## **1. Introduction**

### **What is "Kii" ?**

**Kii** is "Wireless Bluetooth handfree car **K**it of innovation & slimness".

### **Features**

**Kii** is a portable wireless communication device with built-in latest Bluetooth wireless technology.

- \*Crystal clear quality communicates voice & echo elimination.
- \*Support A2DP profile, can play music as Bluetooth music transmitter.
- \*Can connect with car audio system or home studio system.
- \*Automatic connect with the last device, support voice dialing, muting function.
- \*More than 10 hrs talk time and 10 days standby time.
- \*Name card size, slim & fashionable and stylish design.
- \*Friendly & simple user's interface.
- \*Full duplex DSP for Echo canceling & Noise reduction
- \*High tone quality for speaker case design.
- \*Long life cycle battery & high quality power consumption saving.

### **Compatibility**

**Kii** is compatible with the cellular phones or other Bluetooth enabled devices that support Bluetooth Headset, Hands free, A2DP and AVRCP profiles.

### **Working Range**

**Kii** conforms to Bluetooth class 2 for a range of 30 feet (10M) in an open space.

## 2. Getting Started

### > Charging Your Kii



**Kii** is equipped with a lightweight and durable rechargeable Lithium Ion battery and must be charged prior to use.

- Please plug the supplied charger into the charging socket of the **Kii**.
- The Red LED indicator will turn on while charging and will turn off until fully charged.



### > LED Indicator

- Blue light flashes: Power on / Standby / Working mode
- Blue/Red light flash alternately: Pairing mode
- Red light flashes: Low battery alarm / Charging mode / Mic muting

### > Turning Your Kii On/Off

- Turn on: Long press the  button for 3 seconds, the blue LED indicator flashes and you can hear the " Do Re Mi Fe ".
- Turn off: Long press the  button for 5 seconds, the red LED flashes once and go off and you can hear the " Fe Mi Re Do ".



### > Controlling Your Kii Volume

- Increase Volume: Short press the button 
- Reduce Volume: Short press the button 
- Handfree mode: The volume is default on Maximum volume
- Music mode: The volume is default on middle volume

### 3. Pairing


#### > Initial pairing

Pairing **Kii** handfree card with your phone or other Bluetooth devices

- Please turn the **Kii** off.
- Press and hold the  button (5 seconds) until both Blue and Red light indicators flash alternately, then release the  button.
- Perform a Bluetooth device discovery from your phone or other Bluetooth devices and you will see the headset ID " **Kii 101** " displayed on your device's screen. Select " **Kii 101** " and enter the default password " 1234 " to start pairing. After the pairing is successful, the red light indicator will go off and remain blue light indicator flashes.


#### > Quick connection

**Kii** can remember the last device it connected.

You just need to turn **Kii** on, and short press the  button, **Kii** will connect your device automatically, and you can hear the " Doo! " from **Kii**.

The function is only workable when this device is the last **Kii** connected.

## 5. Using Your Headset

### 5.1 Using your Kii with phones

#### > Making a call:

Dial the phone number from your phone.


#### > Receive a call:

Short press the  button to pick up the call.


#### > End a call:

Short press the  button to end a call.

#### > Reject a call:


Hold press the  button for 2 seconds and release it when you hear a " Doo! " sound to reject a call.

#### > Redial the last number:

Hold press the  button for 2 seconds and release it when you hear a " Doo! " sound to redial the last number automatically.



[※ Do not hold the !\[\]\(c444627dab9fee9a1550c053ffaaaae2\_img.jpg\) button more than 5 seconds to avoid turning Kii off.](#)

#### > Make a voice dialing:

Short press the  button and hear a " Doo! " sound, and speak the voice tag to **Kii**. Then your phone will auto dial out the number.

[※ Please ensure to save the voice tag into your phone first before using the voice dialing function.](#)

#### > Retrieve calls in phone:


When **Kii** is on a phone call, hold press the  button for 2 seconds and release it to transfer the call to your phone. If you would change the call from your phone to **Kii** during conversation, just hold press the  button for 2 seconds and release it again.

#### > Switching to Headset mode:

When **Kii** is on a phone call, short press the " Handfree " button to transfer the call to headset mode, you need to pick **Kii** up to near your ear for talking. If you would

change the call to speak out of conversation, just short press the " Handfree " button again.

**> Muting your MIC:**



Hold press the  button for 2 seconds and release, you will hear the alarm tone and turn the mic off during conversation.

Hold press the  button for 2 seconds and release, the mic will be turn on.

**> Listen to music from your phone:**

You can use **Kii** to listen to stereo music streamed from your phone directly if your phone supports Advanced Audio Distribution Profile (A2DP) and AVRCP Profile.

**> Answering a call when listening music**

Press the  button once to answer the call and press it again to end the call and resume the music. If the other party you are speaking to end the call first, the music will automatically resume without having to press the  button.

※ **Some phones don't support Reject Calls, Last Number Dialing, Voice Dialing, Retrieve calls in phones and A2DP/AVRCP. For details, please refer to your phone's user guide.**


## **5.2 Using your Kii in your Car**

**Kii** is the handsfree car kit product.

- Put **Kii** & cradle on the user's side visor in the car.
- Link **Kii** with your mobile phone.
- The best distance of talking is 30 ~ 50 cm.
- Don't put Kii to near the window / air condition gate / car audio speaker for driving safe and get the best voice performance.


## **5.3 Using your Kii with Car audio system**

**Kii** is the Bluetooth audio receiver product.

- Use the audio line to connect **Kii** to your car audio system.
- Plug the audio line to the " AUX IN " or " CD AV plug " on car audio system.
- Play the music from your mobile phone and speaker out in your car audio system.
- Press the  button once to answer the call and press it again to end the call and resume the music.

## **5.4 Using your Kii with Home studio system**

You can connect **Kii** with your home studio system.

- Use the audio line to connect **Kii** to your home studio system.
- Plug the audio line to the " AUX IN "on home studio system.
- Play the music from your mobile phone and speaker out in your home studio system.
- Press the  button once to answer the call and press it again to end the call and resume the music.

## **5.5 Using your Kii with PCs**

- Pairing and connecting **Kii** with your PC (please refer to the pairing step).
- Now you can use your **Kii** to operate the following functions:



### **A. Bluetooth AV service: Listen to music and receive calls**

#### **>Play music:**

Please play music from the Windows Media Player Software in your PC.

**The other functions please refer to the AVRCP function**


#### **>Receive a call from your phone:**


If you want to receive calls and listen to music from your PC at the same time, please make sure to activate Bluetooth link between the **Kii** and your phone first. When there's an incoming call, music will be interrupted and you will hear the ring tone from the **Kii**. Just short press the  button to receive the call and short press the  button again to end the call and resume music playing.

**※ The AVRCP(Audio Video Remote Control) profile is only supported on "Windows Media Player" if you are using Widcomm Software.**

### **B. Bluetooth headset service: Activate Skype/MSN communication**

#### **>Activate the headset:**

After you select Bluetooth headset service, you will hear the ring tone from the **Kii**. Just short press the  button to activate the link.

If you would disconnect headset service, just short press the  button again.

#### **※ Setting your audio source on Skype**

Step 1: Run your Skype and login.

Step 2: Open the tools>options>Sound Devices and set your audio in/audio out

source as " Bluetooth SCO Audio"

**※ Skype/MSN headset service is only available with Bluetooth driver/application version IVT 1.6.1.1 and Widcomm 4.0 after. For details, please refer to your Bluetooth USB dongle user guide.**
