

Prediction of MPE limit at a given distance

Equation from page 18 of OET Bulletin 65, Edition 97-01

$$S = \frac{PG}{4\pi R^2}$$

where: S = power density
P = power input to the antenna
G = power gain of the antenna in the direction of interest relative to an isotropic radiator
R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna

Prediction frequency:	<u>900</u>	(MHz)
MPE limit for uncontrolled exposure at prediction frequency:	<u>0.6</u>	(mW/cm^2)
Power density at prediction frequency:	<u>0.131441</u>	(mW/cm^2)
