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3. TEST METHODOLOGY

The tests documented in this report were performed in accordance with ANSI C63.10: 2013 and FCC CFR 47 Part 15.207, 15.209, 15.247, KDB558074.

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3.1 EUT CONFIGURATION

The EUT configuration for testing is installed on RF field strength measurement to meet the Commissions requirement and operating in a manner that intends to maximize its emission characteristics in a continuous normal application.

3.2 EUT EXERCISE

The EUT was operated in the engineering mode to fix the TX frequency that was for the purpose of the measurements.

According to its specifications, the EUT must comply with the requirements of the Section 15.207, 15.209 and 15.247 under the FCC Rules Part 15 Subpart C.

3.3 GENERAL TEST PROCEDURES

Conducted Emissions

The EUT is placed on the turntable, which is 0.8 m above ground plane. According to the requirements in Section 13.1.4.1 of ANSI C63.10 Conducted emissions from the EUT measured in the frequency range between 0.15 MHz and 30MHz using CISPR Quasi-peak and average detector modes.

Radiated Emissions

The EUT is placed on a turn table, which is 1.5 m above ground plane. The turntable shall rotate 360 degrees to determine the position of maximum emission level. EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna, which varied from 1m to 4m to find out the highest emission. And also, each emission was to be maximized by changing the polarization of receiving antenna both horizontal and vertical. In order to find out the maximum emissions, exploratory radiated emission measurements were made according to the requirements in Section 13.1.4.1 of ANSI C63.10.

⁽b) Except as provided in paragraphs (d) and (e), the field strength of emissions appearing within these frequency bands shall not exceed the limits shown in Section 15.209. At frequencies equal to or less than 1000 MHz, compliance with the limits in Section 15.209 shall be demonstrated using measurement instrumentation employing a CISPR quasi-peak detector. Above 1000 MHz, compliance with the emission limits in Section 15.209 shall be demonstrated based on the average value of the measured emissions. The provisions in Section 15.35 apply to these measurements.

3.5 DESCRIPTION OF TEST MODES

The EUT (model: Satellite L4-C) comes with four types of antenna (model: ANP6Y-100012 (TX1) / ANP6Y-100013 (TX2) / WA-P-LB-01-126 (TX1) / WA-P-LB-02-257 (TX2)) for sale. After the preliminary test, the antenna ANP6Y-100012 (TX1) was found to emit the worst emissions and therefore had been tested under operating condition.

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Software used to control the EUT for staying in continuous transmitting mode was programmed.

After verification, all tests were carried out with the worst case test modes as shown below except radiated spurious emission below 1GHz and power line conducted emissions below 30MHz, which worst case was in normal link mode only.

IEEE 802.11b mode:

Channel Low (2412MHz), Channel Mid (2437MHz), Channel High (2472MHz), Channel 12 (2467MHz) and Channel 13 (2472MHz) with 1Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

IEEE 802.11g mode:

Channel Low (2412MHz), Channel Mid (2437MHz), Channel High (2472MHz), Channel 12 (2467MHz) and Channel 13 (2472MHz) with 6Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

IEEE 802.11n HT 20 MHz mode:

Channel Low (2412MHz), Channel Mid (2437MHz), Channel High (2472MHz), Channel 12 (2467MHz) and Channel 13 (2472MHz) with 6.5Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

IEEE 802.11n HT 40 MHz mode:

Channel Low (2422MHz), Channel Mid (2437MHz), Channel High (2462MHz), Channel 10 (2457MHz) and Channel 11 (2462MHz) with 13.5Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

The field strength of spurious emission was measured in the following position: The EUT has Notebook mode, Flat mode, Tent mode, Stand mode, Tablet X, Y and Z axis modes. The worst emission was found in Notebook mode and the worst case was recorded.

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4. INSTRUMENT CALIBRATION

4.1 MEASURING INSTRUMENT CALIBRATION

The measuring equipment, which was utilized in performing the tests documented herein, has been calibrated in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations for utilizing calibration equipment, which is traceable to recognized national standards.

5.2 EQUIPMENT

Radiated emissions are measured with one or more of the following types of linearly polarized antennas: tuned dipole, biconical, log periodic, bi-log, and/or ridged waveguide, horn. Spectrum analyzers with pre-selectors and quasi-peak detectors are used to perform radiated measurements.

Conducted emissions are measured with Line Impedance Stabilization Networks and EMI Test Receivers.

Calibrated wideband preamplifiers, coaxial cables, and coaxial attenuators are also used for making measurements.

All receiving equipment conforms to CISPR Publication 16-1, "Radio Interference Measuring Apparatus and Measurement Methods."

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

The transmitter output is connected to the spectrum analyzer. Set the RBW=100kHz the emission bandwidth, $VBW \ge 3 \times RBW$, Detector = Peak, Trace mode = max hold, Sweep = auto couple. Measure the maximum width of the emission that is constrained by the frequencies associated with the two amplitude points (upper and lower) that are attenuated by 6dB relative to the maximum level measured in the fundamental emission.


IEEE 802.11b mode / 2472 MHz


IEEE 802.11g mode / 2472 MHz

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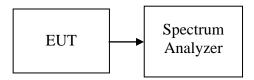
7.6 SPURIOUS EMISSIONS

7.6.1 Conducted Measurement

LIMIT

According to §15.247(d), in any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the frequency bands in which the spread spectrum intentional radiator in operating, the radio frequency power that is produced by the intentional radiator shall be at least 20 dB below that in the 100 kHz bandwidth within the band that contains the highest level of the desired power, based on either an RF conducted or a radiated measurement, provided the transmitter demonstrates compliance with the peak conducted power limits. 


