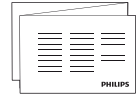

## Product Highlights

### Connecting to devices with HDMI output

With the HDMI to mini HDMI cable you can connect the projector to a computer or laptop (see also [Connect to the Playback Device, page 10](#)).

### WiFiDisplay (Miracast)

With the Miracast™ solution you can display video between Wi-Fi devices, without cables or a network connection. You can do things like view pictures or videos from a smartphone (Android 4 and more) or laptop (Windows 8.1) on your pocket projector.

# 1 General Safety Information

Do not make any changes or settings that are not described in this user manual. Physical injury or damage to the device or loss of data can result from improper handling. Take note of all warning and safety notes indicated.

## Setting up the Device

The unit is for indoor use only. The device should be placed securely on a stable, flat surface. Position all cables in such a way that no one will stumble on them, thus avoiding possible injuries to persons or damage to the device itself.

Do not plug in the device in moist rooms. Never touch the mains cable or the mains connection with wet hands.

The device must have sufficient ventilation and may not be covered. Do not put your device in closed cabinets or boxes.

Do not place the machine on soft surfaces such as tablecloths or carpets and do not cover the ventilation slits. Otherwise the device could overheat or catch fire.

Protect the device against direct sunlight, heat, large temperature fluctuations and moisture. Do not place the device in the vicinity of heaters or air conditioners. Observe the information on temperature and humidity in the technical data.

When the device is running for a long period of time, the surface becomes hot and a warning symbol appears on the projection. The device switches automatically to stand-by mode when it gets too hot. After the device has cooled down, you can continue playback by pressing any key.

Do not allow liquids to enter into the device. Switch off the device and disconnect it from the mains supply if liquids or foreign substances end up inside the device. Have the unit inspected by a technical service department.

Always handle the unit with care. Avoid touching the lens. Never place heavy or sharp objects on the projector or the power cable.

If the projector gets too hot or emits smoke, shut it down immediately and unplug the power cable. Arrange for your device to be investigated by a technical service centre. To prevent the spread of fire, open flames should be kept away from the device.

Under the following conditions, a layer of moisture can appear inside the device which can lead to malfunctions:

- if the device is moved from a cold to a warm area;
- after a cold room is heated;
- when this device is placed in a damp room.

Proceed as follows to avoid any moisture build-up:

- 1 Seal this device in a plastic bag before moving it to another room, in order for it to adapt to room conditions.
- 2 Wait one to two hours before you take the device out of the plastic bag.

The device should not be used in a very dusty environment. Dust particles and other foreign objects may damage the unit.

Do not expose the device to extreme vibrations. It may damage the internal components.

Do not allow children to handle the device without supervision. The packing materials should be kept out of the hands of children.

## Power Supply

Use only the enclosed power adapter (see chapter Appendix / Technical Data). Check whether the mains voltage of the power supply matches the mains voltage available at the setup location. This equipment complies with the voltage type specified on the unit.

The capacity of the battery diminishes with time. If the device functions only with the power supply, the battery is defective. Contact an authorised service centre to replace the battery.

Do not try to replace the battery yourself. Incorrect handling of the battery or using the wrong type of battery can cause damage to the device or cause injury.

### DANGER!



#### Risk of explosion with incorrect type of batteries

Do not try to replace the battery yourself.

**There is a risk of explosion if the incorrect battery type is used.**

Switch the device on or off using the power switch before removing the power supply from the socket.

Turn off the device and remove it from the power supply before cleaning the surface. Use a soft, lint-free cloth. Never use liquid, gaseous or easily flammable cleansers (sprays, abrasives, polishes, alcohol). Do not allow any moisture to reach the interior of the device.

### DANGER!



#### High Power LED

This device is equipped with an high power LED (Light Emitting Diode), which emits very bright light. Do not look directly into the projector lens. This could cause eye irritation or damage.

### DANGER!



#### Danger of hearing damage

Do not use the device over a longer time at high volume – especially when using headphones. This could lead to the risks of hearing damage.

## Repairs

Do not repair the device yourself. Improper maintenance can result in injuries or damage to the device. Your device must be repaired by an authorised service centre.

Find details of authorised service centres on the warranty card.

Do not remove the type label from your device; this would void the warranty.

# 2 Overview

## Top of the Device

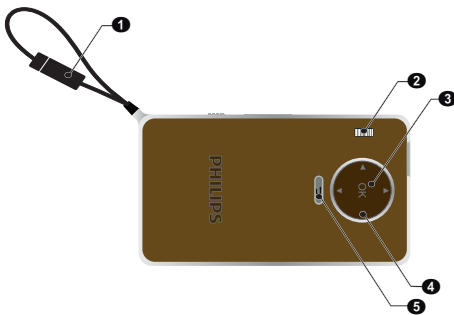
- ❶ – USB cable  
USB connection for a computer / port for power supply  
USB connection for a USB storage medium
- ❷ – Focus wheel for image sharpness.

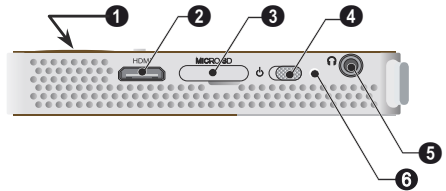
Note that the distance to the projection surface must be a minimum of 0.3 meters and a maximum of 2.1 meters. If the Pocket Projector is located outside of this range, it will not be possible to focus the image. Turn the focus wheel carefully so as to avoid damaging the lens.

- ❸ – **OK** key  
Ⓞ – Confirm entry / start, stop video/music playback or slideshow.
- ❹ – Navigation keys  
⬆️/⬇️ – Navigating / during music playback select previous, next title when image display is switched off / during video/picture playback wake Quick setting bar.  
⬅️/⬆️ – Navigating / during music playback: adjust volume level / during video playback start forward or backward / during picture playback select previous, next picture
- ❺ – ⏪ ⏩ keys  
⏪ – One menu step back, one directory level back / cancelling a function



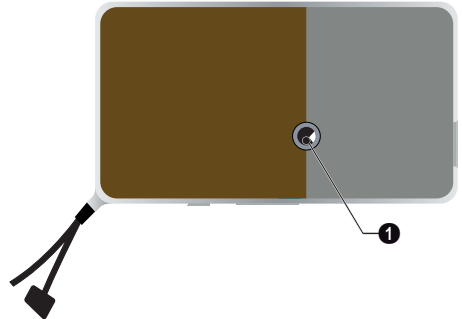

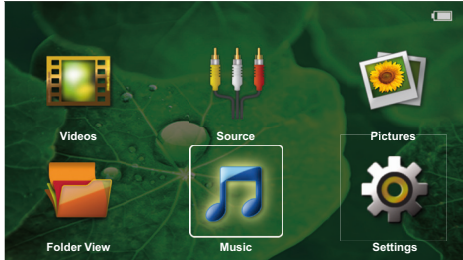

# Overview of the Menu Functions

- 1 After switching on the device the main menu appears.
- 2 Select the desired menu using the navigation keys (▲/▼, ◀/▶).
- 3 Confirm with **OK**.
- 4 By pressing the (↶) key you will return to the main menu.



**Source** – Switch to the external video input **HDMI** or select WiFi (if WiFi dongle connected)

**Videos** – Selecting files for video playback

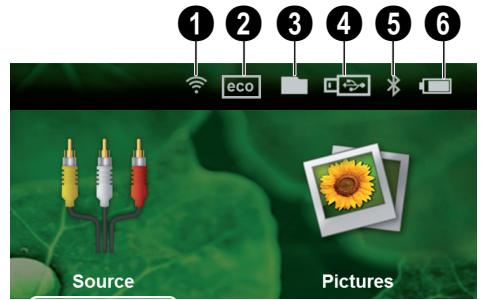
**Pictures** – Selecting files for the slideshow

**Music** – Selecting music files for playback

**Settings** – Access + and configure settings the Pocket Projector

**Folder View** – Selecting files for Playback. Copy or Delete Files (Mark the files with ▶ and confirm using **OK**).

# 3 Initial Operation

## Setting up the Device

A tripod accessory is available if you can to elevate the device.

## Connect Power Supply / Charge Battery

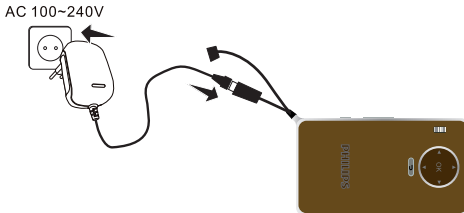
### CAUTION!



#### Mains Voltage at the Site of Installation!

Check whether the mains voltage of the power supply matches the mains voltage available at the setup location.

- 1 Connect the USB plug to a computer, to charge the battery.  
Alternatively you may connect the USB plug to the power adapter (not included), we recommend using the accessory PPA6200. Charge time is faster for to charge the battery (**XX hour/minutes**).



## Initial Installation

- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off switch on the side.
- 2 Turn the device towards a suitable projection surface or wall. Note that the distance to the projection surface must be a minimum of 0.3 meters and a maximum of 2.1 meters. Make sure the projector is in a secure position.
- 3 Use the focus wheel on the top to adjust the image sharpness.
- 4 Select the desired menu language using **▲/▼**.
- 5 Confirm with **OK**.

### Notice



#### The Main Menu Appears Instead of the Language Selection

The device has already been installed. In order to change the menu language, proceed as follows:

- 1 Use the navigation keys to select **Settings**.
- 2 Confirm with **OK**.
- 3 Select with **▲/▼** **Language**.
- 4 Confirm with **OK**.
- 5 Select the desired language with **▲/▼**.
- 6 Confirm with **OK**.
- 7 Exit with **↶**.



# 4 + functions

Functions are available for you to use your projector as a pocket flashlight, emitting a flash or a SOS bright.

## CAUTION!






These functions use a lot of energy, make sure your battery is charged before using them.  
The SOS light can not be seen as an emergency beacon.



## Flashlight

Allows to use the Pocket Projector as a flashlight.



- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Settings**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 Use the navigation keys to select **Flashlight**.
- 6 Confirm with .
- 7 The flashlight is activated.
- 8 For stop, press .




or

- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Press  during two seconds
- 4 The flashlight is activated
- 5 For stop, press .

## SOS light

Your Pocket Projector is equipped with an SOS light function. The flashes are issued according to the rule Morse 3 short, 3 long, 3 short. Your equipment can not be considered a rescue beacon approved.






- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Settings**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 Use the navigation keys to select **SOS**.
- 6 Confirm with .
- 7 The flashlight is activated.
- 8 For stop, press .

## Warning light

Your Pocket Projector can emit a flash of red or orange. This flash can be seen more than 50 meters.



- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Settings**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 Use the navigation keys to select **Warning light**.
- 6 Confirm with .
- 7 The flashlight is activated.
- 8 For stop, press .

Only use the supplied cable or cables that are available as accessories to connect the projector.

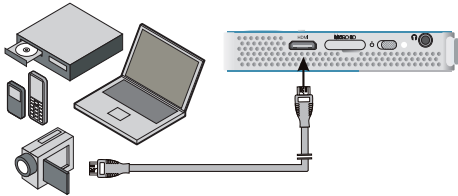

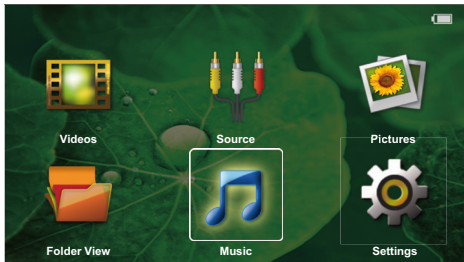

- 3 Connect the HDMI cable to the projector's HDMI socket.
- 4 Connect the cable to the mini-HDMI socket of the playback device.
- 5 Use the navigation keys to select **Source**.
- 6 Confirm with **OK**.
- 7 Use the navigation keys to select **MHL/HDMI**.
- 8 Confirm with **OK**.
- 9 The connection is activated.

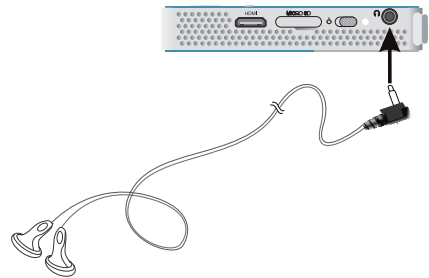

### Switching to the Multimedia Device Signal Output

See the multimedia device instruction manual to find out how to switch the signal output to this jack.

- 1 Before connecting the headphones, turn down the volume on the device.
- 2 Connect the headphones to the projector's headphone slot. The device speakers deactivate automatically when the headphones are connected.



- 3 After connecting the headphones, increase the volume to a comfortable level.

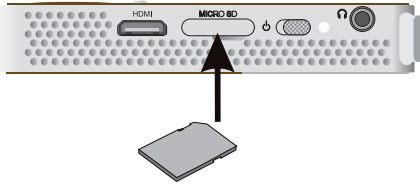


### Danger of Hearing Damage

Do not use the device over a longer time at high volume – especially when using headphones. This could lead to the risks of hearing damage. Before connecting the headphones, turn down the volume on the device. After connecting the headphones, increase the volume to a comfortable level.

# 6 Memory

## Inserting a Memory Card



- 1 Insert a memory card with the contacts facing downwards into the **MICRO SD** slot at the side of the device. Your device supports the following memory cards: Micro SD/SDHC/SDXC.
- 2 Insert the memory card into the slot until it snaps into position.

### **DANGER!**



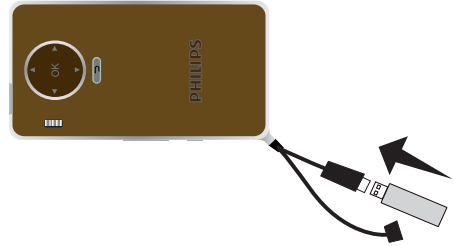
#### **Inserting a Memory Card!**

Never pull out the memory card while the device is accessing it. This could cause data to be damaged or lost.

Switch the device off in order to make sure that the device does not access the memory card.

- 3 Press lightly on the memory card to remove it.
- 4 The memory card is ejected.

## Connecting USB Storage Medium



- 1 Connect the USB storage medium to the USB cable of the device.

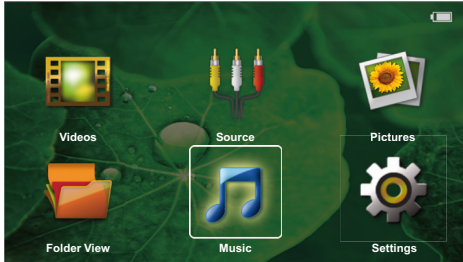

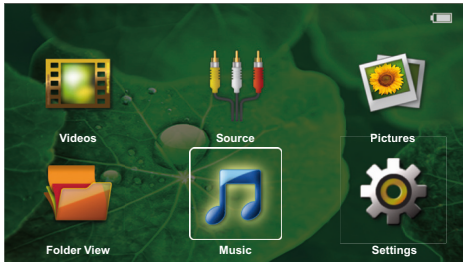

## Video playback

### Video Playback (USB / MICRO SD / Internal Memory)

- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Videos**.
- 4 Confirm with **OK**.
- 5 **With connected memory:** Using the keys **▲/▼** select the internal memory, the USB storage medium or the memory card.
- 6 Confirm with **OK**.
- 7 Use **▲/▼** to select the video file that you wish to play.

## Notice



### Displaying Video Files

Only those videos that are compatible with the Pocket Projector will be displayed.

- 8 Press **OK** to start playback.
- 9 Press **↶** to end the playback and return to the overview.
- 10 When you press **↶** again, you will return to the main menu.

During playback you can adjust the volume using **◀/▶**.

## File Format

There are various video file formats as \*.mov, \*.avi, \*.m4v. Many of these formats function as a container that contains the various encoded audio and video files. MPEG-4, H.264, MP3, and AAC are all examples of encoded audio/video files. In order to play these files, the projector must read them and decode the audio/video signals.

Please note that some files cannot be played as a result of different video and audio encoders.

### Video Playback (Mini-HDMI Socket)

- 1 Connect the audio/video output of the external device to the Pocket Projector's **HDMI** socket. Use the corresponding cable and cable adapter for this purpose (see also Connect to the Playback Device, page 10).
- 2 To find out how to deactivate the video output for the external device, please see the relevant instruction manual. Most often, this option is labelled "TV out" or "TV Output" in the corresponding menu.
- 3 Start the video playback on the external device.
- 4 Modify the volume with **◀/▶**.

## Modify settings during playback

- 1 Press the or key.
  - 2 Use the / keys to choose from the following settings:
    - Volume:** Adjust volume level
    - Smart Settings:** Select predefined settings for brightness / contrast / colour saturation
    - Saturation:** Adjust colour saturation
    - Contrast:** Adjust contrast
    - Brightness:** Adjust brightness
  - 3 Modify the setting using /.
- The device saves the modified settings automatically.

## Photo Playback

- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off switch on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Pictures**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 **With connected memory:** Using the keys / select the internal memory, the USB storage medium or the memory card.
- 6 Confirm with .
- 7 Thumbnail photos are displayed on the screen as an overview.

### Notice



#### Thumbnail or List

In the settings, you are able to select whether the overview will be displayed as miniatures or in a list.

### Notice



#### Many Photos on the Memory Card or the USB Medium

If there are a lot of photos on the memory card or the USB storage medium it can take a moment before the overview appears.

- 8 Use / or / to select the image that you want to start the slide show with.
- 9 Press to start the slide show.
- 10 Press to pause the slide show.
- 11 Press to end the slide show and return to the overview.
- 12 When you press again, you will return to the main menu.

## Slide Show with Background Sound

- 1 Start the slideshow.
- 2 Press /, to open the menu bar.

- 3 Using / select **Music**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 Use / to select the file that you wish to play.

#### Storage Location

Only files from the internal memory/Memory Card/USB Storage Medium can be played.

- 6 To start the background sound confirm with .
- 7 Press / to adjust the volume level.
- 8 If no input is made, the menu bar is hidden after 5 seconds.

## Music Playback

### Notice



#### Switch off the Image Playback

You can turn off image playback while playing music in order to save power (see also Music settings, page 17). As soon as you press the key, the image reappears and the fan starts again.

- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off switch on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Music**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 **With connected memory:** Using the keys / select the internal memory, the USB storage medium or the memory card.
- 6 Confirm with .
- 7 Use / to select the file that you wish to play.
- 8 Press to start playback.
- 9 Press to stop or continue playback.

#### Navigating when Image Playback is Switched off

Press / to skip to the previous or next song.

Press to stop or continue playback.





Press to return to the selection.

During playback you can adjust the volume using / key.

# Managing Files

## Copy Files

You can copy files back and forth from the internal memory to the connected USB storage medium or memory card.

- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off switch on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Folder View**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 **With an inserted memory card or USB storage device:** Select the internal memory, the USB storage medium or the memory card using the keys .
- 6 Confirm with .
- 7 Use  to select the file that you want to copy.

### Notice



#### No Files Found (0 files)

Only those files that are compatible with the Projector will be displayed.







- 8 Mark the file using . Pressing the key again deselects the chose file(s).

### Notice



#### Mark the Entire Folder



You can also mark an entire folder to copy all files from the folder. Note that the copy process of large folders can takes some time.

- 9 Use  to select other files.
- 10 Press .
- 11 Select with  **Copy**.
- 12 Confirm with .
- 13 Use  to select the destination memory: **SD card, internal memory** or **USB storage medium**.
- 14 Confirm with .

### Notice



#### Files Already Exist

If the files you are copying already exist in the target folder, you must choose whether or not you want to overwrite them using  and . If you choose not to overwrite these files, copies will be created. The copies can be recognised by a number added to the file names.

- 15 The files are copied.

### Notice



#### Error





If errors occur during the copying process, make sure that enough free space is available on the medium.

#### Removing Storage Medium

Only remove the storage medium after the copy process is complete.

## Delete Files

You can delete files from the internal memory, the connected USB storage medium or the memory card.








- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Folder View**.
- 4 Confirm with .
- 5 **With connected memory:** Using the keys  select the internal memory, the USB storage medium or the memory card.
- 6 Confirm with .
- 7 Use  to select the file that you want to delete.

#### No Files Found (0 files)

Only those files that are compatible with the Projector will be displayed.

- 8 Mark the file using . Pressing the key again deselects the chose file(s).
- 9 Use  to select other files.
- 10 Press .
- 11 Select with  **Delete**.
- 12 Confirm with .
- 13 Use  if you want to delete the files or cancel the deletion process.
- 14 Confirm with .

### Notice



#### Error

If errors occur during the deletion process, make sure that the storage medium is not write-protected.



#### Deleting Photos on the Memory Card

When deleting photos via the computer, note that the photos may not be correctly displayed when the memory card is inserted into the digital camera again. Digital cameras sometimes store additional information in specific folders, including previews and orientation information. For this reason, only delete the photos using the digital camera.

- 1 Switch the device on using the on/off switch on the side.
- 2 After the initial screen the main menu appears.
- 3 Use the navigation keys to select **Settings**.
- 4 Confirm with **OK**.
- 5 Use **▲/▼** to select from the following settings.
- 6 Confirm with **OK**.
- 7 Modify the settings using **OK**, **▲/▼**,
- 8 Confirm with **OK**.

The **↶** key takes you one step back in the menu.

## Overview of the Menu Functions

### Image settings

**Wall paper** – Select background images

**Fit Screen** – Convert videos and images to Original, Optimal or 16:9 resolution

#### Projection mode

**Front** – Normal projection; the device is located in front of the projection surface/screen

**Rear** – Rear projection; the device is located behind the projection surface; the image is reflected horizontally.

**Rear ceiling** – The device is located behind the projection surface, hanging from the ceiling in an upside-down position; the image is rotated through 180 degrees and reflected horizontally.

**Ceiling** – The device is hanging from the ceiling in an upside-down position; the image is rotated through 180 degrees.

**Wall color correction** – Colour correction of the projected image to adjust to coloured projection surfaces

**Smart Settings** – Select predefined settings for brightness / contrast / colour saturation. If you modify these settings, the setting is switched to **Standard**.

**Brightness** – Adjust brightness

**Contrast** – Adjust contrast

**Saturation** – Adjust saturation

### Sound Settings:

**Volume** – Adjust the volume

**Bass** – Set the playback of the low frequencies

**Treble** – Set the playback of the high frequencies

**Key beep** – Turn key tones on and off

### Video settings

**View** – Display all videos in a list or a corresponding folder structure on the drive.

**Repeat** – Set the repeat type for video files: Repeat deactivated (**Off**), repeat all videos in a directory (**Directory**), repeat only the current video (**Movie**), repeat all videos (**All**).

**Resume play** – If this function is activated, playback will continue at the position it was last stopped. If deactivated, playback will always start at the beginning of the video.

### Music settings

**View** – Show all tracks in a list or a corresponding folder structure on the drive.

**Screen** – Activate or deactivate the projection during playback.

**Repeat** – Set the repeat type for music files: Repeat deactivated (**Off**), repeat all songs in a directory (**Directory**), repeat only the current song (**Song**), repeat all songs (**All**).

**Shuffle** – Activate this function for random playback. Otherwise, playback will take place in sequence.

### Picture settings

**View** – Display the images as a **thumbnail** or as a **list** during selection in the main menu.

**Time per slide** – Image viewing time during slide show

**Repeat** – Set the type of repeat for slide show photos: Repeat off (**Off**), repeat all photos in the directory (**Directory**), repeat all stored photos (**All**).

**Slide transition** – Set image transitions

**Slideshow order** – Play slide show in order or randomly

### Power Save

**Brightness mode** – This function reduces the light output in order to increase the operating time for the built-in battery. When operating from the power supply, the energy saving mode is always deactivated in order to ensure the best-possible image display.

**Sleep mode** – With this function, the projector automatically shuts down after a specified period of time or at the end of a movie.

**Auto demo mode** – Switching demo mode on and off. In this mode, Pocket Projector is continuously displayed on the screen and video and/or audio files placed in internal memory are read directly.

**Bluetooth** – Enables the function and select the Bluetooth device.

**Language** – Select the desired language for the menu.

### Maintenance

**Reset settings** – Reset settings to factory defaults.

**Firmware Update** – Update Firmware

Connect for the duration of the firmware update the power adapter.

**Information** – Display free space in the internal memory and information on the device (Capacity: / Free space: / Firmware version: / Device name: / Model:)

# 11 Service

## Care Instructions for the Battery

The capacity of the battery diminishes with time. You can prolong the life of the battery if you observe the following points:

- Without a power supply, the device operates from the built-in battery. When the battery does not have sufficient capacity, the device turns off. Connect the device to the power supply.
- When the battery does not have sufficient capacity, the battery symbol in the display and turns red.
- When the device is running for a long period of time, the surface becomes hot and a warning symbol appears on the projection. The device behaves as follows:
  - 1 The fan turns to maximum level.
  - 2 At maximum level of brightness the overheat symbol appears in the status bar and the device turns automatically to minimum level of brightness.
  - 3 At minimal level of brightness the overheat symbol shows for three seconds in the middle of the screen. Then the device turns off automatically.

After the device has cooled down, you can continue playback.

- Use the device at least once a week.
- Charge the battery regularly. Don't store the device with a completely discharged battery.
- If the device is not used for several weeks, discharge the battery a little by using the device before storing it.
- If the device only works using the USB connection or with the power supply, the battery is defective.
- Keep the device and the battery away from sources of heat.

### DANGER!



#### Do not Replace the Battery Yourself

Do not try to replace the battery yourself. Incorrect handling of the battery or using the wrong type of battery can cause damage to the device or cause injury.

## Battery deep discharge

When the battery is in deep discharge or the device is not used for a longer period, proceed as followed:

- 1 Connect the device to the power supply (see also Connect Power Supply / Charge Battery, page 8). The device behaves as follows:

	Device off	Device on
Connect to a computer	The indicator light on the side of the device turns red. Slow charging	Connect to a computer No charging
Connect to the power adapter	The indicator light on the side of the device turns red. Fast charging	Device remains turned on. Slow charging

- 2 The device can be turned on and is ready to use after approximately five minutes of charging time.

Slow charging	5 minutes	10 hours
Fast charging	5 minutes	2 hours

# Cleaning

## DANGER!



### Instructions for Cleaning!

Use a soft, lint-free cloth. Never use liquid or easily flammable cleansers (sprays, abrasives, polishes, alcohol, etc.). Do not allow any moisture to reach the interior of the device. Do not spray the device with any cleaning fluids.

Wipe over the surfaces gently. Be careful that you do not scratch the surfaces.

## Cleaning the Lens

Use a brush or lens cleaning paper for cleaning the lens of the projector.

## DANGER!



### Do not use any Liquid Cleaning Agents

Do not use any liquid cleaning agents for cleaning the lens, to avoid damaging the coating film on the lens.

## Device Overheated

A overheat symbol appears if the device is overheated (see also Symbols in the Statusbar, page 7). The device behaves as follows:

- 1 The fan turns to maximum level.
- 2 At maximum level of brightness the symbol appears in the status bar and the device turns automatically to minimum level of brightness.
- 3 At minimal level of brightness the symbol shows for three seconds in the middle of the screen. Then the device turns off automatically.

After the device has cooled down, you can continue playback.

# Update Firmware with Memory Card

## Notice



Connect for the duration of the firmware update the power adapter (see also Connect Power Supply / Charge Battery, page 8).

- 1 Format the memory card in the file system FAT16 or FAT32.

## DANGER!



### All Data will be Deleted!

This procedure erases all your data that is stored on the memory card.

- 2 Save the latest firmware update file to the memory card.
- 3 Insert the memory card (see also Inserting a Memory Card, page 11) and switch the device on.
- 4 Use the navigation keys to select **Settings**.
- 5 Confirm with **OK**.
- 6 Use **▲/▼** to select **Maintenance**.
- 7 Confirm with **OK**.
- 8 Use **▲/▼** to select **Firmware Update**.
- 9 Confirm with **OK**.
- 10 Use **▲/▼** to select **Yes**.
- 11 Confirm with **OK**.
- 12 The device turns off and on again. After around 5 minutes the **Language Selection** screen appears. The firmware update is now completed.

## DANGER!



### Inserting a Memory Card!

Never pull out the memory card while the device is accessing it. This could cause data to be damaged or lost.

## DANGER!



### Power!

Do not unplug the power adapter during the firmware update.

If an error occurs during the firmware update process retry the procedure or contact your dealer.

# Troubleshooting

## Power Cycling

If a problem occurs that cannot be corrected with the instructions in this user manual (see also the help below), follow the steps given here.

- 1 Switch the device off using the on/off switch on the side.
- 2 Wait at least ten seconds.
- 3 Switch the device on using the on/off switch on the side.
- 4 If the problem repeats, please contact our technical customer service or your retailer.
