Set Up Your Phone

You must first install and charge the battery to begin setting up your phone.


Insert and Charge the Battery


Insert and Charge the Battery

Follow the steps below to insert the battery and charge it.


- 1. Install the battery.
 - Turn the battery cover lock counter-clockwise to the unlocked position.




Insert your thumb- or fingernail into the slot and lift the battery cover gently.




Insert the battery, contacts end first, and gently press the battery into place.



 Replace the battery cover, making sure all the tabs are secure and there are no gaps around the cover.



• Turn the battery cover lock clockwise to the locked position.



Note: When you insert the battery, your phone may power on automatically.

Get Started

- 2. Charge your battery.
 - Open the cover of the charger/accessory jack.
 - Plug the smaller end of the USB cable into the phone's charger/accessory jack.




- Plug the other end of the USB cable into the charger, and then plug the charger into an electrical outlet.
- **Note:** Your phone's battery should have enough charge for the phone to turn on and find a signal, run the setup application, set up voicemail, and make a call. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.
 - 3. Press and hold the **Power** button to turn the phone on.
 - If your phone is activated, it will turn on, search for Sprint service, and begin the setup process.
 - If your phone is not yet activated, see Activate Your Phone for more information.


Insert a SIM Card

Your phone comes with a preinstalled SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card.


- **Note:** Your SIM card should be preinstalled. If you need to reinstall your SIM card, follow the instructions below.
- **Note:** The SIM included contains information specific to your phone and should be retained with the phone.
 - 1. Remove the battery cover. See Insert and Charge the Battery.
 - 2. Lift the battery and remove it.




3. Slide the flap of the SIM card holder in the direction of the arrow to unlock it and lift the flap.



4. Hold the SIM card so that the metal contacts on the SIM card face down and the cut off corner points to the bottom-left corner of your phone. Insert the SIM card into the flap of the SIM card holder.



5. Replace the flap of the SIM card holder and slide the flap in the direction of the arrow to lock it.



6. Replace the battery and the battery cover. See Insert and Charge the Battery.

Activate Your Phone

Follow the instructions below to activate your phone if it has not already been activated. Depending on your account or how and where you purchased your phone, it may be ready to use or you may need to activate it on your Sprint account.

- If you purchased your phone at a Sprint Store, it is probably activated and ready to use.
- If you received your phone in the mail and it is for a new Sprint account or a new line of service, it is designed to activate automatically.

- When you turn the phone on for the first time, you should see a Hands Free Activation screen, which may be followed by a PRL Update screen and a Firmware Update screen. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.
- If you received your phone in the mail and you are activating a new phone for an existing number on your account (you're swapping phones), you can activate on your computer online or directly on your phone.
 - Activate on your computer:
 - Go to sprint.com/activate and complete the online instructions to activate your phone
 - Activate on your phone:
 - Turn on your new phone. (Make sure the old one is turned off.) Your phone will automatically attempt Hands-Free Activation.
 - Touch **Activate** to override auto-activation and start the manual activation wizard.
 - Follow the on-screen prompts to complete the activation process.

To confirm activation, make a phone call. If your phone is still not activated or you do not have access to the Internet, contact Sprint Customer Service at **1-888-211-4727** for assistance.

- **Tip:** Do not press the **Power** button while the phone is being activated. Pressing the **Power** button cancels the activation process.
- **Note:** If you are having any difficulty with activation, contact Sprint Customer Service by calling **1-888-211-4727** from any other phone.

Complete the Setup Application

The setup screens help you set up certain features and preferences on your phone. Once your phone has been turned on, you will see a Welcome message. You can then complete the setup process.

- **Note:** You may be able to complete the setup screens before your phone has been activated on your Sprint account.
- Note: During or after setup, you may see a Sprint Connections Optimizer notice. Read the notice and touch I Agree to allow your device to connect automatically to the best available data network, including Wi-Fi. To turn Sprint Connections Optimizer off at any time, touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > Mobile networks > Connections Optimizer and uncheck the box. See Sprint Connections Optimizer for details.

- 1. From the Welcome screen, select a language (if prompted) and touch **Next** to get started.
 - To skip any section, touch **Next** or **Skip**.

Note: On the Welcome screen, there may also be an **Accessibility** button. If you are visually impaired or hard of hearing, touch **Accessibility** to change the accessibility settings.

- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete each section. For each topic, you will have the option to skip it and continue to the next screen.
 - Wi-Fi If prompted, follow the prompts to sign in to an available Wi-Fi network. For secured Wi-Fi networks, you will need to enter a password. See Wi-Fi for more details.
 - Got Google? Touch Yes and complete the steps to sign in to your current Google account, or touch No and then touch Get an account (to set up a new Google Account) or Not now to skip Google setup. The following options may apply depending on your selection:
 - Sign in Enter your Gmail address and password and touch Sign in to sign in to your current Google Account.
 - Get an account Follow the instructions to sign up for a new Google Account. There will be screens to enter your first and last names, create an email address (Gmail), create a password, enter recovery information (including a backup email address and recovery question), an option to join Google+, and an option to enable purchases from the Google Play Store app. Touch Next between each screen.
 - Use Google location Select your Google location options and then touch Next.
 - This phone belongs to... If applicable, enter your first and last name and touch Next. This information is used by the phone to personalize certain apps.
- 3. Touch **Finish**. Your setup is now complete. Follow the onscreen instructions to learn about basic touch menu navigation, view tutorials, or just get started.
- **Note:** You do not need to sign up for a Google Account to use your phone. However, to download apps from the Google Play Store app, you must link your phone to a Google Account.

Set Up Voicemail

You should set up your Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Always use a password to protect against unauthorized access. Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. **Note:** Voicemail Password – Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

To set up visual voicemail:

Touch Home > ::: > Voicemail. (If your screen is locked, press the Power button to turn on the display and then flick () to unlock the screen.)

2. Touch **Personalize now** and follow the system prompts to:

- Create a password (part of standard voicemail).
- Record your name announcement.
- Record your greeting.
- 3. When prompted to enter information, touch **Dialpad** to bring up the onscreen dialpad to enter your numeric responses.
- 4. Once you have completed the setup process, return to the voicemail page (see step 1).
- 5. Touch the **Welcome to Voicemail** message on the screen to play a brief explanation of the voicemail services.

To set up traditional voicemail:

- Touch Home > < > < . (If your screen is locked, press the Power button to turn on the display and then flick () to unlock the screen.)
- 2. Touch and hold 1 to dial your voicemail number.
- 3. Follow the system prompts to:
 - Create your password.
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.

Account User Name and Password

If you are the account owner, you will create an account user name and password when you sign on to sprint.com. (Click **Sign in/Register** and then click **Sign up now!** to get started.) If you are not the account owner (if someone else receives the bill for your Sprint service), you can get a sub-account password at sprint.com.

Voicemail Password

You'll create your voicemail password when you set up your voicemail. See Set Up Voicemail for more information on your voicemail password.

Data Services Password

With your Sprint phone, you may elect to set up an optional data services password to control access and authorize purchases.

Sprint 411

Sprint 411 gives you access to a variety of services and information, including residential, business, and government listings; movie listings or showtimes; driving directions, restaurant reservations, and major local event information. You can get up to three pieces of information per call, and the operator can automatically connect your call at no additional charge.

There is a per-call charge to use Sprint 411, and you will be billed for airtime.

Phone Basics

Your phone is packed with features that simplify your life and expand your ability to stay connected to the people and information that are important to you. The following topics will introduce the basic functions and features of your phone.

Your Phone's Layout

The illustrations and descriptions below outline your phone's basic layout.



Key Functions

- **Earpiece** lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.
- **Proximity Sensor/Light Sensor** detects how close an object is to the surface of the screen. This is typically used to detect when your face is pressed up against the screen, such as during a phone call. It also automatically turns off the keyboard backlight and brightens the display when you are in sunlight or a bright room, and turns on the keyboard backlight and dims the display in darker places.
- **LED Indicator** displays a phone notification, charging status, or alert.

- **Home Key** returns you to the home screen. Press and hold to open the recentlyused applications window.
- **Back Key** lets you return to the previous screen, or close a dialog box, options menu, the Notifications panel, or onscreen keyboard.
- **Speaker** lets you hear the different ringtones and sounds. The speaker also lets you hear the caller's voice in speakerphone mode.
- Menu Key 📰 lets you open the menus of the current screen or application.
- Self Camera Lens takes pictures and records videos while facing the screen, and allows you to video conference.
- **Touchscreen** displays all the information needed to operate your phone. Use finger gestures to navigate and interact with items on the screen.
- **Power Button** lets you turn the phone on or off or turn the screen on or off, or switch your phone to silent mode, vibration mode, or airplane mode.
- **Headset Jack** allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.
- **Speaker Button** lets you place or receive calls in speakerphone mode or turn the speakerphone on and off during a call.
- **Microphones** transmit your voice for phone calls or record your voice or ambient sounds for voice recordings and videos.
- **Charger/Accessory Jack** allows you to connect the micro-USB cable (included) to charge the battery or to transfer files to and from a computer.
- **Volume Button** allows you to adjust the ringtone or media volume when you are not on a call, or adjust the voice volume during a call.
- **Direct Connect Button (DC Button)** allows you to make Direct Connect calls, send Call Alerts, and view Direct Connect call history.
- **Camera Button** lets you activate the camera and video camera, and take pictures and videos.
- Internal Antennas facilitate reception and transmission. To maximize performance, do not obstruct while using the phone.
- Battery Cover Lock turns to lock and unlock the battery cover.
- **Power Connectors** allow your phone to be connected to an optional multi-bay charger.
- SIM Card Slot (Internal) allows you to insert a SIM card.

Note: Your phone comes with the SIM card preinstalled.

 microSD Card Slot (Internal) allows you to insert a microSD card to support external memory.

Note: Your phone comes with the microSD card preinstalled.

- Back Camera Lens lets you take pictures and videos.
- **Camera Flash** helps illuminate subjects in low-light environments when taking a picture or recording a video.
- **CAUTION!** Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.

Turn Your Phone On and Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your phone on and off.

Turn Your Phone On

▶ Press and hold the **Power** button.

Turn Your Phone Off

- 1. Press and hold the **Power** button to open the phone options menu.
- 2. Touch **Power off** > **OK** to turn the phone off.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off.

Turn Your Screen On and Off

Your phone allows you to quickly turn the screen off when not in use and to turn it back on and unlock it when you need it.

Turn the Screen Off When Not in Use

► To quickly turn the screen off, press the **Power** button. Pressing the **Power** button again or receiving an incoming call will turn on your phone screen and show the lock screen.

To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after a certain period of time when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone's screen is off.

Note: For information on how to adjust the time before the screen turns off, see Sleep.

Turn the Screen On and Unlock It

1. To turn the screen on, press the **Power** button.

- 2. Flick (to unlock the screen.
 - You can disable the screen lock or enable a more secure one from the Settings menu. See Screen Lock.

Touchscreen Navigation

Your phone's touchscreen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

Touch

Touch the screen with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application. A light touch works best.

Touch and Hold

To open the available options for an item (for example, a contact), touch and hold the item.

Drag

Touch and hold your finger before you start to move it. Do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.

Swipe or Slide

To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.

Flick

Flicking the screen is similar to swiping, except that you need to swipe your finger in light, quick strokes.

Pinch and Spread

Pinch the screen using your thumb and forefinger to zoom out or spread the screen to zoom in when viewing a picture or a Web page. (Move fingers inward to zoom out and outward to zoom in.)

Rotate

For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways. When entering text, you can turn the phone sideways to bring up a bigger keyboard. See Touchscreen Keyboards for more details.

Note: The Auto-rotate screen check box needs to be selected for the screen orientation to automatically change. Touch Home 🗀 > Menu 📰 > System settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen.

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more.



Customize the Home Screen

Home Screen Overview

Your home screen extends beyond the initial screen. Swipe the screen left or right to display additional screens.



Application Launcher-

- **Status Bar:** Displays the time, notification, and phone status icons. Slide down to display the Notifications panel.
- Shortcut: Allows users to quickly launch applications.
- **Application Launcher:** Touch to display available applications and widgets on the phone.
- **Favorites Tray:** Contains up to five icons and appears on every home screen. You can customize these icons except the application launcher icon in the middle.

- Screen Position Indicator: Indicates where you are among the five home screens.
- **Folder:** Allows users to organize screen items. You can store multiple application icons as a group.
- **Google Search Bar:** Allows users to enter text or spoken keywords for a quick search on the phone or on the Internet. Touch to enter text or touch $\oint_{\mathcal{D}}$ to speak your keyword.

Tip: Touch **Home** to return to the main home screen from any other screen.

Extended Home Screens

In addition to the main home screen, your phone has four extended home screens to provide more space for adding icons, widgets, and more. Touch **Home** and then drag across the screen to move from the main screen to an extended screen.

- You cannot add more screens.
- While on an extended screen, touch **Home** () to return to the main home screen.



Customize the Home Screen

Learn how to add, move, or remove items from the home screen.

Add App Shortcuts or Widgets to the Home Screen

- 1. Touch i on the favorites tray.
- 2. Slide the **APPS** or **WIDGETS** screens to find the item you want to add to the home screen.

- 3. Touch and hold the app icon or a widget and move your finger to find the place to add it to. The blue frames which appear on the screen indicate where you might place the item.
- 4. Release your finger.

Move or Remove Items on the Home Screen

- ▶ Touch and hold the item you want to move or remove from the home screen.
 - To move the item, drag it to a new area and release it.
 - To remove the item, drag it to "**X Remove**" at the top of the screen and release it when it turns red.

Favorites Tray

The favorites tray takes up to five icons and appears on every home screen. You can replace those icons except the application launcher icon in the center of the tray.

To add a new icon to the favorites tray:

- 1. Remove the current icon on the tray. See Move or Remove Items on the Home Screen.
- 2. Touch and hold an app icon and drag it to the favorites tray.
- 3. Release your finger.

Use Folders

You can place several app icons in a folder. Drop an app icon over another on the home screen, and the two icons will be in the same folder.

- 1. Touch and hold an app icon and drag it over another on the home screen.
- 2. Release your finger. You can see two icons piled within a folder (a black circle).
- 3. Touch the circle. You can see the app icons within the folder.
- 4. Touch **Unnamed Folder**. The keyboard opens and you can name the folder. To rename it, touch the name.

Change Wallpaper

- 1. Touch and hold an empty area on a home screen.
- 2. Select one of the following options:
 - **Gallery:** Select to use saved or captured pictures on your phone. Touch to select a picture and crop it before setting it as wallpaper.

- **ID wallpapers:** Select to use ID wallpapers. Select the wallpaper and touch **Set wallpaper**.
- Live Wallpapers: Select to use Live wallpapers. Select the wallpaper and touch Set wallpaper.
- Wallpapers: Select to use preset wallpapers. Select the wallpaper and touch Set wallpaper

Status Bar

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left. To view notification alerts, touch the status bar and drag it down.

Touchscreen Keyboards

Your phone offers you a choice of two touchscreen keyboards for entering text. The keyboard appear automatically onscreen when you touch a text entry field, and they can be used in either portrait or landscape mode.

The methods available include:

- Android keyboard lets you use a traditional QWERTY setup to enter text. Additional options expand your ability to enter text faster and more accurately. See Android Keyboard for details.
- **Swype** lets you enter letters and words in one continuous motion by swiping your finger across the letters. See Swype for details.

Note: Swype is selected as a default keyboard.

To select a keyboard from Settings:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input > Default.
- 2. Touch **Swype** or **Android keyboard**.

To switch the keyboard when a keyboard is displayed:

- 1. Drag the Notifications panel down and touch **Select input method**.
- 2. Touch Swype or Android keyboard.



The Swype[™] keyboard lets you enter words by drawing a path from letter to letter in one continuous motion.

Some of the keys on the Swype keyboard are given below:

Key	Description
123 +!= Edit ABC	Text mode: Touch to toggle between the Alphabet keyboard and Number & Symbol keyboard.
5	Swype: Touch and hold to access the tips or the settings of Swype.
Ŷ	Voice input mode: Touch to enter text using your voice.
$\langle \times \rangle$	Backspace: Touch to delete a character. Touch and hold to delete multiple characters.
:-)	Smiley: Touch to insert a smiley. Touch and hold to view and select other smileys.
EN	Space: Touch to insert a space. The letters on the key shows the keyboard's language. Touch and hold to bring up the Languages screen to select another language.
Ļ	Enter: Touch to confirm your entry or move to a new line.
☆ ♠ 	Shift: Touch to toggle between the lowercase, uppercase, and caps lock text input.

Text Mode

ABC mode is primarily used for entering letters while Number & Symbol mode for numbers and symbols.

Touch ^{Edit}_{ABC} to select ABC mode. Touch ¹²³_{+!=} to select Number & Symbol mode.

In ABC mode, touch Δ to alter the capitalization:



(Unshifted) to enter all letters in a word lowercase.



▲ (One-character-shifted) to capitalize only the first letter of a word.



Caps Lock) to enter all letters in a word uppercase.

- The Number & Symbol keyboards are in two layers. Touch 🗗 to display the second keyboard.
- Some keys have alternate characters. In either mode, if a key displays an extra character on the upper right corner, touch and hold the key to enter the character. Or, touch and long hold a key to call up a list of all the characters available on that key. Touch the character you want to enter from the list.

Swype Voice Input

You can use voice input to enter text by speaking anywhere that you can enter text with the touchscreen kevboard.

- 1. Touch \oint on the keyboard.
- 2. Say the text you wish to enter into the microphone.

Swype User Dictionary

To add a word to your Swype dictionary:

- 1. Enter a word on the Swype keyboard.
- 2. Touch <u>M</u>. The word is highlighted.
- 3. Touch 🕂 again.
- 4. Touch Add "xxx" to dictionary.

To delete a word in your Swype dictionary:

1. Touch and hold **n** on the Swype keyboard.

– or –

Touch Home \bigcirc > Menu \bigcirc > System settings > Language & input, and then touch \bigcirc next to Swype.

- 2. Touch **Personalization** > **Edit Dictionary**.
- 3. Touch a word to select it. You can touch \checkmark to select all the words in the dictionary.
- 4. Touch 🔣 > OK.

Swype Settings

You can customize the Swype settings as you like.

- 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch -- next to **Swype**.

Tip: You can open the Swype settings from the Swype keyboard. Touch and hold \checkmark on the keyboard.

- 3. Choose from the following options:
 - How to Swype: Touch to learn Swype in quick steps.
 - **Gestures:** Touch to learn some useful shortcuts on the Swype keyboard.
 - **Preferences:** Touch to show the following settings menus for Swype.
 - Vibrate on keypress: Select to activate vibration when a key is touched.
 - **Sound on keypress:** Select to play tones when a key is touched.
 - Auto-correction: Select to automatically correct mistyped words.
 - Show helpful tips: Select to display helpful tips for using Swype.
 - Auto-spacing: Select to automatically insert spaces between words.
 - **Auto-capitalization:** Select to automatically capitalize the first letter of sentenceinitial words where available.
 - Show complete trace: Select to display the complete Swype path.
 - **Pup-up on keypress:** Select to display a larger image of the key above it when you touch it.
 - Next word prediction: Select to predict words based on the previously entered text.


- Enable handwriting: Select to convert your handwriting into a text.
- **Reset Swype's dictionary:** Select to delete all the words you have added to Swype's dictionary.
- Version: Touch to display the current Swype version.
- Language Options: Touch to select the language to use on Swype
- Swype Connect: Touch to use a background service which collects Swype-specific data and utilize it to improve your Swype experience.
- Personalization: Touch to personalize Swype to your taste, including changing the keyboard theme and editing the dictionary.
- Updates: Touch to perform an update.

Android Keyboard

The Android keyboard offers a traditional QWERTY keyboard setup for entering text by touching keys (like on a computer), along with enhancements and options that allow you to enter text faster and more accurately, such as continuous key input, personalized usage dictionaries, and more.

Some of the keys on the Android keyboard are given below:

Text Mode

ABC mode is primarily used for entering letters while Number & Symbol mode for numbers and symbols.

Touch **ABC** to select ABC mode. Touch **?123** to select Number & Symbol mode.



✤ (Unshifted) to enter all letters in a word lowercase.



(One-character-shifted) to capitalize only the first letter of a word.

You can select the caps lock by double-touching 🔂 or 🛧 to make all letters in a word uppercase.



(Caps Lock) to enter all letters in a word uppercase.

- In Number & Symbol mode, touch = \< to display more symbols.
- Some keys have alternate characters. In either mode, if a key displays an extra character at the upper right corner, touch and hold the key to enter the character. Or, touch and long hold a key to call up a list of all the characters available on that key. Touch the character you want to enter from the list.

Google Voice Typing

Google Voice typing uses Google voice recognition to convert speech to text. You need a data or Wi-Fi connection to use this feature.

If the Android keyboard does not display the microphone icon \bigcup , the voice input feature is not enabled.

To enable the voice input feature:

- 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Select the **Google voice typing** check box if it is not selected.
- 3. Touch -- next to **Android keyboard**.
- Touch Voice input key and select On main keyboard or On symbols keyboard. The microphone icon g appears on the specified keyboard.

To enter text by speaking:

- 1. Touch the microphone icon \bigcup on the keyboard.
- 2. Say the text you wish to enter into the microphone and touch **Done**.

Add a Word to the User Dictionary

You can use the user dictionary option to add new words to the dictionary.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch **Personal dictionaries**.
- 3. Select a language.
- 4. Touch + .
- 5. Type the word you want to add and touch **OK**. (A list of words you have added to the dictionary is displayed.)

- Touch a word to edit it.
- Touch X to delete it.

Android Keyboard Settings


- 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch -- next to **Android keyboard**.
- **Tip:** When **Show settings key** is enabled in the Android keyboard settings, touch **I** on the Android keyboard and touch **Android keyboard settings**. When the setting is disabled, touch and hold the key to the immediate left of the space key on the Android keyboard and touch **Android keyboard settings**.
 - 3. Choose from the following options.
 - **Input languages:** Touch to select the input language. The dictionary for the selected language will be enabled.
 - Auto-capitalization: Check to automatically set the first letter of a sentence to upper case.
 - Vibrate on keypress: Check to activate vibration when a key is touched.
 - **Sound on keypress:** Check to activate a clicking sound when a key is touched.
 - **Popup on keypress:** Check to display a larger image of the key above it when you touch it.
 - Show settings key: Check to display the keyboard settings key on the keyboard.
 - Voice input key: Touch to select where the Voice Input key is displayed from On main keyboard, On symbols keyboard, or Off.
 - Add-on dictionaries: Touch to select the dictionary you want to use.
 - Auto correction: Touch to allow the space bar and punctuation to automatically correct mistyped words.
 - Show correction suggestions: Touch to select when correction suggestions are displayed.
 - Advanced settings: Touch to open the settings for expert users.

Copy and Paste Text

In applications that require text entry, such as Messaging, use the copy and paste functions to copy and paste text from one application to another.

To copy and paste the text:

- 1. Open the application or received message that you want to copy text from.
- Touch and hold the text body. Selection tabs appear and the currently selected words or characters are highlighted. Drag the tabs to expand or reduce the range of the selected text.



- **Tip:** Touch **III** or **SELECT ALL** to select all the text on the Web page.
 - 3. Touch 📄.
 - 4. Open the application that you want to paste the text to.
 - 5. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the text to, and touch **PASTE**.
 - If you want to add the selected text to the current text, place a cursor to the position where you want to insert the selected words or characters. Touch and hold the text box, and touch **PASTE**.

To copy text from a Web page:

- 1. Scroll to the area of the Web page containing the text you want to select.
- 2. Touch and hold the text you want to copy. Drag tabs to expand or reduce the range of the selected text. Any selected text will appear highlighted.
- Tip: Touch **SELECT ALL** to select all the text on the Web page.
 - 1. Touch > **Copy**.
 - 2. Open the application that you want to paste into.
 - 3. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the text to, and touch **PASTE**.

To copy a URL:

- 1. To copy a URL, touch and hold the URL to display the options menu.
- 2. Touch Copy link URL or [].
- 3. Open the application that you want to paste into.
- 4. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the URL to, and touch **PASTE**.



The most "traditional" way to place a call is by using the phone's dialpad.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc . If the dialpad is not displayed, touch the Phone tab \bigcirc .
- 2. Touch the number keys on the dialpad to enter the phone number.
- 3. Touch the Talk key 📞 to call the number.



4. To end the call, touch 🔚.

Call from Call Logs

The Call logs list lets you quickly place calls to recent incoming, outgoing, or missed numbers.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone app.
- 2. Touch the Call log tab 🕔 to display the Call log list.
- 3. Touch the phone icon 📞 next to the number or contact to place a call.
 - For additional options, touch the name or number.

Call from Contacts

You can place phone calls directly from entries in your Contacts list.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone app.
- 2. Touch the People tab 👤 to display the People list. Your frequent contacts are displayed at the top of the list.
- 3. Touch the contact you want to place a call.
 - Touch Q to search your contact.
 - Touch Menu => Contacts to display to customize the display of contacts.
 - For additional information on Contacts, see Contacts.

Call Using a Speed Dial Number

Speed dialing lets you contact friends and family easier. See Set Up Speed Dialing for information on assigning speed dial numbers.

- 1. Touch **Home** (> 📞 > .
- 2. For speed dial numbers 2-9, touch and hold the number on the dialpad.

– or –

For speed dial numbers 10-99, touch the first digit and then touch and hold the second digit on the dialpad.

Call a Number in a Text Message or Email Message

While viewing a text message or email message, you can place a call to a number that is in the body of the message.

- 1. Touch **Home** > ::: > Messaging. If necessary, select a messaging or email account.
- 2. Touch the message with the phone number.
- 3. The Phone screen then opens, with the phone number automatically filled in and ready to be dialed. To place the call, touch **C**.

Call Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 even if the phone's screen is locked or your account is restricted.

To call the 911 emergency number:

Phone Calls

- 1. Flick () to unlock the screen, if the slide screen lock is on.
- 2. Touch $\langle \cdot \rangle$ on the screen.
- 3. Touch 9[™] 1[∞] 1[∞] .

To call the 911 emergency number when the pattern screen lock, the facial screen lock, the PIN screen lock or the password screen lock is on:

- 1. Touch **Emergency call** on the screen.
- 2. Touch 9 1_ 1_ 📞.

Once an emergency call is placed, your device will be in Emergency mode for the following five minutes after the call where non-emergency calls cannot be made.

To exit Emergency mode immediately:

Press Menu and touch Exit Emergency mode > Yes.

Enhanced 911 (E911) Information

This phone features an embedded Global Positioning System (GPS) chip necessary for utilizing E911 emergency location services where available.

When you place an emergency 911 call, the GPS feature of your phone seeks information to calculate your approximate location. Depending on several variables, including availability and access to satellite signals, it may take up to 30 seconds or more to determine and report your approximate location.

Important: Always report your location to the 911 operator when placing an emergency call. Some designated emergency call takers, known as Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), may not be equipped to receive GPS location information from your phone.

Call Numbers with Pauses

You can dial phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- Add 2-sec pause: Automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.
- Add wait: Sends the next set of numbers when you touch Yes in the pop-up window.
- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc , and enter all or part of a number.

- Touch Menu => Add 2-sec pause or Add wait.
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- 4. Touch the Talk key 📞 to dial the number.

Call Using the Plus (+) Code

When placing international calls, Plus Code Dialing automatically enters the international access code for your location (for example, 011 for international calls made from the U.S.).

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch and hold 0 until you see a "+" on the display screen.
- 3. Enter the country code and phone number, and then touch **C**. The phone automatically prepends the access code for international dialing, followed by the country code and phone number.

Call Using Internet Calling

When Wi-Fi network is available, you can make and receive calls through an Internet calling account.

Important: Calling a phone number using Internet calling may incur additional charges.

Add an Internet Calling Account

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch Menu => Settings > SIP Accounts > Add account.
- 3. Enter your account details.
- 4. To set your phone to receive Internet calls on your added account, select the **Receive incoming calls** check box.
- **Note:** This requires the phone to maintain a connection with a Wi-Fi data network, which reduces the life of your phone's battery.

Make an Internet Call

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > People.
- 2. Touch a contact and then touch **Internet call**.

Internet Calling Setting

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch **Menu > Settings** > **Use Internet calling**.
- 3. Select an option:
 - For all calls when data network is available to use Internet calling for all calls when Wi-Fi network is available.
 - Only for Internet calls to use Internet calling only for calls to Internet calling addresses.
 - Ask for each call to ask each time you make a call.

Receive Phone Calls

The following information lets you know how to answer incoming calls, mute the ringer on incoming calls, reject incoming calls, and more.

When you receive a phone call from a contact, the Incoming call screen appears and displays the caller ID icon, name, and phone number of the calling party. When you receive a phone call from someone who is not stored in People, only the default caller ID icon and phone number appear on the Incoming call screen.

Note: If your phone is turned off, all calls automatically go to voicemail.

Answer an Incoming Call

On the Incoming call screen, flick the Answer icon (C).

Mute the Ringing Sound

To mute the ringer without rejecting the call:

Press the volume button up or down.

Send an Incoming Call to Voicemail

▶ Flick the Ignore icon (to send the call to your voicemail inbox.

Reject a Call and Send a Text Message

You can reject an incoming call and automatically send a text message to the caller.

Flick the Ignore & Text icon () to ignore the call and send a message to the caller.

You can edit the text messages through the Call settings menu. From the phone app, touch Menu => Settings > Quick responses and edit the text messages.

Visual Voicemail

Visual Voicemail gives you a quick and easy way to access your voicemail. Now you can find exactly the message you are looking for without having to listen to every voicemail message first. This new feature periodically goes out to your voicemail, and gathers the caller information from all of the current voicemails. It then populates a list with the caller name and number, along with the length of time and priority level of the voicemail message.

Set Up Visual Voicemail

Setting up Visual Voicemail follows many of the same procedures as setting up traditional Sprint voicemail. You should set up your Sprint voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

Note: To set up your traditional voicemail box, see Set Up Voicemail.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voicemail.
- 2. Touch **Personalize now** and follow the system prompts to:
 - Create a password (part of standard voicemail).
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.
- 3. When prompted to enter information, touch **Dialpad** to bring up the onscreen dialpad to enter your numeric responses.

Important: Voicemail Password – Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a


password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

- 4. Once you have completed the setup process, return to the voicemail page (see step 1).
- 5. Touch the Welcome to Voicemail message on the screen to play a brief explanation of the voicemail services.

Review Visual Voicemail

Visual Voicemail lets you easily access and select which messages you want to review.

1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > **Voicemail**. You will see the voicemail inbox.



- Note: Touch Inbox at the top left on the screen to move to other folders, such as Trash or SD card.
 - 2. Touch \equiv to play all the new messages.

Touch a message to play it.

- The bar """ provides a visual timeline for the current message. Touch and drag this bar to scrub through the message to different points.
- Touch III to pause the playback. Touch IV to resume.
- Touch Ø or 1 to turn the speakerphone on or off during playback.
- Touch it to delete the current voicemail message. The message will be moved to the trash folder.
- Touch to call the number the message came from.
- Touch to share the message. Select an available method and follow the onscreen instructions.
- Touch
 to reply to the message via text or voice message.
- Touch 🔄 to move the message to the SD card.
- Touch Late to move the message to Inbox.

Listen to Multiple Voicemail Messages

When you are done listening to a voicemail message you can easily access other voicemail messages without returning to the main voicemail screen.

- 1. Listen to the current voicemail message.
- 2. Swipe your finger left or right to display the next or previous message. (It will begin playing automatically.)

You can navigate through voicemail messages as frequently as you'd like. You can even move to the next or previous message before you're finished listening to the current one.

Compose a Message

Record a voice message and share it.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voicemail > $\underbrace{\Psi}_{+}$.
- 2. Touch 👤 to start recording.
- 3. Touch 👤 to stop recording.
- 4. Touch () to review the recorded message.
 - Touch start a new recording.
- 5. Touch <<p>to select a method to share the recorded message and follow the onscreen instructions.
 - You will be asked to set a **Display name** if it is not set.

Configure Visual Voicemail Settings

The Visual Voicemail settings menu lets you access settings for notifications, pictures, greetings, and more.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Voicemail**.
- 2. Touch **Menu E** > **Settings**. Select an option to change its settings.
 - Manage subscription to verify the Voicemail-to-Text account information.
 - Auto forward to email to send a copy of new messages to an email address of your choice.
 - Personalize voicemail to change your voicemail greeting for incoming calls and update password. See Change Your Main Greeting via the Voicemail Menu.
 - Notifications to determine how you are notified of new voicemails.
 - Delete messages to set the timing to permanently delete the messages in the trash folder.

- Display name to enter a name that is attached to your outgoing voicemails as part of an identification string. See Edit the Display Name via the Voicemail Menu.
- View quick tips tutorial to display some quick tips for using visual voicemail.
- Help to go to the help page of Visual Voicemail.
- Send feedback to send your feedback on the visual voicemail.
- Check for update to search for an update to your Visual message software.
- About Voicemail to view build information about the current visual voicemail application.
- **Tip:** You can restore messages you have sent to the trash folder. Touch **Inbox** > **Trash**, touch and hold the message you want to restore to the inbox, and then touch the restore icon **E**.
- Note: Voicemail settings can also be accessed by touching Home > Settings > Voicemail.

Change Your Main Greeting via the Voicemail Menu

Your main greeting can be changed directly via the Visual Voicemail system. This direct access saves you from having to navigate within the voicemail menu.

- 1. Touch Home (> (> Voicemail.
- 2. Touch Menu => Settings > Personalize voicemail.
- 3. Touch **OK** to connect to the Sprint voicemail system. Follow the prompts to change your current greeting.

Edit the Display Name via the Voicemail Menu

From your Visual Voicemail menu, you can quickly change the name or number attached to your voice messages.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Voicemail**.
- 2. Touch Menu **E** > Settings > Display name.
- 3. Touch the existing identification field and enter a new identifying name or number (used to identify you to recipients of your voice messages).
- 4. Touch **OK** to save your information.

- 3. Follow the system prompts to:
 - Create your password.
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.
- Important: Voicemail Password Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

Voicemail Notification

There are a couple of different ways your phone alerts you to a new voicemail message.

- By sounding the assigned ringer type.
- By displaying **within the Notifications area of the Status bar when new unheard** voicemail message(s) is received. The figure is the number of new messages. This icon means you have ten unheard new messages.
- **Note:** When you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network, you may not receive notification of new voicemail messages. Sprint recommends that you periodically check your voicemail by dialing 1 + area code + your wireless phone number. When your

voicemail answers, touch ***** and enter your password. Roaming rates apply when you access voicemail while roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network.

Note: Your phone accepts messages even when it is turned off. However, your phone notifies you of new messages only when it is turned on and you are in a Sprint service area.

Retrieve Your Voicemail Messages

You can review your messages directly from your wireless phone (using either traditional voicemail or Visual Voicemail) or from any other touch-tone phone.

Use Traditional Voicemail to Access Your Messages

- 1. Touch **Home** (> 📞 > 📞 .
- 2. Touch and hold 1. If prompted, enter your voicemail password.
- 3. Follow the voice prompts to listen to and manage your voicemail messages.

Use Visual Voicemail to Access Your Messages

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Voicemail**.
- 2. Touch an entry to listen to the message.
- **Note:** Depending on your plan, you may be charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your wireless phone.

Use Another Phone to Access Messages

- 1. Dial your wireless phone number.
- 2. When your voicemail answers, press the asterisk key on the phone (*).
- 3. Enter your password.


Phone Call Options

Your phone application provides many useful features and options to help you make the most of your calling experience.

In-call Options Caller ID Call Waiting 3-Way Calling Call Forwarding Phone Calls

In-call Options

While you're on a call, you will see a number of onscreen options. Touch an option to select it.



- Add call: Touch to initiate a 3-way call.
- **End:** End the current call.
- **Dialpad/Hide:** Toggle the appearance of the onscreen dialpad to enter additional numbers such as an extension or access code.
 - For example: When you call your bank's 800 number, use your dialpad to enter your account number and PIN.
- Mute: Mute the microphone (^{On}) during an active call, or unmute the microphone (^{Off}).

Note: If Mute is activated, the speaker mode is deactivated.

• **Speaker:** Route the phone's audio through the speaker (^{On}) or through the earpiece (^{Off}).

Warning: Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

Touch **Menu** during a call to display a list of additional in-call features. Touch an option to select it.

• Contacts: Display your contacts list.

• **Bluetooth:** Route the phone's audio through a connected Bluetooth headset (On) or through the speaker (Off).

Caller ID

Caller ID identifies a caller before you answer the phone by displaying the number of the incoming call. If you do not want your number displayed when you make a call, follow these steps.

- 1. Touch **Home** (> 📞 > .
- 2. Touch \star 6 🗠 7 🗠
- 3. Enter a phone number.
- 4. Touch 📞.

To permanently block your number, call Sprint Customer Service.

Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding two beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if available).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

▶ Flick S. This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.

To switch back to the first caller:

- ► Touch Switch calls.
- Note: For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can temporarily disable Call Waiting by pressing ★ 7 and 0 the before placing your call. Call Waiting is automatically reactivated once you end the call.

3-Way Calling

With 3-way calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. On the Phone screen, enter a number and touch 📞 (or place a call from Log or Contacts).
- 2. Once you have established the connection, touch **Add call**, and dial the second number (or place the call from Logs or Contacts). This puts the first caller on hold and dials the second number.

- 3. When you're connected to the second party, touch **Merge calls**. Your conference call is now in session.
- 4. To end the 3-way call, touch 🔂.
- **Note:** If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number – even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when you have activated Call Forwarding.

Note: You are charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

To activate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Touch **Home** (> 📞 > 📞 .
- 2. Touch \star 7 🚥 2 🔤 .
- 3. Enter the area code and phone number to which you want your calls forwarded.
- 4. Touch **C**. You will hear a tone to confirm the activation of Call Forwarding.

To deactivate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Touch **Home** (> 📞 > .
- 2. Touch ★ 7[™] 2[™] 0⁺.

TTY Mode

A TTY (teletypewriter, also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone.

Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect using a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

When establishing your Sprint service, please call Sprint Customer Service using the state Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS) by first dialing 7 1 1 1 1 K. Then provide the state TRS with this number: **866-727-4889**.

To turn TTY Mode on or off:

- 1. Touch **Home** > ****.
- 2. Touch **Menu Settings** > **TTY mode**.
- 3. Touch **TTY Full**, **TTY HCO**, or **TTY VCO** to turn TTY mode on.

Touch **TTY Off** to turn TTY mode off.

Note: When enabled, TTY mode may impair the audio quality of non-TTY devices connected to the headset jack.

Warning: 911 Emergency Calling

Sprint recommends that TTY users make emergency calls by other means, including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and landline communications. Wireless TTY calls to 911 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs), rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to TTY equipment or software used by PSAPs. This matter has been brought to the attention of the FCC, and the wireless industry and the PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

Sprint[®] Direct Connect[®] on your Sprint phone offers instant, two-way "walkie-talkie-style" communication between you and your family, friends, and co-workers, all at the click of a button. Perfect for get-in get-out conversations such as checking status, getting information, getting directions, or coordinating with others—fast. Call Alert sends an alert to other Direct Connect users to let them know you want to reach them.

- **Group Connect**[®] Creates and manages groups in Contacts, "on the fly," or online to connect instantly with up to 20 other Direct Connect users at the same time. (Currently Sprint phones do not support Group Connect calls with Nextel or PowerSource phones.)
- **TeamDCSM** and **Opt-In TeamDC** Create a group online that allows nationwide group calling with up to 200 other Direct Connect users (with Sprint phones only). With TeamDC and Opt-In TeamDC, all members can access the most up-to-date group list on their phones.

Before Making Your First Direct Connect Call

To enable Direct Connect on your phone, a Sprint Customer Service representative must add Direct Connect services to your account. Please call Sprint Customer Service at **1-888-211-4727** for more information.

Important: When the Direct Connect feature is active, your phone's data services are enabled.

Your Direct Connect Number

Your Sprint phone allows you two different options for your Direct Connect number.

Your Direct Connect number will be one of the following:

- Separate number (**DC Only**) Your Direct Connect number is a unique number (not your wireless number). It is made up of three sets of digits separated by asterisks (for example, 444*5555*111).
- A single number Your Direct Connect number is the same as your wireless number (for example, 555-555-1234).

Understand the types of Direct Connect numbers for making Direct Connect calls.

- If the person you are calling has a separate number for Direct Connect, make sure you dial any asterisks (*) in the number. If you are saving the number in your Contacts, choose **DC Only** for the phone type.
- If the person you are calling has a single number for both voice calls and for Direct Connect, use that ten-digit phone number to make Direct Connect calls. You do not need to add any asterisks (*) to the number. If you are saving this number in your Contacts, choose other than **DC Only** for the phone type.
- **Tip:** Users with a Nextel phone must always add asterisks (*) between sets of numbers to dial Direct Connect numbers. If you use a single number, make sure to tell your contacts with Nextel phones to dial the number using asterisks (*) in place of hyphens (for example, 555*555*1234).
- **Tip:** One way to easily ensure that your contacts have your correct number is to call them so that they can save your number from their Call Log. Ask them for their contact information. Remember you will need all digits of the number to make a successful call.

Also, if they have a Nextel phone or a separate number for Direct Connect, you will need to enter asterisks (*) between sets of numbers.

Save a Direct Connect Number



- 4. After the recipient accepts your call:
 - Wait for "**Push to Talk**" to appear onscreen.
 - Press and hold the DC button.
 - Wait for a tone to sound and "Me" to appear onscreen before you begin talking.
- 5. Release the DC button to listen.
- 6. Touch \bigcirc to end the call.
- **Note:** All Direct Connect calls end automatically if there is no activity on the call for several seconds.

Answer Direct Connect Calls

When you receive a Direct Connect call, you hear an incoming tone or the phone vibrates, depending on your settings. You will see the Direct Connect number and the caller's name (if available) on your screen. You may also hear the caller's voice through the speakerphone. Default for Direct Connect calls is speakerphone on. You can turn the speakerphone off and listen to Direct Connect calls through the earpiece as you would a regular call, or you can listen through a headset.

- 1. Press the speaker button to either enable or disable the Direct Connect speakerphone feature.
 - If you enable the Direct Connect speakerphone ()), you will hear the caller's voice through the speakerphone on the front of the phone.
 - If you disable the Direct Connect speakerphone ()^(h)), you will only hear the caller's voice through the earpiece.
- 2. Accept the incoming call. If available, the caller's name and Direct Connect number also appear on the display.

- 3. When the caller has finished speaking, you will hear a tone and see "**Push to Talk**" on the display.
- 4. Press and hold the DC button and wait for a tone to sound and a message ("**Me**") to appear onscreen. Continue the Direct Connect call as described previously.
- **Tip:** Touch 🔐 to dismiss an incoming Direct Connect call.
- **Tip:** Touch **Menu Bluetooth** to route the audio through a paired Bluetooth device.

Convert a Direct Connect Call to a Phone Call

- 1. While on a Direct Connect call, touch **Convert call**.
- 2. Read the message, and then select a number (if more than two numbers are available) or touch **Convert call**. Your phone ends the Direct Connect call and dials the selected number.
- **Tip: Quieting incoming calls and increasing your privacy.** When you are in an area where incoming Direct Connect calls may disturb others, or if you wish to increase the privacy of your calls, please set your speakerphone to "off" and your ringer to "vibrate." When the speakerphone is off, Direct Connect calls use the phone's earpiece and microphone, while still utilizing the DC button. You may also use an earbud or other hands-free device for increased convenience.

End a Direct Connect Call

There are two ways to disconnect a Direct Connect call.

Group Connect

A Group Connect call is a Direct Connect call made to up to 20 Direct Connect users with Sprint phones nationwide at one time.

You can make a Group Connect call in several different ways:

- By setting up a group entry in Contact on your phone.
- By using the Sprint Mobile Sync tool at sprint.com. See Sprint Mobile Sync.
- By selecting or entering multiple numbers for a one-time call.

For information on creating groups and storing them in Contacts, see Add a Group Connect Contact.

Important: When making a Group Connect call or creating a group list for Group Connect calls in Contacts, you must select an entry's Direct Connect–capable number. If you select a number that is not Direct Connect–capable, the name will be added to the list, but Group Connect calls will not go through to that group member.

Note: Currently Sprint phones do not support Group Connect calls with Nextel and PowerSource phones. This enhancement is planned for future implementation. If your calls are not going through, please check to see whether your contact is using a Sprint phone.

TeamDC

TeamDC lets Direct Connect users make group calls to up to 200 other users nationwide. With TeamDC, any Direct Connect or Sprint user can create a TeamDC group online, which the system then automatically pushes to all the group members' phones. Once a user creates and distributes a TeamDC group, any member of the group can make a TeamDC call to the entire group. If the user who created the group makes any changes to the group, the system automatically sends updates to the members' phones.

Note: The TeamDC feature supports group calls only with Direct Connect users with Sprint phones. You cannot include users with Nextel phones in TeamDC groups.

- 3. Add TeamDC members directly (using Direct Connect numbers) or select individual members or groups from your Contacts list.
- 4. **(Optional)** Click **Set Talker Priority** to select a Talker Priority for each group member (default is **Medium**).
 - You can assign a priority of **Low**, **Medium**, or **High** to each member.
 - During a TeamDC call, members with a higher Talker Priority can "break in" when members with a lower priority are speaking.
- **Note: Talker Priority**: The optional TeamDC "Talker Priority" feature lets you define a priority level (Low, Medium, or High) for each member of a TeamDC group. When a TeamDC call is active, members with a higher priority may interrupt a member with a lower priority while that member is speaking. By default, the system sets all members of a TeamDC group to a "Medium" priority level.
 - 5. Click **Save** to save the TeamDC group and distribute it to the other group members.

During a TeamDC call, the following information may appear on your screen:

- The name or Direct Connect number of the person speaking.
- The number of TeamDC members who are connected to the call out of the number invited (for example, 4 out of 6).

Opt-In TeamDC

Opt-In TeamDC works like a chatroom. You can make and manage Opt-In TeamDC groups in the same way as you would for TeamDC groups on the Web. You can also send an Invite during an Opt-In TeamDC call to the group members who have not yet joined the call. (See Send an Invite during a call.)

Scan Lock

At any given time, you can specify which TeamDC and Opt-in Team DC groups you wish to be active on your phone. You can either participate in all TeamDC and Opt-in TeamDC calls for which you are a member, or select specific groups to be active.

- 1. Touch **Home** () > (...) > **People** > (...)
- 2. Touch Menu => List TeamDC Groups > Menu => Scan lock.
- 3. Select an option:
 - Receive all TeamDC calls to allow TeamDC calls, Opt-In TeamDC calls, and Invites for all groups.
 - Select which TeamDC calls to receive to allow TeamDC calls, Opt-In TeamDC calls and Invites for certain groups only. Select the groups and touch OK.

You can send an Invite to initiate a Group Connect call. When the group members receive an Invite, their phones sound a tone and display your name (if it is in Contacts).

To send an Invite to start an Opt-In TeamDC call:

- 2. When the group is not active, a message appears. Read the message and touch **Invite**.

Send an Invite during a call

To send an Invite during an Opt-In TeamDC call to the group members who have not joined the call yet:

▶ While on an Opt-In TeamDC call, touch **Send invites**.

To send an Invite during a Direct Connect or Group Connect call to a personal or group Contacts entry:

- 1. While on a Direct Connect or Group Connect call, touch Add to call.
- 2. Select an entry from the displayed list.
- 3. Touch Invite.

Reply to an Invite

Respond to an Invite to return the call, place a voice call, or dismiss it. If you receive an Invite while in a DC call, touch **Call back** to finish the current call and respond to the Invite.

To reply to an Invite:

- 2. Continue with the Direct Connect call as previously detailed.

To place a voice call:

Direct Connect Permissions

Beep During a DC Call

While on a DC call, you can control the beep sound for missed DC calls, Invites, Call Alerts and Availability Notifications.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Direct Connect settings > Beep during a DC call.
- 2. Select **On** to hear the sound during DC calls, or **Off** to mute it.



- **Group:** Touch to display the Group of contacts.

- **★ Favorite:** Touch to display your favorite contacts.
- ICE ICE: Touch to display your ICE (in case of emergency) contacts and your information.

ICE (In Case of Emergency)

- 2. Touch ICE contacts > Menu
- Touch Add to ICE contacts (Call) or Add to ICE contacts (Text). You can register one Call contact and up to four Text contacts.

Synchronize Contacts

Syncing data from your managed accounts lets you add and manage new or existing contacts from your online or remote accounts to your phone. Prior to syncing, you must have an active Google or corporate account with associated contacts, and be signed into your account with the phone.

With syncing, any contacts (with phone numbers, email addresses, pictures, etc.) are updated and synced with your phone.

You can quickly share contacts using Bluetooth, email, Gmail, or text messaging.

 - Messaging to send the information in a text message. Select a contact or enter a wireless phone number or email address, enter any additional information, and then touch Send. For more information on text messaging, see Text Messaging.

Add an Email Account

You can add several types of personal email accounts, such as POP3 and IMAP accounts, on your phone.

 Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Accounts & sync > ADD ACCOUNT > Email.

– or –

Touch Home > ::: > Email.

- 2. Enter the **Email address** and **Password** for the email account and then touch **Next**.
 - Touching Next prompts your device to attempt a "regular" email setup and test the incoming and outgoing servers.
 - If you have custom settings you need to configure, touch Manual setup and enter your settings. These may include mail type, user name, password, server, security type, etc.
- 3. Touch the type of account, if prompted.
- 4. Confirm the Email settings and touch Next.
- 5. Enter the name to be displayed on your outgoing messages and touch **Next**. The inbox of the account is displayed.

Important: If the account type you want to set up is not in the phone database, you will be asked to enter more details. You should get all pertinent information for the email account, such as incoming and outgoing server settings, before you proceed.

Add a Corporate Account

If you synchronize your phone with your corporate account, you can read, manage, and send email in the same easy way as with a POP3/IMAP account. However, you can also access some powerful Exchange features.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Touch ADD ACCOUNT > Corporate.
- 3. Enter the **Email address** and **Password** information and then touch **Next**. Consult your network administrator for further details:
 - Email address: your corporate email address.
 - **Password:** typically your network access password (case-sensitive).
- 4. Enter the **Domain\Username**, **Password**, and **Server** information and touch **Next**:
 - Domain\Username: enter your network domain\login username.
 - **Password:** typically your network access password (case-sensitive).
 - **Server:** your exchange server remote email address. Typically it is in the form mail.XXX.com. Obtain this information from your company's network administrator.
- 5. If your network requires SSL encryption, select the **Use secure connection (SSL)** check box and activate this additional level of security. If your exchange server requires this feature, leaving this field unchecked can prevent connection.
- 6. If the onscreen activation disclaimer is displayed, touch **Next**.
- 7. Configure your Inbox checking frequency, Days to sync (days to synchronize between your phone and server), and activate any other email settings, then touch **Next**.
- **Note:** Signal interruptions or incorrect user name or password information can cause completion issues.
 - 8. Identify your new account with a unique name, provide the outgoing name, and then touch **Done**.
- **Note:** You can have multiple corporate email (Microsoft[®] Exchange ActiveSync[®]) accounts active on your device.
- **Note:** Your corporate Exchange Server must support auto-detect for the phone to automatically set up the Exchange ActiveSync account. If your corporate Exchange

Server does not support auto-detect, you will need to enter your Exchange Server settings after you touch **Next**. Ask your Exchange Server administrator for details.

Compose and Send Email

Compose and send email using any account you have set up on your phone. Increase your productivity by attaching files such as pictures, videos, or documents to your email messages.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Email**.
- 2. On the email account inbox, touch X.

Tip: Touch the account name at the top of the screen to switch to a different email account.

- 3. Enter email addresses directly in the **To** field. If you're sending the email to several recipients, separate the email addresses with a comma. As you enter email addresses, any matching addresses from your contacts list are displayed. Touch a match to enter the address directly.
- **Tip:** You can enter a name saved in People to call up the email address. Touch a match from an available list.
- Tip: If you want to send a CC or a BCC of the email to other recipients, touch Menu **Add Cc/Bcc**.
 - 4. Enter the subject, and then compose your message.
 - 5. To add an attachment, touch **Menu > Attach file,** and choose from the following options:
 - **Pictures:** Select photos from Gallery.
 - Videos: Select videos from Gallery.
 - Audio: Select sound files.
 - 6. Touch ► to send the message immediately, or touch **Menu** ► > **Save draft** to save it as a draft.
- **Note:** To open a draft email, in the email account inbox, touch **Inbox** (top of the Email screen) and then touch **Drafts**.

View and Reply to Email

Reading and replying to email on your phone is as simple as on your computer.

- 1. Touch Home 🗀 > 🗰 > Email.
- 2. On the email account inbox, touch the message you want to view.

Accounts and Messaging

Tip: Touch the account name at the top of the screen to switch to a different email account.

3. Touch \blacklozenge , or touch \blacklozenge > **Reply all**, to reply to the message.

Manage Your Email Inbox

Your email inbox provides management options for viewing, sorting, and deleting your email messages.

View Your Email Inbox

- 1. Touch **Home** > ::: > Email.
- 2. Touch the email account at the top of the screen to select a different inbox.

Refresh an Email Account

Whatever your automatic synchronization settings are, you can also synchronize your sent and received email messages manually at any time.

While viewing the account you want to synchronize, touch <a>C.

Delete an Email Message

- 1. On the email account Inbox, select the check box next to the message you want to delete.
- 2. Touch 🚔.

Delete Multiple Email Messages

- 1. On the email account inbox, select the check box next to the messages you want to delete.
- 2. Touch 🚔.

General Email Settings

You can edit the general settings of your email.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Email.
- 2. Touch **Menu > Settings** > **General**:
 - Auto-advance: Choose which screen to show after you delete a message.
 - Message text size: Select the message text size.
 - **Reply all:** Check if you want to display "Reply all" option as default.

• Ask to show pictures: Touch if you want to be asked before pictures in messages to be displayed.

Email Account Settings

You can edit settings for your individual email accounts, such as email address and password, name display and signature, frequency of retrieval, and more.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Email**.
- 2. Touch **Menu Settings**.
- 3. Select the email account you want to edit.
- 4. Set the following options:
 - Account name: Edit your account name.
 - Your name: Edit your name displayed on your emails.
 - **Signature:** Create an email signature for your outgoing emails.
 - Quick responses: Edit the text you frequently insert when composing emails.
 - Inbox view: Select how the inbox is displayed from Normal View and Conversation View (corporate account only).
 - Default account: Check to assign this account as the default email used for outgoing messages.
 - Inbox check frequency: Select the time interval used by your phone to check your new emails from Automatic (Push) (corporate only), Never, Every 5 minutes, Every 10 minutes, Every 15 minutes, Every 30 minutes, and Every hour.
 - Enable Peak-Time: Set the two sets of time intervals to check your new emails one for peak time and the other for off peak-time (corporate account only).
 - **Frequency during Peak-Time:** Select the time interval used by your phone to check your new emails during peak time.
 - **Frequency during Off Peak-Time:** Select the time interval used by your phone to check your new emails during off peak time.
 - **Peak-Time schedule:** Set a period of time to be the peak time according to the days of the week.
 - Days to sync: Set a period of time to synchronize your account (corporate account only).
 - Sync email: Check to synchronize your email (corporate account only).

- Sync contacts: Check to synchronize your contacts (corporate account only).
- Sync calendar: Check to synchronize your calendar (corporate account only).
- Download attachments: Check if you want to automatically download attachments via Wi-Fi.
- **Email notifications:** Check to display the email notification icon on the status bar when a new mail is received.
 - Choose ringtone: Select a ringtone for new email messages.
 - Vibrate: Select a vibration pattern for new email messages.
- Incoming settings: Adjust the incoming email parameters, such as username, password, and other incoming connection parameters (ex: IMAP server).
- **Out of office settings:** Set your current status and your message to reply automatically while you are out of the office (corporate account only).
- **Remove account:** Touch to remove the account.

Delete an Email Account

If you no longer want an email account on your phone, you can delete it through the mail settings menu.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Email.
- 2. Touch Menu **E** > Settings.
- 3. Select the account you want to delete.
- 4. Touch **Remove account** > **OK**.

Text Messaging and MMS

With Text Messaging (SMS), you can send and receive instant text messages between your wireless phone and another messaging-ready phone.

Multimedia messages, or MMS, can contain text and pictures, recorded voice, audio or video files, picture slideshows.

See your service plan for applicable charges for messaging.



Compose Text Messages

Quickly compose and send text messages on your phone.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch =___. The Compose screen opens.
- 3. Fill in one or more recipients. You can:
 - Enter phone numbers or email addresses in the **To** field. If you're sending the message to several recipients, separate the phone numbers or email addresses with a comma. As you enter information, any matching phone numbers or addresses from your contacts list are displayed. Touch a match to enter that number or address.



Note: You can add a subject line by touching **Menu > Add subject**.

- 4. Touch **Type message** and then start composing your message.
- 5. When done, touch > to send the text message.

Send a Multimedia Message (MMS)

When you need to add a little more to a text message, you can send a multimedia message (MMS) with pictures, recorded voices, audio or video files, or slideshows.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch \blacksquare_1 . The Compose screen opens.
- 3. Fill in one or more recipients. You can:
 - Enter phone numbers or email addresses in the **To** field. If you're sending the message to several recipients, separate the phone numbers or email addresses with a comma. As you enter information, any matching phone numbers or addresses from your contacts list are displayed. Touch a match to enter that number or address.

Note: You can add a subject line by touching **Menu > Add subject**.

- 4. Touch **Type message** and then start composing your message.
- 5. Touch () and select from the following file attachments:
 - **Pictures:** Open **Gallery** to attach a photo from your storage card.
 - Capture picture: Run the camera application to take a photo and attach it.
 - Videos: Open Gallery to attach a video from your storage card.
 - **Capture video:** Run the video camera application to record a video and attach it.
 - Audio: Select a ringtone and attach it.
 - **Record audio:** Run the voice recorder application to create a recording and attach it.
 - Slideshow: See Create a Slideshow for details.
- 6. To make changes to your attachment, touch **Replace** or **Remove**.
- 7. Touch $\overset{\text{MMS}}{\searrow}$ to send the MMS message.

Create a Slideshow

In a multimedia message, you can add slides, each containing a picture, video, or audio.

- 1. In the multimedia message you're composing, touch \gg > Slideshow.
- 2. To compose your slideshow, do any of the following:
 - Touch Add slide to create a new slide. (This is a placeholder for new images to be added, similar to a playlist.)
 - Touch the created slide (example, Slide 1), touch Add picture, and then select the picture you want to add to the slide.

- Touch the text field below the image to enter a caption for the picture.
- Touch Preview (to preview the slide), Replace picture (to delete the currently selected picture), Remove slide, or touch Menu > Add music, Add slide, Duration, or Layout.
- When finished, touch **Done** to attach the slideshow to your message.
- 3. When you have finished composing the multimedia message, touch $\sum_{n=1}^{MMS}$ or **Send**.

Save and Resume a Draft Message

While composing a text or multimedia message, touch **Back** \bigcirc > **Yes** to save your message as a draft.

To resume composing the message:

- 1. Touch Home > . > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch the message to resume editing. "Draft" in red appears at the right of the message in the list.
- 3. When you finish editing the message, , touch \triangleright or $\overset{\text{\tiny MMS}}{\triangleright}$.

New Messages Notification

Depending on your notification settings, the phone will play a ringtone, vibrate, or display the message briefly in the status bar when you receive a new text or multimedia message. To change the notification for new text and multimedia messages, see Text and MMS Options for details.

A new message icon 🗭 or 🔽 also appears in the notifications area of the status bar to notify you of a new text or multimedia message.

To open the message, slide the status bar down to open the Notifications panel. Touch the new message to open and read it. For information on reading and replying to messages see "Managing Message Conversations" in this chapter.

Managing Message Conversations

Text and multimedia messages that are sent to and received from a contact (or a number) are grouped into conversations or message threads in the Messaging screen. Threaded text or multimedia messages let you see exchanged messages (similar to a chat program) with a contact on the screen.

Read a Text Message

- ► Do one of the following:
 - On the Messaging screen, touch the text message or message thread to open and read it.
 - If you have a new message notification, slide the status bar down to open the Notifications panel. Touch the new message to open and read it.

To return to the Messaging screen from a text message thread, touch **Back** (-).

- **Note:** To view the details of a particular message, in the message thread, touch the message to open the options menu, and then touch **View details**.
- **Note:** If a message contains a link to a Web page, touch the message and then touch the link to open it in the Web browser.
- **Note:** If a message contains a phone number, touch the message and then touch the phone number to dial the number or add it to your contacts.

View a Multimedia Message (MMS)

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch a multimedia message or message thread to open it.
- 3. Touch the attachment to open it.
- 4. To save the attachment to the storage card, touch and hold the message, and then touch **Save attachment** on the options menu.
- **Note:** When **Auto-retrieve** in MMS settings is disabled, only the message header is downloaded. To download the entire message, touch the **Download** button at the right side of the message. For details, see **Text** and MMS Options.
- **Note:** If you are concerned about the size of your data downloads, check the multimedia message size before you download it.

Reply to a Message

- 1. Touch Home (> . > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch a text or multimedia message thread to open it.
- Touch the text box at the bottom of the screen, enter your reply message, and then touch ➤ or ➤ .

Note: To reply to a text message with a multimedia message, open the text message and touch \bigotimes . The text message is automatically converted into a multimedia message.

Delete a Message Thread

- 1. Touch Home > . > Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch and hold the message thread that you want to delete. The thread is highlighted and the number of the selected thread appears next to **Choose conversations**.

Tip: Repeat step 2 to select multiple threads.

- 3. Touch 👕.
- 4. When prompted to confirm, touch **Delete**.

Delete a Single Message

- 1. While viewing a message thread, touch and hold the message that you want to delete.
- 2. From the options menu, touch **Delete**.
- 3. When prompted to confirm, touch **Delete**.

View Contact Information from a Message

When you have received a message from someone in your stored contacts, you can touch the contact's picture or icon in the message thread to open a menu of options. Depending on the stored contact information, you can view the contact details, phone or send an email message to the contact, and more.

Text and MMS Options

The messages settings menu lets you control options for your text and MMS messages including message limits, size settings, and notifications.

- 1. Touch Home) > . Messaging.
- 2. On the Messaging screen, touch **Menu E** > **Settings**. You can set the following:

Storage Settings

- **Delete old messages:** Automatically delete older messages when the set limits are reached.
- **Text message limit:** Choose the maximum number of text messages to store in each conversation thread.

• **Multimedia message limit:** Choose the maximum number of MMS messages to store in each conversation thread.

Text (SMS) Messages Settings

- **Emergency Alerts:** Sets the federally supervised cell phone alert services to send out broadcast SMS messages for public warning:
 - **Presidential:** Receives an emergency presidential alert. (Presidential is always grayed out [not selectable] and cannot be excluded.)
 - Imminent Threat Extreme: Select this option if you want to receive emergency alerts in an extreme emergency situation (an extraordinary threat to life or property).
 - Imminent Threat Severe: Select this option if you want to receive emergency alerts in a severe emergency situation (a significant threat to life or property).
 - **Amber:** Select this option if you want to receive alerts related to missing or endangered children.
 - **Emergency Alerts Test:** Select this option if you want to receive a test message to make sure that the alert messages can be successfully received.
 - Help: Displays the help information for Emergency Alerts.

Multimedia (MMS) Messages Settings

- **Auto-retrieve:** Select this option to automatically retrieve all your multimedia messages completely. When selected, the multimedia message header plus the message body and attachments will automatically download to your phone. If you clear this check box, only the multimedia message header will be retrieved and shown in your Messaging screen.
 - **Roaming auto-retrieve:** Automatically retrieve all your messages completely when roaming. This may incur significant phone charges.

Notifications Settings

- **Notifications:** Select this option if you want to receive a notification in the status bar when a new text or multimedia message arrives.
 - **Choose ringtone:** Select a ringtone that is specific to new text and multimedia messages. Note that the ringtone briefly plays when selected.
 - Vibrate: Select this option if you want the phone to vibrate when a new text or multimedia message arrives.

YouTube[™] is a video sharing website on which users can upload and share videos. The site is used to display a wide variety of user-generated video content, including movie clips, TV clips, and music videos, as well as video content such as video blogging, informational shorts and other original videos.

Open YouTube

Note: Terms of Service may appear. Touch Accept, if you agree to the Terms of Service.

Watch YouTube Videos

- 1. On the YouTube screen, touch a video.
- 2. Touch the screen to show the progress bar at the bottom. Touch the screen while the bar is displayed to pause/play the video. Move the slider on the bar to the left or right to rewind or fast-forward the video.

Search for Videos

- 1. On the YouTube screen, touch Q at the upper right of the screen to open the search box.
- 2. Enter the keyword to search. Search results appear below the status bar.
- 3. Touch one of the results, or touch \mathbf{Q} or \mathbf{Q} .



Close a Chat

- ► On a chat screen, touch **Menu** => End chat.

On the friends list screen, touch **Menu E** > **End all chats**. All the chats will be closed.

Manage Your Friends

Friends on the friends list screen are sorted according to their online status and are listed alphabetically.

View the Friends List

You can sort your friends as you like.

- ► On the friends list screen, touch **Menu Display options**.
 - Availability to show the friends that you frequently chat with first and now available first.
 - Name to sort all your friends by name.
 - **Recency** to show the friends that you frequently chat with first.

Block Friends

You can block friends from sending you messages.

1. On the friends list screen, touch the name of the friend you want to block.

2. Touch **Menu > Friend info > Block**. That friend is removed from your friends list and is added to the blocked friends list.

Unblock Friends

- 1. On the friends list screen, touch **Menu E** > **Settings** and touch your account.

- 3. On the blocked friends list, touch the name of the friend you want to unblock.
- 4. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Mobile Indicators

Mobile indicators allow you to check your friend's device.

Check Friends' Devices

You can see which phones your friends are using to chat in Google Talk.

- If "on Mobile Device" appears under your friend's name, it indicates that your friend is using an Android phone.
- If an email address is displayed, it indicates that your friend is using a computer.

Display a Mobile Indicator

You can choose to show a mobile indicator along with your name to let your friends know the type of wireless device you are using.

- Vibrate: Select if you want the phone to vibrate when a new instant message is received.
- Video chat notifications: Select whether to open a dialog or to show a notification when a new voice or video chat invitation arrives.
- Video chat ringtone: Select if you want the phone to ring when a new voice or video chat invitation arrives. On the ringtone menu, touch a ringtone to play the tone briefly, and then touch OK to confirm the selection. Select Silent if you do not want the phone to ring when a new voice or video chat invitation arrives.
- **Vibrate:** Select if you want the phone to vibrate when a new voice or video chat invitation arrives.
- Blocked friends: Select to show your blocked friends list.
- Clear search history: Select to delete the Google Talk search history.
- **Manage account:** Select to open the Accounts & sync settings menu.
- **Terms & privacy:** Select to show the Google legal information.



When you install apps from the Google Play Store app and use them on your phone, they may require access to your personal information (such as your location, contact data, and more) or access to certain functions or settings of your phone. Download and install only apps that you trust.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Play Store.
- 2. When you open the Google Play Store app for the first time, the Terms of Service window will appear. Touch **Accept** to continue.
- 3. Find an app you want and touch it to open its details screen.



- **Note:** The Google Play Store screen shots and options may vary depending on the version installed on your phone. Your Google Play Store app will update automatically when available.
 - 4. Touch an app to read a description about the app and user reviews.
 - 5. Touch Install (for free applications) or the price icon (for paid applications).
- **Note:** You need a Google Wallet account to purchase items on Google Play. See Create a Google Wallet Account to set up a Google Wallet account if you do not have one.
 - 6. The subsequent screen notifies you whether the app will require access to your personal information or access to certain functions or settings of your phone. If you agree to the conditions, touch **Accept & download** (for free applications) or **Accept & buy** (for paid application) to begin downloading and installing the app.

Warning: When you've used Google Wallet once to purchase an application from the Google Play Store app, the phone remembers your password, so you don't need to enter it the next time. For this reason, you should secure your phone to prevent others from using it without your permission. (For more information, see Security Settings.)

Request a Refund for a Paid App

If you are not satisfied with an app, you can ask for a refund within 15 minutes of the purchase, unless otherwise stated by the app developer. Your credit card is not charged and the app is uninstalled from your phone.

If you change your mind, you can install the app again, but you can't request a refund a second time.

- 3. Touch the app to uninstall for a refund. The details screen for the app opens.
- 4. Touch **Refund**. Your app is uninstalled and the charge is cancelled.

Uninstall an App



- 2. Select the check boxes for your location options.
 - **Google's location service** uses Wi-Fi and mobile networks to determine location.
 - **GPS satellites** uses GPS to provide location accurate to street level.
 - Location & Google search allows Google to use your location data for improved search results and other services.
- 3. When prompted, touch Agree.

On the Google Maps screen, touch (). A blinking blue arrow indicates your current location on the map. This feature is available when **Google's location service** or **GPS satellites** is enabled. See Enable Location Services on Your Phone.

Search Maps

- 2. Type the place that you want to search. You can enter an address, a city, or type of establishment.

Add Map Layers

- **Satellite:** Add this layer to use the same satellite data as Google Earth. The images are not real-time and are approximately one to three years old.
- **Terrain:** Add this layer for a shaded relief view of topographic features.
- **Transit Lines:** Add this layer to provide geographic representations of transit lines. This mode is available in selected areas only.
- Latitude: Add this layer to see your friends' locations and share yours with them. You may sign in with your Google Account to use this feature.
- My Maps: Adds this layer to display Google My Maps on Google Maps of your phone.
- **Bicycling:** Adds this layer to provide the road map suitable for bicycling.
- **Wikipedia:** Adds this layer to provide a list of Wikipedia articles that are geo-referenced. An extract of the Wikipedia article can be accessed by clicking on the icon, a link to the full version of the Wikipedia article is also available.

Get Directions

- 1. On the Google Maps screen, touch \diamond .
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - The starting point is set to your current location as default. Touch default to change your starting point place.
 - Touch End point: and type your destination or touch destination from the list.
- 3. Select the way to get to the destination (by car, by train, or by foot).
- 4. Touch **GET DIRECTIONS**. The directions to your destination appear in a list or on the map. Touch **NAVIGATION** to open Google Navigation to navigate you to your destination.

Clear the Map

TeleNav GPS Navigator

TeleNav GPS Navigator gives you turn-by-turn directions onscreen and over speakerphone.

Google Latitude

Google Latitude[™] user location service lets you and your friends share locations and status messages with each other. It also lets you send instant messages and emails, make phone calls, and get directions to your friends' locations.

Your location is not shared automatically. You must join Latitude, and then invite your friends to view your location or accept their invitations.

Open Latitude

To join Latitude:

- 1. Touch Home > ::: > Latitude.
- 2. Read the privacy policy. If you agree with it, touch **Agree & Continue**.

After you join Latitude, you can start sharing your locations with your friends. Only friends that you have explicitly invited or accepted can see your location.

To open Latitude after joining:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Latitude.
- 2. Select the following options.
 - Touch **MAP VIEW** to see your friend on Google Maps.
 - Touch $\Delta_{\mathbf{k}}$ to invite your friend to Latitude.
 - Touch ⊘ to sign in Latitude.
 - Touch to refresh the friend list.

Apps and Entertainment

 Touch Menu > Location settings > Location reporting to configure your location reporting and sharing.

Invite Friends

To share your location with friends and request to see their locations:

- 1. In Latitude, touch $\Delta_{\rm L}$.
- 2. Choose how to add friends:
 - Select from Contacts: Select any number of friends from contacts.
 - Add via email address: Enter an email address and touch Add friends.
- 3. Confirm your friend is checked and touch **Yes**.

If your friends already use Latitude, they receive an email request and a notification on Latitude. If they have not yet joined Latitude, they receive an email request that tells them to sign in to Latitude with their Google Account.

Accept an Invitation

When you get a sharing request from a friend, you see "... new sharing requests" message. Touch it and you can:

- Accept and share back: You can see your friends' locations, and they can see yours.
- Accept, but hide my location: You can see your friends' locations, but they can't see yours.
- **Don't accept:** No location information is shared between you and your friends.

You can change how your location is shared with each friend at any time. See Connect with Your Friends for details.

Show Your Friends

You can show your friends using the map view or the list view.

Map View:

Touch **MAP VIEW** on the Latitude screen. Google Maps[™] shows your friends' locations. Each friend is represented by a photo icon with an arrow pointing at his or her approximate location. If a friend has opted to enable city-level sharing, his or her icon will not have an arrow and it appears in the middle of the city. See Connect with Your Friends for more details.

To see your friend's profile and connect with him or her, touch the photo. This will display your friend's name, and then touch the balloon right above his or her icon.

List View:

To show a list of your friends, in Google Maps, touch **FRIENDS LIST**.

To see a friend's profile and connect with him or her, select your friend's name from the list.

Connect with Your Friends

Touch a friend's contact details balloon in map view or touch a friend in list view to open the friend's profile. In the profile screen, you can communicate with your friend and set privacy options.

- Map: Find a friend's location on the map.
- **Directions:** Get directions to the friend's location.
- **Ping for check in:** Send this friend a notification asking them to check in.
- Manage sharing: Select from the following:
 - Share best available location: Share your precise location information.
 - Share only city level location: Share only the city you are in, not the street-level location. Your friend can see your photo icon in the middle of the city you are in. To share more precise location again, touch Share best available location.
 - Hide from this friend: Stop sharing your location with this friend, both in list view and in map view.
- **Remove this friend:** Remove the friend from your list and stop sharing locations with him or her altogether.

Change Privacy Settings

You have control over how and when you can be found by your friends. Only the last location sent to Latitude is stored with your Google Account. If you turn off Latitude or are hiding, no location is stored.

To change your public profile:

- 2. Touch your own name, and then touch **Location settings**.

3. Set the following options to your preferences.

- Location reporting: Let Latitude detect and update your location as you move. The update frequency is determined by several factors, such as how recently your location has changed.
- Enable location history: Store your past location and visualize them on the Latitude website.
- Manage your friends: Add or remove friends who can see your location.
- **Sign out of Latitude:** Disable Latitude and stop sharing your location or status. You can always join Latitude again.
- Automatic check-ins: Check you into places you have designated.
- Check-in notifications: Enable notifications that suggest places to check in.
- Manage your places: View and modify your automatic check-ins and muted places.

Music Player

The Play Music app plays digital audio files saved on the storage card. You need to copy music files to your storage card first to use the Music application. See Use the Phone's microSD Card as a USB Drive for more details on copying files.

Note: If you have signed up for Google Music[™], the first time you open the Music application you will be prompted to select the account whose online music library you want to access from the Android Music application. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.



Back Up Your Downloaded Music Files

Sprint recommends you back up your downloaded music files to your computer. Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet. To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or "hotspot."

The availability and range of the Wi-Fi signal depends on a number of factors, including infrastructure and other objects through which the signal passes.

Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wireless Network

Use the Wireless & networks setting menu to enable your phone's Wi-Fi radio and connect to an available Wi-Fi network.

- If the off icon OFF is displayed next to Wi-Fi, touch it to turn Wi-Fi on. The on icon is displayed and the phone will scan for available wireless networks.

- 3. Touch **Wi-Fi**. The network names and security settings (open network or secured with WEP/WPA/WPA2 PSK) of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed.
- 4. Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If you selected an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network. If you selected a network that is secured with a password, enter the password and then touch **Connect**.

Depending on the network type and its security settings, you may also need to enter more information or choose a security certificate.

When your phone is connected to a wireless network, the Wi-Fi icon () appears in the status bar and tells you the approximate signal strength. (The above icon indicates maximum signal strength.)

If **Network notification** in Advanced Wi-Fi settings is enabled, this icon (**?**) appears in the status bar whenever the phone detects an available open wireless network within range.

- **Note:** The next time your phone connects to a previously accessed secured wireless network, you will not be prompted to enter the password again, unless you reset your phone to its factory default settings or you instruct the phone to forget the network.
- **Note:** Wi-Fi networks are self-discoverable, which means no additional steps are required for your phone to connect to a Wi-Fi network. It may be necessary to provide a user name and password for certain closed wireless networks.

Check the Wireless Network Status

Check the status of your current wireless network, including speed and signal strength, through the Wi-Fi settings menu.

Sprint Connections Optimizer

The Sprint Connections Optimizer is a tool that automatically selects the best mobile network for your phone, including "remembered" Wi-Fi networks.

The Sprint Connections Optimizer helps you manage and enhance your data experience by finding and connecting to "remembered" Wi-Fi networks on your phone. Remembered Wi-Fi networks are networks with which you have previously chosen to connect. Active Wi-Fi connections may offer improved performance and generally improve battery life while allowing you to talk on the phone and use data at the same time. The Sprint Connections Optimizer works by searching for available "remembered" Wi-Fi networks. If you do not leave your Wi-Fi antenna on all the time, you will only notice the Sprint Connections Optimizer operating at certain times of the day in a small number of locations on the Sprint network. Your Wi-Fi antenna will conserve battery by scanning for connections periodically (not continuously), and if no connection is achieved, the antennas will be turned off. You may also manually turn the antennas off during the scan period. To facilitate quality assurance and enable feature enhancements, information is collected about your battery levels, Wi-Fi and Sprint Network connections and usage. No personal information is collected.

- 2. Uncheck the box on the Sprint Connections Optimizer page.

Sprint 4G

Sprint 4G provides your phone with wireless Internet access over greater distances than Wi-Fi and delivers data transfer rates of up to 30 Mbps. To connect your phone to Sprint 4G network, you need access to a Sprint 4G base station.

For more information about the availability of Sprint 4G in your location, visit sprint.com/coverage.

Note: The availability and range of the Sprint 4G depends on a number of factors including your distance to the Sprint 4G base station, and infrastructure and other objects through which the signal passes.

Turn Sprint 4G On and Connect to the Sprint 4G Network

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > Mobile networks > Network mode.
- 2. Select an option:
 - LTE/CDMA: The phone will connect to LTE or CDMA. The Direct Connect services will be disabled in LTE/CDMA mode. Read the message, if it appears, and touch OK. The phone will scan for the Sprint 4G network and will automatically connect to it when it is available.
 - **CDMA only:** The phone will connect to CDMA only.

When your phone is connected to the Sprint 4G network, the 4G icon ($\frac{1}{4G}$) appears in the status bar.

Note: The Sprint 4G network is self-discoverable, which means no additional steps are required for your phone to connect to it.

Data Services (Sprint 3G and 4G Networks)

The following topics will help you learn the basics of using your data services, including managing your user name, launching a data connection, and navigating the Web with your phone.

Important: Certain data services requests may require additional time to process. While your phone is loading the requested service, the touchscreen may appear unresponsive when in fact they are functioning properly. Allow the phone some time to process your data usage request.

Your User Name

Your User Name

When you buy your phone and sign up for service, you're automatically assigned a user name, which is typically based on your name and a number, followed by "@sprintpcs.com." (For example, the third John Smith to sign up for Sprint data services might have jsmith003@sprintpcs.com as his user name.)

When you use data services, your user name is submitted to identify you to the Nationwide Sprint Network. Your user name is automatically programmed into your phone. You don't have to enter it.

Update Your User Name

If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, or make any changes to your services, you must then update the profile on your phone.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > System update.
- 2. Touch Update profile.

Launch a Web Connection

Launching a Web connection is as simple as opening the browser on your phone.

- ► Touch **Home** > ::: > **Browser**. (Your data connection starts and you see the home page.)
- **Note:** Internet connections can be made either through the Sprint (3G or 4G) or via Wi-Fi (configured within the **Settings** > **Wi-Fi** page).
- **Tip:** To change the phone's default launch page to your current page, touch **Menu Settings** > **General** > **Set homepage** > **Current page**.
- **Note:** The Browser automatically launches when a Web link is touched from within either an email or text message.

Data Connection Status and Indicators

Your phone displays the current status of your data connection through indicators at the top of the screen. The following symbols are used:

4G 4G 4G

Your phone is connected to the high-speed 4G Sprint Mobile Broadband Network. When the arrows are animated, your phone is scanning and connecting. During data transfer, the animated icon is not used (for example, when you are opening a Web page).

When the arrows are gray, your phone is connected to the network, signal is weak.

When both the arrow and the 4G icon are gray, there is no coverage and you are disconnected from the 4G network.



Your phone is connected to the high-speed Sprint Mobile Broadband Network (3G). When the arrows are animated, your phone is transferring data (for example, when you are opening a Web page); when the arrows are gray, your phone is connected to the network but is not currently transferring data (for example, when you are viewing a Web page that is completely open). In either state, you can receive incoming calls.

If you do not see an indicator, your phone does not have a current data connection. To launch a connection, see Launch a Web Connection.

Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

From your phone, you can add, set up, and manage virtual private networks (VPNs) that allow you to connect and access resources inside a secured local network, such as your corporate network.

Prepare Your Phone for VPN Connection

Prepare Your Phone for VPN Connection

Depending on the type of VPN you are using at work, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your company's local network. You can get this information from your network administrator.

Before you can initiate a VPN connection, your phone must first establish a Wi-Fi or data connection. For information about setting up and using these connections on your phone, see Launch a Web Connection and Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wireless Network.

Install Security Certificates

Your network administrator may instruct you to download and install security certificates to connect to the network.

- 1. Download and install the certificates needed to access your local network into a microSD card. Your network administrator can tell you how to do this.
- 2. Insert the microSD card into your phone.
- 3. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Install from SD card, and install the necessary security certificates.

Add a VPN Connection

Use the Wireless & networks settings menu to add a VPN connection to your phone.

- 1. Touch Home (> Menu = > System settings > More... > VPN.
- 2. If you are asked to set up a screen lock, touch **OK** and set up a required type of lock. To set up a screen lock, see Screen Lock.
- 3. Touch Add VPN network, and then enter the information for the VPN you want to add.
 - Information may include Name, Type, Server address, PPP encryption (MPPE), and advanced options.
 - Set up all options according to the security details you have obtained from your network administrator.
- 4. Touch Save.

The VPN is then added to the VPNs section of the VPN settings screen.

Connect to or Disconnect from a VPN

Once you have set up a VPN connection, connecting and disconnecting from the VPN is easy.

Connect to a VPN

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > VPN.
- 2. In the VPNs section, touch the VPN that you want to connect to.
- 3. When prompted, enter your login credentials, and then touch **Connect**. When you are connected, a VPN connected icon appears in the notification area.
- 4. Open the Web browser to access resources such as intranet sites on your corporate network. (For more information about browsing the Web, see Learn to Navigate the Browser.)

Disconnect from a VPN

- 1. Drag the status bar down to open the Notifications panel.
- 2. Touch the VPN connection to return to the VPN settings screen, and then touch the VPN connection to disconnect from it.

When your phone has disconnected from the VPN, you will see a VPN disconnected icon in the notification area of the title bar.

Browser

Your phone's Web browser gives you full access to both mobile and traditional websites on the go, using 3G, 4G, or Wi-Fi data connections.

• Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.

Learn to Navigate the Browser

Navigating through menus and websites during a data session is easy once you have learned a few basics.

Note: Before you access the SprintWeb home page, you may be asked to enter your 10-digit wireless phone number and touch **OK**. Entering your phone number is not required for access to other Web pages.

Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to drag up and down to see everything on some websites.

To scroll through a website's page:

▶ In a single motion, touch and drag across or up and down a page.

Selecting

To select onscreen items or links:

Drag across a page, and then touch an item or onscreen link.

Web and Data

Links, which are displayed as <u>underlined text</u>, allow you to jump to Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

Pinching and Zooming

Zooming in and out on a Web page can be done now without the need of an onscreen zoom tool. Just use your fingers to pinch in or spread out on the screen.

To zoom in:

- 1. Place your thumb and index finger on the screen.
- 2. Expand them outward (spread) to zoom in.

To zoom out:

- 1. Place your thumb and index finger on the screen.
- 2. Bring them together (pinch) to zoom out.

Go Back

To go back one page:

Go to a Web Page

- 1. Touch the Address field (top of the browser window) and enter a new Web address.
 - As you enter the address, possible matches are displayed within an onscreen list. Touch an entry to launch the desired website.
- 2. Touch **Go** or **Go** to launch the new page.

Browser Menu

The browser menu offers additional options to expand your use of the Web on your phone.

Open the Browser Menu

The browser menu may be opened anytime you have an active data session, from any page you are viewing.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Browser**.
- 2. From any open Web page, touch **Menu E**. You will see the browser menu.

Options available within the browser menu may include:


Web and Data

- **Stop:** Stops loading the current Web page.
- **Refresh:** Reloads the current Web page.
- Forward: Returns you to a previously viewed page.
- **Bookmarks:** Allows you to access and manage your bookmarks.
- Save to bookmarks: Adds the currently viewed page to bookmarks.
- Share page: Allows you to share the URL via Gmail, SMS, Email, or Bluetooth.
- Find on page: Allows you to search in the current page.
- **Request desktop site:** Allows you to assign the browser to display the current page in the desktop view (to closely mimic the display as it would appear on a Desktop computer).
- **Save for offline reading:** Saves the Web page so you can read it later even when offline.
- Settings: Allows you to modify your Web settings. For more information, see Adjust Browser Settings.

Select Text on a Web Page

You can highlight text on a Web page and copy it, search for it, or share it.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Browser** and navigate to a Web page.
- 2. Touch and hold the text you want to copy. Drag the tabs to expand or reduce the range of the selected text. Any selected text will appear highlighted.



- Tip: Touch **SELECT ALL** to select all the text on the Web page.
 - 3. Touch and select an option:

Web and Data

- **Copy** to copy the selected text.
- Share to share the selected text via Bluetooth, Gmail, or messaging, etc.
- **Find** to search for all instances of the selected text in the current Web page.
- Web Search to launch a Web search for the selected text.

Go to a Specific Website

Follow the instructions to go to a particular website by entering a URL (website address).

- 1. Touch the **URL** field and enter a website address.
 - As you type the address, if your desired website appears within the suggested sites list, touch the entry to begin surfing.
- 2. Touch Go or Go.

Note: Not all websites are viewable on your phone.

Adjust Browser Settings

You can control many of the settings for your browser through the browser settings menu, including general page settings, privacy & security, accessibility settings, advanced settings such as Javascript and plug-ins, bandwidth management, and labs settings.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- 2. From any open Web page, touch **Menu Settings**. You will see the browser settings menu.
- 3. You can access the following settings menus:
 - General
 - Set homepage: Sets the current home page for the Web browser.
 - Form auto-fill: Fills out web forms with a single touch.
 - Auto-fill text: Sets up text to auto-fill in web forms.
 - Privacy & security
 - **Clear cache:** Deletes all currently cached data. Touch **OK** to complete the process.
 - **Clear history:** Clears the browser navigation history. Touch **OK** to complete the process.

- **Show security warnings:** Notifies you if there is a security issue with the current website. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
- Accept cookies: Allows sites that require cookies to save and read cookies from your phone.
- Clear all cookie data: Clears all current browser cookie files.
- **Remember form data:** Allows the phone to store data from any previously filledout forms. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
- **Clear form data:** Deletes any stored data from previously filled out forms. Touch **OK** to complete the process.
- **Enable location:** Allows sites to request access to your current location (using the built-in GPS function).
- **Clear location access:** Clears location access for all websites. Touch **OK** to complete the process.
- **Remember passwords:** Stores user names and passwords for visited sites. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
- **Clear passwords:** Deletes any previously stored usernames or passwords. Touch **OK** to complete the process.
- Accessibility
 - Force enable zoom: Overrides a website's request to control zoom behavior.
 - **Text scaling:** Changes text size as you see on its preview screen.
 - **Zoom on double-tap:** Enables zoom function by double-tapping the screen.
 - **Minimum font size:** Sets the minimum font size on the Web as you see on its preview screen.
 - **Inverted rendering:** Inverts the screen image. Black becomes white and vice versa.
 - **Contrast:** When **Inverted rendering** is enabled, you can set the contrast using the slider.
- Advanced
 - Set search engine: Sets the search engine.
 - **Open in background:** New pages are launched in a separate page and displayed behind the current one. Clear the check mark to disable this function.

- **Enable JavaScript:** Enables javascript for the current Web page. Without this feature, some pages may not display properly. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
- Enable plug-ins: Allows you to determine the way your phone handles program enhancements. Select Always on, On demand, or Off.
- **Website settings:** Allows you to configure advanced settings for individual websites.
- **Default zoom:** Sets the default browser viewing size. Choose from: **Far**, **Medium**, or **Close**.
- **Open pages in overview:** Provides an overview of the recently opened pages.
- **Auto-fit pages:** Allows Web pages to be resized to fit as much of the screen as possible.
- **Block pop-ups:** Prevents pop-up advertisements or windows from appearing onscreen. Clear the check mark to disable this function.
- **Text encoding:** Adjusts the current text encoding.
- **Reset to default:** Resets the browser settings to default.
- Bandwidth management
 - **Search result preloading:** Allows browser to preload high confidence search results in the background.
 - Load images: Displays images on Web pages.
- Labs
 - Quick controls: Opens the Quick controls and hide application and URL bars.
 - Fullscreen: Enables the full screen mode and hide the status bar.

Create Website Settings

You can create settings for individual websites.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Browser.
- From any open Web page, touch Menu > Settings > Advanced > Website settings.
- 3. Touch the website you want to create the settings of. These advanced settings can be configured for individual sites.

4. Touch the settings (for example, **Clear stored data**) to complete the process.

Reset the Browser to Default

You always have the option to restore your browser to its default settings.

- 1. Touch **Home** > ::: > Browser.
- From any open Web page, touch Menu > Settings > Advanced > Reset to default.
- 3. Touch **OK** to complete the process.

Set the Browser Home Page

Customize your Web experience by setting your browser's home page.

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Browser**.
- 2. From any open Web page, touch **Menu > Settings** > **General** > **Set homepage**.
- 3. Select an option to set your browser's home page.
 - **Current page** to set the current page as the home page.
 - Blank page to set a blank page as the home page. It helps new Browser windows to open more quickly.
 - **Default page** to set a factory default URL as home page.
 - Most visited sites to select a home page from a list of recently visited sites.
 - **Other** to enter a specific website address for your home page.
- 4. Touch **OK** to complete the process.

Create Bookmarks

Make browsing easier by setting up and using custom bookmarks.

View Bookmarks

- 1. Touch Home > : > Browser.
- 2. From any open Web page, touch **Menu E** > **Bookmarks**. Three tabs are revealed:
 - BOOKMARKS: Displays a list of your current Web bookmarks.
 - **HISTORY:** Displays a record of your browsing history. These records are organized into folders such as: **Today**, **Yesterday**, **Last 7 days**, and **Most visited**.

• **SAVED PAGES:** Displays a list of websites you saved for offline reading. Touch an entry to launch the selected page.

Create Bookmarks

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **Browser**.
- 2. Open the Web page you want to bookmark and touch **Menu Solution Soluti**
- 3. Enter a descriptive name for the new bookmark.
- 4. Select an account you want to add the bookmark to
- 5. Select where to save the bookmark and touch **OK**.

Create Bookmarks from History Tab

- 1. Touch Home () > ::: > Browser > Menu : > Bookmarks.
- 2. Touch the **HISTORY** tab.
- 3. Locate the Web page you want to bookmark and touch the star icon next to it.
- 4. Edit the necessary info and touch **OK**.

Create a New Homepage

Select any previously visited Web page to display as your home page.

- 1. Touch Home) > ::: > Browser > Menu : > Bookmarks.
- 2. Touch and hold an entry from the list to display an onscreen popup menu.
- 3. Touch **Set as homepage** to assign the selected entry as your new homepage.

Add Bookmarks to Your Home Screen

You can add Web bookmarks to your phone's home screen for quick access.

- 1. Touch Home) > ::: > Browser > Menu : > Bookmarks.
- 2. Touch and hold an entry from the list to display an onscreen popup menu.
- 3. Touch **Add shortcut to home** to add the selected entry to your home screen.

Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot allows you to turn your phone into a Wi-Fi hotspot. The feature works best when used in conjunction with 4G data services (although 3G service can also be used).

Set Up Sprint Mobile Hotspot

- 1. Touch Home > + > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot > OK.
- 2. Touch **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** and place a checkmark in the adjacent field to activate the service.
 - Using both 4G service and Hotspot drains your phone's battery at a much faster rate than when using any other feature combination.
- **Note:** The best way to keep using the phone as a hotspot is to have it connected to a power supply.

Important: Write down the passkey (password) for this communication (shown onscreen).

Connect to Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot

- 1. Enable Wi-Fi (wireless) functionality on your target device (laptop, media device, etc.).
- 2. Scan for Wi-Fi networks from the device and select your phone hotspot from the network list.
 - The name for your phone hotspot can be changed by touching Home > ::: > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot > Network SSID.
- 3. Select this device and follow your onscreen instructions to enter the passkey (provided on the Portable Wi-Fi hotspot page).
- 4. Launch your Web browser to confirm you have an Internet connection.

Configure Sprint Mobile Hotspot

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > Tethering & portable hotspot > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings.
- 2. Set the following options:
 - Network SSID: Sets your network name.
 - **SSID broadcast:** Selects the check box to broadcast the SSID.
 - **Security:** Sets the security level.
 - **Password:** Sets a password if necessary.
 - Maximum Wi-Fi clients: Sets the maximum Wi-Fi clients that can connect to your phone.

- **Auto off:** Sets the length of time to elapse when your hotspot feature is disabled if there is no device connected.
- Channel: Selects the channel you want to use.
- Touch Menu > Advanced: Sets the advanced settings, such as local router IP settings or DHCP server settings.

When the portable Wi-Fi hotspot is active and is ready to share its connection, the hotspot icon appears on the status bar.

Phone As Modem

You can tether your phone to your computer with a USB cable, to share your phone's Internet connection with your computer.

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 2. Check the **Phone as modem** check box to turn on the tethered mode.

When the tethered mode is active, the tethered mode icon Ψ appears on the notification panel.

If you want to use your phone in tethered mode whenever it is connected to a PC, select Phone as modem in Default connection type of PC connection. See PC Connection.

Camera and Video

You can use the camera or video camera to take and share pictures and videos. Your phone comes with a 5.0 megapixel main camera with an autofocus feature that lets you capture sharp pictures and videos.

You can open the camera through the applications list and close it from the camera menu. In addition to using the applications list to open the camera, you may be able to launch the camera from within other applications such as Contacts or Messaging.

Open the Camera

To open the camera in picture mode and take pictures:

Press and hold the camera button on the lower right side of the phone.

Touch Home -> Camera.



Close the Camera

► On the camera screen, touch **Home** () or **Back** (.

Camera Viewfinder Screen

The Viewfinder screen lets you view your subject and access camera controls and options.



- 1. **Switch view button:** Switches between the back camera lens and the front-facing camera lens (for self portraits, video chatting, etc.).
- 2. **Settings button:** Opens the camera settings menu and lets you change the camera settings. For more information, see Camera Settings.
- 3. Battery icon: Displays how full the battery is.
- 4. **Picture size:** Displays the current picture size.
- 5. Available shots: Displays remaining shots with the current settings.
- 6. **Thumbnail:** Displays the thumbnail of the latest image. Touch to view and manage.
- 7. Storage area: Displays where the pictures you take will be saved.
- 8. Shutter button: Takes a picture.
- 9. Switch button: Switches between the camera mode and the video camera mode.

Take a Picture

You can take high-resolution pictures using your phone's digital camera.

1. Press and hold the camera button on the lower right side of the phone.

– or –

- 2. Touch if you want to select the front-facing camera.
- 3. Change the settings if necessary. See Camera Settings.
- 4. Before taking the picture, you can zoom in on your subject.
 - To zoom in and out, slide the screen with your finger up and down. The zoom slider appears on the screen.
- 5. Frame your subject on the screen.
- **Tip:** Hold the phone vertically when taking portrait shots or hold the phone horizontally when taking landscape shots.
 - 6. Touch 💫 to take the picture.
 - 7. Choose what you want to do with the picture you've just taken. See Review Screen for details.

Review Screen

After capturing a picture or video, touch the thumbnail image to see the item in the review screen. From there, you can instantly share your photos or videos, (see Share Pictures and Videos) or touch the Gallery icon to edit your photos or videos (see View Pictures and Videos).



- 1. Gallery: Opens the Gallery application. See View Pictures and Videos Using Gallery.
- 2. **Thumbnails:** Displays the pictures in the same album as the currently displayed image. Touch a thumbnail to expand it.
- 3. **Share:** Displays the available applications to share your image.
- 4. **Delete:** Delete the currently displayed image. Confirm the deletion by touching **Delete** again.



You'll find the following controls on the video viewfinder screen:



- 1. **Switch view button:** Switches between the back camera lens and the front-facing camera lens (for self portraits, video chatting, etc.).
- 2. **Settings button:** Displays the video settings menu. For more information, see Video Camera Settings.
- 3. Battery icon: Displays how full the battery is.
- 4. Video size: Displays the current video size.
- 5. **Available time:** From the left, displays the current recording time, the remaining recording time with the current settings, and the total recording time.
- 6. **Thumbnail:** Displays the thumbnail of the latest image. Touch to view and manage.
- 7. **Storage area:** Displays where the videos you take will be saved.
- 8. **Record button:** Records a video. Touch again to stop.
- 9. **Switch button:** Switches between the camera mode and the video camera mode.

Record Videos

Record high-quality videos using your phone's video camera.

1. Press and hold the camera button at the lower right side of the phone.

– or –

Touch Home 🗀 > 👀 > Camera.

- 2. Touch is to activate video camera mode.
- 3. Touch 🥥 if you want to select the front-facing video camera.
- 4. Change the settings if necessary. See Video Camera Settings.
- 5. Holding the phone in landscape mode, frame your subject on the screen.
- 6. Touch b to start capturing video.
- 7. Touch to stop recording.
- 8. Choose what you want to do with the video you've just captured. See Review Screen for details.

Camera Settings

You can adjust your camera's settings using the icons on the main camera screen and the full camera settings menu.

1. Press and hold the camera button at the lower right side of the phone.

– or –

Touch Home 🗁 > 👀 > Camera.

- 2. Touch 🥥 if you want to select the front-facing camera.
- 3. Touch (O) for the available options (some options are available to the back-facing camera only or the front-facing camera only):
 - Picture mode: Selects from Normal, Continuous shooting, Panorama, Smile shutter, Effects, or HDR.
 - Normal: Takes a normal picture.
 - **Continuous Shooting:** Takes up to nine pictures continuously while pressing the shutter button.
 - **Panorama:** Takes a panorama picture as you pan the phone sideways.

- **Smile shutter:** Detects a smile on a face and automatically takes a picture without your touching the shutter button.
- Effects: Takes a picture with various types of effects, such as Colored pencil, Poster, Kaleidoscope, Fish-eye, and more.
- **HDR:** Takes three pictures at different exposure levels and combines them into one picture. It compensates the loss of detail at each exposure level and helps produce a clear and detailed picture. The shutter sounds only once while taking the three pictures.
- Size: Selects from 5.0M(2592x1944), 3.2M(2048x1536), 2.0M(1600x1200),
 1.3M(1280x960), 0.8M(1024x768), WVGA(800x480), or VGA(640x480).
- **Zoom:** Displays the zoom slider on the screen. Drag the slider to zoom in and out.
- Camera light: Selects from ON, OFF, or Auto.
- More Settings:
 - Focus settings: Selects from Auto, Face detection, Macro, or OFF.
 - Shooting scene: Selects from Auto, Portrait, Scenery, Night portrait, Night scenery, or Action.
 - Add location info: Touch the OFF icon to turn it on. Touch the ON icon to turn it off.
 - Image quality: Selects from Super fine, Fine, or Normal.
 - Blink detection: Touch the OFF icon to turn it on. Touch the ON icon to turn it off.
 - Auto exposure: Selects from Frame average, Center weighted, or Spot metering.
 - Select ISO: Selects from Auto, 100, 200, 400, or 800.
 - White balance: Selects from Auto, Daylight, Cloudy, Incandescent, or Fluorescent.
 - Auxiliary line: Selects from OFF or Grid.
 - Auto-review: Selects from Moment auto-review, Auto-review, or OFF.
 - Initialize: Initializes all the camera settings. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Note: If you select items other than Auto for Shooting scene, you cannot select Flash mode, Focus settings, Auto exposure, Select ISO, and White balance.

Video Camera Settings

You can adjust your video camera settings using the icons on the main video camera screen and the full video camera settings menu.

 - More Settings:
 - Auto exposure: Selects from Frame average, Center weighted, or Spot metering.
 - White balance: Selects from Auto, Daylight, Cloudy, Incandescent, or Fluorescent.
 - Auxiliary line: Selects from OFF or Grid.
 - Time lapse interval: Selects from: 1s, 1.5s, 2s, 2.5s, 3s, 5s, or 10s.
 - Initialize: Initializes all the video camera settings. Touch **OK** to confirm.

View Pictures and Videos Using Gallery

Using the Gallery application, you can view pictures and watch videos that you've taken with your phone's camera, downloaded, or copied onto your microSD card or phone memory.

For pictures that are on your microSD card or phone memory, you can do basic editing such as rotating and cropping. You can also easily assign a picture as your contact picture or wallpaper and share pictures with your friends.



The Gallery app opens in the Albums view where your pictures and videos are organized by albums for easy viewing.

Open the Gallery App



Photos or videos you took with the internal camera are stored in Camera album.

Folders in your storage card or phone memory that contain pictures and videos will also be treated as albums. The actual folder names will be used as the album names. If you have downloaded any pictures and videos, these will be placed in the **Download** album.

When viewing pictures in Gallery, scroll left or right the screen to view more albums. Simply touch an album to view the pictures or videos in that album.

Note: Depending on the number of pictures stored, it may take some time for Gallery to load all your albums on the screen.



- **Details:** Shows the details of the picture.
- Set picture as: Sets the picture as the contact photo or wallpaper.
- **Show on map:** Shows the location where you took the picture in Google Maps if Store location is set to ON. See Camera Settings.

Edit a Picture

Your phone has a built in editing tool and you can alter the picture you took easily.



Rotate and Save a Picture

- 4. Touch **Menu > Rotate left** or **Rotate right**.

Crop a Picture

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Gallery.

- 3. Touch the picture you want to crop.
- 4. Touch **Menu > Crop**. A crop box appears on the picture.



- 5. To adjust the crop box size, touch and hold the edge of the box. When directional arrows appear, drag your finger inward to or outward to resize the crop box.
- 6. To move the crop box to the part of the picture that you want to crop, drag the crop box to the desired size and position.
- 7. Touch **CROP** to apply the changes to the picture.

The cropped picture is saved in the album as a copy. The original picture remains unedited.

- 3. Touch and hold the picture or video until you see a blue frame around it. Touch multiple pictures and videos to select them.

- 4. Touch See all....
- 5. Compose your message and then touch \triangleright .
- **Note:** If you selected **Mail** and you have multiple email accounts, the default email account will be used.

For more information about using email and Gmail, see Compose and Send Email or Send a Gmail Message.

Send Pictures or Videos by Multimedia Message

Multimedia Messaging (MMS) lets you send pictures and videos using your phone's messaging app. Although you can send several pictures or videos in a multimedia message, it may be better to just send one at a time, especially if the files are large in size.

- 2. Touch the album that contains the pictures or videos you want to share.
- 3. Touch and hold the picture or video until you see a blue frame around it. Touch multiple pictures and videos to select them.
- 4. Touch See all....

Send Pictures or Videos Using Bluetooth

You can select several pictures, videos, or both and send them to another phone or your computer using Bluetooth.

- 2. Touch the album that contains the pictures or videos you want to share.
- 3. Touch and hold the picture or video until you see a blue frame around it. Touch multiple pictures and videos to select them.

- In the next few screens, you'll be asked to turn on Bluetooth on your phone and connect to the receiving Bluetooth device so the files can be sent. For more information, see Bluetooth.

Use Calendar to create and manage events, meetings, and appointments. Your Calendar helps organize your time and reminds you of important events. Depending on your synchronization settings, your phone's Calendar stays in sync with your Calendar on the Web, or the corporate calendar.

Add an Event to the Calendar

Add events to your calendar directly from the Calendar application.

- 3. If you have more than two calendars, select a calendar in which to add the event:
- **Note:** You can create multiple Google Calendars only in Google Calendar on the Web. After creating them in Google Calendar on the Web, you'll be able to see them in the Calendar application on your phone. For more information about creating and managing multiple Google Calendars, visit the Google website: calendar.google.com.
- **Note:** If you have synchronized your phone with an Exchange ActiveSync account or Outlook on your computer, you can also select these calendars.
 - 4. Enter a name for the event.
 - 5. Enter the event location
 - 6. To specify the date and time of the event, do one of the following:
 - If there is a time frame for the event, touch the FROM and TO dates and times to set them.
 - If the event is a special occasion such as a birthday or an all-day event, set the FROM and TO dates, and then select the ALL DAY check box.
 - 7. Enter email addresses to invite guests to your event and add the event descriptions. See Invite Guests to Your Calendar Event (Google Account Only).
 - 8. If the event occurs on a regular basis, touch the **REPETITION** box and then choose how often the event occurs.
 - 9. Set the event reminder time and select how you are notified.

Note: You can add another reminder time in a Google Calendar event. Touch **Add reminder** to add another reminder.

- 10. Select your status to be displayed on your calendar.
- 11. Set the privacy status of this event.
- 12. Touch **DONE**.

Invite Guests to Your Calendar Event (Google Account Only)

If you want to invite guests to your event, you need to create and add the event in your Google Calendar.

An email invitation will be sent to your guests using your Google Account.

- 1. Open Calendar and create a new event. Touch the Calendar field and then select your Google Account (or one of your other Google Calendars). See Add an Event to the Calendar.
- 2. Add details about the event, such as date and time, location, and more.
- 3. In the **GUESTS** field, enter the email addresses of everyone you want to invite to the event. Separate multiple addresses with commas.
- 4. Add the description of the event to be displayed on the email to your guests
- 5. Touch **DONE** to add the event to your Google Calendar.

If the people to whom you send invitations use Google Calendar, they'll receive an invitation in Calendar and by email.

Calendar Event Alerts

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone alerts you and displays the event summary. There are several ways your phone alerts you to scheduled events:

- By playing the assigned ringer or vibration type.
- By showing the **1** icon on the status bar.
- By showing the Alert pop-up screen.

Event Reminders

If you have set at least one reminder for an event, the upcoming event icon **m** will appear in the notifications area of the status bar to remind you of the upcoming event.

To view, dismiss, or snooze the reminder:

- 1. Slide the status bar down to open the Notifications panel.
- 2. Touch the upcoming event name to display the event.

Note: If you have other pending event reminders, these events will also appear on the screen.

- 3. Do one of the following:
 - Touch **Snooze all** to snooze all event reminders for five minutes.
 - Touch **Dismiss all** to dismiss all event reminders.
 - Touch Back to keep the reminders pending in the notifications area of the status bar.

To set reminder settings:

On any Calendar view, touch Menu > Settings > General settings, and set the items under REMINDER SETTINGS.

View Calendar Events

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view. To change the Calendar view, touch the date displayed at the upper left corner, and touch **Day**, **Week**, **Month**, or **Agenda**.

The color of the events indicate the type of calendar that includes the event. To find out what each color represents, touch **Menu E** > **Calendars to display**.

Day and Agenda Views

Day view displays a list of the events of one day. Agenda view shows a list of all your events in chronological order.



- 9. Touch Turn alarm on to set the alarm on.
- 10. When you're finished, touch OK. (Alarms that are set are checked in blue.)
 - Touch the check mark next to an alarm to turn it on or off.

 - Set default ringtone: Select to set the ringtone for the alarm.

Calculator

Your phone's convenient built-in calculator lets you perform basic mathematical equations.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Calculator.
- 2. Enter numbers by touching the onscreen keys.
- 3. Touch **DELETE** to clear a number. Touch and hold to clear an entire number.

- 4. To access more advanced features, flick the screen left or touch **Menu Solution** > **Advanced panel**.
- 5. Touch **Back** \longleftrightarrow to close the calculator.

Voice Services

Your phone's voice services let you place calls using your voice, convert text into speech, and more.

Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)

You can use your phone's built-in automatic speech recognition (ASR) software (Voice Dialer) to dial a phone number in your contacts or to launch phone functions. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and ASR will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself.

Activate the Voice Dialer

► Touch Home > . > Voice Dialer.

The phone prompts you to say a command from the list displayed on the screen. To complete your task, simply follow the onscreen prompts or touch an onscreen option.

If the application does not recognize the number, name, or application name, it will find the most likely matches and display a list. Touch a selection or touch **Cancel** to exit the Voice Dialer.

Tip: Use ASR in a quiet environment so it can accurately recognize your commands.

Make a Voice Call with the Voice Dialer

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voice Dialer.
- 2. When prompted to speak, say "Call [contact]" or "Dial [number]."
- 3. For example, say "**Call John Smith on mobile**," to call John Smith's mobile phone. Your phone dials the number stored for the contact "John Smith" with the label "Mobile."

Open an Application with the Voice Dialer

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voice Dialer.
- 2. When prompted to speak, say "Open [application name]."

 For example, say "Open Calendar," to open the Calendar. The application screen is displayed.

Open a Settings Menu with the Voice Dialer

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Voice Dialer.
- 2. When prompted to speak, say "Open [settings menu name]."
- 3. For example, say "**Open sound settings**." The Sound settings menu screen is displayed.

Text-to-Speech Settings

Your phone can convert text into speech in some downloaded applications. You may select the language you hear or adjust its speed.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.
- 2. Touch Text-to-speech output.
- 3. Select your engine. Touch $\frac{1}{2}$ to configure the settings of the selected engine.
- 4. Touch **Speech rate** and select a speed.
- 5. Touch **Listen to an example** to play a short demonstration of the set speech synthesis.

Voice Search

Voice Search allows you to find information on the web as well as items and information on your phone by speaking your search terms.

1. Touch $\oint f$ on the Google Search Bar.

Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Search > \oint .

- 2. Speak clearly into the phone's microphone. If an error occurs, touch **Speak again** or **Try again**.
- 3. Touch a matching item from the onscreen list.

Voice Search Settings

You can configure the settings of the voice search feature.

1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Language & input.

- 2. Touch Voice Search.
 - Language to set the language used when entering text by speaking.
 - **SafeSearch** to filter explicit text and images from the search results. Select from Off, Moderate, or Strict.
 - Block offensive words to replace recognized offensive words in transcriptions with
 [#] when entering text by speaking.
 - **Personalized recognition** to improve speech recognition accuracy.
 - **Google Account dashboard** to manage your collected data.

Eco Mode

The Eco Mode allows you to save battery life while using your phone.

- 1. Touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Eco Mode.
- 2. Touch an option to enable or disable the Eco Mode:
 - **On:** Enables the Eco Mode.
 - Auto On: Enables the Eco Mode when the remaining battery level falls below the set level. Scroll and set the percentage.
 - Off: Disables the Eco Mode.
- 3. Configure the **Eco settings** to select the Eco level. Touch the icon of the following items to select:
 - Sleep to set the screen timeout to 15 seconds.
 - **Display brightness** to decrease the display brightness.
 - Wallpaper to select the Eco wallpaper.
 - Vibrate on touch to turn off the vibration feedback.
 - Auto-rotate screen to disable the Auto-rotate screen feature.

When Eco Mode is on, the Eco Mode icon 🐚 appears on the status bar.

Configured settings in the Eco Mode are automatically reflected in the respective Settings menu, and vice versa.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is usually approximately 30 feet.

Note: Turn off Bluetooth when not in use to conserve battery power, or in places where using a wireless phone is prohibited, such as aboard an aircraft and in hospitals.

The Bluetooth Settings Menu

The Bluetooth settings menu gives you access to information and controls for your phone's Bluetooth feature.

- ► Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
 - Touch your phone name at the top of the list to set your phone visible to other devices. Touch again to set your phone to not visible to other devices. The duration your phone is visible can be changed.
 - Touch SEARCH FOR DEVICES to search for other visible in-range Bluetooth devices.

- Touch **Menu > Rename phone** to rename your phone for Bluetooth access.
- Touch Menu > Visibility timeout to select the duration your phone is visible to other devices.
- Touch Menu > Show received files to view all files you have received via Bluetooth.

Change the Device Name

The device name identifies your phone to other devices.

- 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If Bluetooth is not switched on, touch the off icon off to turn Bluetooth on on.
- 3. Touch **Menu > Rename phone**.
- 4. Enter the name for your phone in the dialog box, and then touch **Rename**.

Connect a Bluetooth Headset or Car Kit

You can listen to music over a Bluetooth stereo headset, or have hands-free conversations using a compatible Bluetooth headset or car kit. It's the same procedure to set up stereo audio and hands-free devices.

To listen to music with your headset or car kit, the headset or car kit must support the A2DP Bluetooth profile.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If Bluetooth is not switched on, touch the off icon OFF to turn Bluetooth on ON.
- 3. Make sure that the headset is discoverable, so that your phone can find the headset. Refer to the instructions that came with the headset to find out how to set it to discoverable mode.
- 4. Touch **SEARCH FOR DEVICES**. Your phone will start to scan for Bluetooth devices within range.
- 5. When you see the name of your headset displayed on the **AVAILABLE DEVICES** list, touch the name. Your phone then automatically tries to pair with the headset.
- 6. If automatic pairing fails, enter the passcode supplied with your headset.

The pairing and connection status is displayed below the hands-free headset or car kit name in the Bluetooth devices section. When the Bluetooth headset or car kit is connected to your phone, the Bluetooth paired icon 😵 is displayed in the status bar. Depending on the type of

headset or car kit you have connected, you can then start using the headset or car kit to listen to music or make and receive phone calls.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth-compatible devices.

Reconnect a Headset or Car Kit

When you have paired a headset with your phone, you should be able to reconnect it automatically by turning on Bluetooth on your phone and then turning on the headset. However, sometimes you will need to reconnect manually, for example if you have been using your headset with another Bluetooth device.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If Bluetooth is not switched on, touch the off icon OFF to turn Bluetooth on ON.
- 3. Make sure that the headset is discoverable.
- 4. Touch the headset's name in the **AVAILABLE DEVICES** list.
- 5. If prompted to enter a passcode, try 0000 or 1234, or consult the headset or car kit documentation to find the passcode.
- 6. If you still cannot reconnect to the headset or car kit, follow the instructions in Disconnect or Unpair from a Bluetooth Device, and then follow the instructions in Connect a Bluetooth Headset or Car Kit.

Disconnect or Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

You can manually disconnect or unpair from a Bluetooth device through the Bluetooth settings menu.

Disconnect a Bluetooth Device

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. On the **PAIRED DEVICES** list, touch the device to disconnect.
- 3. Touch OK.

Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

You can make your phone forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the other device again, you may need to enter or confirm a passcode again.

1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.

- 2. On the **PAIRED DEVICES** list, touch $\frac{-1}{-1}$ next to the device to unpair.
- 3. Touch Unpair.

Send and Receive Information Using Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer information between your phone and another Bluetoothenabled device such as a phone or notebook computer. The first time you transfer information between your phone and another device, you need to enter or confirm a security passcode. After that, your phone and the other device are paired, and you will not need to exchange passcodes to transfer information in the future.

Send Information from Your Phone to Another Device

You can send the following types of information, depending on the device you are sending to:

- Images and videos
- Contacts
- 1. Set the receiving device to discoverable mode. You may also need to set it to "Receive Beams" or "Receive Files". Refer to the device's documentation for instructions on receiving information over Bluetooth.
- 2. On the phone, open the application that contains the information or file you want to send. For example, if you want to send a saved picture, touch **Home** \bigcirc > **(::)** > **Gallery**.
- 3. Follow the steps for the type of item you want to send:
 - Picture or video (in Camera): After capturing a picture or video, on the preview screen, touch 3.
 - Pictures and videos (in Gallery): On the Albums tab, touch an album. Touch the items you want to share and then touch <> Bluetooth.
 - Contact: Display a contact and then touch Menu > Share > Bluetooth.
- 4. If you are prompted to turn on Bluetooth, touch **Turn on**.
- 5. Touch the name of the receiving device.
- 6. If prompted, accept the connection on the receiving device, and enter the same passcode on both your phone and the other device, or confirm the auto-generated passcode.
- 7. On the receiving device, accept the file.

Receive Information from Another Device

Your phone is capable of receiving a wide variety of file types with Bluetooth, including pictures, videos, or contacts.

To receive files from another device, you need to have a microSD card installed in your phone.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.
- If Bluetooth is not switched on, touch the off icon OFF to turn Bluetooth on ON.
- 3. Touch your phone name to make your phone visible to unpaired devices.
- 4. On the sending device, send one or more files to your phone. Refer to the device's documentation for instructions on sending information over Bluetooth.
- 5. If prompted, enter the same passcode on both your phone and the other device, or confirm the auto-generated passcode. A Bluetooth authorization request is displayed on your phone.
- 6. Touch OK.
- 7. When your phone receives a file transfer request notification, slide down the notifications panel, and then touch **Accept**.
- 8. When a file is transferred, a notification is displayed. To open the file immediately, slide down the notifications panel, and then touch the relevant notification.

When you open a received file, what happens next depends on the file type:

• For a vCard contact file, if there are multiple vCard files on your storage card, you can choose to import one, several, or all of those contacts to your contacts list.

Near Field Communication (NFC) Technology

NFC (Near Field Communication) technology is a short-range, wireless technology that lets you quickly and wirelessly exchange information between your phone and other NFC-enabled smartphones, smart accessories, and NFC-enabled access points. You can also use NFC technology to save, view, create, or change smart tags.

Depending on the applications that you have added to your phone, you might be able to use your phone as a transit pass or as an access pass, by tapping the back of your phone against an NFC-enabled access point, subject to applicable terms and conditions from the particular vendor.

To use NFC technology on your phone, your phone must be within approximately 0.78 in. (2 cm) of the NFC-enabled smartphone, smart accessory, NFC-enabled access point, or smart tag that you want to exchange information with. When information is transferred over an NFC connection, your smartphone vibrates.

Android Beam

With Android Beam you can beam app content such as Browser pages, YouTube videos, and People contacts, to another NFC-capable device by holding the devices close together.

To turn Android Beam on or off:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > More....
- 2. If NFC is off, select the **NFC** check box to turn it on.
- 3. Touch Android Beam.
- 4. Touch the off icon OFF to turn Android Beam on ON.

– or –

Touch the on icon <u>on</u> to turn Bluetooth off <u>off</u>.

To share app contents:

- 1. With Android Beam turned on, display the contents you want to share on your screen.
- 2. Bring your phone close to another NFC-enabled device, typically back to back, and then touch your screen. The app determines what gets beamed.

microSD Card

Your phone is equipped with a microSD[™] (Secure Digital) memory card that allows you to store images, videos, music, documents, and voice data on your phone.

Important: Your phone comes with the microSD card preinstalled.



3. Gently push the microSD card inward and release it. The card is now halfway out of the microSD card slot.




- 4. Gently pull out the card from the slot.
- 5. Replace the battery and the battery cover. See Insert and Charge the Battery.

- **Note:** You can easily damage the microSD card by improper operation. Please be careful when inserting, removing, or handling the microSD card.
- **Note:** Make sure your battery is fully charged before using the microSD card. Your data may become damaged or unusable if the battery runs out while using the microSD card.

Insert a microSD Card

Remove the battery cover and the battery to insert a compatible microSD card into your phone.

- 1. Turn your phone off and remove the battery cover. See Turn Your Phone On and Off and Insert and Charge the Battery.
- 2. Lift the battery and remove it.



3. Insert a microSD card into the microSD card slot with the gold terminals facing down. Gently push the card in until it snaps into place.



4. Replace the battery and the battery cover. See Insert and Charge the Battery.

View the microSD Card Memory

The Storage settings menu gives you access to your microSD card memory information.

With the microSD card inserted, touch Home > Menu > System settings > Storage. (The total and available memory space will be displayed.)

Format the microSD Card

Formatting a microSD card permanently removes all files stored on the card.

- 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > Storage.
- 2. Scroll down the screen, touch Erase SD card > Erase SD card > Erase everything.
- **Note:** The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSD card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved. To prevent the loss of important data, please check the contents before you format the card.

Unmount the microSD Card

Unmount the microSD card to prevent corrupting the data stored on it or damaging the microSD card.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Storage.
- 2. Touch **Unmount SD card** > **OK**.

Use the Phone's microSD Card as a USB Drive

To transfer music, pictures, and other files from your computer to your phone's microSD card, you need to set the phone's microSD card as a USB drive.

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. The PC connection screen automatically opens.

– or –

If you see **W** on the status bar, slide it down to open the Notifications panel and touch the USB connection notification.

- 3. Touch Mass Storage > Done > OK. See PC Connection.
- 4. On your computer, the connected phone is recognized as a removable disk. Navigate to this removable disk and open it.
- 5. Do one of the following:
 - Copy files from the computer to the root folder on the phone's storage card.
 - Copy files from the phone's storage card to a folder on your computer or computer desktop.
- 6. After copying the files, unmount the removable disk (that is, the connected phone) as required by your computer's operating system to safely remove your phone, and disconnect the phone from the computer.

Note: The phone will not recognize the microSD card when it is connected to a computer as a disk drive. You will not be able to use some of the phone's applications such as Camera or Play Music.

Use the Phone's microSD Card as a Media Device

You can connect your phone as a media device to your computer.

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. The PC connection screen automatically opens.

– or –

If you see **W** on the status bar, slide it down to open the Notifications panel and touch the USB connection notification.

3. Touch **Media Transfer > Done**. See **PC Connection**.

Update Your PRL

This option allows you to download and update the PRL (preferred roaming list) automatically.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > System update > Update PRL.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Update Your Profile

This option allows you to automatically update your online user profile information. If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, you must then update the user name on your phone.

- 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > System update > Update profile.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Note: If your data services or account syncing ever seems to go out unexpectedly, use this feature to reconnect with the network.

Update Your Phone Firmware

This option allows you to update the Android Operating System (OS) and the phone software on your phone via an over-the-air connection.

Before Updating Your Firmware

Updating your phone firmware will erase all user data from your phone. You must back up all critical information before updating your phone firmware.

Back Up All Data Prior to Update

To back up your account information:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Touch the account containing the data you want to back up now.
- 3. Select the check box of the items you want to back up.
- 4. Touch **Menu Sync now**.

To back up stored text messages:

- 1. Touch Home (> Application Launcher : > Messaging.
- 2. Select the text message from the list to view the message thread.
- 3. Touch and hold on a portion of the text message from the string. The Message options context menu appears.
- **Note:** You can back up stored text messages by forwarding them to your own phone number. Open the messages after you have updated your firmware.
 - 4. Touch Forward.
 - 5. Enter your phone number and touch **Send**.

As an added precaution, to preserve any data on your microSD card, please unmount it from your phone prior to starting the update process. Touch Home \bigcirc > Menu \bigcirc > System settings > Storage > Unmount SD card.

Update Your Phone Firmware

Once you have backed up all your data, use the **Update Firmware** option to update your phone firmware.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > System update.
- 2. Touch **Update firmware**. (Your phone automatically downloads and installs any available updates. You may be required to power your phone off and back on to complete the software upgrade.)

Confirm Your Current Phone Firmware

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > About phone.
- 2. Locate the version number.

Reinstall Your Google Application

Your Google[™] app purchases are reloaded remotely and can be re-installed after the update is applied.

- 1. Touch Home > : > Play Store.
- 2. Touch Menu => My Apps > All.
- 3. Scroll through the list of previously downloaded Google apps and choose those you wish to reinstall.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Update Kyocera Software

This option provides you the latest Android Operating System (OS) and the phone firmware on your phone via an over-the-air connection.

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > System update > Update
 Kyocera software.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Enable Global Roaming Mode

Your phone is designed to disable/enable global roaming mode to avoid automatically connecting to an appropriate network when you travel.

To set your global roaming options:

- Touch Home) > Menu) > System settings > More... > Mobile networks > Roaming > Roaming mode > Automatic.
- 2. Select the type(s) of communication for which global roaming should be allowed:
 - International voice to allow voice communication on international roaming systems.
 - International data to allow data communication on international roaming systems.

Note: You cannot select the international data roaming only.

To set your global roaming guards:

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > More... > Mobile networks > Roaming > Roaming guards.
- 2. Select a check box of the category under **INTERNATIONAL** to enable roaming guards for:
 - Voice to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to access voice service while roaming internationally.
 - **Data** to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to access data service while roaming internationally.
 - **Outgoing SMS** to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to send a text message while roaming internationally.

Make and Receive Worldwide Calls

When travelling on international networks, you can place and answer calls as you would on the Sprint network (see Make Phone Calls and Receive Phone Calls), although some additional instructions may be required to place a call. Some features and services are not available in all countries. For more information on services that are available while roaming, visit sprint.com/sww.

Make Calls Using Plus (+) Code Dialing

Placing calls from one country to another country is simple with the Plus (+) Code Dialing feature. When placing international calls, you can use Plus Code Dialing to enter the appropriate international access code for your location (for example, 011 for international calls placed from the United States).

Note: International access codes and dialing information are available online at sprint.com/sww.

To use Plus Code Dialing to place an international call from outside the United States or Canada:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.

- 3. Clear the North American dialing check box.
- 4. Touch International dialing.

- 5. Delete the previous value.
- 6. Enter a new value and touch **OK**.

To use Plus Code Dialing to place an international call from the United States or Canada:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- 2. Touch **Menu E** > **Settings**.
- 3. Check the North American dialing check box.

To place an international call:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > \bigcirc to display the phone screen.
- Touch and hold 0: to insert a "+" on the phone dial screen. (The "+" symbol automatically inserts the international access code for the country from which you are calling.)
- 3. Enter the country code and phone number, and then touch **C**. (The phone automatically prepends the access code for international dialing, followed by the country code and phone number.)

Sprint Voicemail Service

Your Sprint voicemail will follow you as you travel. All of your unanswered calls will be forwarded to your Sprint voicemail. You will need to be sure your voicemail box is already set up and that you know your voicemail password.

Note: In India, Sprint voicemail is not available while roaming on the GSM network; it does work while on the CDMA network.

To simplify accessing your Sprint Voicemail while travelling, you can set up your voicemail access number as a Contacts entry. This will make it faster and easier to access your messages while roaming internationally.

- 2. Touch \square_+ to add a contact.

- 3. Type the contact information (for example, "Voicemail").
- 4. Enter "+", "1", your area code, and your wireless phone number.
- 5. Touch **DONE**.

Access Your Voicemail

You will need to call your voicemail number to access your voicemail while roaming internationally.

New Message Indicators

Your voicemail message indicators may be displayed differently when roaming internationally, or you may not receive notification of new voicemail messages. Sprint recommends that you periodically check your voicemail.

Retrieve Voicemail Messages

The voicemail retrieval process while travelling is the same as on the Sprint Network; however, you will be required to enter your voicemail password.

To retrieve your voicemail messages:

- 1. Touch **Home** \bigcirc > \bigcirc > **People** > \bigcirc , touch the voicemail entry and then touch the number to call it.
- 2. When your voicemail answers, touch *****, enter the password, and touch **#** to access your voicemail.

Voicemail Troubleshooting

- Some carriers may not support voicemail indicators. It may be necessary to call your voicemail to see if you have any new messages.
- If you hear the message "Please enter the number of the subscriber you wish to call," enter your 10-digit wireless phone number.

International Data Roaming

Please Try Later	This service is temporarily not available. Please try again later.	
Service Restricted	Service may not be activated properly. Please contact Sprint Customer Service to report the issue for resolution.	
Service Not Available	This feature is not available on the current network.	
Energency Calls Only	Either the service is not activated properly or the current network is available for emergency calling only. Adjust your network settings to check for other available networks. If service is still not available after adjusting the settings, contact Sprint Customer Service to report the issue for resolution	
System Busy. Try Later	The system is experiencing heavy traffic. Please try again later.	
Service Conflict	This service cannot be enabled because an incompatible service has already been turned on.	
Please Try Again	An error occurred. Note the error code and try again.	
Self Check Error	A fault was detected with your phone. If this error recurs, note the error and contact Sprint Customer Service.	
Self Check Fail	An operational fault was detected with your phone. Note the numeric code, turn your phone off, and contact Sprint Customer Service.	
Wrong PIN	You have entered an incorrect SIM PIN number. You have only three attempts to enter your PIN. After a third unsuccessful attempt, your phone will be locked and you will have to call Sprint Customer Service to have it unlocked. Insert SIM	Your SIM Card is not being detected. Please check to ensure that you have inserted the SIM Card.	
Check SIM Card	Please check your SIM card to make sure it is properly inserted.

 - **Network notification:** Notifies you when an open Wi-Fi network is available.
 - Secure network notification: Notifies you when a secure Wi-Fi network is available.
 - Wi-Fi auto on: Enables Wi-Fi automatically.
 - Wi-Fi auto on schedule: Enables Wi-Fi for the scheduled period.
 - Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Stays connected to Wi-Fi when the screen goes to sleep to conserve mobile data usage.
 - MAC address: Displays the Media Access Control (MAC) address of your phone when connected to a Wi-Fi network.
 - IP address: Displays the Internet Protocol (IP) address assigned to your phone by the Wi-Fi network you are connected to (unless you used the IP settings to assign it a static IP address).

Bluetooth Settings

Your phone's Bluetooth capabilities let you use wireless headsets, send and receive pictures and files, and more. For details on your phone's Bluetooth settings, see The Bluetooth Settings Menu.

Access the Bluetooth Settings Menu

► Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Bluetooth.

MaxiMZR Settings

MaxiMZR will limit the background data connection based on your personal usage of applications. It will ultimately help conserve battery power with minimal impact to the usability of your phone.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > MaxiMZR.
- 2. Touch the off icon **OFF** to enable MaxiMZR. The on icon **W** will be displayed.
- 3. Touch **Apps** to see the list of regulated applications.

Data Usage Settings

The Data usage menu lets you view your phone's mobile and Wi-Fi data usage, set data limits, restrict hotspot usage, and more.

Enable Data Statistics

Enabling the Data statistics feature allows your phone to collect the necessary data.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Data usage.
- 2. Touch **Data statistics** if the off icon **OFF** is displayed next to it.
- 3. Read the message and touch **OK**. The on icon will be displayed next to **Data statistics**.

View Data Usage by Application

- 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > Data usage.
- 2. Confirm Mobile data is set to
- 3. Touch _ next to **Data usage cycle** to change the period of time for which the chart will display the data usage.
- 4. Touch either of the white lines on the chart to display the tabs. Drag the white tabs horizontally to see the data usage of a specific period within the displayed cycle.
 - The usage amount will be displayed just below the chart.

Set Data Usage Limit

You can also set the limit for mobile data in case you don't have unlimited data plan which cuts off data at a specified threshold.

Airplane Mode

Airplane Mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Gallery, Camera, and Music, when you are on an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited. When you set your phone to Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information.

To quickly turn Airplane Mode on or off:

Press and hold the power button, and then touch Airplane mode in the Device options menu. While in Airplane Mode, the status bar will display .

To turn Airplane Mode on or off in Settings:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > More....
- Select the Airplane mode check box. While in Airplane Mode, the status bar will display
 .

VPN Settings

A virtual private network (VPN) is a network that uses a public telecommunication infrastructure, such as the Internet, to provide remote offices or individual users with secure access to their organization's network. For more information about VPN settings, see Virtual Private Networks (VPN).

Tethering & Portable Hotspot Settings

Use the settings menu to configure your Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot settings, which allow you to share your phone's data service with multiple Wi-Fi capable devices. For details on your phone's tethering and portable hotspot settings, see Portable Wi-Fi Hotspot.

NFC Settings

The NFC (Near Field Communication) settings menu lets you turn NFC on or off. For more information about Wi-Fi settings, see Near Field Communication (NFC) Technology.

Wi-Fi Direct Settings

Wi-Fi Direct allows Wi-Fi devices to connect to each other without the need for a wireless access point. The Wi-Fi client and the hotspot operation will be disabled while Wi-Fi direct is enabled.

To turn Wi-Fi direct on:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > More... > Wi-Fi direct.
- 2. Read the message and touch **OK**.

To configure Wi-Fi direct settings:

Mobile Networks Settings

The Mobile networks options let you enable your phone's mobile data access, set your preferred network mode, configure Sprint Connections Optimizer, and select network operators for international use.

Enable Data

Roaming is the ability to make or receive calls and access data services when you're off the Nationwide Sprint Network.

Roaming Icon

Your display screen always lets you know when you're off the Nationwide Sprint Network. Anytime you are roaming, the phone displays the roaming icon ().

Roaming on Other Networks

When you're roaming on other networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the Nationwide Sprint Network. However, you may not be able to access certain features, such as data services, depending on the available network.

Note: If you're on a call when you leave the Nationwide Sprint Network, your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think Sprint service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the network.

Check for Voicemail Messages While Roaming

When you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network, you may not receive on-phone notification of new voicemail messages. Callers can still leave messages, but you will need to periodically check your voicemail for new messages if you are in a roaming service area for an extended period of time.

- 2. When you hear your voicemail greeting, touch *
- 3. Enter your password at the prompt and follow the voice prompts.

When you return to the Nationwide Sprint Network, voicemail notification will resume as normal.

When the roaming mode is set to **Automatic**, you can specify which services are available while roaming.

- Domestic voice to allow voice communication only on domestic roaming systems.

- 4. If required, touch **Yes**.

Note: Data service is not available without voice service for both domestic and international settings. Disabling voice service automatically disables its data service.

Roaming Guard

Your phone alerts you when you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network by requiring an extra step before you can place or answer a call, or try to access data while roaming.

- 2. Touch More... > Mobile networks > Roaming > Roaming guards.
- 3. Select each service you want to enable Roaming guards for:
 - Voice to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to access voice service while roaming in the selected region (DOMESTIC or INTERNATIONAL).
 - Data to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to access data service while roaming in the selected region (DOMESTIC or INTERNATIONAL). The prompt will not appear again while you are in the data session you allowed.
 - **Outgoing SMS** to display a prompt that will require you to respond anytime you attempt to send a text message while roaming internationally.
- **Tip:** If you prefer not to use the Roaming guards feature, touch the **Never ask** check box and then touch **OK** or **Roam** while the alert dialog is displayed. You will not be notified of your roaming status until you enable Roaming guards again.

- 3. Read the message and touch **OK**.

Battery Settings

Monitor your phone's battery usage through this settings menu. View which functions are consuming your battery's charge and at what percentage.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Battery.
- 2. View your phone's battery usage statistics.
- 3. Touch [# of hours, minutes and seconds] **on battery** to see the history details of the battery usage.
- 4. For additional details and settings options, touch a usage category.

PC Connection Settings

Set your phone's default connection mode when connected to the USB port of a computer.

- 1. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > PC connection.
- 2. Touch **Default connection type** and select an option:
 - Charge Only to let your PC charge your phone only.
 - Mass Storage to let your phone function as a removable disk when connected to the USB port of a computer.

- Media Transfer to let your phone function as a media device when connected to the USB port of a computer.

 - RUNNING to display currently the running applications. You can also see the RAM status on your phone at the bottom of the screen. Touch SHOW CACHED PROCESSES to see the cached processes of the application.
 - ALL to display all applications on your phone and the installed SD card.

You can increase the security of your phone by creating a screen lock. When enabled, you have to draw the correct unlock pattern on the screen, enter the correct PIN, or enter the correct password to unlock the phone's control keys, buttons, and touchscreen.

If you fail to enter the correct pattern, PIN or password after five attempts, you will have to wait for 30 seconds before you can try again.

In order from least secure to most secure, the available screen lock options are:

- PIN
- Password
- **Important:** To protect your phone and data from unauthorized access, Sprint recommends using the highest security level available (Password protection). Sprint also recommends you frequently change your password to ensure the safety of your phone and personal data.

Use Slide to Unlock the Screen

Use Face Unlock

Encryption

You can encrypt your phone and the SD card installed in your phone. For both encryption and decryption, you need to enter a PIN or password for the screen lock. To set up a PIN or password, see Screen Lock.

- **Warning:** Once the encryption is performed, it cannot be undone. The process to remove the encryption will be a factory data reset for the phone and a formatting for the SD card, which will delete all the data on the phone and the SD card.
- **Warning:** Refrain from using the phone, including removing the battery and the SD card, during the encryption process as some or all of your data will be lost if the encryption process is interrupted.
 - 1. Charge the battery first.
 - With your phone connected to the power source, touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Encrypt data.
 - 3. Select the target to be encrypted from **Phone & SD card**, **Phone**, or **SD card**.

 - 5. Enter a PIN or password and touch Next.
 - 6. Read the message and touch **Encrypt**.

Set Up SIM Card Lock

Protect your SIM card with a PIN.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Security > Set up SIM card lock.
- 2. Select the Lock SIM card check box.
- 3. Enter your SIM PIN and touch **OK**.
- 4. To change the SIM PIN, touch **Change SIM PIN**.
- 5. Enter a new PIN and touch **OK**.

Make Passwords Visible

You can hide your password or PIN number as you type it.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > Security.
- 2. Clear the **Make passwords visible** check box.

Device Administrators

You can disable the authority to be a device administrator of certain applications. If disabled, you will typically lose some functionality in those applications, such as the ability to sync new email or calendar events to your phone.

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Security > Device administrators.
- 2. Touch an application you want to disable the authority to be a device administrator.

Unknown Sources

Follow the steps below to allow installation of non-Play Store applications.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > Security.
- 2. Touch **Unknown sources** > **OK**.

Credential Storage

These options let you control how your phone accesses and stores secure certificates, passwords, and other credentials.

Trusted Credentials

You can see the trusted credentials on your phone's system.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Security.
- 2. Touch an item to read the information.

Install from SD Card

You can install encrypted certificates from the SD card.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Security > Install from SD card.
- 2. Touch an available certificate.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Clear Credentials

You can remove all the credentials on your phone.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Security > Clear credentials.
- 2. Touch OK.

Language & Input Settings

Your phone's language and input settings let you select a language for the phone's menus and keyboards, select and configure keyboard settings, configure speech input settings, and more. For details, see Enter Text.

This menu also provides the settings when using voice function. See Text-to-Speech Settings and Voice Search.

Language Settings

Pointer Speed

Language Settings

The language settings menu lets you select an onscreen language and add custom words to your phone's user dictionary.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Language & input > Language.
- 2. Select English or Español.

Pointer Speed

Change the pointer speed.

- Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Language & input > Pointer speed.
- 2. Use the slider to set the speed and touch **OK**.

Back Up and Reset Phone Settings

Your phone's **Back up and reset** menu lets you back up your phone's data and settings to Google servers before resetting your phone to the original factory settings. The Factory data reset erases all data from the phone's application storage, including:

- Your Google Account
- All other email and social networking accounts
- System and application data and settings
- Downloaded applications

Backup and Restore

To set your backup and restore options:

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu = > System settings > Backup & reset.
- 2. Select your backup and restore options.
 - Back up my data: This option lets you back up your app data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to Google servers.
 - Backup account: Select a Google account for your phone backup.
 - **Automatic restore:** This option lets you restore backed up settings and data when reinstalling an application after a factory data reset.

Factory Data Reset

- Tip: Before performing a factory data reset on your phone, you may want to unmount the microSD card to avoid losing any data you may have stored on it. Touch Home > Menu > System settings > Storage > Unmount SD card to unmount the storage card.
 - 1. Touch Home (> Menu) > System settings > Backup & reset.
 - 2. Touch Factory data reset.
 - 3. Read the factory data reset information, select the **Erase SD card** check box if necessary, and touch **Reset phone**.
 - 4. Touch **Erase everything**. Your phone will power down and reset itself, which may take up to 10 minutes.

Date & Time Settings

Use the Date & Time settings menu either to automatically use the network-provided date and time or manually set these values, as well as select time and date format options.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Date & time.
- 2. Clear the Automatic date & time check box if necessary.
- 3. Clear the Automatic time zone check box if necessary.
- Touch Set date. Adjust the date, month, and year by touching ▲ or ▼ or scrolling each value. Touch Set when finished.

- 5. Touch **Set time**. Adjust the hour and minute, and select AM or PM by touching ▲ or ▼ or scrolling each value. Touch **Set** when finished.
- 6. Touch **Select time zone**, and then select a time zone from the onscreen list. Scroll down the list to view additional time zones.
- 7. Touch **Use 24-hour format** to toggle between 12-hour or 24-hour format.
- 8. Touch **Select date format** to select how the date information is displayed on your phone.

Accessibility Settings

The Accessibility menu lets you enable and manage accessibility-related applications.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Touch an application and configure its settings.

TalkBack

TalkBack provides spoken feedback to help visually impaired users.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Accessibility > TalkBack.
- 2. To turn it on, touch the off icon **OFF**, read a message and then touch **OK**. The on icon **ON** is displayed.
- 3. Touch **SETTINGS** to configure its settings.

Large Text

Use large fonts on the screen.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Select the Large text check box.

Power Button Ends Call

Use the power button to end a call.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Select the **Power button ends call** check box.

Auto-Rotate Screen

Automatically change the orientation of some onscreen content when the phone is rotated. This option can be set from Home () > Menu) > System settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen as well.

- 1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Select the Auto-rotate screen check box.

Speak Passwords

Let your phone speak the password you enter.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Select the **Speak passwords** check box.

Explore by Touch

Hear or see descriptions of what's under your finger. This option is available when TalkBack is turned on.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Touch **Explore by touch**.
- 3. Touch the off icon to turn it on and then touch **OK**.

Touch & Hold Delay

Set the delay time when the screen recognizes the touch and hold operation.

1. Touch Home -> Menu > System settings > Accessibility.

- 2. Touch **Touch & hold delay**.
- 3. Select Short, Medium, or Long.

Install Web Scripts

Install web scripts that make the web content more accessible.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu => System settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Touch Install web scripts.
- 3. Read a message and touch **Allow**.

DC Button

If you don't subscribe to Sprint Direct Connect services, you can use the DC button for other function.

1. Press the DC button and touch **Customize**, if available.

Touch Home) > Menu) > System settings > Accessibility > DC button.

2. Select a function to assign to the button, or select **Do nothing** to assign no specific function.

Developer Options Settings

These menus are specific for application development. Unless you have a specific reason for changing these settings, you should leave them at the default settings.

► Touch Home → Menu > System settings > Developer options.

Activate This Device

The Activate this device menu lets you activate a new device or use additional self-service options such as checking the status of an in-service device.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > Activate this device.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions.

About Phone

The About phone menu lets you access important phone information including your phone number, battery status, and view legal information.

► Touch Home (> Menu = > System settings > About phone.

Settings

System Update

The System update menu lets you update your PRL (preferred roaming list), your data user profile, your Android software, and your phone firmware.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > System Update.
- 2. Select an option and follow the prompts to complete the updates. For complete system update information see Update Your Phone.

UICC Unlock

You can unlock the SIM card.

- 1. Touch Home) > Menu > System settings > System update.
- 2. Check the **UICC Unlock** check box.
