,tap Back to go back to the previous screen.
- Input the recipient's number and tap Send to sent out the message (as fig.2.34 and fig.2.35).

#### 2. Replying:

- Select a message in the *Inbox* folder (as fig.2.36). Tap *View* on the lower right hand side or tap a message directly to enter fig.2.37.
- 2. Tap **RE** to enter the message editing screen (as fig.2.38).
- 3. Tap **Send** to send out the reply (as fig.2.39).
- Remark: You can always edit a message in the message editing screen to rewrite or modify it.





#### 3 Call history

You can check the "Missed", "answer" or "Called" phone numbers in "Call list". To enter this screen, tap *Home* > *MyPhone* > *Call list*.


#### 3.1 Call history and operational instructions

- Missed calls: Listing out all the missed calls (as fig.3.2).
   Tap a contact or number from the list, then tap Dial or press green-key.
- press green-key to make a call.

  2. **Answer calls**: Listing out all the answered calls (as fig.3.3). Tap a contact or number from the list, then tap

**Dial** or press green-key to make a call (as fig.3.4). Select a contact or number from the list, then tap it to display detail information such as name,tel,time and duration (as fig.3.5).

- 3. **Called:** Listing out all the called phone numbers (as fig.3.1). Tap a contact or number from the list, then tap
  - Dial or press green-key to make a call.
- 4. Items.
- 5. Phone number/Contact.
- 6. Time
- 7. Exit. Exit Call list and back to "MyPhone".
- Del: Press this button and you will see a dialogue window asking whether you want to delete one or all (as fig.3.6). Tap O.K. to delete one or all (fig.3.7) or tap Cancel to exit.
- Save: If you want to save the missed/answered/called phone numbers, please check "Saving phone numbers".
- Dial: You can tap this button to dial out from the missed/answered/called phone number lists.




# 3.2 Saving phone numbers

- 1. Tap a record to highlight it (as fig.3.8).
- 2. Select **Save** to enter the edit screen (as fig.3.9).
- Edit contact information then tap Save to save the contact.

### 3.3 Making a call from the call history list

- 1. Tap a record to highlight it (as fig.3.10).
- 2. Tap *Dial* or press to make a call (as fig.3.11).



# 4 Mobile phone settings

There are a number of ways you can give your B8 a personal touch and change its settings to suit your requirements, such as security, screen display, sound, message, call divert, call, and network. To set up, tap Home > MyPhone (Fig.4.0.1) > Settings (Fig.4.0.2)  $^{\circ}$ 

#### 4.1 Security settings

Tap **Home > MyPhone > Settings** and select **Security** to enter security settings as fig.41.1.


 PIN control: Enable or disable PIN control. Enter your (or default) PIN code to change the protection status before modification.

- 2. **Change PIN:** If you want to change the PIN code, tap this button to set up a new code (as fig.4.1.2 and fig.4.1.3).
- 3. **Change PIN2:** If you want to change the PIN2 code, tap this button to set up a new code(as fig.4.1.4).

#### ⚠ Note:

1. If there is an error message that means the input PIN code is wrong or inconsistent. Please re-enter again or call your service provider for assistance.

2. Usually the SIM card will be blocked after three wrong attempts (the number of attempts is SIM-card dependent), and you need to enter the PUK code to unlock it. Please check with your service provider for the PUK code.



#### 4.2 Display settings

Tap **Home > MyPhone > Settings** and select **Display** to enter the display settings as fig.4.2.1.

- Hide buttons: You can choose to hide the dial buttons and display the wallpaper after 15 seconds of inactivity on the *Phone* screen (as fig.4.2.2). If the original status is "On", tap this button to switch to "Off", or tap again to switch to "On".
- 2. **Logo:** You can change the wallpaper for the **Phone** screen. Tap the drop-down menu (as fig.4.2.3) and select a picture to be the wallpaper (as fig.4.2.4).
- Tip: Simple tap the screen again to show the hidden dial buttons when you want to make a call.

#### 4.3 Audio settings

Tap *Home > MyPhone > Settings* and select *Audio* to enter the audio settings as fig.4.3.1. Your B8 provides ring melodies for incoming calls, new message notifications, alarms and also offers Eight profiles: *Norm.*, *Quiet*, *Noisy* and *User*.

- 1. Ring Type: There are several default melodies that you can choose from. You can also personalize your ring tone by loading melodies to the Music folder in your B8. To choose an incoming call melody, tap the drop-down menu and select file (Fig.4.3.2), the file will be played automatically. To stop playing, tap Stop on the right hand side.
- 2. **Melody**: Check **Melody** to set the ring melody as the incoming call notification.
- 3. *Vibrator*: Check *Vibrating* to set vibrating as the incoming call notification.














- Vib 2 ring: Check Vibrating before ring to set vibrating before ring as the incoming call notification.
- Quiet: Check Quiet and there will be no signals for notification except showing a message when there is an incoming call.
- Receiver volume: There are Eight levels for adjusting the receiver volume. You can scroll the adjusting bar, or tap the left button 

   or the right button 
   to set up the receiver volume.
- Key tone: Check Key tone to turn on or turn off the key tone.

#### 4.4 Messages settings

Messages settings include Voice mail, SMS center and SMS backup. Tap *Home > MyPhone > Settings* and select *Messages* to enter messages settings as fig.4.4.1.

1. Voice Mail: Tap this item to change your voice mail number (as fig.4.4.2). Enter your voice mail number and tap OK. You will see a dialogue window asking whether you want to change the number (as fig.4.4.3). Tap Yes to save the new number and go back to the previous page, or tap No to exit without saving the new number. You can also tap Cancel to go back and enter a new number.



- 2. SMSC no.: Please check with your service provider for the SMS center number. Tap this item to enter the number (as fig.4.4.4) and tap OK. There will be a dialogue window asking whether you wan to change the number (as fig.4.4.5). Tap Yes to save the new number and go back to the previous page, or tap No to exit without saving the new number. You can also tap Cancel to go back and enter a new number.
- 3. **SMS Backup:** Tap this item to set up SMS backup as "On" or "Off". A dialogue window will also appear and ask you to confirm (as fig.4.4.6 and fig.4.4.7).

#### 4.5 Call divert settings

You can divert incoming calls to another number if for any reason you are unable to answer them. You will have to apply this function with your service provider before starting to use it. Your B8 allows the type of call you want to divert, such as "All calls", "Unanswered", "No Reply", "Not reachable", "Busy", "All faxes", "All data" and "Clear all" (as fig.4.5.1). Tap <code>Home > MyPhone > Settings</code> and select <code>Divert</code> to enter call divert settings as fig.4.5.1. For every mode, you can select <code>Run</code>, <code>Check</code> or <code>Clear</code>. For example, if you want to divert all calls, please follow the instructions as below:

Check: Select "All calls" and tap Check, you will see a
message asking you to wait for the service provider while
the network is negotiating. Then another message will
appear to tell you if divert is set or not (as fig.4.5.2).



- 2. Run: Select "All calls" and tap Run, you will enter an editing screen for you to input the phone number to divert (as fig.4.5.3). After inputting a number, tap **OK** and you will see a dialogue window asking whether you want to divert all calls (as fig.4.5.4). Tap Yes to save the number and go back to the previous screen, or tap No to exit without saving. You can also tap Cancel to go back and change the diverting number.
- 3. Clear: Select "All calls" and tap Clear to cancel diverting all calls (as fig.4.5.5).

#### 4.6 Call settings

Tap Home > MyPhone > Settings and select Call to enter call settings as fig.4.6.1.

- 1. Send Phone Num: You can choose whether you want to display your phone number on recipient's phone screen. Tap this item to set this function as "On" or "Off".
- 2. Auto Redial: You can choose whether you want to redial the most recent call. Tap this item to set this function as "On" or "Off".
- Tip: Your A8 can auto redial for 30 times.
- 3. Auto Answer: You can choose whether you want your A8 to answer an incoming call automatically. Tap this item to set this function as "On" or "Off".





- Call Waiting: Use the setting to control how A8 handles incoming calls during an already ongoing call. Tap this item to set this function as "On" or "Off".
- 5. Call Barring: You can set restrictions for calls made from or to your B8 (as fig.4.6.2). You can, for example, protect it from being used for long-distance calls. Select an item and tap Check to check the current setting. To activate, select an item and tap Run. You will have to input a password (as fig.4.6.3). Tap OK and you will see a dialogue window (as fig.4.6.3) asking you to confirm it. Tap Yes to activate the restriction.
- Flip Answer: When "Flip answer" is enabled, you can open the flip to answer the call. Tap this item to set the function as "On" or "Off".

#### 4.7 Network settings

You can get network information or set up auto network by tapping **Home > MyPhone > Settings** and select **Network** to enter a setup screen as fig.4.7.1.

- Network info: Tap this item and you will see a list of network service providers (as fig.4.7.2). means the network is providing service for you. means the network is not providing service for you.
- Auto network: When the radio signal is weak or if you are roaming outside of your Home network, select "Auto network" to improve the radio signal strength (as fig.4.7.3).





#### **Guidelines for Safe and Efficient Use**

Please read this information carefully before using your mobile phone:

#### **Mobile Phone**

- In US GSM Can be used 850/1900MHz Band only.
- Do not expose this product to extreme high or low temperatures, or directly under the sun.
- 3. Do not expose this product to open flames.
- Do not keep this product in a potentially explosive environment.
- 5. Do not expose this product to liquid or moisture or humidity.
- Do not paint this product. The paint may clog the receiver, the microphone and other components.
- Do not put pressure on the screen of this product as it may damage the screen.
- Do not wipe this product with corrosive or volatile liquid so as to prevent any damage to the outer casing. Use a clean and soft cloth or paper towel to wipe it if necessary.
- Do not attempt to disassemble this product. Please send this
  product directly back for maintenance. Tampering with any of

#### Antenna

- 1. Do not remove the antenna.
- Only use an antenna specifically designed by TelePaq for your mobile phone. Use of unauthorized or modified antennas could damage your mobile phone, cause RF (radio frequency) levels above the recommended limits, and even violate local regulations.
- Do not hold the antenna while using your mobile phone as this
  affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a
  higher power level than needed, thus shortening talk and
  standby times.

#### **Battery Use**

- Fully charge the battery before you use your mobile phone for the first time.
- 2. Use only original batteries and chargers.
- 3. Turn off your mobile phone before removing the battery.
- Do not let the metal contacts on the battery touch another metal object. This could short-circuit your battery and cause sparks. Please separate your mobile phone from your keys, necklaces, paper clips or jewelry when you place it in your bags.
- 5. Please check your local regulations for disposal of batteries.

#### **Areas Where Using Mobiles Phones Are Restricted**

**Aircraft:** The use of mobile phones is forbidden on aircraft during flight as to avoid interfering with the radio-based communication of the aircraft.
