Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg.*

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions specified by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified by the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government-adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon availability of accessories and FCC requirements. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF emission guidelines. * In the United States and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

Optimize your Phone's Performance

Use the instructions in this guide to learn how to optimize the performance and life of your phone and battery.

Air Bags

If you have an air bag, DO NOT place installed or portable phone equipment or other objects over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If equipment is not properly installed, you and your passengers risk serious injury.

Medical devices

Pacemakers—Warning to pacemaker wearers: Wireless phones, when in the 'on' position, have been shown to interfere with pacemakers. The phone should be kept at least six (6) inches away from the pacemaker to reduce risk.

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association and the wireless technology research community recommend that you follow these guidelines to minimize the potential for interference.

- Always keep the phone at least six inches (15 centimeters) away from your pacemaker when the phone is turned on.
- Do not carry your phone near your heart.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn off your phone immediately.

Hearing aids—Some digital wireless phones may interfere with hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider or call the customer service line to discuss alternatives.

Other medical devices—If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of the device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to help you obtain this information.

In health care facilities—Turn your phone off in health care facilities when instructed. Hospitals and health care facilities may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy.

Potentially unsafe areas

Posted facilities—Turn your phone off in any facility when posted notices require you to do so.

Aircraft—FCC regulations prohibit using your phone on a plane that is in the air. Turn your phone off or switch it to Airplane Mode before boarding aircraft.

Vehicles—RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer of the device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy.

Blasting areas—Turn off your phone where blasting is in progress. Observe restrictions, and follow any regulations or rules.

Potentially explosive atmospheres—Turn off your phone when you are in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or death. Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked.

They include:

- fueling areas such as gas stations
- below deck on boats
- transfer or storage facilities for fuel or chemicals
- vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas, such as propane or butane
- areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders
- any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine

Use with care

Use only in normal position (to ear). Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on the phone.

Avoid magnetic environments

Keep the phone away from magnets which can cause improper functioning of the phone.

Keep your phone dry

Keep the phone dry. Damage can result if the phone gets wet. Water damage is not covered under warranty.

Resetting the phone

If the screen seems frozen and the keypad does not respond to key presses, reset the phone by completing the following steps:

1. Remove the battery cover.
2. Remove and replace the battery.

If the problem persists, return the phone to the dealer for service.

Accessories

Use only Kyocera-approved accessories with Kyocera phones. Use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and will void the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Radio Frequency (RF) energy

Your telephone is a radio transmitter and receiver. When it is on, it receives and sends out RF energy. Your service provider's network controls the power of the RF signal. This power level can range from 0.006 to 0.6 watts.

In August 1996, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for hand-held wireless phones. These guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies in the following reports:

- ANSI C95.1 (American National Standards Institute, 1992)
- NCRP Report 86 (National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements, 1986)
- ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection, 1996)

Your phone complies with the standards set by these reports and the FCC guidelines.

E911 mandates

Where service is available, this handset complies with the Phase I and Phase II E911 Mandates issued by the FCC.

Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) with Mobile Phones

Some mobile phones and hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), when used together, result in buzzing, humming, or whining noises detected by the user.

Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed ratings for some of their mobile phones, to assist hearing device users in finding phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated.

Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label on the box. The ratings are not guarantees and results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings—Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

T-Ratings—Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Hearing devices may also be measured for immunity to this type of interference. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you choose the proper rating for your mobile phone. The more immune your hearing aid is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from mobile phones.

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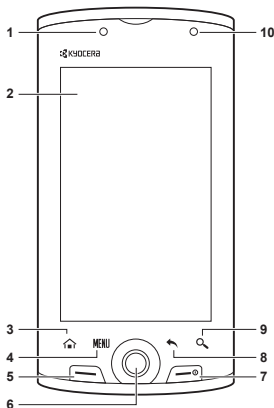

Phone Overview

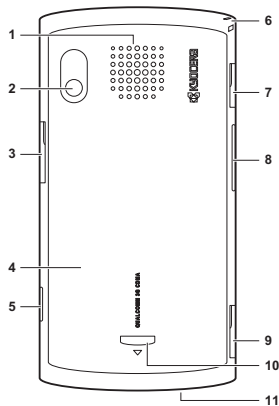
Front Panel

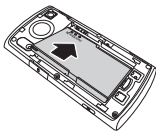

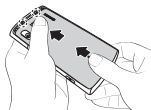
Phone Battery

Install the Battery

1. Hold the phone face down.
2. Using your thumbnail, press and hold the latch to release lock then slide the back cover down to remove.
3. Insert the battery with the metal contacts facing those on the device.

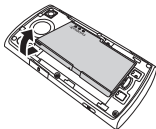


4. To replace the back cover, align then slide the back cover until it snaps into place.



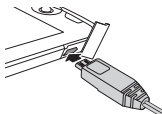
Remove the Battery

1. Make sure the device is turned off.
2. Remove the back cover.
3. Insert your finger into the grip then lift to remove the battery.



Charge the Battery

1. Connect the AC adapter to the USB connector on the side of the device.
2. Plug the adapter into a wall outlet.



The LED indicator and the battery icon in the upper-right corner of the screen indicate the battery status:

LED Indicator	Battery icon	Battery status
Solid RED		Battery is charging
Flashing RED		Battery is low.
Solid GREEN		Battery is fully charged.

You must have at least a partial charge in the battery to make or receive calls. You can safely recharge the battery at any time, even if it has a partial charge.

Warning:

- Do not remove the battery while it is charging.
- Always remove the AC adapter from the wall outlet first before removing the USB cable from the device.

Battery Safety Guidelines

- Do not disassemble or open the battery.
- Do not crush, bend, deform, puncture, or shred the battery.
- Do not attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery.
- Do not immerse the battery or expose it to water or other liquids. Even if a battery appears to dry out and operate normally, internal parts can slowly corrode and pose a safety hazard.
- Always keep the battery between 15 °C and 25 °C (59 °F and 77 °F). Do not expose the battery to extremes of temperature (heat or cold), fire, or other hazards such as a cooking surface, iron, or radiator.
- Never use any damaged battery.
- Only use the battery for its intended phone.
- Only use the battery with a qualified charger. Use of an unqualified battery charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If you are unsure about whether a charger is qualified, contact customer support.
- Do not short-circuit the battery or allow metallic conductive objects—such as keys, coins, or jewelry—to contact the battery’s terminals.

- Replace the battery only with another qualified battery. Use of an unqualified battery may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If you are unsure about whether a replacement battery is compatible, contact customer support.
- Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations and recycle if possible. Do not dispose as household waste.
- Supervise all battery usage by children.
- Avoid dropping the phone or battery. If the phone or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, an internal short-circuit can occur and pose a safety hazard. If you suspect battery damage, take it to a service center for inspection.
- Improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard.

Common Causes of Battery Drain

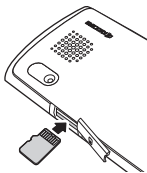
- Playing games or using the Web.
- Keeping backlighting on.
- Operating when far away from a base station or cell site.
- Using data cables or accessories.
- Operating when no service is available, or service is available intermittently.
- High earpiece and ringer volume settings.
- Repeating sound, vibration, or lighted alerts.

Storage Card

You can use a compatible microSD[®] card for more storage space to save your photos, videos, and other files.

Install the Storage Card

1. Open the storage card slot cover.
2. Insert the microSD[®] card into the slot with the metal contacts facing the back of the device.
3. Push the microSD[®] card until it snaps into place.



Remove the Storage Card

1. Open the storage card slot cover.
2. Push the microSD[®] card into the slot to eject card.

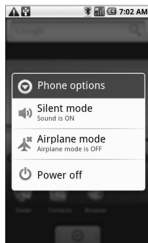
Turn the Device ON or OFF

Turn the Device ON


To turn the device on, press and hold the **End** key.

Turn the Device OFF

1. Press and hold the **End** key. The phone options window appears.
2. Touch **Power off** to turn the device off.




Set Device to Silent Mode

1. Press and hold the **End** key. The phone options window appears.
2. Touch **Silent mode**. The silent mode icon  appears on the status bar.

To undo silent mode, repeat the above steps.

Set Device to Airplane Mode

1. Press and hold the **End** key. The phone options window appears.
2. Touch **Airplane mode**. The airplane mode icon  appears on the status bar.

To undo airplane mode, repeat the above steps.

Lock or Unlock the Device

To avoid the screen from accidentally being touched, lock the touch screen.

Lock the Touch Screen

Press the **End** key to lock the touch screen. The backlight turns off.

Unlock the Touch Screen

Press the **End** key, then slide the triangle to the right to unlock the touch screen.

Navigate Your Device

Use the Touch Panel

- **Touch:** Touch the screen panel with your finger to highlight or select an item on screen.
- **Touch and Hold:** Touch and hold an item to open its options windows.
- **Drag:** Touch and hold an item then drag your finger to move the item.
- **Slide or swipe:** Touch and drag your finger across the screen to scroll or view more items.
- **Change Orientation:** By default, the screen orientation, from portrait to landscape, is automatically changed by turning the phone sideways. See “Enable Orientation” on page 89.

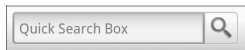
Use the Trackball


- Roll the trackball up, down, left, or right to highlight items on screen.
- Press the trackball to confirm a selection or open more windows.

Use the Search key

Use the Search function to search information, such as Contacts, Videos, and others on your device or on the Internet.

1. Touch **Search**. The Quick Search Box is highlighted.



2. Enter the information you want to search. As you type, matching information from your device is displayed on screen.
3. To select a matched item, touch the item. To browse the Internet using Google™ search, touch .

Adjust the Volume

Your device has 4 adjustable volumes:

- **Ringer volume:** Volume level of phone ring and other alert sounds.
- **Media volume:** Volume level when playing media files.
- **In-call volume:** Volume level of phone conversation.

You can adjust the ringer volume from the Home screen, the media volume while playing music or videos, and the in-call volume during a phone call. To adjust the volume, press the **Volume** key up or down.

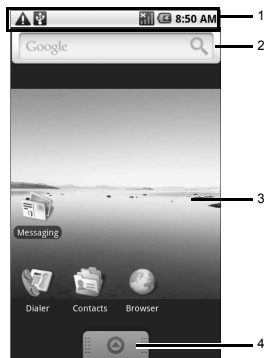
2 The Basics

Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for all applications. You can access applications, view call notifications and battery or connection status.

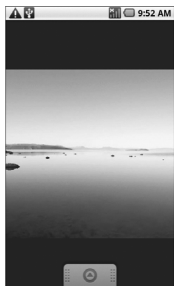
1. **Status Bar**
 - Displays notification and phone status icons.
 - Touch and hold to display the device date.
 - Slide down to display the notifications panel.
2. **Google or Quick Search Bar:** Allows users to enter text for a quick search in the device or browse in the Internet.
3. **Main Home Screen**
 - Displays shortcut icons.
 - Touch an icon to open the application.
4. **Applications Tab:** Slide upwards to display a list of applications installed in the device.

Note: From any application screen, touch **Home** to go back to the Home screen.

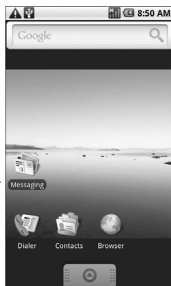

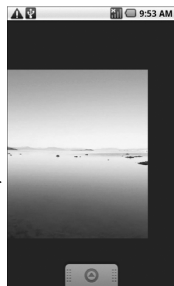
From the Home screen, slide your finger horizontally across the screen to view the left or right extended Home screen.

Use Menu to Customize the Home Screen

1. Touch **Home** > **Menu**.
2. Touch one of the following:
 - **Add**: Select to add items to the Home screen. See “Add an Item” on page 18.
 - **Wallpaper**: Select to change the wallpaper. See “Change the Wallpaper” on page 18.
 - **Search**: Select to search for files, folders, contacts, and other information on your device or on the web.
 - **Notifications**: Select to display the notifications panel. See “Notifications

Panel” on page 21.

- **Settings**: Select to open the Settings screen. See “Settings Menu” on page 84.

Reposition an Item



1. Touch and hold the item that you want to reposition. The item becomes moveable.
2. Drag the item to the desired location.
3. Release your finger to finalize repositioning.

Note: To reposition the item to the extended Home screen, drag the item to the edge of the screen until the Home screen extends. Then release your finger to reposition the item to your desired location.

Add an Item

1. Touch **Home** > **Menu**, then touch **Add**. The **Add to Home** screen appears.
2. Select the type of item you want to add:
 - **Shortcuts:** Select to add a shortcut to an application, a bookmarked web page, or a music playlist.
 - **Cox Clips:** Select to add a tool such as the clock, calendar, or the music bar.
 - **Folders:** Select to add a folder to organize your home screen items. See “Create a Folder” on page 18.
 - **Wallpapers:** Select to change the wallpaper of the Home screen. See “Change the Wallpaper” on page 18.

Remove an Item

1. Touch and hold the item that you want to remove. The item becomes moveable and the applications tab icon changes into .
2. Drag the item to .
3. When the item and the icon turns red, release your finger.

Change the Wallpaper

1. Touch **Home** > **Menu**, then touch **Wallpaper**.
2. Touch either of the following:
 - **Pictures:** Select to use saved or captured pictures on your device. You can crop the picture before setting it as wallpaper. See “Crop Pictures” on page 65.
 - **Wallpaper gallery:** Select to use preset wallpapers that came with your device.
3. Touch **Save** or **Set wallpaper**.

Create a Folder

1. Touch **Home** > **Menu**, then touch **Add** > **Folders**.
2. On the **Select folder** screen, touch:
 - **New folder:** Select to create a new folder with no items inside.
 - **All contacts:** Select to create a Contacts folder.
 - **Contacts with phone numbers:** Select to create a folder of Contacts that have phone numbers.
 - **Starred contacts:** Select to create a folder of Favorite Contacts.

Rename the folder

1. Touch the folder to open it.
2. Touch and hold the title bar of the folder.
The **Rename folder** screen appears.
3. Enter the desired folder name.
4. Touch **OK** when done.

Add items on the Home screen to the folder

1. Touch and hold the item. The item becomes moveable.
2. Drag the item to the folder.

Access items inside the folder

1. Touch the folder to open it.
2. Touch the icon of the application you want to access.

Remove an item or the folder

Notifications Panel

Open the notifications panel

Touch and hold the status bar, then slide downwards to open the notifications panel.



- Touch the notification to open the related application.
- Touch **Clear** to clear all notifications

Close the notifications panel

Touch and hold the bottom bar of the notifications panel, then slide upwards to close it.

The applications tab contains pre-installed and downloaded applications. The following table shows the applications that come with your device.

Applications	Description
Alarm Clock	Allows you to set multiple alarms.
Browser	Allows you to browse the Internet.
Calculator	Allows you to perform basic mathematical functions.
Calendar	Allows you to schedule appointments and set reminders.
Camcorder	Allows you to record videos.
Camera	Allows you to take photos.
Contacts	Allows you to create and store Contact information on your device.
Dialer	Used to make calls.
Email	Allows you to access your POP3 or IMAP based email accounts on your device.
File Browser	Manages files and folders stored in the device memory and the storage card.
Gallery	Organizes media files and allows you to view pictures and playback videos stored in the storage card.
Messaging	Allows you to send and receive text and multimedia messages.
Music	Allows you to play music files by artists, albums or playlists.
Notepad	Allows you to create and save notes.
Sound Recorder	Allows you to record voice.
Videos	Allows you to playback videos.

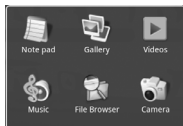

Text Entry

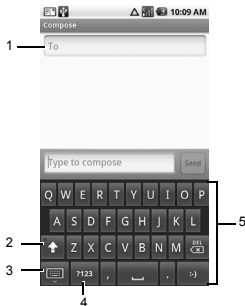
When you open an application that requires text or numeric entry, you can enter information using the on-screen keyboard.

Your device has the following on-screen keyboards: **QWERTY**, **Numeric & Symbol**, and **Phone Keypad**. The keyboard that is displayed depends on the type of information required.

QWERTY Keyboard

The QWERTY keyboard is activated whenever an alphanumeric entry is required. The keyboard layout looks similar to a computer keyboard.



1. **Text entry field**
2. **Upper case key**
 - Touch once to type an upper case letter.
 - Touch again to enable Caps lock.
3. **Hide keyboard key**
4. **Switch to Numeric & Symbol keyboard key**
5. **QWERTY keyboard**





Use the QWERTY Keyboard





1. Touch the text entry field to display the keyboard.
2. Touch the keys to type letters.

Other keyboard functions:

	Touch once to type an upper case letter. Touch twice to turn on Caps Lock.
	Indicates Caps lock is turned on. Touch once to turn off Caps lock.

	Touch to delete a character. Touch and hold to continuously delete characters.
	Touch to hide keyboard.



Phone Keypad

Use Landscape Keyboard

For added convenience, you can turn the phone sideways to switch to a landscape keyboard. This brings out a wider keyboard and allows you to type by using two thumbs.

Note: To use this feature, ensure that the **Orientation** box is checked in **Home > Menu > Settings > Sound & display**.

Input Method

From applications that require text entry, such as Messaging, use the copy and paste functions to copy and paste text from one application to another.

1. Open the application that you want to copy text from.
2. Touch and hold the text body to display the options menu.
3. Touch **Copy text** to copy the text.
4. Open the application that you want to paste the text to.

5. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the text.
6. Touch **Paste**.

Copy Text from Web Page

1. When viewing a web page, touch **Menu > More > Select text**.
2. Touch and drag your finger to highlight the text that you want to copy.
3. Lift your finger to copy the highlighted text to the clipboard.
4. Open the application that you want to paste the selected text to.
5. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the text.
6. Touch **Paste**.

Copy a URL

1. To copy a URL, touch and hold the URL to display the options menu.
2. Touch **Copy link URL**.
3. Open the application that you want to paste the URL to.
4. Touch and hold the text box where you want to paste the URL.

1. Page tabs

Call Using a Number

1. On the **Dialer** screen, touch the keypad to enter number.
2. Press the **Send** key or touch the **Call** tab.

Note: To save the dialed number to Contacts, touch **Menu** > **Add to contacts**.

Call a Number from Call Log

1. On the **Dialer** screen, touch the **Call log** tab.
2. Touch a name or number from the list.
3. Press the **Send** key.

Call a Contact

1. On the **Dialer** screen, touch the **Contacts** tab.
2. Touch desired contact.
3. Press the **Send** key.

Call a Favorite Contact

1. On the **Dialer** screen, touch the **Favorites** tab.
2. Touch desired favorite contact.
3. Press the **Send** key.

Call a Number with Pause

Use the Pause function to send DTMF tones from your phone. Your phone supports two types of pauses:

- **Hard Pause:** Add a hard pause to indicate that the succeeding numbers are DTMF tones. For every hard pause, a message appears to confirm whether to send the tones.
 - **2-sec Pause:** This is a 2-second interval in sending DTMF tones. To increase the interval, add a succession of 2-sec pause. For example, to have an interval of 4 seconds, add two 2-sec pause.
1. On the **Dialer** screen, touch the keypad to enter number to call.
 2. To add a hard pause, touch **Menu > Hard Pause**. The letter **P** appears to indicate the hard pause location.
 3. Touch the keypad again to enter number of the DTMF tone.
 4. To add a 2-sec pause, touch **Menu > 2-sec Pause**. The letter **T** appears to indicate the 2-sec pause location.
 5. Touch the keypad to enter number of the DTMF tone that you want to send after the 2-sec pause.

Note: Repeat the above procedures to add more pauses.

6. Press the **Send** key. Your phone dials the number before the first hard pause then sends the DTMF tones upon confirmation.

Call a Number with Prepend

Prepend is used to add prefix numbers in front of a phone number. For example, if your contact entry is saved without an area code and you are out of town, use the prepend function to add the area code before calling the number.

1. On the **Dialer** screen, touch the **Call log** tab.
2. Touch and hold a name or number from the list.
3. Touch **Prepend**.
4. Touch the keypad to enter the number you want to add before the phone number.
5. Press the **Send** key.

The following numbers can also be added to use their function:

- To call the voicemail of the person you are calling directly, dial **11 + phone number**.
- To hide your phone number from the person you are calling to, dial **67 + phone number**.

Answer or Reject Phone Calls

When a call comes in, the phone rings or vibrates and a message is displayed on screen. The phone number of the caller appears. If the caller is listed in your Contacts, the contact's name appears.

Answer a Phone Call

Press the **Send** key.

Reject a Phone Call

Press the **End** key.

Speak Incoming Caller ID

Your phone will speak the incoming caller ID.

1. Touch **Menu** > **Settings** > **Text to Speech** > **Speak incoming caller ID**.
2. Touch **On**.

Call Options

Other options are available during a phone call.

Put a Call on Hold

Touch **Menu** > **Hold** to put a call on hold.
Touch **Hold** again to resume the call.

Mute the Microphone

Touch **Menu** > **Mute** to toggle between turning the microphone on or off.

Use the Speakerphone

Touch **Menu** > **Speaker** to toggle between turning the speaker on or off.

Use In-call Touch Lock

Use the **In-call touch lock** to avoid accidentally touching the screen or the keys on your phone during a call.

To Manually Lock the Screen

Touch and slide the arrow to the left.

To Unlock the Screen

Touch and slide the arrow to the right.

End Phone Calls

To end a call, press the **End** key.

Use Call Log

The **Call log** tab lists all the dialed numbers, missed, and received calls.

From the Call log tab, you can call a name or number on the list, view the contact information, edit the number, or send SMS message.

1. Press the **Send** key, then touch the **Call log** tab.
2. Do one of the following:
 - Touch a name or number on the list to call.

- Touch and hold a name or number to display the options menu:
 - **Call [name/number]**: Touch to return the phone call.
 - **View contact**: Touch to view the contact information.
 - **Add to contacts**: Touch to save the number to Contacts.
 - **Edit number before call**: Touch to edit the number then call the number.
 - **Send SMS message**: Touch to send an SMS message to the name or number.
 - **Remove from call log**: Touch to delete the call information from call log.
- Touch **Menu > Clear call log** to clear the Call log.

4 Contacts

Use **Contacts** to store names, phone numbers, e-mail addresses, and other information.

To access **Contacts**:

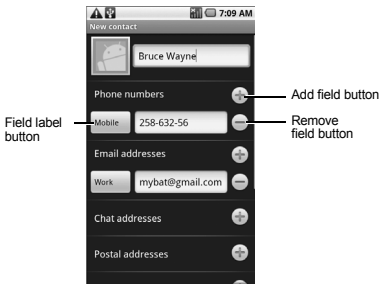

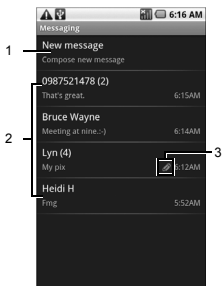

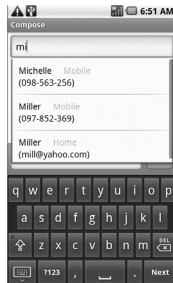

6. When done, touch **Send**.

Create an MMS Message

An MMS message can contain text, numbers, symbols, subject, pictures, videos, and audio files. You can only send an MMS message to recipients with devices capable of MMS service or to email addresses.

1. From the **Messaging** screen, touch **New message**.
 2. Touch the **To** field, then type the recipient's name, number, or e-mail address. As you type the letters, numbers, or e-mail address, matching Contacts are displayed on the screen.
 - To use the desired Contact, touch the Contact.
 - To add more recipients, repeat step 2.
 3. Touch **Type to compose** to activate the keyboard.
 4. Type your message.
 5. To attach a file, touch **Menu > Attach**, then select one of the following:
 - **Pictures:** Touch to attach a picture.
 - **Capture picture:** Touch to capture an image to attach using the device camera.
 - **Videos:** Touch to attach a video.
 - **Capture video:** Touch to record a video to attach using the device camcorder.
 - **Audio:** Touch to attach an audio file.
 - **Record audio:** Touch to record audio to attach.
 - **Slideshow:** Touch to attach a slide.
- Note:** See “Attach Files to Messages” below for more details.
6. To add a subject, touch **Menu > Add Subject**. Touch the **Subject** field, and type the subject.
 7. To access more features, touch **Menu** then the option:
 - **Call:** Touch to call the recipient.
 - **View Contact:** Touch to view the recipient's contact information.
 - **Insert Smiley:** Touch to open the **Insert smiley** window and touch the image to insert.
 - To discard message, touch **Menu > Discard**.
 - To save message as draft and close the compose message screen, touch **Menu > All threads**.
 8. When done, touch **Send**.

Attach Files to Messages

You can attach files such as pictures, videos, and audio to your messages. When files are attached to a text message, the device automatically converts the message into an MMS message.

3. Touch the thumbnail of desired picture to attach.
4. Do one of the following:
 - To view the attached picture, touch **View**.

Capture Pictures to Attach

1. From the compose message screen, touch **Menu > Attach**.
2. Touch **Capture picture** to activate the camera.

Attach Videos

2. Touch **Videos**.
3. Touch the thumbnail of desired video to attach.

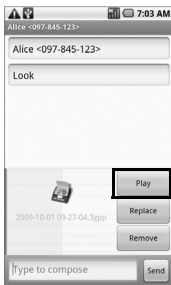

Delivery Reports

Touch to enable or disable this option if you want to receive a report of the delivery status of your message.

MMS Settings

Delivery Reports

Touch to enable or disable this option if you want to receive a report of the delivery status of your multimedia message.

Read Reports

Touch to enable or disable this option if you want to receive a report whether each recipient has read or has deleted your message without reading it.

Auto-retrieve

Touch to enable or disable this option if you want to automatically retrieve multimedia messages completely. When selected, the MMS header, body, and attachments are automatically downloaded to your device. If this option is disabled, only the message header is retrieved.

Roaming Auto-retrieve

Touch to enable or disable this option if you want to automatically retrieve multimedia messages completely while roaming.

Notification Settings

Notifications

Touch to enable or disable this option if you want to receive a notification on the status bar when a new message is received.

Select Ringtone

This option allows you to set the ringtone when a new message is received.

1. Touch this option to open the Ringtones window.
2. Touch a ringtone to play it briefly.
3. Touch **OK** to select ringtone.

Vibrate

Touch to enable or disable this option if you want to the device to vibrate when a new message is received.

Use Email

Email allows you to add external POP3 or IMAP email accounts from web-based email service providers such as Yahoo!™ Mail, AOL, or Hotmail.

To access **Email**, touch **Home**, open the applications tab, touch **Email**.

Add Email Accounts

1. Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Email**.
2. Follow the on-screen instructions, touch **Next**.
3. Touch the **Email address** box, then type your email address.
4. Touch **Next** on the keyboard.

 - **Sender (A-Z/Z-A)**: Select to alphabetically sort email messages by sender.
 - **Size (Largest/Smallest)**: Select to sort email by file size.
3. Touch **OK**.

Delete Messages

1. On the email account inbox, touch and hold the email you want to delete.
2. On the options menu, touch **Delete**.
3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Delete Email Accounts

1. Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Email**.
2. Touch and hold the email account you want to delete.
3. On the options menu, touch **Delete account**.
4. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Email Account Settings

1. Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Email**.
2. Touch and hold the email account you want to edit.
3. On the options menu, touch **Settings**.
4. Touch one of the following to adjust settings:
 - **Account info**: Select to change the name, email address, password, or description.
 - **General settings**: Select to set the font size when reading emails, enable or disable signature. Touch **Signature** to enter the signature.
 - **Send & receive**: Select to set the file size limit when receiving emails, the frequency and number of emails when checking for new mail from the server.
 - **Notification settings**: Select to set email notification settings.
5. Touch **Back** to save your changes.

Use Gmail (Google Mail)

Gmail or **Google Mail** (hereinafter referred to as Gmail) is the web-based email service provided by Google. Gmail comes preconfigured on your device. You can synchronize your Gmail account on your device with your Gmail account on the web.

To access **Gmail**, touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Gmail**.

Refresh Gmail

The Inbox displays all received email messages on your Gmail account.

Touch **Menu > Refresh** to send or receive new emails and synchronize your emails with your Gmail web account.

Create and Send Emails

1. From the Inbox, touch **Menu > Compose**.
2. On the **To** field, enter the recipient's email address. To send to multiple recipients, separate the email addresses with a comma and add as many recipients as you want.
 - To add a carbon copy (Cc) or blind carbon copy (Bcc), touch **Menu > Add Cc/Bcc**.
3. Enter the subject and compose your email.
4. Touch **Send**.

Attach Picture File to Emails

1. On the compose email screen, touch **Menu > Attach**.
2. Select the picture you want to attach.
3. Touch **OK**.
4. Complete your email.
5. Touch **Send**.

Remove Attached File

To remove the attachment, touch the **x** button next to the filename.

Add Signature to Emails

1. From the Inbox, touch **Menu > Settings > Signature**.
2. On the text box, type your signature.
3. Touch **OK**.

View Sent Messages

From the Inbox, touch **Menu > View labels > Sent**.

Save Email as Draft

On the compose email screen, touch the **Back** button to automatically save the email as a draft.

View Draft Emails

From the Inbox, touch **Menu > View labels > Drafts** to display your draft email messages.

Receive and Read Emails

When new email messages are received, a message is displayed briefly and a new email message icon appears on the status bar.

Email messages you send to and receive from the same recipient are grouped as message threads or conversation.

Open and Read Received Emails

To view emails, do one of the following:

- Touch **Home**, then slide down the status bar to open the notifications panel. Touch the new email to open and read it.
- From the Inbox, touch the email message to open and read it.

Note: Unread messages are bolded.

Reply to Sender

1. From the Inbox, touch to open and view the email message.
2. Scroll down to the end of the message thread, then touch **Reply**.
3. Type your reply message.
4. Scroll down to the end of the message, then touch **Send**.

Reply to All Recipients

1. From the Inbox, touch to open and view the email message.
2. Scroll down to the end of the message thread, then touch **Reply to all**.
3. Type your reply message.
4. Scroll down to the end of the message, then touch **Send**.

Forward Emails

1. From the Inbox, touch to open and view the email message.
2. Scroll down to the end of the message thread, then touch **Forward**.
3. On the **To** field, enter the recipient's email address. To send to multiple recipients, separate the email addresses with a comma and add as many recipients as you want.
4. Scroll down to the end of the message, then touch **Send**.

Handle Emails

Search for Emails

You can search emails by sender, subject or label.

1. From the Inbox, touch **Menu > Search**.
2. Touch the search box, then type the words to search.
3. Touch **Search**.

Archive Email Messages

1. In the message thread, touch the email header or message.
2. Touch **Menu > Archive**.

Display Archived Emails

From the Inbox, touch **Menu > View labels > All mail**.

Add or Remove Star on Emails

1. In the message thread, touch the email header or message.
2. Touch **Menu > Add star** or **Remove star** to add or remove star.

Mark Emails Read or Unread

1. In the message thread, touch the email header or message.
2. Touch **Menu > Mark read** or **Mark unread**. Unread messages or threads appear in bold in the Inbox.

Change Labels

1. In the message thread, touch the email header or message.
2. Touch **Menu > Change labels** to add or change the label of the conversation.

Note: You cannot use the device to create labels. This can only be done on Gmail's web site.

Delete Emails

1. In the message thread, touch the email header or message.
2. Touch **Menu > Delete** to delete the email message.

Mute Emails

1. In the message thread, touch the email header or message.
2. Touch **Menu > More > Mute** to keep all future additions to the message thread out of your Inbox.

Report Spam Emails

1. In the message thread, touch the email header or message.
2. Touch **Menu > Report spam** to report the email message as spam.

Handle Email Message Threads

Open and Read Message Threads

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. Touch **Read**.

Archive Message Threads

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. On the options menu, touch **Archive**.

Display Archived Message Threads

From the Inbox, touch **Menu > View labels > All Mail**.

Mute Message Threads

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. On the options menu, touch **Mute** to keep all future additions to the message thread out of your Inbox.

Mark Emails Read or Unread

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. On the options menu, touch **Mark read** or **Mark unread**. Unread messages appear in bold in the Inbox.

Delete Message Threads

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. On the options menu, touch **Delete**.
3. Touch **OK** to delete the email message.

Add or Remove Star on Message Threads

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. On the options menu, touch **Add star** or **Remove star** to add or remove star on the message thread.

Change Labels

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. On the options menu, touch **Change labels** to add or change the label of the message thread.

Note: You cannot use the device to create labels. This can only be done on Gmail's web site.

Report Spam Message Threads

1. From the Inbox, touch and hold the message thread.
2. On the options menu, touch **Report spam** to report the message threads as spam.

Gmail Account Settings

1. From the Inbox, touch **Menu** > **Settings**.
2. Touch one of the following to change the settings:
 - **Signature**: Select to enter a signature that is added at the end of the emails.
 - **Confirm delete**: Select to show a confirmation box when you delete a message thread.
 - **Batch operations**: Select to show the batch operations features, such as: archive, delete, or apply a label to multiple emails at once.
 - **Labels**: Select to set which Gmail labels to synchronize.
 - **Email notifications**: Select to show a notification icon on the status bar when you receive a new email.
 - **Select ringtone**: Select if you want the device to ring when a new email is received. On the ringtone menu, touch a ringtone to play the tone briefly, then touch **OK** to confirm selection. Select **Silent** if you do not want the device to ring when a new email is received.
 - **Vibrate**: Select if you want the device to vibrate when a new email is received.
3. Touch **Back** to save your changes.

Use Google Talk

Google Talk is the instant messaging program provided by Google. Google Talk lets you chat with other people that also have a Google account. Your Google Talk account is based on the Gmail account set on your device.

Sign In and Chat

Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Google Talk** to open Google Talk.

Add New Friends

You can only add people who have a Google account.

1. On the Friends list screen, touch **Menu** > **Add friend**.
2. Enter the Google Talk ID or the Gmail email address of the person you want to add.
3. Touch **Send invitation**.

View and Accept Invitations

1. On the Friends list screen, touch **Menu** > **Invites**. The pending invitations screen lists all chat invitations that you have sent or received.
2. Touch a pending invitation, then touch **Accept** or **Decline**.

Note: When a person accepts your invitation, that invitation disappears from the pending invitation list.

Change Online Status and Message

1. On the Friends list screen, touch the online status icon that appears beside your name.
2. Touch the status that you want from the menu.
3. Touch the text box on the right of your online status icon, then type your desired status message.
4. Touch **Enter** on the on-screen keyboard.

Start a Chat

1. Touch a friend on the Friends list.
2. Touch the text box, then type your message.
3. Touch **Send**.

Switch Between Active Chats

You can conduct multiple chats at the same time and switch between active chats.

1. Either on the Friends list screen or a chat screen, touch **Menu > Switch chats**.
2. On the panel, touch the friend you want to chat with.

Close a Chat

Do one of the following:

- On the Friends list screen, touch and hold a friend. On the options menu, touch **End chat**.
- On a chat screen, touch **Menu > End chat**.

Manage Your Friends

Friends on the friends list screen are sorted according to their online status and are listed alphabetically.

View Friends List

By default, only the friends that you frequently chat with are displayed on the friends list screen.

To list all your friends, touch **Menu > All friends**.

To display only the friends that you frequently chat with, touch **Menu > Most popular**.

Find Friends

On the Friends list screen, enter the name of your friend to filter the list and show only the friends with names matching what you have entered.

Block Friends

You can block friends from sending you messages. Blocked friends are removed from your friends list.

1. On the Friends list screen, touch and hold the name of the friend you want to block.
2. On the options menu, touch **Block friend**. That friend is removed from your friends list and is added to the blocked friends list.

Unblock Friends

1. On the Friends list screen, touch **Menu** > **Blocked**.
2. On the Blocked Friends list, touch the name of the friend you want to unblock.
3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Pin Friends

Pin friends to ensure that they always appear on the your Most Popular friends list.

1. On the Friends list screen, touch and hold the name of the friend you want to pin.
2. On the options menu, touch **Pin friend**.

Unpin Friends

1. On the Friends list screen, touch and hold the name of the friend you want to unpin.
2. On the options menu, touch **Unpin friend**.

Mobile Indicators

Check Friends' Device

You can check what device your friends use to chat in Google Talk.

- If an Android icon appears on the right of your friend's name, it indicates that your friend is using an Android phone.
- If no icon is displayed, it indicates that your friend is using a computer.

Display Mobile Indicator

You can choose to show a mobile indicator along with your name to let your friends know the type of mobile device you are using.

1. On the Friends list screen, touch **Menu** > **More** > **Settings**.
2. Touch **Mobile indicator**, then touch **Back**.

Sign Out

On the Friends list screen, touch **Menu** > **More** > **Sign out** to sign out from Google Talk.

Google Talk Settings

1. On the Friends list screen, touch **Menu** > **More** > **Settings**.
2. Touch one of the following to change the settings:
 - **IM notifications:** Select to receive a notification on the status bar when a new instant message is received.
 - **Select ringtone:** Select if you want the device to ring when a new instant message is received. On the ringtone menu, touch a ringtone to play the tone briefly, then touch **OK** to confirm selection. Select **Silent** if you do not want the device to ring when a new instant message is received.

- **Vibrate:** Select if you want the device to vibrate when a new instant message is received.
- **Automatically sign in:** Select to automatically sign in to Google Talk every time you turn on your device.

6 Make Connections

Connect to the Internet

Your device can connect to the Internet using Wi-Fi connections.

Connect via Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet connection when connected to a wireless access point within a 100-meter distance.

Note: The availability and range of Wi-Fi varies depending on environmental obstructions through which the signal passes.

Turn On Wi-Fi

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Wireless controls**.
2. Touch the **Wi-Fi** check box to turn on Wi-Fi. The device scans for available wireless networks.

Connect to a Wireless Network

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Wireless controls**.
2. Touch **Wi-Fi settings** to view the network name and security settings of available wireless networks under the Wi-Fi networks list.

3. Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to.
 - If you select an open network, your device will automatically be connected.
 - If you select a network that is secured with WPA or WEP, enter the WPA or WEP key, then touch **Connect**.

Note: The next time your device connects to a previously accessed secured network, you will not be prompted for the security key again.

Connect to Another Wi-Fi Network

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings**.
2. Under Wi-Fi networks, do one of the following:
 - Touch an available Wi-Fi network to connect to.
 - Touch **Add Wi-Fi network** if the network you want to connect to is not on the list. Enter the **Network SSID** and **Security**, then touch **Save**.
 - Touch **Menu > Scan** to manually scan for available Wi-Fi networks.

Check the Wireless Network Status

Do one of the following to check the connection status of a wireless network:

- Check if the Wi-Fi icon appears on the status bar. The lighted bars indicate the signal strength.
- Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Wireless controls > Wi-Fi settings**, and the wireless network that the device is currently connected to. The Wi-Fi network name, status, speed, signal strength, security, and IP address are displayed.

Use Browser

Use **Browser** to surf the Internet on your device.

Launch Browser

Do one of the following:

- Touch **Home > Browser**.
- Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, touch **Browser**.
- Touch a web link in an email message or text message.

Open Web Pages

1. Launch **Browser**.
2. Touch **Menu > Go**.
3. Type the web page address. As you type, matching web page addresses are displayed on screen. Touch an address to go directly

to the web page or continue typing the web page address.

4. Touch **Go**.

Set Your Home Page

1. Launch Browser.
2. Touch **Menu > More > Settings > Set home page**.
3. Enter the web page address that you want to set as your home page.
4. Touch **OK**.

Bookmark a Page

1. Launch Browser.
2. Go to the web page that you want to bookmark.
3. Touch **Menu > Bookmarks**.
4. On the **Bookmarks** tab, touch **Add bookmark**.
5. Edit the bookmark **Name** if necessary, then touch **OK**.

Open a Bookmark

1. Launch Browser.
2. Touch **Menu > Bookmarks**.
3. On the **Bookmarks** tab, do one of the following:
 - Touch the bookmark you want to open.
 - Touch and hold a bookmark name. On the options menu, touch **Open** or **Open in new window**.

Edit a Bookmark

1. Launch Browser.
2. Touch **Menu > Bookmarks**.
3. On the **Bookmarks** tab, touch and hold a bookmark name.
4. On the options menu, touch **Edit bookmark**.
5. Enter the changes and touch **OK**.

Navigate on Web Pages

Use the Trackball or slide your finger on the screen to navigate the areas of a web page.

Zoom In or Out on Web Pages

1. Touch the screen twice to display the zoom buttons.
2. Touch the + button to zoom in or the - button to zoom out on the web page.

Open a New Window

You can open a new browser window to easily view and switch between multiple web sites.

1. Launch Browser.
2. Touch **Menu > New window**.
3. Touch **Menu > Go** to enter a web page address or open a bookmark page.

Switch Between Windows

1. On a browser window, touch **Menu > Window**.
2. Touch the browser window you want to view.
3. To close a browser window, touch the **x** button on the browser window you want to close.

Find Text on Web Pages

Your device supports searching for text within web page.

1. On the browser window, touch **Menu > More > Find on page**.
2. Type the text you want to find. As you type, matching characters are highlighted in green.
 - Touch **Done** on the on-screen keyboard.
 - Touch the left or right arrows to go to the previous or next matching item.
3. Touch the **x** button to close the search bar.

Copy Text From Web Pages

You can highlight items on the web page and copy them to the clipboard.

1. On the browser window, touch **Menu > More > Select text**.
2. Touch and drag your finger to highlight the text that you want to copy. When you lift your finger, the highlighted text are automatically copied to the clipboard.

View Web Page Information

1. On the browser window, touch **Menu** > **More** > **Page info**.
2. The web page information is displayed. Touch **OK** to close the information window.

Share Web Page

1. On the browser window, touch **Menu** > **More** > **Share page**.
2. Select **Messaging** or **Gmail**.
3. The compose message screen appears. On the **To** box, enter the recipient's name, number or email address. As you type, matching Contacts appear on the screen. Touch a contact or continue typing.
4. Touch **Send** to send the web page address.

View Downloads

On the browser window, touch **Menu** > **More** > **Downloads** to display the download history list.

- Touch **Menu** > **Clear list**, to delete download history list.
- Touch **Menu** > **Cancel all downloads** to cancel current download process.

Close Browser

On the browser window, touch **Menu** > **Exit**.

Use Bluetooth

Bluetooth technology allows devices to wirelessly exchange information over a short distance of up to 32 feet.

Bluetooth operates in three modes:

- **On:** Bluetooth is turned on. Your device can detect other Bluetooth devices but other devices cannot detect your device.
- **Discoverable:** Bluetooth is turned on. Your device can detect other Bluetooth devices and other devices can also detect your device.
- **Off:** Bluetooth is turned off. Information cannot be sent or received when Bluetooth is turned off.

Turn On Bluetooth

1. Touch **Home** > **Menu** > **Settings** > **Wireless controls**.
2. Touch the **Bluetooth** check box to turn on Bluetooth.
3. To make your device discoverable, touch **Bluetooth settings**, then select **Discoverable** check box to enable other Bluetooth devices to detect your device.

Change Device Name

The device name is the name used to identify your device in a Bluetooth network.

1. Turn on Bluetooth.
2. On the **Wireless controls** screen, touch **Bluetooth settings > Device name**.
3. Type the name of your device.
4. Touch **OK**.

Pair and Connect to Bluetooth Devices

Before you can connect to other Bluetooth devices, you must pair the devices first.

1. Turn on Bluetooth.
2. On the **Wireless controls** screen, touch **Bluetooth settings > Scan for devices**.
Your device starts scanning for Bluetooth devices. All detected devices are displayed under **Bluetooth devices**.

Note: Make sure the device that you want to pair with has turned Bluetooth on and is discoverable.

3. To start pairing, touch the device name that you want to pair with.
4. If prompted, enter a passcode to start pairing. The same passcode must also be entered on the Bluetooth device.

Note: For car kits, try to enter “0000” or “1234”. If it does not work, consult the Bluetooth device’s documentation.

5. After pairing, touch and hold the paired device.
6. On the options menu, touch **Options > Connect**.
7. The pairing and connection status appears below the Bluetooth device name. When Bluetooth hands-free headsets or car kits are connected to your device, the Bluetooth connection icon appears on the status bar.

Note: Once a Bluetooth device has been paired, the devices will not prompt for passcode entry again.

Note: When a second headset is paired, the first headset is automatically disconnected.

Disconnect Bluetooth Devices

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings**.
2. Under the Bluetooth devices section, touch and hold the connected device.
3. On the options menu, touch **Disconnect**.

Unpair Bluetooth Devices

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings**.
2. Under the Bluetooth devices section, touch and hold the paired device.
3. On the options menu, touch **Unpair**.

Enable OPP/FTP

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings**.
2. Under the Bluetooth devices section, touch and hold the connected device.
3. On the options menu, touch **OPP/FTP**.

Connect to a Computer

You can connect your device to a computer to transfer pictures, videos, and music files. To do this, you must set the device's storage card as a USB drive.

Use the Storage Card as a USB Drive

1. Connect the device to the computer using the supplied USB cable. A notification icon appears on the status bar.
2. Touch the status bar and slide it downwards to open the notifications panel.
3. On the notifications panel, touch **USB connected**, then touch **Mount**.
4. Transfer files from your computer to your device or vice versa using copy and paste functions.

Note: When the storage device is mounted to the computer, your device will not recognize the storage card and you will not be able to use some of the applications such as Camera.

Turn Off USB Storage

1. Touch the status bar and slide it downwards to open the notifications panel.
2. Touch **Turn off USB storage**.
3. Touch **Turn Off**.

Remove the Storage Card

When you need to remove the storage card while the device is turned on, you must unmount the storage card first to avoid damaging the card or corrupting stored data.

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > SD card, USB mass storage & phone storage**.
2. Touch **Unmount SD card**.
3. Remove the storage card. See “Remove the Storage Card” on page 13.

7 Camera and Multimedia Applications

Camera and Camcorder

Your device has a camera which allows you to take pictures and videos.

- To take pictures, activate the **Camera**.
- To record videos, activate **Camcorder**.

Camera Tips

Before using your device's camera, here are some tips:

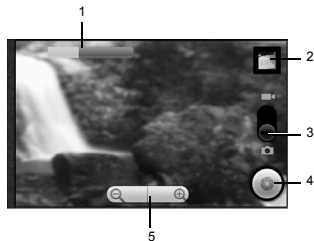
- You cannot activate the camera while on an active call or while browsing files in the gallery or playing videos.
- You cannot activate the camera when your device is connected to a PC and the storage card is recognized as a USB drive of the PC.
- If you get a low memory error, check the resolution and quality compression settings.
- Camera menu settings can only be accessed when the camera is active.

Activate the Camera

Do one of the following to activate the camera.

- Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, touch **Camera**.
- Press and hold the **Camera** key.

The screen automatically switches to landscape orientation.



1. Orange bar indicates the brightness level.
2. **Review** button
3. Slide to select capture mode
4. **Camera** button
5. Zoom control

Take Pictures

1. Activate the camera.
2. Frame your subject on the screen.
3. Scroll the trackball to adjust the brightness level.
4. Do one of the following to take the picture:
 - Press the **Camera** key.
 - Touch the **Camera** button on the screen.

Zoom Images

- To zoom in, touch the + button.
- To zoom out, touch the - button.

Preview Pictures

The **Review** screen allows you to delete, share, or assign the captured picture.


After taking a picture, touch the **Review** button to open the **Review** screen.

Touch one of the following buttons:

- **Delete:** Select to delete the captured picture from the storage card. Touch **OK** to confirm.
- **Share:** Select to send the captured image via MMS message, Gmail, or Bluetooth.
- **Set as:** Select to set the picture as a contact icon or wallpaper.
 - To set as a contact icon, touch **Contact icon** on the options menu. Touch a contact name to assign picture to. If necessary, crop the picture. Touch **Save** when done.
 - To set as the wallpaper, touch **Wallpaper** on the options menu. If necessary, crop the picture. Touch **Save** when done.
- **Done:** Select to go back to the finder screen.

Activate the Camcorder

Do one of the following to activate the camcorder.

- Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, touch **Camcorder**.
- Press the **Camera** key, then slide the slider to the Video icon .

The screen automatically switches to landscape orientation.



1. **Review** button
2. Slide to select capture mode
3. **Record** button

Record Videos

1. Activate the camcorder.
2. To start recording, press the **Camera** key or touch the **Record** button on the screen.
3. To stop recording, press the **Camera** key again or touch the **Stop** button on the screen.

Preview Videos

The **Review** screen allows you to delete, share, or playback the recorded video.

After recording, touch the **Review** button to open the **Review** screen.

Touch one of the following buttons:

- **Delete:** Select to delete the recorded video from the storage card. Touch **OK** to confirm.
- **Share:** Select to send the recorded video via MMS message, Gmail, or Bluetooth.
- **Play:** Select to playback video. Touch the playback buttons to rewind, pause, or forward playback.
- **Done:** Select to go back to the finder screen.

Capture Settings

You can access the capture settings both in **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode.

General Settings

Set Record Location

From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Store location in pictures** to record location in picture data.

Set JPEG Quality

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > JPEG Quality**.
2. On the options menu, touch the JPEG quality you prefer from **JPEG 55%** to **100%**.

Set Picture Size

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Picture Size**.
2. On the options menu, touch one of the following options: **3.2MP (2048x1536)**, **HD1080 (1920x1080)**, **UXGA (1600x1200)**, **XGA (1024x768)**, **VGA (640x480)**.

Set Recording Format

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings**.
2. Select **Video Recording in MPEG4 Format** check box to record videos in MPEG4 format. Uncheck to record videos in H263 format.

Set Video Quality

When you select a higher quality, the resulting size of the file is bigger.

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Select Video Quality**.
2. On the options menu, touch one of the following options: **WVGA (800*480)**, **VGA (640*480)**, **CIF (352*288)**, **QVGA (320*240)**, **QCIF (176*144)**.

Set Video Duration

You can set the maximum duration in recording a video. When the set video duration is reached, recording is automatically stopped.

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Select video duration**.
2. On the options menu, touch one of the following options:

Set White Balance

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > White Balance/Lighting**.
2. On the options menu, touch desired white balance setting: **Auto**, **Incandescent**, **Fluorescent**, **Daylight**, or **Cloudy**.

Add Effects

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Select effect**.
2. On the options menu, touch desired effect: **Off**, **Mono**, **Negative**, **Sepia**, or **Aqua**.

Enable or Disable Auto Focus

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Select focus mode**.
2. On the options menu, touch **AutoFocus On** or **AutoFocus Off**.

Set Exposure Mode

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Select Auto Exposure Mode**.
2. On the options menu, touch **Frame Average**, **Center Weighted**, or **Spot Metering**.

Enable or Disable Lens Shading

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Lens Shading**.
2. On the options menu, touch **Enable** or **Disable**.

Set Night Mode

1. From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu > Settings > Night Mode**.
2. On the options menu, touch **Enable** or **Disable**.

Use Gallery

Use the **Gallery** to retrieve and playback captured pictures, videos, and media files stored on the storage card and other downloads.

Open Gallery

- Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Gallery**.
- From **Camera** or **Camcorder** mode, touch **Menu** > **Gallery**.

If files in the storage card are saved in folders, Gallery displays these folders as separate albums.

By default, Gallery has the following albums:

- **Camera pictures**: Pictures captured using the device camera are displayed in this album.
- **Camera videos**: Videos recorded using the device camera are displayed in this album.
- **Camera media**: All media files captured using the device camera are displayed in this album.
- **All pictures**: All pictures captured by the device camera or copied to the storage card are displayed in this album.
- **Download**: Downloaded media files are displayed in this album.
- **SD card**: Media files stored in the storage card are displayed in this album.

Pictures

View Pictures

1. On the Gallery screen, touch the album to view pictures inside the album.
2. To view a picture in full screen, touch the thumbnail or touch and hold the thumbnail and touch **View**.

Browse Through Pictures

1. While viewing pictures in full screen, touch the screen to display the scroll arrows.
2. Touch the left or right scroll arrows to view the previous or next picture.

Zoom Pictures

1. While viewing pictures in full screen, touch the screen to display the zoom controls.
2. Touch the - button to zoom out or touch the + button to zoom in.

Rotate Pictures

Pictures can be rotated 90 degrees each time a rotate function is executed.

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold a thumbnail or while viewing pictures in full screen, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Rotate**, then touch either **Rotate left** or **Rotate right**.

Crop Pictures

 - To move the cropper tool to another area on the picture, touch and hold inside the cropper tool, then drag your finger to the desired area.

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold a thumbnail or while viewing pictures in full screen, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Share** to display the options menu.
3. Touch **Messaging**.
4. The picture is automatically attached to your multimedia message. Enter the recipient and compose your message.
5. Touch **Send**.

Upload Pictures to Picasa

Picasa is a photo organizing service provided by Google. You must have a Google account in order to use this service.

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold a thumbnail or while viewing pictures in full screen, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Share** to display the options menu.
3. Touch **Picasa**.
4. Enter the **Caption** for the picture and select the **Album** where you want to upload the picture.
5. Touch **Upload**. Pictures are uploaded to <http://\picasaweb.google.com>.

Send Pictures via Bluetooth

To send pictures via Bluetooth, you must turn on Bluetooth first, make your device

discoverable and pair devices. See “Use Bluetooth” on page 57.

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold a thumbnail or while viewing pictures in full screen, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Share** to display the options menu.
3. Touch **Select a Device**.
4. Touch the device name of the Bluetooth device that you want to send the picture to.

Delete Pictures

2. Touch **Details** to display file information such as size, resolution, and date when the picture was taken.
3. Touch **OK** to close the detail window.

Show Pictures on Maps

2. Touch **Show on Maps** to open a browser window and show the picture on the map.

Play and Stop Slideshow

1. To start slideshow, do one of the following:

 - While viewing pictures in full screen, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Slideshow** to start slideshow.
3. To stop slideshow, touch the screen.

Videos

Play Videos

1. On the Gallery screen, touch the album to view the video thumbnails inside.
2. To play video, touch the thumbnail or touch and hold the thumbnail and touch **Play**.

Send Videos Using Gmail

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold the video thumbnail that you want to send.
2. On the options menu, touch **Share > Gmail**.
3. The video is automatically attached to your email. Enter the recipient and compose your email message.
4. Touch **Send**.

Send Videos via MMS

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold the video thumbnail that you want to send.
2. On the options menu, touch **Share > Messaging**.
3. The video is automatically attached to your multimedia message. Enter the recipient and compose your message.
4. Touch **Send**.

Upload Videos to YouTube

You can upload your video to YouTube. A YouTube account and Wi-Fi connection is required to use this function.

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold the thumbnail that you want to upload.
2. Touch **Share** to display the options menu.
3. Touch **YouTube**.
4. Enter the **Title Description**, and **Tags** for your video. Select the **Public** check box if you want to share the video with someone.
5. Touch **Upload**.

Send Videos via Bluetooth

To send videos via Bluetooth, you must turn on Bluetooth first, make your device discoverable and pair devices. See “Use Bluetooth” on page 57.

1. On the Gallery screen, touch and hold the thumbnail that you want to send.
2. On the options menu, touch **Share > Bluetooth**.
3. Touch **Select a Device**.
4. Touch the device name of the Bluetooth device that you want to send the picture to.

You can select the effect to use when moving from one slide to another.

2. On the options menu, touch one of the options: **Fade in & out**, **Slide left-right**, **Slide up-down**, **Random selection**.

Repeat Slideshow

1. On the Gallery screen, touch **Menu > Settings**.
2. Touch the **Repeat slideshow** check box to continuously play the slideshow until you touch the screen to stop it.

Shuffle Slides

1. On the Gallery screen, touch **Menu > Settings**.

Use YouTube

YouTube is an online video streaming service that allows you to view videos uploaded by YouTube members.


Open YouTube

Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, touch **YouTube**.

Watch YouTube Videos

1. On the YouTube screen, touch a video category.
2. Touch a video to watch it.
3. Touch the screen to display the playback controls. Use the playback controls to rewind, pause/play, or forward the video.
4. Touch **Back** to stop playback.

Search for Videos

1. On the YouTube screen, enter the keyword to search on the search box at the upper right of the screen, and then touch .
2. Search results appear below the status bar. Scroll through the results and touch a video to watch it.

Share Videos

1. While viewing videos in a list, touch and hold the video, or watching the video, touch **Menu**.
2. Touch **Share**.
3. Select the email account that you want to use to send the video link.
4. The video link is automatically added to your email message.
5. Enter the recipient and complete your email message, then touch **Send**.

Use Music

Music plays digital audio files saved on the storage card.

To play audio files which are not saved in the storage card, copy the files to the storage card first. See “Use the Storage Card as a USB Drive” on page 59 for more details on copying files.

Open Music

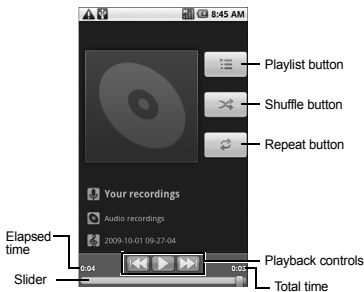
Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Music**. The **Music library** screen appears.

Browse for Music

1. On the Music library screen, touch a category to view the contents under that category. Options are: **Artist**, **Albums**, **Songs**, and **Playlist**.
2. Keep touching to browse through folders until you reach the music you want to play.

Play Music

1. Open Music and browse for the music you want to play.
2. Touch the music name to play it. The playback screen opens.



3. Do one of the following:
 - Touch the playback controls to rewind, pause/play, forward playback.
 - Touch the rewind button twice to play the previous music.
 - Touch the Playlist button to view the current playlist.
 - Touch the Shuffle button to toggle shuffle on or off.
 - Touch the Repeat button to cycle through the repeat modes: **Repeating songs**, **Repeating current song**, or **Repeat is off**.

Create a playlist to organize your music.

Create Playlists

1. Open Music library and browse for the music that you want to add to the playlist.
2. Touch and hold the music to open the options menu.
3. Touch **Add to playlist**.
4. On the **Add to playlist** window, touch **New**.
5. Type the name of your new playlist.
6. Touch **Save**.

Add Music to Existing Playlists

Set Music As Ringtone

1. Open Music and browse for the music that you want to set as ringtone.
2. Touch and hold the music, then touch **Use as phone ringtone**.

You can delete music files from the storage card.

Use **Videos** to play back videos files stored on the storage card.

2. The Video list screen appears. Touch a video to play it.
3. Use the playback controls to rewind, pause/play, or forward playback.

8 Use Maps

Maps allows you to keep track of your location, find places of interest, view traffic situations, and view detailed directions to your destination.

Before you start using Maps, set your location first.

Enable Location Setting

1. Touch **Home > Menu > Settings > Security & Location**.
2. Touch the **Use wireless networks, Enable GPS satellites**, or both.

Open Maps

Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Google Maps**.

Zoom Maps

1. On the Maps screen, touch the screen to display the zoom controls.
2. Touch the - button to zoom out on the map or touch the + button zoom in on the map.

Navigate the Map

To navigate on the map, slide your finger on the screen towards the direction of the area you want to view.

Change Map Mode

On the Maps screen, touch **Menu > Map mode**, then touch one of the following options:

- **Map**: This is the default mode. Select this option to display the map with names of streets, rivers, parks, and boundaries.
- **Satellite**: Select this mode to use the same satellite data as Google Earth. The images are not real-time and are approximately one to three years old.
- **Traffic**: Select this mode to view real-time traffic conditions with roads marked in color-coded lines that indicate the traffic condition. This mode is available in selected areas only.
- Press and hold the screen to view a street-level map.

Find Your Current Location

On the Maps screen, touch **Menu > My Location**. A blinking blue dot indicates your current location on the map.

Search Places

1. On the Map screen, touch **Menu > Search**.
2. On the search box, type the place that you want to search. You can enter an address, a city or type of establishments.
3. Touch **Search**.
4. Touch a place in the list. A callout appears on the map to indicate the location.
5. Touch the callout to open the location details.

Get Directions

1. On the Map screen, touch **Menu > Directions**.
2. Do one of the following:
 - In the first text box, type your starting point place, then type the destination in the second text box.
 - Touch the location source buttons to open the location source menu and select a starting point and destination.
3. Touch **Route**. The directions to your destination appears in a list.

View Directions on Map

On the Directions list screen, touch **Show map** to view the directions on a map.

Change the Route

On the Directions list screen, touch **Edit** to change your route.

Clear the Map

When you have reached your destination, touch **Menu > Clear map** to reset the map. Your destination is automatically saved in the Maps history.

9 Use Android Market

Android Market allows you to access, download and install applications and fun games on your phone.

Open Android Market

1. Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Market**.
2. When Android Market is opened for the first time, the Terms of Service window appears. Touch **Accept** to continue.
3. On the Android Market screen, do one of the following:
 - Touch **Search** to search Android Market.
 - Touch a category to open a sub-category and view more applications.
 - Touch **My downloads** to view your downloads.

Get Help About Android Market

On the Android Market screen, touch **Menu > Help** to go to the Android Market web site.

Find Applications

You can select an application through one of the following means:

- Select an icon in **Featured** applications.
- Select a category to browse its content, then select a subcategory.

Sort Categories

- To view applications sorted from most popular to least popular, touch the **By popularity** tab.
- To view applications sorted from newest to oldest, touch the **By date** tab.

Install Applications

1. Select the item that you want to download.
2. On the item details screen, view ratings of the application, comments by users and developer information.
3. Touch **Install** to start installation.

Note: To check the status of download, open the Notifications panel. To stop the download, touch **Cancel download**.

4. When installation is complete, the content download icon will appear on the status bar.
5. On the Android Market screen, touch **My downloads**.
6. Touch the application, then touch **Open**.

Uninstall Applications

1. On the Android Market screen, touch **My downloads** to view downloaded applications.
2. Touch the application that you want to remove.
3. Touch **Uninstall**.
4. Touch **OK** to confirm.
5. Select the reason for removing the application, then touch **OK**.

Alarm Clock

Use **Alarm Clock** to set unlimited number of alarms.

Open Alarm Clock

Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Alarm Clock**.

Set an Alarm

By default, three alarms are already set up.

1. Touch an alarm that you want to customize.
2. On the Set alarm screen, touch the **Turn on alarm** check box to activate alarm.
3. Touch **Time**.
 - Touch the + or - buttons to adjust the time.
 - Touch to select **AM** or **PM**.
4. Touch **Set** to set the alarm time.
5. Touch **Ringtone** to set the alarm ringtone. Touch a tone to play it briefly, then touch **OK**.
6. Touch the **Vibrate** check box to set the device to vibrate when the alarm goes off.
7. Touch **Repeat**. Select the days that you want the alarm to sound, then touch **OK**.

8. Touch **Label** to set the alarm name. Type the name on the text box, then touch **OK**.
9. Touch **Back** to return to the Alarm Clock screen.

Add More Alarms

On the Alarm Clock screen, touch **Menu > Add alarm**, then set the alarm.

Enable or Disable Alarm

On the Alarm Clock screen, touch an alarm check box to enable alarm, uncheck to disable alarm.

Delete Alarms

1. On the Alarm Clock screen, touch and hold the alarm that you want to delete.
2. Touch **Delete alarm**.
3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Set Alarm in Silent Mode

1. On the Alarm Clock screen, touch **Menu > Settings**.
2. Touch the **Alarm in silent mode** check box to set the alarm to sound even when the device is in silent mode.

Customize Alarm Clock

You can change the appearance or hide the clock displayed on the Alarm Clock screen.

Change Clock Display

1. Touch and hold the clock.
2. The clock selection appears on the bottom of the screen. Scroll left or right to view the clock selection.
3. Touch the clock display that you want.

Hide Clock

On the Alarm Clock screen, touch **Menu** > **Hide clock** to hide the clock. To show clock, touch **Show clock**.

Calculator

Use **Calculator** to perform basic and advanced mathematical operations.

Open Calculator

Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **Calculator**.

Use Calculator

1. Open Calculator.
2. Touch the keys to enter numbers and symbols to perform mathematical operations.
 - Touch **CLEAR** to delete entries.

- Touch **Menu** > **Advanced panel** to change the panel to advanced operations panel. Touch a symbol to perform the operation.

3. Touch **Back** to close Calculator.

Calendar

Use **Calendar** to view and schedule events and set reminder alerts.

Open Calendar

Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, touch **Calendar**.

Create Events

1. On any Calendar screen, touch **Menu** > **New event**.
2. On the **What** box, type the event name.
3. Do one of the following to set the date and time.
 - To set the date and time, touch the **From** and **To** date and time boxes. Touch the + or - buttons to adjust the date and time, then touch **Set**.
 - If the event is an all day affair, such as a birthday, touch the **All day** check box. Touch the **From** and **To** date boxes, touch the + or - buttons to adjust the date, then touch **Set**.
4. Enter the event location and description.

5. Touch the **Repetition** box, then touch a repeat mode option.
6. Touch the **Reminders** box, then touch a reminder option.
 - To add more reminders, touch the + button. You can add up to five reminders.
7. Scroll down to the bottom of the page, then touch **Done**.

View Events

You can view the Calendar in a list, by day, by week, or by month.

View Events by List

On any Calendar screen, select **Menu > Agenda**.

View Events by Day

On any Calendar screen, select **Menu > Day**.

- Scroll left to go to the next day's calendar.
- Scroll right to go to the previous day's calendar.

View Events by Week

On any Calendar screen, select **Menu > Week**.

- Scroll left to go to the next week's calendar.
- Scroll right to go to the previous week's calendar.

View Events by Month

On any Calendar screen, select **Menu > Month**.

- Scroll left to view the next month's calendar.
- Scroll right to view the previous month's calendar.
- Touch a date to view the event details.

Modify Events

1. On any Calendar screen, touch the date or time to open the Event screen.
2. Touch **Menu > Edit event**.
3. Modify the event, then touch **Done**.

Delete Events

1. On any Calendar screen, touch the date or time to open the Event screen.
2. Touch **Menu > Delete event**.
3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Handle Reminders

When you have an upcoming event, the calendar icon appears on the status bar. Touch and hold the status bar then slide downwards to open the notifications panel.

1. On any Calendar screen, touch the date or time to open the Event screen.
2. Touch the event to display the event details.

3. Touch either of the following:
 - **Snooze all:** Select to snooze all event reminders for 5 minutes.
 - **Dismiss all:** Select to dismiss all event reminders.
 - Touch **Back** to close the event detail screen.

Calendar Settings

Hide Declined Events

1. On any Calendar screen, touch **Menu > Settings**.
2. Touch the **Hide declined events** check box to hide all declined events.

Set Alerts and Notifications

1. On any Calendar screen, touch **Menu > Settings > Set alerts & notifications**.
2. On the options menu, touch an alert and notification option:
 - **Alert:** Select to sound an alarm to remind the event.
 - **Status bar notification:** Select to display notification icon on the status bar.
 - **Off:** Select to disable alert and notifications.

Set Alert Ringtone

1. On any Calendar screen, touch **Menu > Settings > Select ringtone**.
2. On the options menu, touch a ringtone to play the tone briefly, then touch **OK**.

Set Vibrate Mode

1. On any Calendar screen, touch **Menu > Settings**.
2. Touch the **Vibrate** check box to enable the device to vibrate when an event reminder occurs.

Set Default Reminder Time

1. On any Calendar screen, touch **Menu > Settings > Set default reminder**.
2. On the options menu, touch a reminder time.

File Browser

Use **File Browser** to view the contents of your device.

Open File Browser

Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **File Browser**.

Browse Files and Folders

- Touch a folder to view its contents.
- Touch the back button on the bottom of the screen to return to the previous folder.
- Touch a folder name button on the bottom of the screen to go to that folder.

Refresh File Browser

On the File Browser screen, touch **Menu** > **Refresh** to refresh the list.

Create Folders

1. On the File Browser screen, touch **Menu** > **New Folder**.
2. Type the folder name in the text box, then touch **OK**.

Copy Files or Folders

1. On the File Browser screen, browse for the file or folder that you want to copy.
2. Touch and hold the file or folder.
3. On the options menu, touch **Copy**.
4. Select the destination location.
5. Touch the **Paste here** button on the bottom of the screen to paste the copied item.

Move Files or Folders

1. On the File Browser screen, browse for the file or folder that you want to move.
2. Touch and hold the file or folder.
3. On the options menu, touch **Move**.
4. Select the destination location.
5. Touch the **Move here** button on the bottom of the screen to move the item.

Delete Files or Folders

1. On the File Browser screen, browse for the file or folder that you want to delete.

Warning: Do not attempt to delete files or folders if you are unsure of their functions. You may delete system application files that are required to operate the device.

4. Type the new name in the text box, then touch **OK**.

Send Files

1. On the File Browser screen, browse for the file that you want to send.
2. Touch and hold the file.
3. On the options menu, touch **Send**.

View File Information

1. On the File Browser screen, browse for the file that you want to view.
2. Touch and hold the file.
3. On the options menu, touch **Info**.
4. Touch **OK** to close the information window.

Close File Browser

Touch **Back** to close the File Browser screen.

Voice Commands

Use **VSuite** voice command application to say commands for the phone to execute.

Start VSuite

Do one of the following to start VSuite:

- Press and hold the **Send** key.
- Touch **Home**, open the applications tab, then touch **VSuite**.

Use VSuite

1. Start **VSuite**.
2. When prompted to speak, say a command from the displayed list on screen. When the application recognizes the command, it executes the command right away.
3. If the application is not sure which several possible matches was spoken, it may prompt you for a confirmation both visually and verbally, say or touch **Yes** or **No**.

Call a Number By Voice Command

1. Start **VSuite**.
2. When prompted to speak, say **Call [contact name or number]**. For example, to call John Smith's mobile phone, say "**Call John Smith Mobile**". Your phone will automatically call the said contact.

1. Start **VSuite**.
2. When prompted to speak, say **Send Text [contact name or number]**. For example, to send a text message to Joe, say "**Send Text Joe**".
3. The compose message screen appears. The contact name or number that you said is

displayed on the **To** box. Complete your message.

4. Touch **Send** to send the text message.

Send MMS By Voice Command

1. Start **VSuite**.
2. When prompted to speak, say **Send MMS [contact name or number]**. For example, to send a multimedia message to Joe, say “**Send MMS Joe**”.
3. The compose message screen appears. The contact name or number that you said is displayed on the **To** box. Complete your message.
4. Touch **Send** to send MMS.

Send E-mail By Voice Command

1. Start **VSuite**.
2. When prompted to speak, say **Send E-mail [contact name]**. For example, to send an e-mail to Sean, say “**Send E-mail Sean**”.
3. The compose e-mail message screen appears. The contact name that you said is displayed on the **To** box. Complete your message.
4. Touch **Send** to send your e-mail.

Search Contact Details By Voice Command

2. When prompted to speak, say **Lookup [contact name]**. For example, to search for Jessica’s contact details, say “**Lookup Jessica**”. The contact details screen is displayed.

Open an Application By Voice Command

1. Start **VSuite**.
2. When prompted to speak, say **Go To [application name]**. For example, to open Calculator, say “**Go To Calculator**”. The application screen is displayed.

Note: If you do not specify an application after the command **Go To**, the screen displays a list of applications, then waits for you to say an application name.
