

The EUT can transmit the NFC signal through Swiping card (NFC) NFC support both ISO /IEC 14443A and ISO /IEC 14443B. 
TEST PROCEDURE

The transmitter output is connected to the spectrum analyzer. The RBW is set to 1 kHz. The VBW is set to 3 times the RBW. The sweep time is coupled. The spectrum analyzer internal 99% bandwidth function is utilized.

Note: Because the measured signal is CW or CW-like adjusting the RBW per C63.10 would not be practical since measured bandwidth will always follow the RBW and the result will be approximately twice the RBW.

The type of band for the signal is narrowband.





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
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HARMONICS AND SPURIOUS EMISSIONS (VERTICAL)








