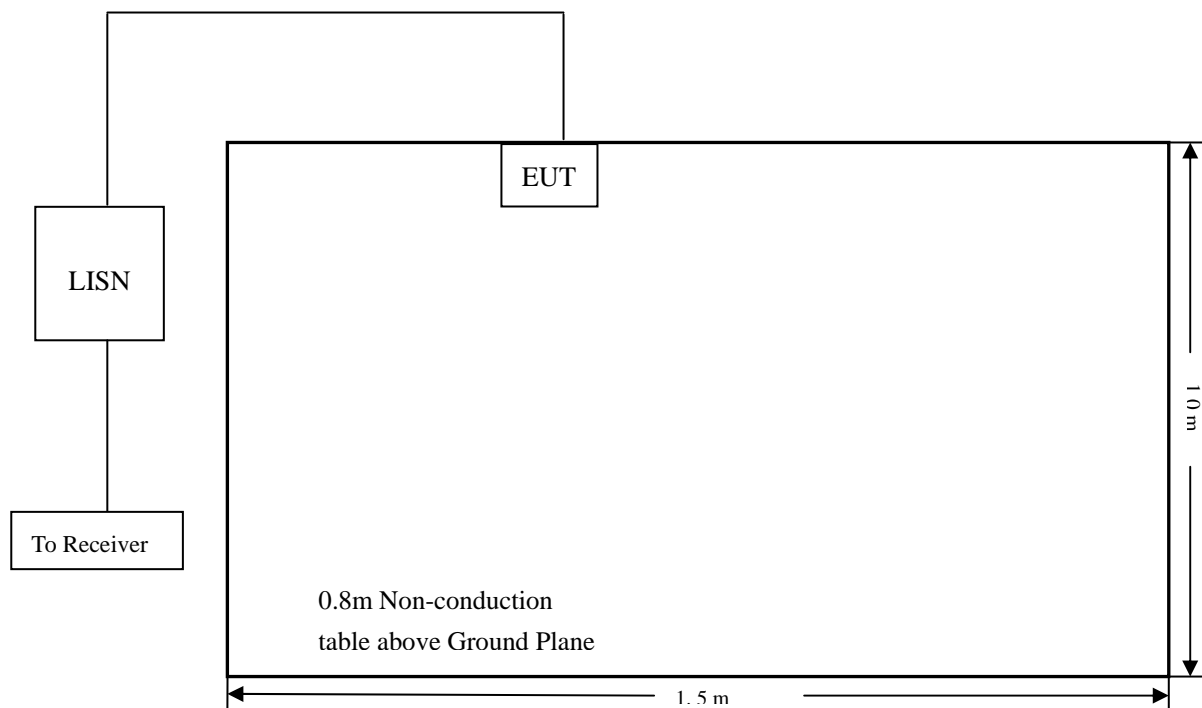

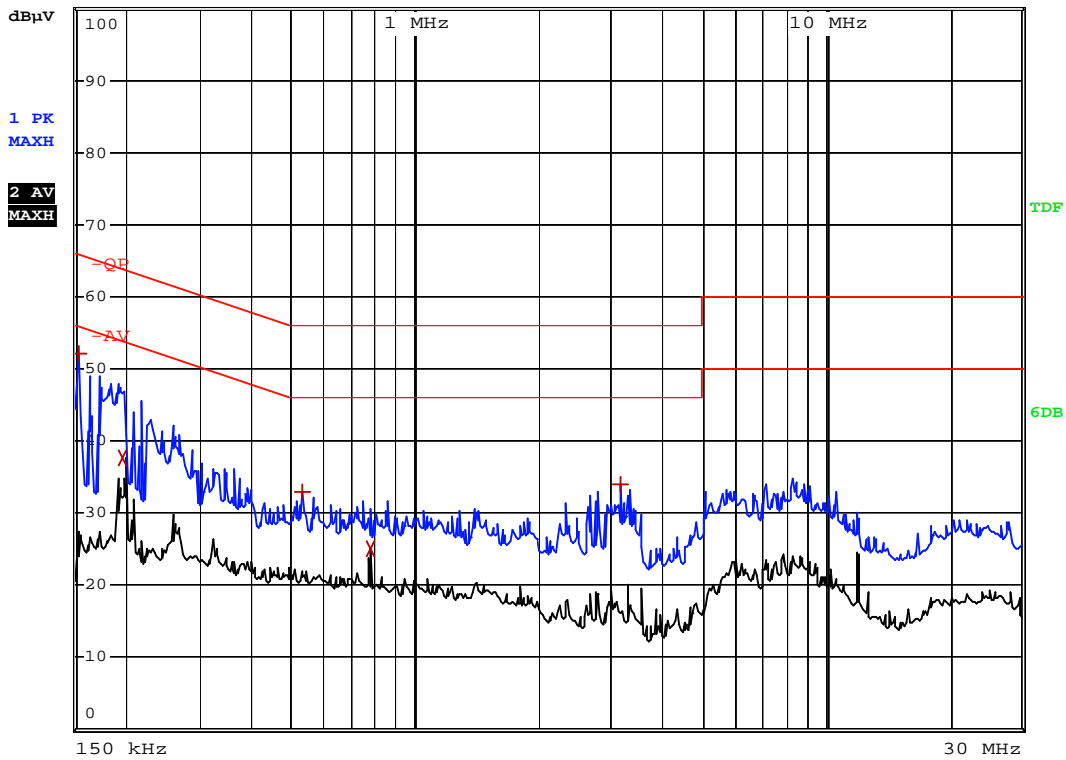

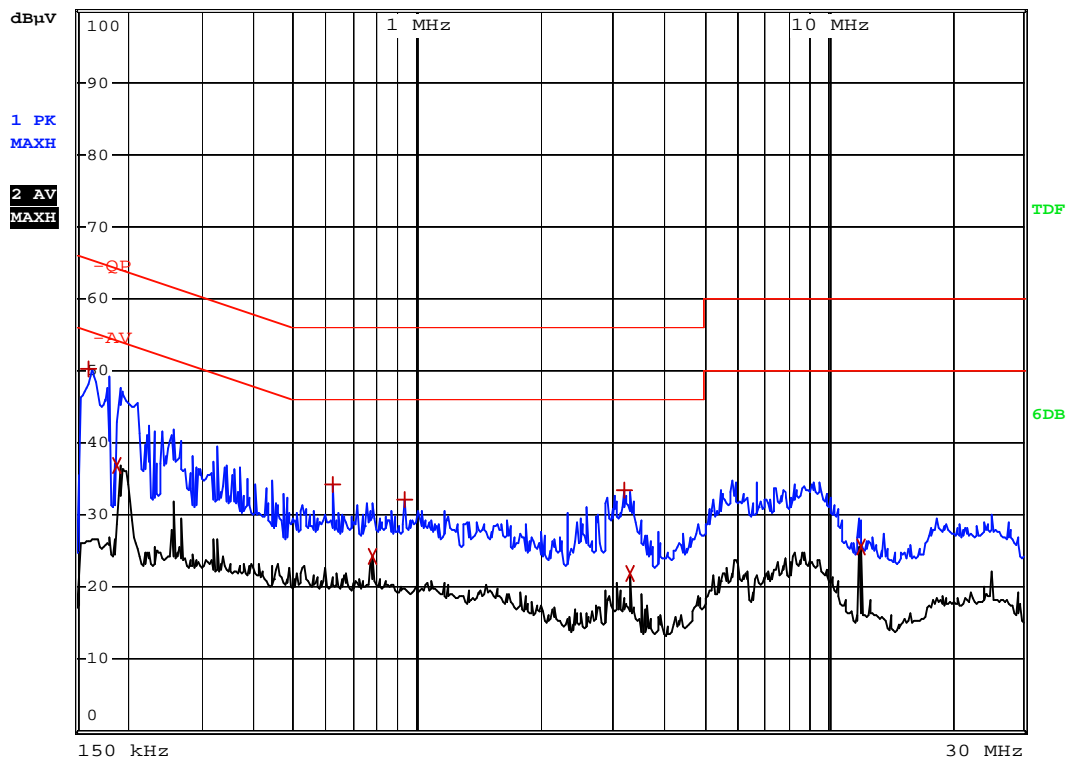

## 5. NUMBER OF HOPPING CHANNELS AND CHANNEL SPACING

### 5.1 Standard Applicable

According to FCC 15.247(a)(1), frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band may have hopping channel carrier frequencies that are separated by 25 kHz or two-thirds of the 20 dB bandwidth of the hopping channel, and frequency hopping systems in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band shall use at least 15 channels.

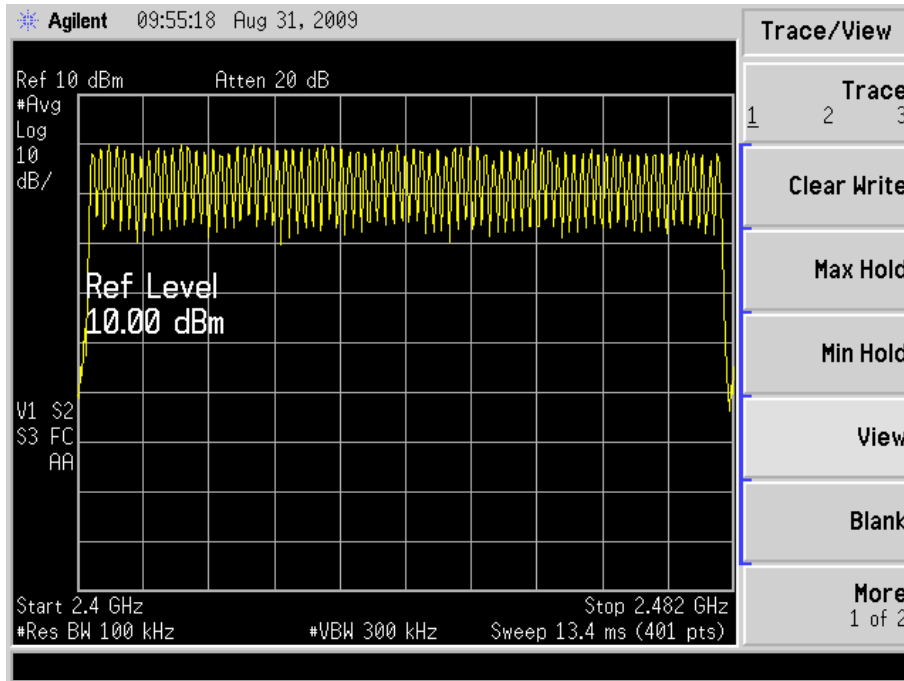

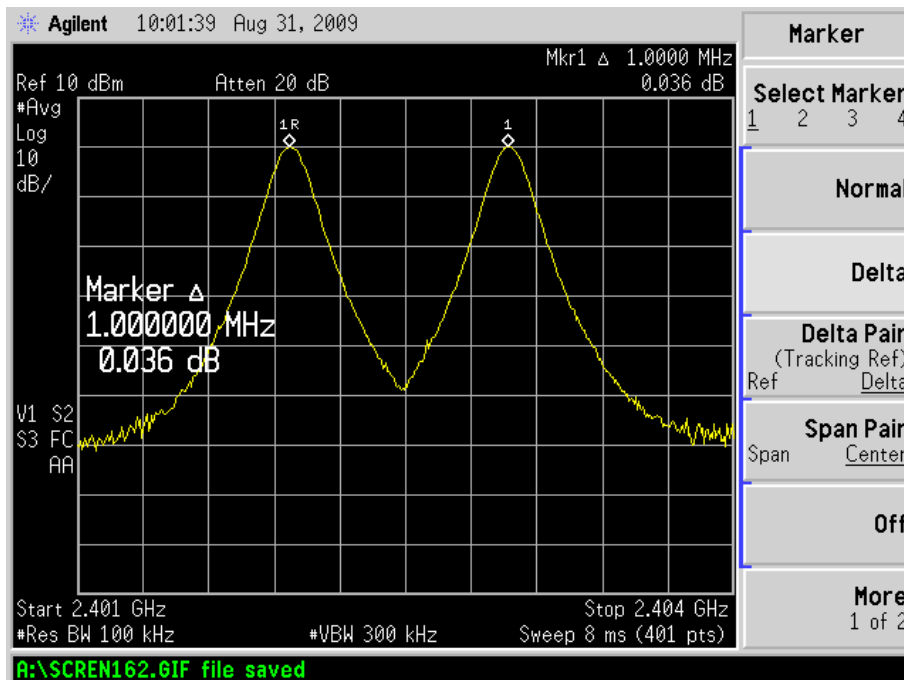

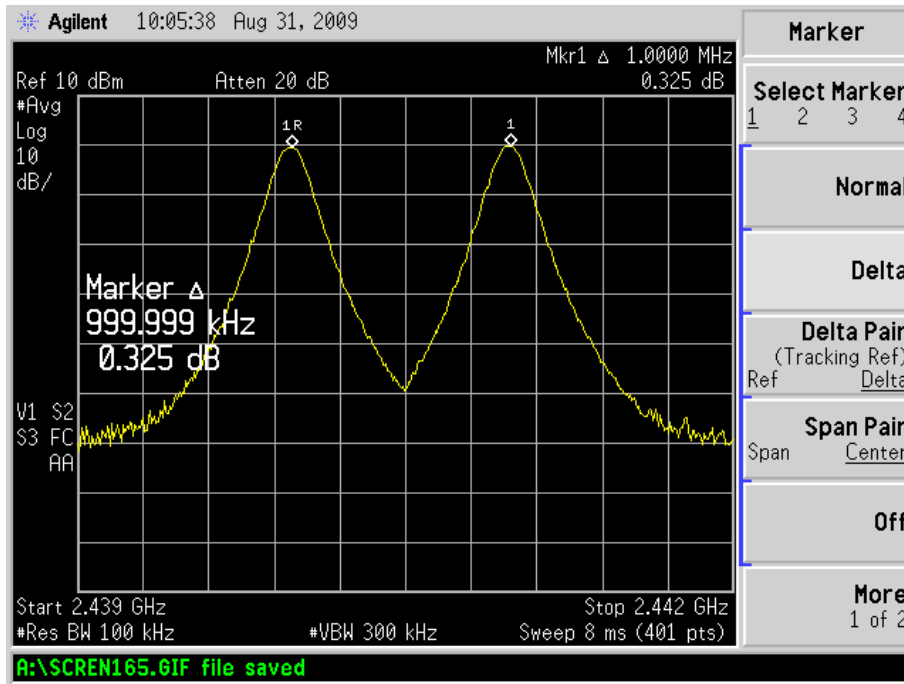

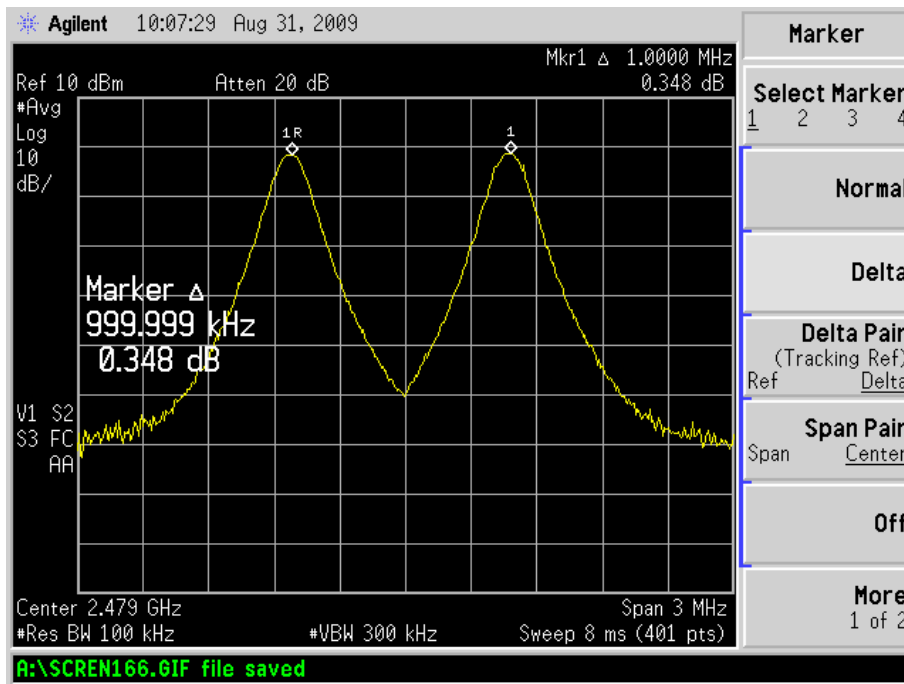
Channel Spacing (Low CH=1MHz)

## 6. DWELL TIME OF A HOPPING CHANNEL

### 6.1 Standard Applicable

According to 15.247(a)(1)(iii), Frequency hopping systems in the 2400–2483.5 MHz band shall use at least 15 channels. The average time of occupancy on any channel shall not be greater than 0.4 seconds within a period of 0.4 seconds multiplied by the number of hopping channels employed.

### 6.3 Test Procedure

1. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the spectrum analyzer.
2. Set center frequency of spectrum analyzer = operating frequency.
3. Set the spectrum analyzer as RBW, VBW=100KHz, Span = 0Hz.
4. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured was complete.

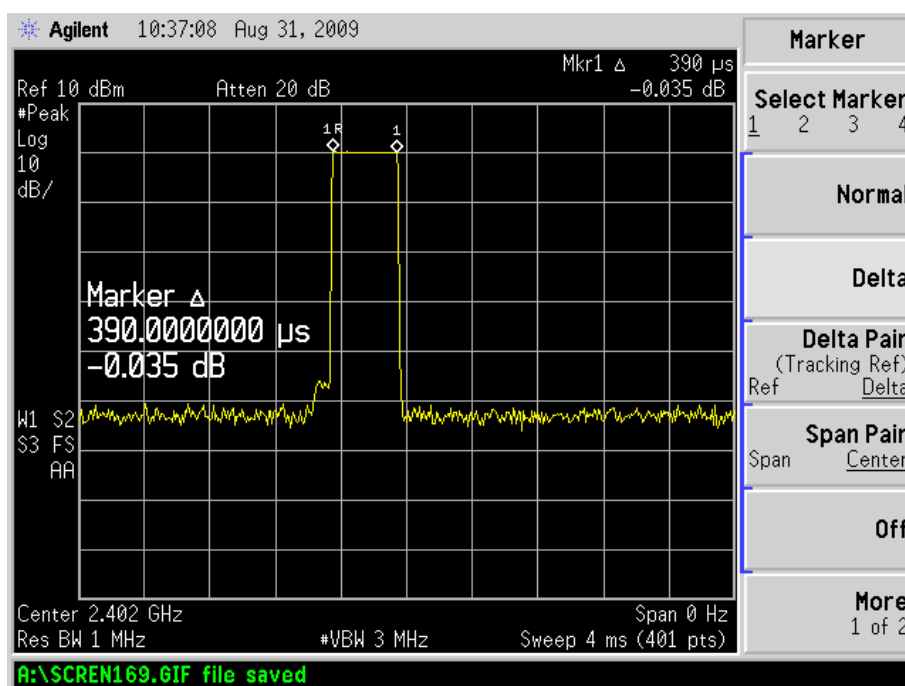
### 6.5 Summary of Test Results/Plots

The dwell time within a 31.6 second period in data mode is independent from the packet type (packet length). The calculation for a 31.6 second period is as follows:

$$\text{Dwell time} = \text{time slot length} * \text{hop rate} / \text{number of hopping channels} * 31.6\text{s}$$

Test data is corrected with the worse case, which the packet length is DH1.

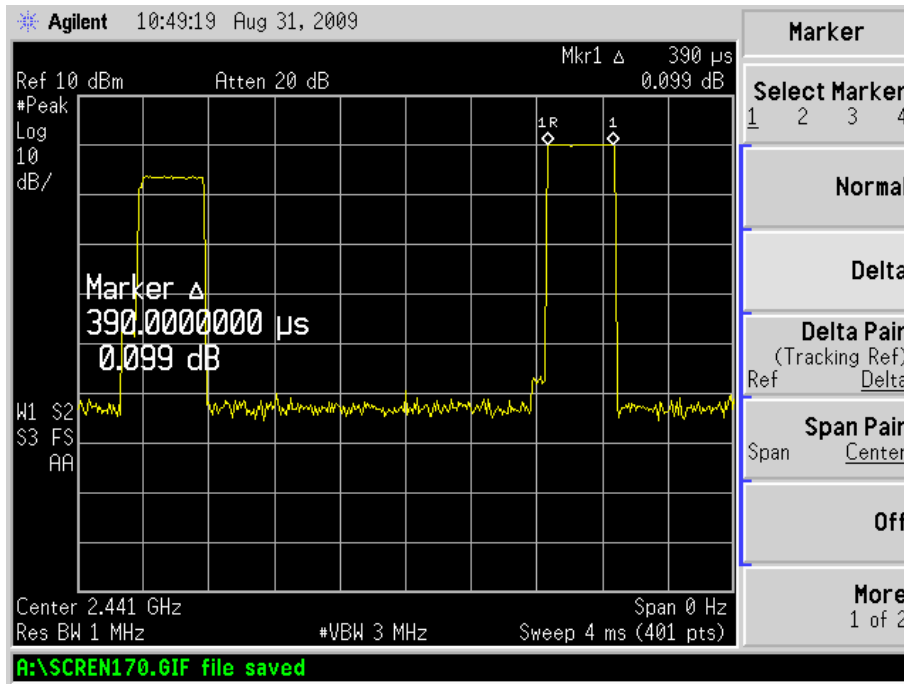

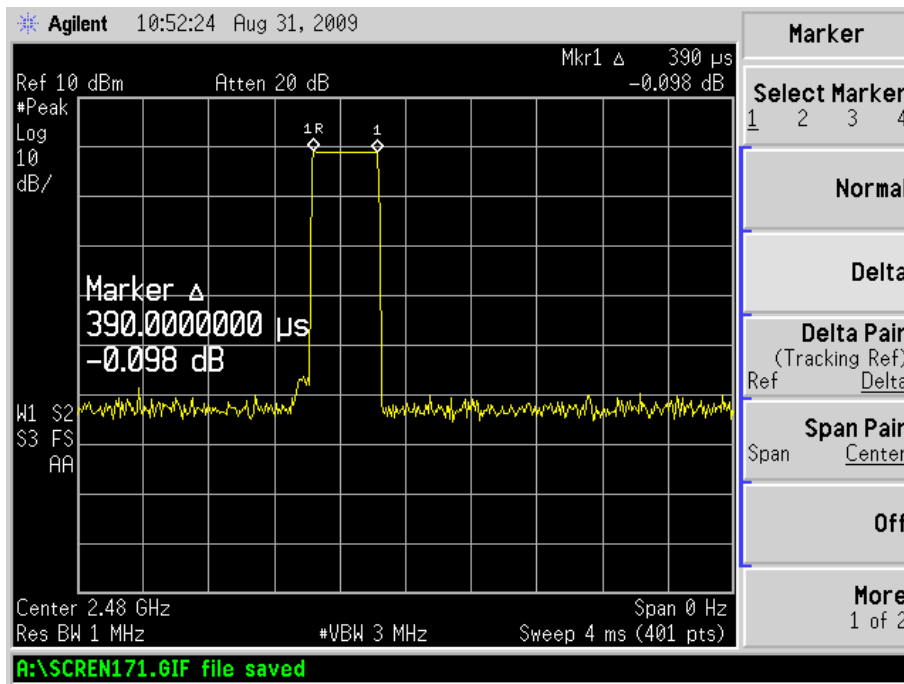

3. The spectrum analyzer as RBW=10KHz (1 % of Bandwidth.), Sweep=auto
4. Mark the peak frequency and -20dB (upper and lower) frequency.

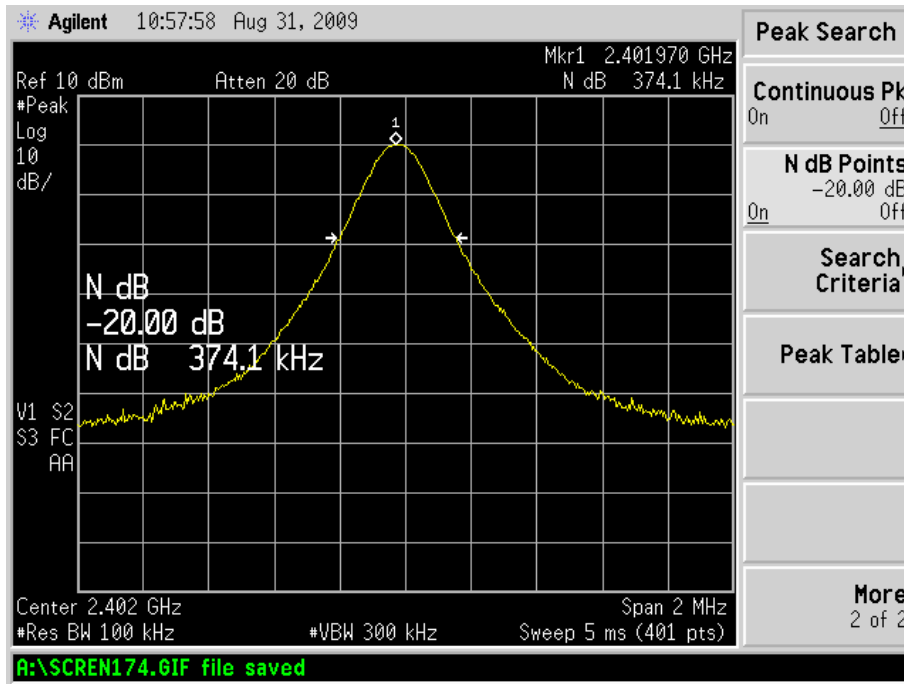

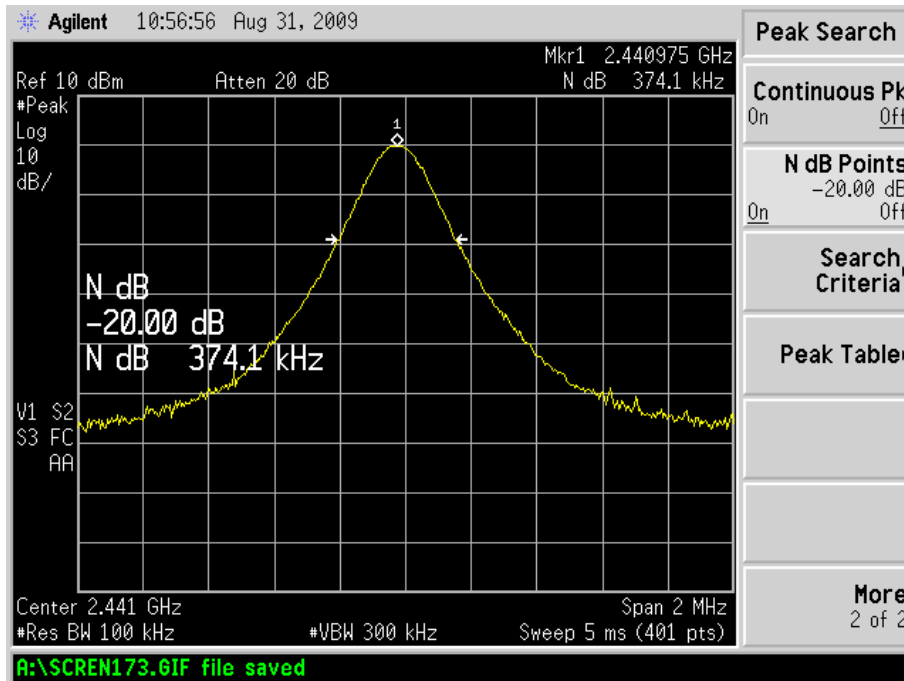

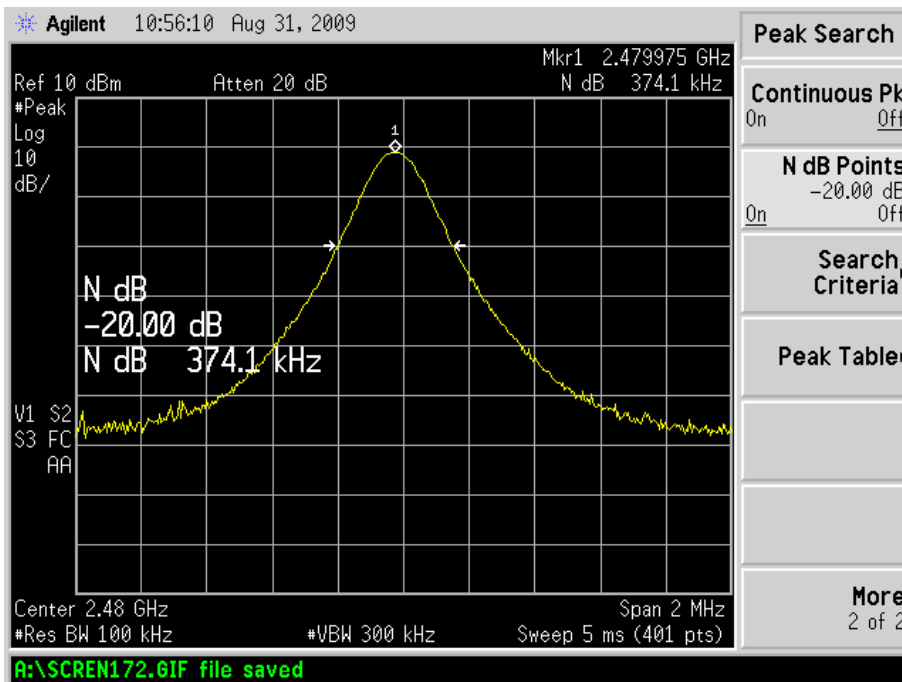

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## 9. FIELD STRENGTH OF SPURIOUS EMISSIONS

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### 9.1 Measurement Uncertainty

Based on NIS 81, The Treatment of Uncertainty in EMC Measurements, the best estimate of the uncertainty of a radiation emissions measurement is  $\pm 3.0$  dB.

### 9.2 Standard Applicable

According to §15.247(c), 15.205 15.209(b) & 15.35 (b), the field strength of emissions from intentional radiators operated within these frequency bands shall comply with the following:

Section 15.209:

30 - 88 MHz 40 dBuV/m @3M

88 -216 MHz 43.5 dBuV/m @3M

216 -960 MHz 46 dBuV/m @3M

Above 960 MHz 54dBuV/m @3M

The emission limit in this paragraph is based on measurement instrumentation employing an average detector. The provisions in §15.35 for limiting peak emissions apply.

EMISSIONS RADIATED OUTSIDE OF THE SPECIFIED FREQUENCY BANDS, EXCEPT FOR HARMONICS, SHALL BE ATTENUATED BY AT LEAST 20 dB BELOW THE LEVEL OF THE FUNDAMENTAL OR TO THE GENERAL RADIATED EMISSION LIMITS IN 15.209,WHICHEVER IS THE LESSER ATTENUATION.

Emissions that fall in the restricted bands (15.205) must be less than 54dBuV/m otherwise the spurious and harmonics must be attenuated by at least 20dB.

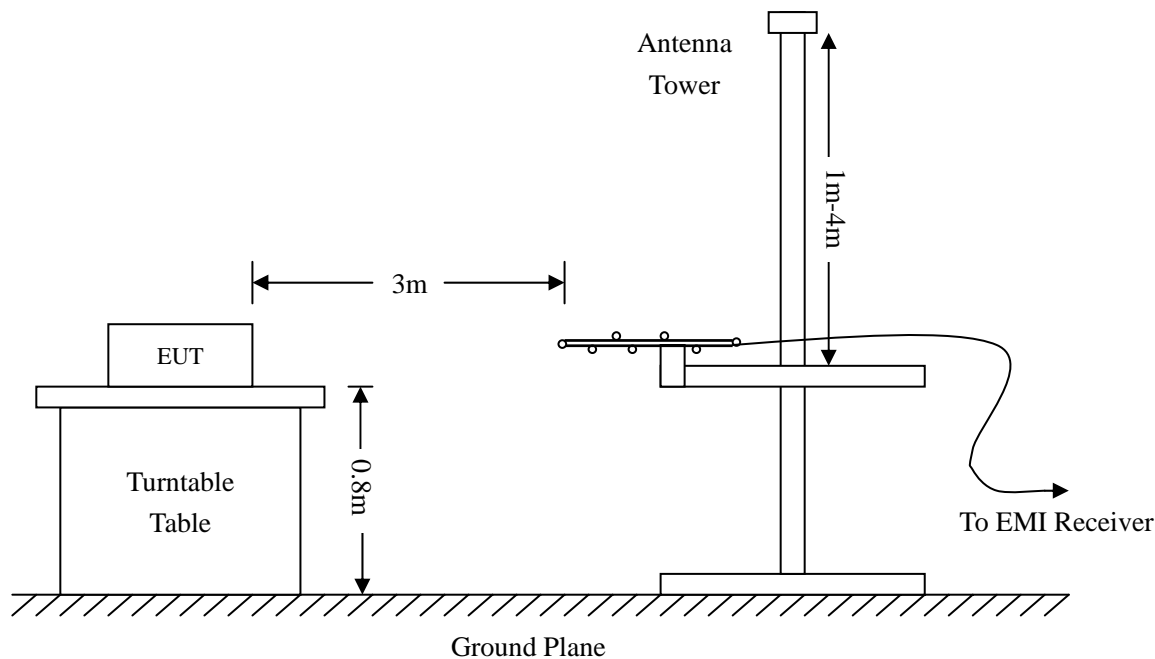

### 9.4 Test Procedure

The setup of EUT is according with per ANSI C63.4-2003 measurement procedure. The specification used was with the FCC Part 15.205 15.247(a) and FCC Part 15.209 Limit.

The external I/O cables were draped along the test table and formed a bundle 30 to 40 cm long in the middle. The spacing between the peripherals was 10 cm.



## 9.5 Corrected Amplitude & Margin Calculation

The Corrected Amplitude is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor and the Cable Factor, and subtracting the Amplifier Gain from the Amplitude reading. The basic equation is as follows:

$$\text{Corr. Ampl.} = \text{Indicated Reading} + \text{Ant. Factor} + \text{Cable Loss} - \text{Ampl. Gain}$$

The “**Margin**” column of the following data tables indicates the degree of compliance with the applicable limit. For example, a margin of -6dB $\mu$ V means the emission is 6dB $\mu$ V below the maximum limit for Class B. The equation for margin calculation is as follows:

$$\text{Margin} = \text{Corr. Ampl.} - \text{FCC Part 15 Limit}$$

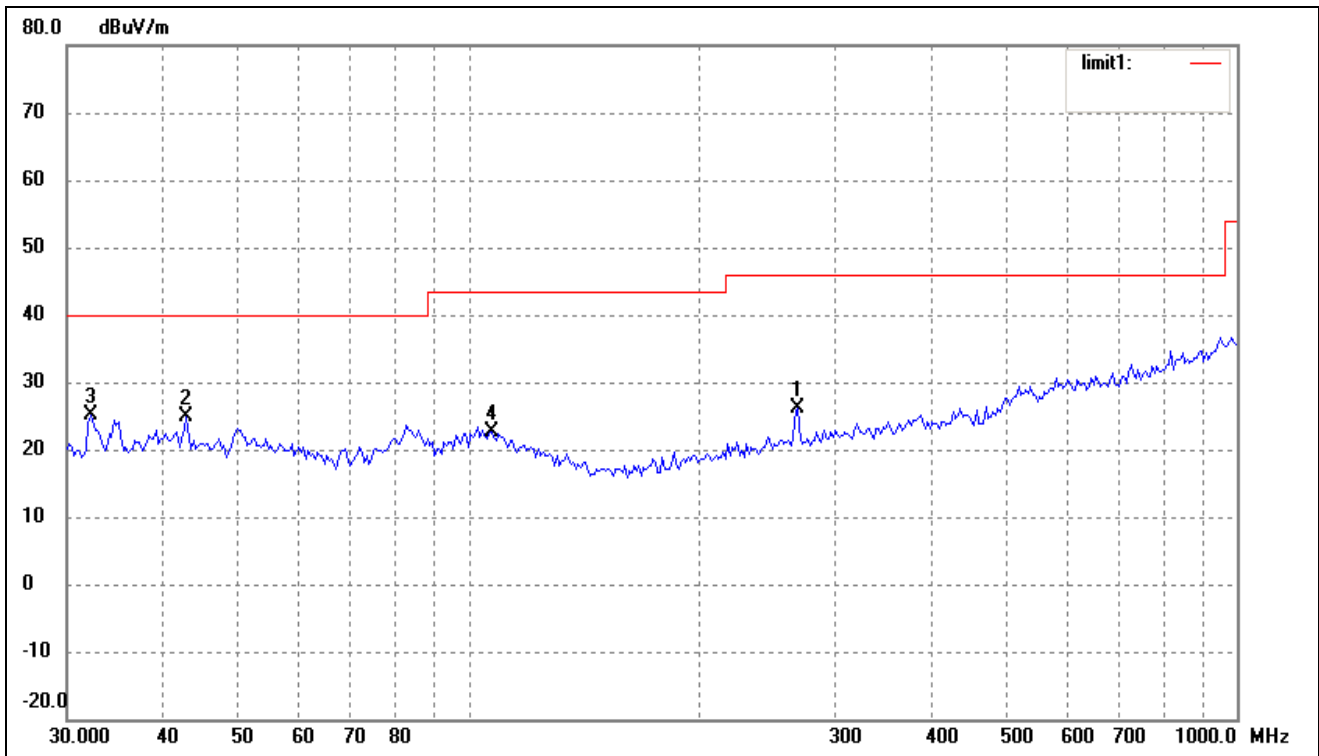

Spurious Emissions From 30 MHz to 1 GHz

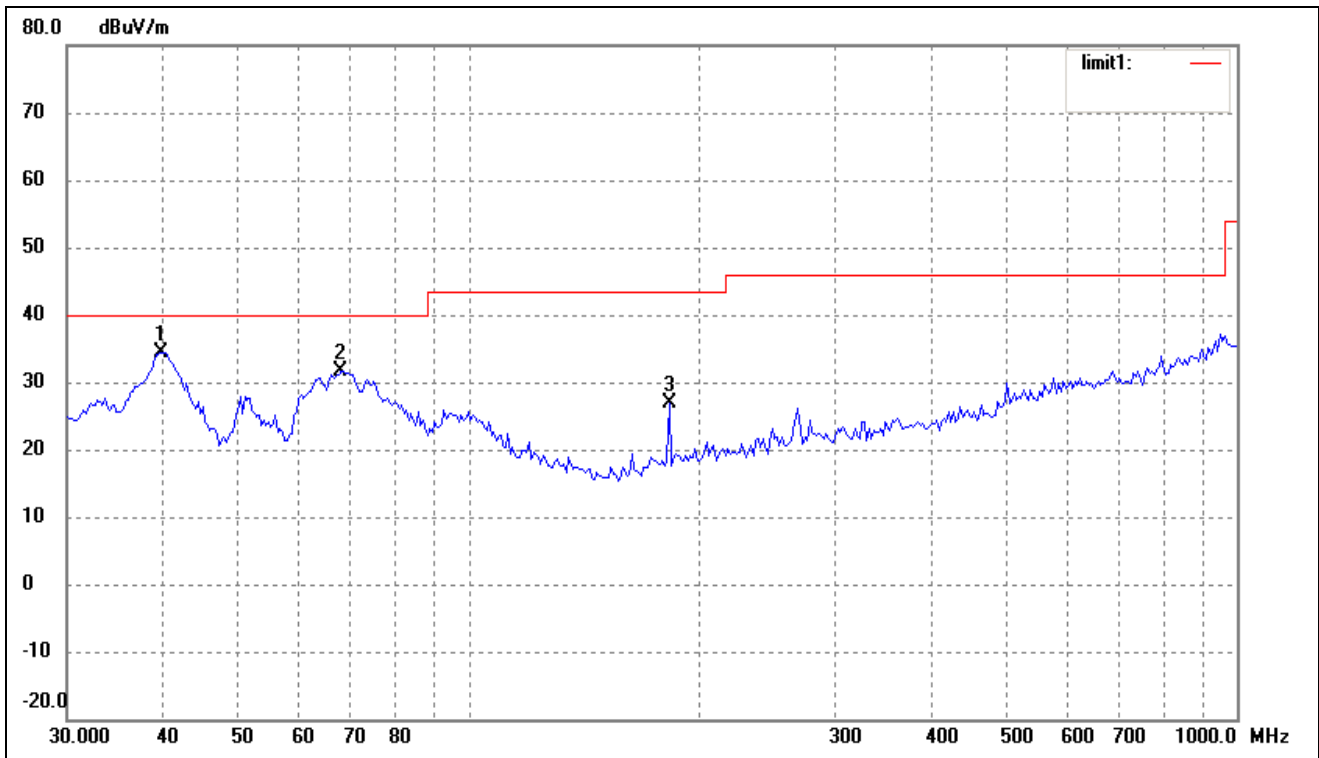

## 10. OUT OF BAND EMISSIONS

### 10.1 Standard Applicable

According to §15.247 (d) In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the frequency band in which the spread spectrum or digitally modulated intentional radiator is operating, the radio frequency power that is produced by the intentional radiator shall be at least 20 dB below that in the 100 kHz bandwidth within the band that contains the highest level of the desired power, based on either an RF conducted or a radiated measurement, provided the transmitter demonstrates compliance with the peak conducted power limits.

### 10.3 Test Procedure

1. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the spectrum analyzer.
2. Set the spectrum analyzer as RBW, VBW=100KHz, Span=100MHz, Sweep = auto
3. Set the Lowest and Highest Transmitting Channel, observed the outside band of 2400MHz to 2438.5MHz, then mark the higher-level emission for comparing with the FCC rules.

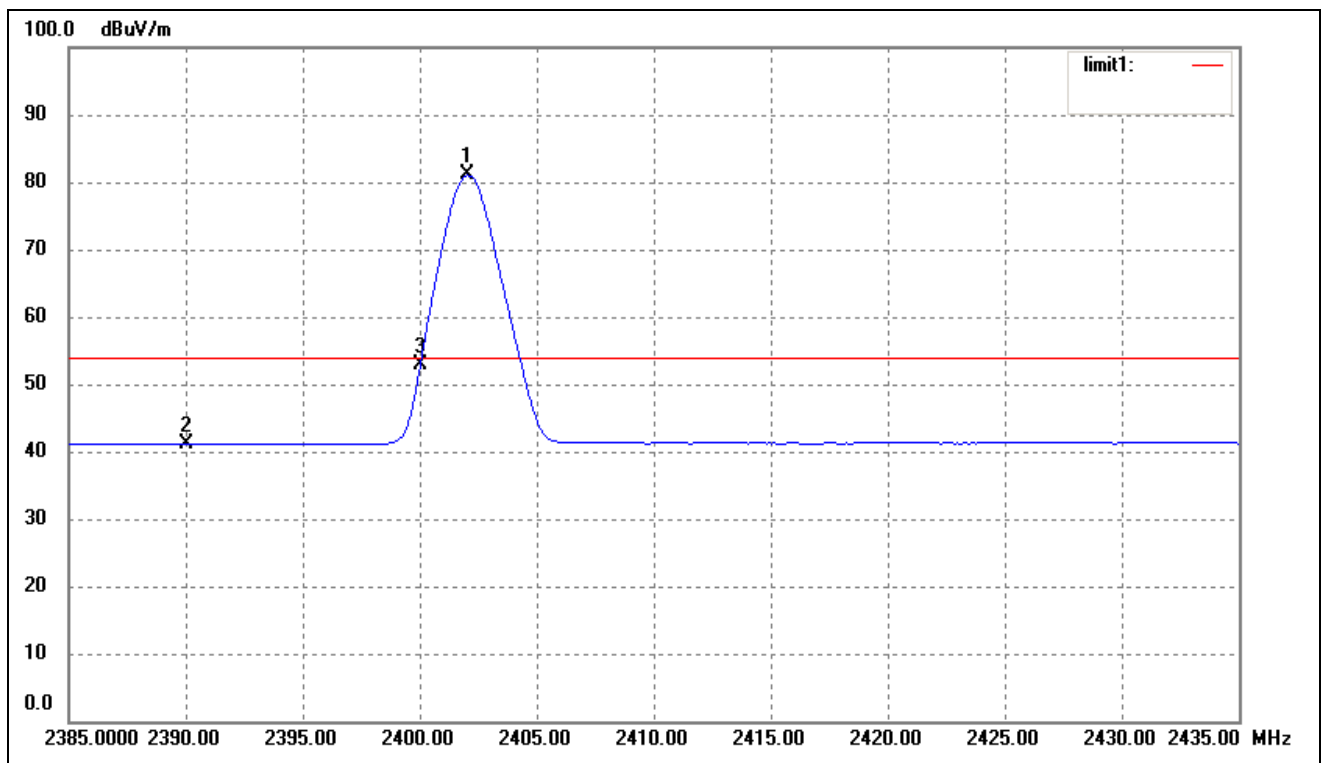

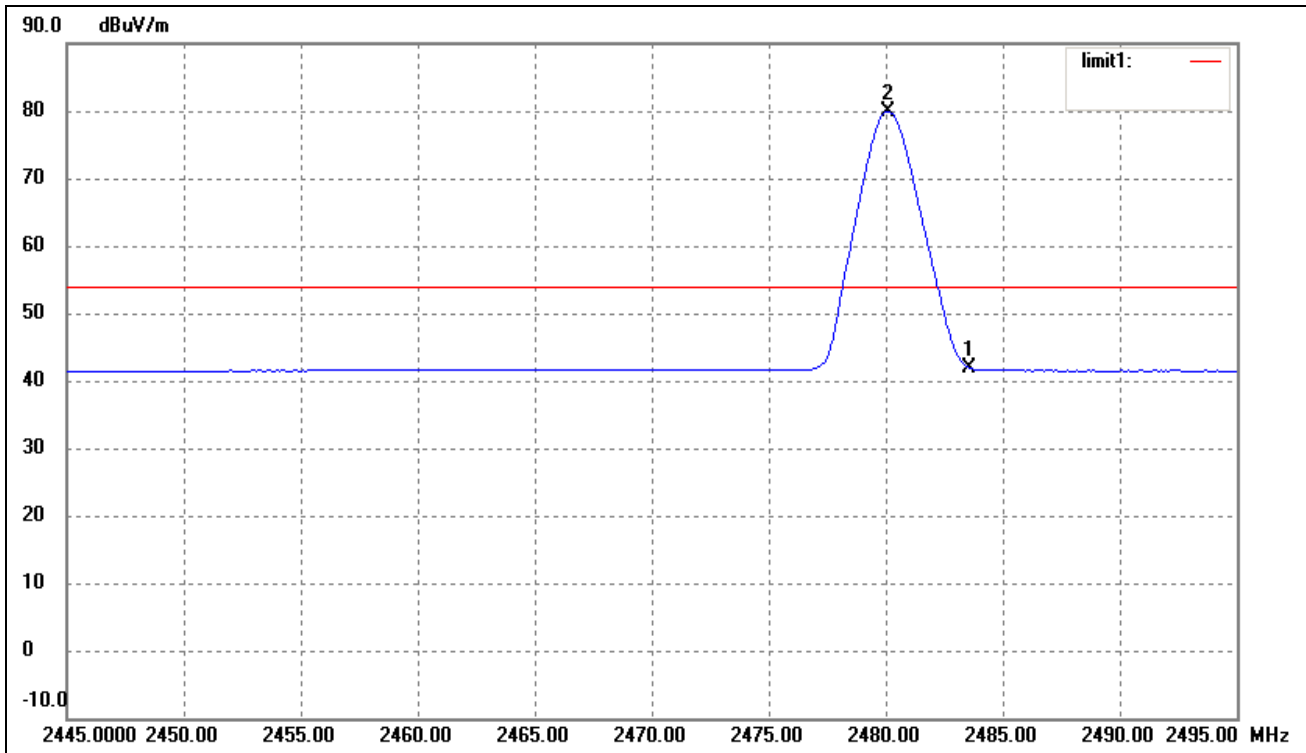
