REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIALITY

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of xG Technology, Inc. (xG) and pursuant to Sections 0.457(d) and 0.459 of the Commission's Rules, I hereby request that the following exhibits of the accompanying application for equipment certification of a low-power device be afforded confidential treatment and not be made available for public inspection on a long-term basis: Test Report, Schematics (three sets), Operational Description and Block Diagrams (two).

The reasons in support of this request are as follows:

The device under application utilizes a new proprietary technology developed by xG that is not widely commercially available. While xG has filed patent applications for a number of the features of this new technology, the specific details of how it works and, more specifically, the information and diagrams in the above-described exhibits, have never been disclosed to the public and remain closely guarded trade secrets by xG. Accordingly, the information and diagrams in these exhibits of the application are highly sensitive. If these exhibits were to be made public, it would allow access by xG's would be competitors and would result in severe

economic injury to xG which has yet to realize the benefits of its intellectual property.

It is accordingly submitted that the information and diagrams in the above-described exhibits of the application qualify as trade secrets and are properly excluded from public inspection under Section 0.457(d) of the Commission's Rules and Section 552(b)(4) of the Freedom of Information Act (5 USC § 552(b)(4)).

If there is any possibility that this request for confidentiality will not be granted, xG hereby requests that it be given the opportunity to withdraw the instant application before any public disclosure is made of its contents.
