Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. Recharge your battery only with Daviscomms approved chargers designated for this device.

Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, since overcharging may shorten its lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time. If the battery is completely discharged, it may take several minutes before the charging indicator appears on the display or before any calls can be made.


