

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## 1. Getting started

#### WARNING

- Do not place your digital photo frame in the bathroom or other humid areas.
- Do not place your digital photo frame near sources of heat and extreme temperatures, such as fluorescent lighting, microwave ovens, heating appliances and direct sunlight.
- Do not disassemble your digital photo frame; there are no user-serviceable parts inside.
- If the LCD screen breaks, do not touch the glass or liquid. Contact Motorola customer support for assistance.
- Use only the power adapter supplied with your digital photo frame.

### **Compatible photo format**

Your digital photo frame can only display photos that are in JPEG format. Other photo formats may not be detected or displayed correctly.

### Care and maintenance

Wipe the frame and the LCD screen gently with a soft, clean, dry cloth.

To remove fingerprints on the LCD screen, wipe gently with a soft, lint-free cloth. Do not use cleaning solutions unless they are designed specifically for LCD screens.

### **IMPORTANT**

Always switch off and disconnect the power adapter before cleaning the digital photo frame.




## 1.1 Installing the stand

### 1.1.1 Landscape position

To place the photo frame in landscape position, follow the steps below to install the stand.

- **1.** Hold the photo frame in landscape position.
- **2.** Attach the stand to the stand locking slot on the back of the photo frame.



**3.** Insert the stand into the stand locking slot as illustrated, until the stand is secured to the photo frame.



### WARNING


- Do not rotate the stand during the installation. Otherwise, the photo frame will be damaged.
- Once the installation is complete, place the photo frame on a stable surface to avoid any possible movement.



### 1.1.2 Portrait position

To place the photo frame in portrait position, follow the steps below to install the stand.

- **1.** Hold the photo frame in portrait position.
- 2. Attach the stand to the stand locking slot on the back of the photo frame.



3. Insert the stand into the stand locking slot as illustrated, until the stand is secured to the photo frame.



#### WARNING

- Do not rotate the stand during the installation. Otherwise, the photo frame will be damaged.
- Once the installation is complete, place the photo frame on a stable surface to avoid any possible movement.



### 1.2 Connecting to power

Follow the steps below to connect the photo frame to a power outlet to turn on the power.

- Plug one end of the AC power adapter to the power jack on the back of the photo frame.
- **2.** Plug the other end into a power outlet. The power of the photo frame will be turned on.



Place the photo frame in landscape or portrait position on a stable surface.

#### NOTE

Available plug types may vary depending on where you purchased this photo frame.

# 1.3 Inserting a memory card or a USB flash drive

The photo frame is preloaded with some photos in the internal memory. On the top of the photo frame, you can also insert a memory card or a USB flash drive containing the content you want to show on this unit.

#### NOTE


- After you insert a photo-loaded memory card or USB flash drive and connect the photo frame to power, the photo frame will automatically start to display photos in slideshow mode.
- The memory card slot and USB port both support hot-swap function.
- The memory card slot accepts these types of memory cards: SD, SDHC, MMC.
- You can play audio and image files on the photo frame.
   The supported audio file format is MP3 (\*.mp3). The supported image file format is JPEG (\*.jpg).
- Video files are not supported on this photo frame.



# 1.4 Replacing the remote control battery

The supplied remote control comes installed with a CR2025 lithium battery. When you need to replace the battery, follow the steps below.

Slide the locking tab to the right.



Pull out the battery holder.



**3.** Insert the new battery into the battery holder. The battery must be placed with the positive pole facing upwards in the illustrated position.



**4.** Slide the battery holder into the remote control.

#### WARNING

- Protect the battery from overheating or excessive moisture
- Failure to replace the battery in the correct manner may result in damage to the battery.
- Use only the approved specified batteries.
- Properly recycle or dispose of used batteries according to local guidelines and regulations.
- Do not throw batteries into fire. This may result in an explosion.
- If the battery is completely drained or the remote control is not in use for a long time, remove the battery to prevent leakage.



# 3. Using the menus

## 3.1 Using the Main Menu

After turning on the power of the photo frame, photos will play in slideshow mode automatically.

- If a memory card has been inserted, photos in the card will play in slideshow mode automatically.
- If no memory card is inserted, photos in the built-in memory will play in slideshow mode automatically.

To exit slideshow mode and return to the **Main Menu**, press the **EXIT** button on the back of the photo frame.



#### NOTE

To check the available space in Internal Memory, USB or Memory Card, select Internal Memory, USB or Memory Card and check the amount of free space shown on the bottom right corner.

In the Main Menu, you can:

- Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select the Photo,
   Music, Calendar, Wi-Fi or Settings menu.
- Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL— button to select a device, including Internal Memory, USB or Memory Card.



## 3.2 Using the Photo menu

### NOTE

The photo frame only supports JPEG (\*.jpg) image file format

- 1. In the **Main Menu**, press the **LEFT** or **RIGHT** button to select the **Photo** menu.
- Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL- button to select a device.
- 3. Press the button to enter Photo Viewer, which displays your photos in thumbnail view. In Photo Viewer, both photos and folders may display, depending on the content stored in your device.




- To browse or select a photo, use the UP/VOL+,
   DOWN/VOL-, LEFT and RIGHT buttons.
- To play photos in full screen single photo mode, press the button. Press the button again to start running slideshow.
- To make photos play with background music in slideshow mode, go to the **Settings** menu to set **Music slideshow** to **On**. (This function is only available when you have music files in the internal memory or inserted memory card/USB flash drive.)
- To switch to the previous or next photo in slideshow mode, press the LEFT or RIGHT button.
- To control the slideshow music volume, press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL- button.
- To rotate a photo, press the ROTATE button on your remote control.
- To zoom in a photo, press the ZOOM button on your remote control.



## 3.2.1 Copying one or all photos

### NOTE

- To copy photos from your memory card or USB to the internal memory, please insert your memory card or USB flash drive first.
- Use the supplied remote control for this operation.
- In Photo Viewer, press the MENU button on the remote control. Copy One, Copy All, Delete One and Delete All options will appear on the screen.



Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select Copy One or Copy All, and then press the button.

- Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL- button to select Yes, and then press the button.
- 4. Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL— button to select the destination (USB, Memory Card or Internal Memory), and then press the button to confirm.

Once the copy process starts, do not remove your USB or memory card from the photo frame before the "Complete" message appears.

## 3.2.2 Deleting one or all photos

### NOTE

Use the supplied remote control for this operation.

- In Photo Viewer, press the MENU button on the remote control. Copy One, Copy All, Delete One and Delete All options will appear on the screen.
- Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select Delete One or Delete All, and then press the button.
- Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL- button to select Yes, and then press the button to confirm.



### 3.2.3 Auto rotation

The photo frame has a built-in tilt sensor that allows auto rotation of photos. Follow the instructions below to enable auto rotation.

 When the photo frame is placed in landscape position, rotate the photo frame 90 degrees counterclockwise to enable auto rotation.





 When the photo frame is placed in portrait position, rotate the photo frame 90 degrees clockwise to enable auto rotation.







## 3.3 Using the Music menu

### NOTE

The photo frame only supports MP3 (\*.mp3) audio file format.

- 1. In the **Main Menu**, press the **LEFT** or **RIGHT** button to select the **Music** menu.
- Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL- button to select a device.
- 3. Press the 壁 button to enter Music Player.



 To select the previous track, press the UP/VOL+ or LEFT button.

- To select the next track, press the DOWN/VOL— or RIGHT button.
- To play the selected track, press the button.
- During music playing, volume bar shows on top right corner. To increase or decrease the volume, press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL— button.



# 3.3.1 Copying one or all music files

### NOTE

- To copy music files from your memory card or USB to the internal memory, please insert your memory card or USB flash drive first.
- Use the supplied remote control for this operation.
- In Music Player, press the MENU button on the remote control. Copy One, Copy All, Delete One and Delete All options will appear on the screen.



- Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select Copy One or Copy All, and then press the button.
- Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL- button to select Yes, and then press the button.
- 4. Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL— button to select the destination (USB, Memory Card or Internal Memory), and then press the button to confirm.

Once the copy process starts, do not remove your USB or memory card from the photo frame before the "Complete" message appears.



# 3.3.2 Deleting one or all music files

### NOTE

Use the supplied remote control for this operation.

- In Music Player, press the MENU button on the remote control. Copy One, Copy All, Delete One and Delete All options will appear on the screen.
- Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select Delete One or Delete All, and then press the button.
- Press the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL- button to select Yes, and then press the button to confirm.

## 3.4 Using the Calendar menu

 In the Main Menu, press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select the Calendar menu. 2. Press the button to enter the Calendar preview screen, and then press the button again to enter full screen mode in the Calendar menu. The slideshow automatically starts.



3. In full screen calendar mode, you can press the button to display one specific still photo or enter slideshow mode. To switch to next or previous photo, press the **RIGHT** or **LEFT** button.

### NOTE

If you have set the alarm, an alarm icon will show on the Calendar screen. For details about alarm settings, refer to "3.6.1 Setting an alarm".



## 3.5 Using the Wi-Fi menu

To enjoy the provided web services, such as Picasa<sup>™</sup>, Flickr<sup>®</sup> and FrameChannel<sup>™</sup> from the photo frame, you need to sign up for a new account for the web service you want to use on the Internet. Then, follow the steps below to set up Wi-Fi<sup>®</sup> connection and make required account configurations, so that you can use the available web services in **Wi-Fi List**.

# 3.5.1 Step 1: Setting up Wi-Fi connection

Press the button on the remote control to go to **Wi-Fi Setup** in the **Wi-Fi** menu.

### If you are using automatic IP network:

 Select DHCP for automatic connection in the Wi-Fi Setup menu.





 The Select Access Point screen appears and shows access points that are available nearby.



- c. Use the UP/VOL+ or DOWN/VOL— button to select an access point you want to connect to, and then press the button.
- d. To connect to a security-enabled access point, you will be prompted to enter the password in the Keyboard screen that appears. (To connect to a security-disabled network, Step d and e are not required.)

Enter the password in the **KEY** field. When finished, select **Done**, and then press the button.




Make sure the settings of your access point (AP) have been enabled to broadcast the SSID.



### **TIPS**

On-screen keyboard use:





- To switch between uppercase and lowercase letters or switch to other symbols, select Shift, and then press the button.
- To cancel your last input, select Backspace, and then press the button.
- To enter a space, select Space, and then press the button.
- To go to the next field or move among fields,
   select **Done**, and then press the button.

f. Once the connection is established, the screen shows the "Your connection was successful" message in the middle and the icon on the top right corner. Press the EXIT button to return to the Wi-Fi menu.

#### NOTE

- When you have set up Wi-Fi<sup>®</sup> connection using DHCP, the photo frame will connect to the Wi-Fi network automatically every time it is powered on.
- To manually disconnect from the currently active Wi-Fi network, go to the Settings menu, select Default settings and press the button, and then select OK and press the button. Note that this option will also clear all the settings in Account Cfg.



### If you are using static IP connection:

Select Static IP Address in the Wi-Fi Setup menu.




b. The **Choose AP** screen appears. Use the keyboard to enter your IP address, subnet mask, gateway and DNS server settings.



For details about how to use the keyboard, see the tips below.

### **TIPS**

On-screen keyboard use:



 To move the cursor forwards, select Next, and then press the button.



- To move the cursor backwards, select Prev, and then press the button.
- To go to the next field or move among fields, select **Done**, and then press the button.
- To cancel your last input, select , and then press the button.
- When finished, select **Done**, and then press the button.
- d. Once the connection is established, the screen shows the "Your connection was successful" message in the middle and the icon on the top right corner. Press the EXIT button to return to the Wi-Fi menu.

### NOTE

When you have set up Wi-Fi<sup>®</sup> connection using Static IP Address, the photo frame will save the settings you have entered in the Choose AP page. However, every time the photo frame is powered on, you need to select Done in the

**Choose AP** page and press the button repeatedly to manually connect to the Wi-Fi network.

# 3.5.2 Step 2: Configuring your accounts

# 3.5.2.1 Configuring your Picasa<sup>™</sup> account

### NOTE

Before making the following configurations, you need to sign up for a Picasa account on the Internet first if you don't have an existing account. Go to www.picasa.google.com

- Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select Account Cfg from the Wi-Fi menu, and then press the button.
- 2. Press the button to select Picasa.



In the Keyboard screen that appears, enter your account in the Account field.



- **4.** Use the control buttons to select **Done**, and then press the button to move to the next field.
- Continue to enter your password in the Password field
- **6.** Use the control buttons to select **Done**, and then press the button to complete.
- 7. Now you will be able to use Picasa in the Wi-Fi List.

# 3.5.2.2 Configuring your Flickr® account

### NOTE

Before making the following configurations, you need to sign up for a Flickr account on the Internet first if you don't have an existing account. Go to www.flickr.com

- Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select Account Cfg from the Wi-Fi menu, and then press the button.
- Press the DOWN/VOL button to move to Flickr, and then press the button.



 In the Keyboard screen that appears, enter your Flickr<sup>®</sup> account (full email address) in the Email Adr: field.



- **4.** When finished, use the control buttons to select **Done**, and then press the button to complete.
- 5. Now you will be able to use Flickr in the Wi-Fi List.

### **TIPS**

The photo frame is limited to access public photos from Flickr account owners over the age of 18. For details, review the terms and conditions of use on Flickr's web site.

### 3.5.2.3 Configuring RSS

RSS (Really Simple Syndication) is a method used to publish frequently updated web site content, such as news headlines, blog entries or podcasts. An RSS document (called a "feed") contains a summary of content from an associated web site or the full text. When you subscribe to an RSS feed, you will receive an update once the publisher releases new content. You can view RSS feeds that you have subscribed to with the provided RSS Feed Viewer in the **Wi-Fi List**.

- Press the LEFT or RIGHT button to select Account Cfg from the Wi-Fi menu, and then press the button.
- Press the DOWN/VOL button to move to RSS, and then press the button.



3. The Keyboard screen appears and shows the web address of the default RSS channel. You can clear the web address by using the Backspace key, and then enter the web address of another RSS channel you want to subscribe to.



**4.** Use the control buttons to select **Done**, and then press the button to complete.

### 3.5.2.4 Configuring your email account

- Sign up for a new Gmail<sup>™</sup> (referred to as Google Mail in some countries/regions) email account.
- Select Mail Config from Account Cfg in the Wi-Fi menu.
- 3. Select **Done**, and then press repeatedly to move to the **Account** field.



- Enter your account in the Account field.
- 5. Select **Done**, and then press 🦭.
- **6.** Enter your password in the **Password** field.
- 7. Select **Done**, and then press 🖭



8. Confirm the Authentication option, and then press

to complete the settings.

### NOTE

- IMPORTANT: Depending on server settings, emails may be deleted from server after received by the photo frame. DO NOT use email account currently using for email communication. Create a new Gmail or Yahoo! Mail account.
- If you use a Gmail email account, you only need to enter your email account and password in the Account and Password fields. The Gmail server settings have been preset on the photo frame.
- For additional information about email server settings or mail server accessibility, contact your network administrator or network service provider.



To avoid the risk of losing important email data in your email account, DO NOT use your existing personal email account to receive photo emails on this photo frame. Create a new Gmail email account and use it for best compatibility with this photo frame.



# 3.5.2.5 More information about on-screen keyboard use

Note that when entering information using the LS1000W on-screen keyboard there are two pages of keys available, and there may be times when you will need to use characters from both keyboard pages to enter the information you require.

The default page has the **lower case** characters plus other characters and symbols you may need.



The second page contains the **UPPER CASE** keys plus other additional characters some of which are commonly used in email or URL addresses. This page is accessed by selecting the **Shift** key on the bottom left of the screen. This key acts as a toggle between the two pages.





## 3.5.3 Step 3: Using web services


# 6. Wall mounting instructions

### Landscape wall mounting


 Cut the illustration below and drill holes in the wall exactly as illustrated.

**3.** Mount your photo frame in landscape position on the wall.









## **Portrait wall mounting**
