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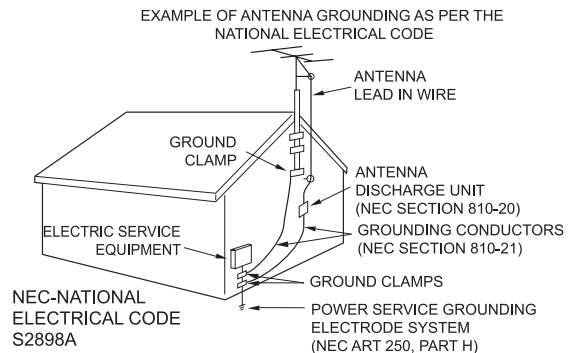

9. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
10. Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.

22. When you connect the product to other equipment, turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet. Failure to do so may cause an electric shock and serious personal injury. ## CONDENSATION:

Moisture will form in the operating section of the unit if the unit is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, unit's performance will be impaired. To prevent this, let the unit stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching it on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually.

Condensation may also form during the summer if the unit is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the unit.

## HOW TO HANDLE THE LCD PANEL:

- Do not press hard or jolt the LCD panel. It may cause the LCD panel glass to break and injury may occur.
- If the LCD panel is broken, make absolutely sure that you do not touch the liquid in the panel. This may cause skin inflammation.

If the liquid gets in your mouth, immediately gargle and consult with your doctor. Also, if the liquid gets in your eyes or touches your skin, consult with your doctor after rinsing for at least 15 minutes or longer in clean water.

# Getting Started

## Viewing the Remote Control

### Keys on the front of the remote control

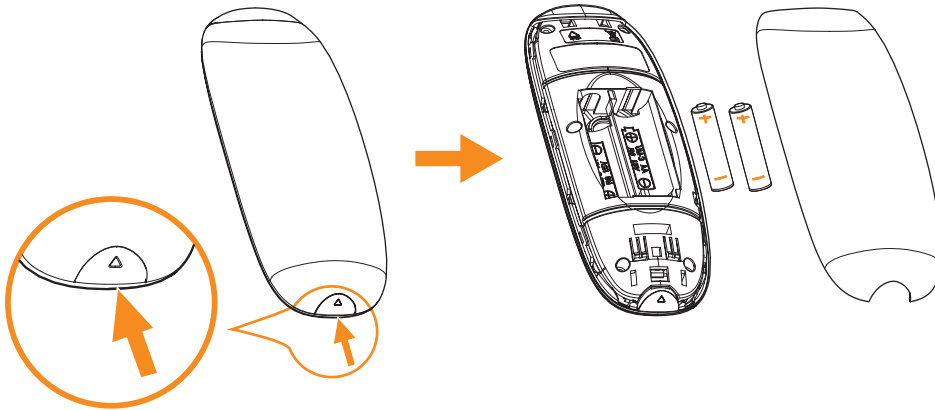


### LED indicator

- The LED on the remote control will blink with each button press.
- In pairing mode, the red LED will light continuously for ~60-seconds.
- When pairing is complete, the blue LED will flash three times.
- The LED light will blink continuously when the battery is low.
- The remote control will automatically go into sleep mode thirty seconds after the last button press. Sleep Mode can conserve battery life. Any movement or button press will immediately wake up the remote.

# Getting Started

## Installing Batteries in the Remote Control



Insert batteries into the remote control as shown.

1. To open the battery cover, push the latch in the direction of the Arrow and lift off the cover.
2. Insert two AA size batteries. Make sure to match the (+) and (-) ends of the batteries with the (+) and (-) ends indicated in the battery compartment.
3. Close the battery cover.

### NOTE

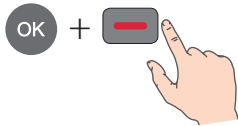
The batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

## Pairing the Remote

The air mouse and microphone functions are available after the remote control is paired.

### ● The First Method

The Setup Wizard menu appears the first time you turn on the TV. Step of the remote pairing, press and hold down the [Red] and [OK] buttons simultaneously until the red LED turns on. When the red LED lights, release the buttons and wait for the TV to pair with the remote. The blue LED on the remote control will flash three times when the pairing is successfully completed.



### ● The Second Method

1. Enter **Settings > Bluetooth** to turn on **Bluetooth**.
2. Press and hold the [Red] button and [OK] button for three seconds simultaneously.
3. Select **Find nearby devices** to search the remote control, and the remote control will appear in available devices, then press [▲/▼] button to select the Hisense Vision Remote Control and press [OK] to pair.

## Using the Air Mouse and Voice Input

The remote control supports air mouse and voice input (requires remote control pairing).

Shake the remote control to turn on air mouse function, and press the direction key to turn off the function.

Press the Voice key to start Google Voice Search. You can input voice via the microphone of the remote control.

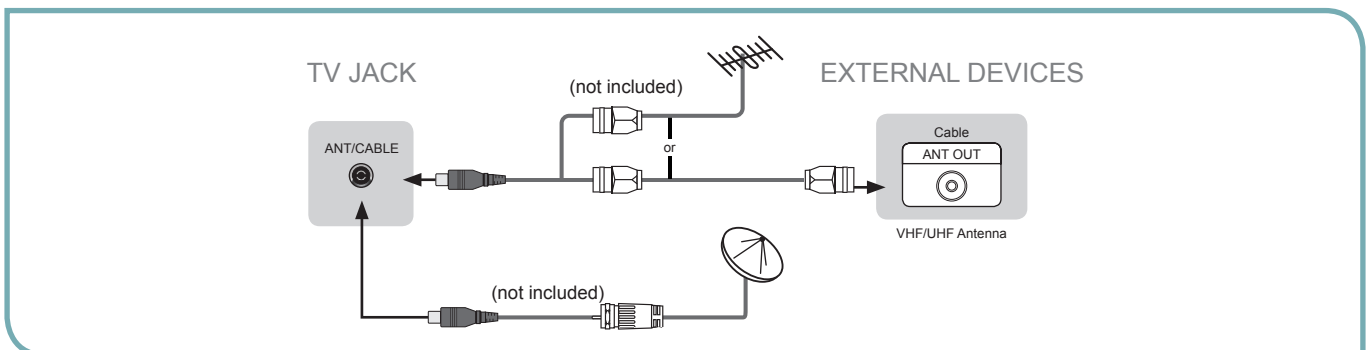

### NOTES

- Check the jacks for position and type before making any connections. Loose connections can result in image or color problems. Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.
- Not all A/V devices have the ability to connect to a TV, please refer to the user manual of your A/V device for compatibility and connection procedure.
- Always unplug the power cord when connecting external equipment.

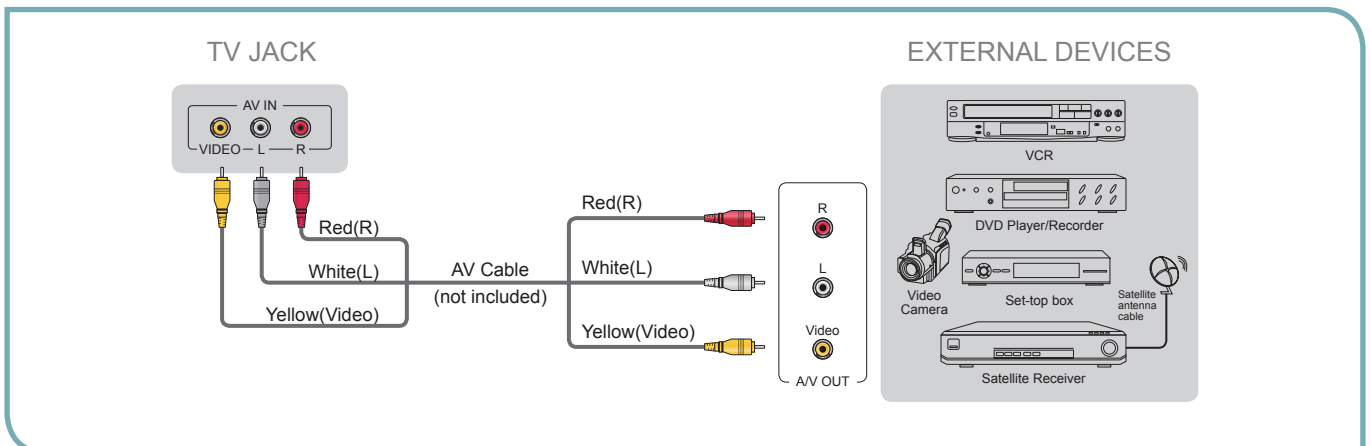
### Connecting an antenna, cable or cable/satellite box

1. Turn off the TV before connecting the antenna.
2. Connect one end of a coaxial cable (not included) to the RF OUT jack on the antenna, cable or cable/satellite box. If you are using an antenna with twin-lead cable, you may need a 300-75 ohm adapter (not provided) to connect it to the back of your TV. Likewise, if you are using several antennas, you may need a combiner (not provided).
3. Connect the other end of the cable to the ANT/CABLE jack on the side of your TV.



### Connecting an A/V Device with Composite Cable

1. Use the audio and video cables to connect the external A/V device's composite video/audio jacks to the TV's jacks. (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red)
2. Plug the connected devices into the mains socket before switching on the TV.
3. Select the corresponding source on the TV using the INPUT button.



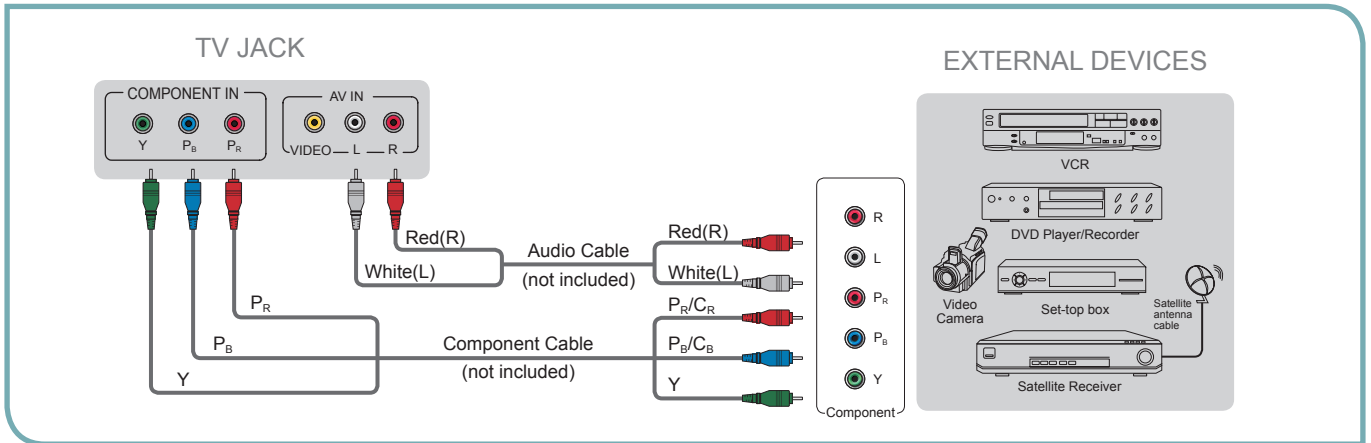
### NOTE

One AV device can be connected to the TV using either composite or component cable.

## Connecting an A/V Device with Component (YP<sub>B</sub>P<sub>R</sub>) Cable

1. Use a component cable to connect the external A/V device's component output jacks to the TV's YP<sub>B</sub>P<sub>R</sub> jacks. Use an audio cable to connect the external A/V device's component audio jacks to the TV's AUDIO (L/R) jacks.
2. Plug the connected devices into the mains socket before switching on the TV.
3. Select the corresponding source on the TV using the INPUT button.

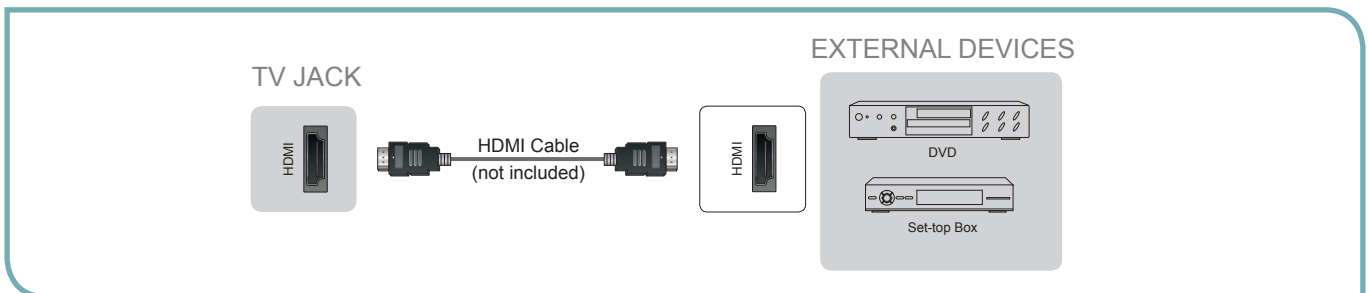


### NOTE

One AV device can be connected to the TV using a component or composite cable.

## Connecting an A/V Device with HDMI Cable


- Supports digital connections between HDMI - enabled AV devices such as PVR, DVD, Blu-Ray, AV receiver and digital devices.
  - Some devices such as PVR or DVD player require HDMI signal to be set to output in the device's settings.
  - Please consult your device user manual for instructions.
1. Use an HDMI cable to connect the A/V device's HDMI output jack to the TV's HDMI jack.
  2. Plug the connected devices into the mains socket before switching on the TV .
  3. Select the corresponding source on the TV using the INPUT button.

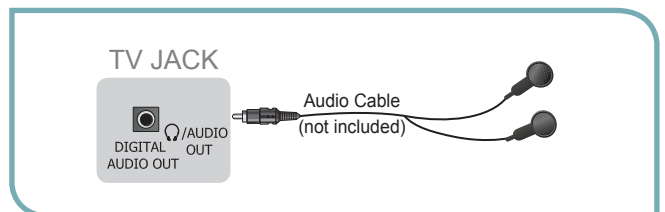


### NOTE

The HDMI connector provides both video and audio signals, it's not necessary to connect an audio cable.

## Connecting a headphone

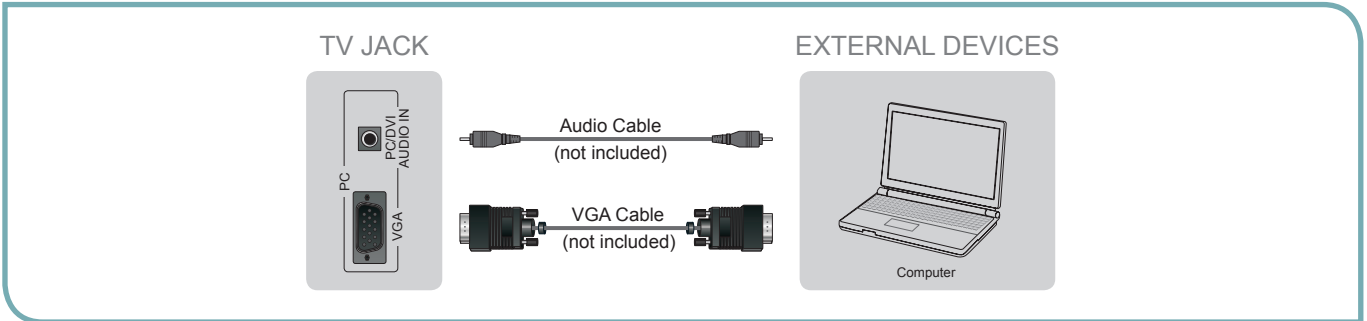
Headphones or an analog sound bar can be connected to the  /AUDIO OUT jack on your set. (While the headphone is connected, the sound from the built-in speakers will be disabled.)

## ❏ Connecting a PC with VGA Cable

1. Use a VGA cable to connect the PC's VGA output jack to the TV's VGA jack. Use an audio cable to connect the PC's audio output jack to TV's PC/DVI AUDIO IN jack.
2. Plug the connected devices into the mains socket before switching on the TV.
3. Select the corresponding source on the TV using the INPUT button.

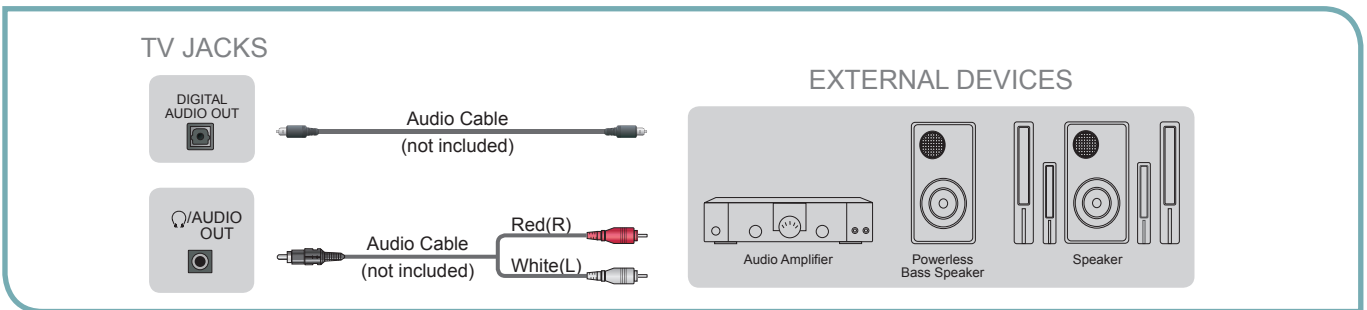


### ✔ NOTES

- Primarily this unit is intended for use as an LCD TV. If you want to use it as a monitor, please contact the manufacturer of the PC Video/Graphic's card for further support. Perfect compatibility is not guaranteed.
- The VGA cable is not supplied with the product.
- We recommend the use of a VGA cable with 2 ferrite cores as shown in the diagram.

## ❏ Connecting an Audio Receiver with a digital Audio cable

1. Use an audio cable to connect the A/V device's digital audio in jack to the TV's DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack. Or use an RCA Y-cable (1/8"-stereo mini to L/R phono - not provided) to connect analog sound system to the TV's AUDIO OUT jack.
2. Plug the connected devices into the mains socket before switching on the TV.
3. Select the corresponding source on the audio receiver.



### ✔ NOTES

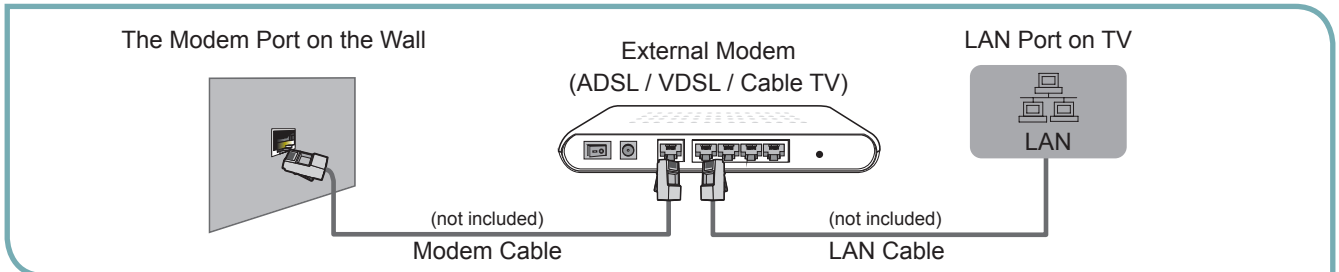
- When a digital audio system is connected to the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack, decrease the volume of both the TV and the system.
- 5.1 CH (channel) audio is available when the TV is connected to an external device supporting 5.1 CH.
- When the receiver (home theater) is set to on, you can hear sound output from the TV's digital audio out jack. When the TV is receiving a DTV signal, the TV will send 5.1 CH sound to the home theater receiver. When the source is connected to the TV via HDMI, only 2 CH audio will be heard from the home theater receiver. If you want to hear 5.1 CH audio, connect the digital audio out jack from your DVD/Blu-ray player/cable box/STB satellite receiver directly to an amplifier or home theater.
- Settings > Sound > Digital sound output must be set to either PCM or Dolby digital.

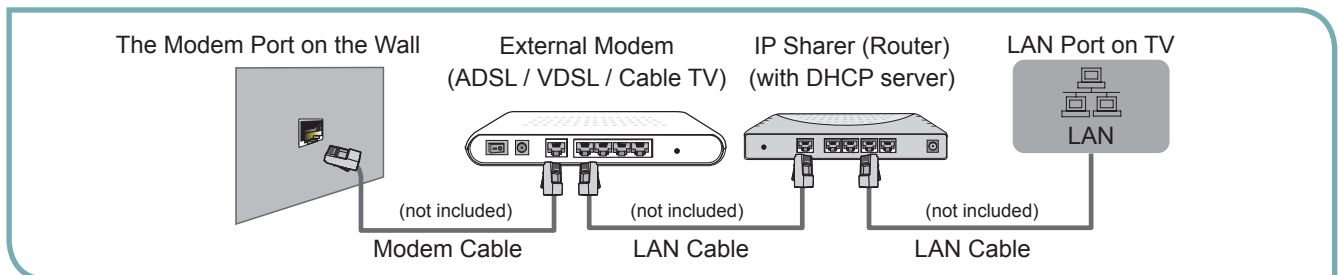
## Connecting to a Wired Network

You can attach your TV to your LAN by one of the three following ways:

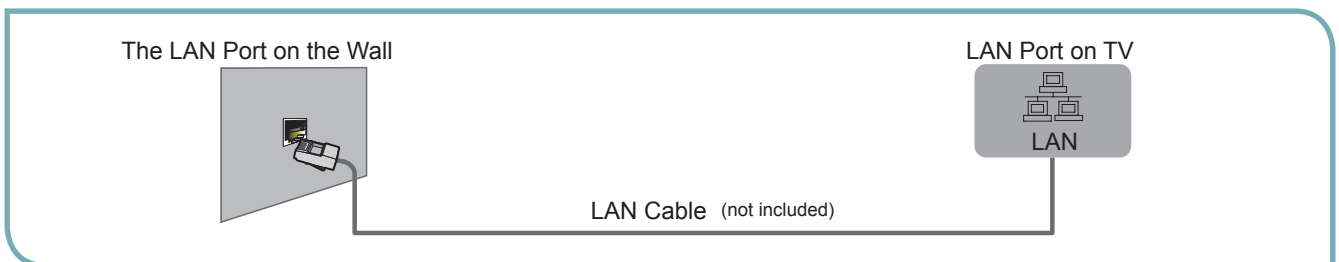
- You can attach your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an external modem using a Cat 5 LAN cable. See the diagram below.



- You can attach your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an IP Sharer which is connected to an external modem. Use LAN cable for the connection. See the diagram below.



- Depending on how your network is configured, you may be able to attach your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV directly to a network wall outlet with a Cat 5 cable. See the diagram below. Note that the wall outlet is attached to a modem or router elsewhere in your house.



If you have a Dynamic Network, you should use an ADSL modem or router that supports Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP). Modems and routers that support DHCP automatically provide the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS, so you don't have to enter them manually. Most home networks are Dynamic Networks.

Some networks require a Static IP address. If your network requires a Static IP address, you must enter the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS values manually on your TV's Cable Setup Screen when you set up the network connection. To get the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS values, contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP).

If you have a Windows computer, you can also get these values through your computer.

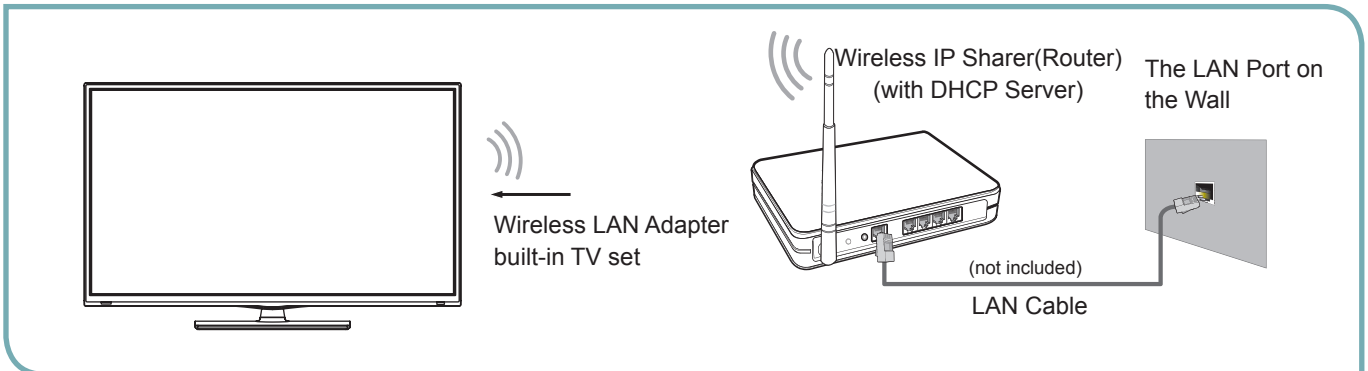
### NOTE

You can use ADSL modems that support DHCP if your network requires a Static IP address. ADSL modems that support DHCP also let you use Static IP addresses.

# Getting Started

## Connecting to a Wireless Network

To connect your TV to your network wirelessly, you need a wireless router or modem. See the illustration below.



Hisense's built-in Wireless LAN Adapter supports the IEEE 802.11 b/g/n communication protocols. Hisense recommends using IEEE 802.11n router. When you play video over a IEEE 802.11b/g connection, the video may not play smoothly.

### NOTES

- You must use the Hisense's built-in Wireless LAN Adapter to use a wireless network, the set doesn't support external USB network adapter.
- To use a wireless network, your TV must be connected to a wireless IP sharer. If the wireless IP sharer supports DHCP, your TV can use a DHCP or static IP address to connect to the wireless network.
- Select a channel for the wireless IP sharer that is not currently being used. If the channel set for the wireless IP sharer is currently being used by another device nearby, this will result in interference and communication failure.
- If you apply a security system other than the systems listed below, it will not work with the TV.
- If Pure High-throughput (Greenfield) 802.11N mode is selected and the Encryption type is set to WEP, TKIP or TKIP-AES (WPS2 Mixed) for your Access Point (AP), Hisense TVs will not support a connection in compliance with these Wi-Fi certification specifications.
- If your AP supports WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup), you can connect to the network via PBC (Push Button Configuration) or PIN (Personal Identification Number). WPS will automatically configure the SSID and WPA key in either mode.

## Wireless Display

If your phone, PAD with Wireless Display function can be achieved wireless connection with the TV.

1. Set the Wireless Display function on your phone or PAD is available.
2. Share your phone or PAD's display.

## To control the other devices

You can control connected devices with the TV remote control without using a remote control of each individual device.

You can use CEC function or connect an IR Blaster to do this. We recommend the IR Blaster. CEC function requires that your device is compatible with HDMI Consumer Electronic Control (CEC).

### CEC

1. Connect the TV to the HDMI CEC - compatible devices.
2. Set the CEC function of the Connected device (please refer to the device's User Guide for instructions).

3. Press  button, go to **Settings > Local Settings > HDMI settings** to configure the HDMI CEC function.

**Control for HDMI:** Allow the TV to control compatible HDMI devices.

**Device auto power off:** When HDMI CEC is enabled, this function turns off HDMI CEC devices when you turn off your TV.

**TV auto power on:** When HDMI CEC is enabled and you turn on an HDMI CEC device, this function turns on your TV automatically.

**System Audio control:** Control the volume of the AV receiver with the volume key of TV remote control.

**Device list:** Display a list of HDMI CEC devices that are connected to your TV.


## NOTES

- HDMI cables must be used to connect HDMI CEC - compatible devices to your TV.
- The connected device's HDMI CEC feature must be turned on.
- If you connect an HDMI device that is not HDMI CEC - compatible, none of the HDMI CEC Control features will work.
- Depending on the connected HDMI device, the HDMI CEC Control feature may not work.
- After choosing control for HDMI, you may select device auto power off and/or TV auto power on and/or system audio control.


## IR Blaster

You can connect an IR Blaster to control many popular video input devices, AV receivers and audio amplifiers.

### - To control video input

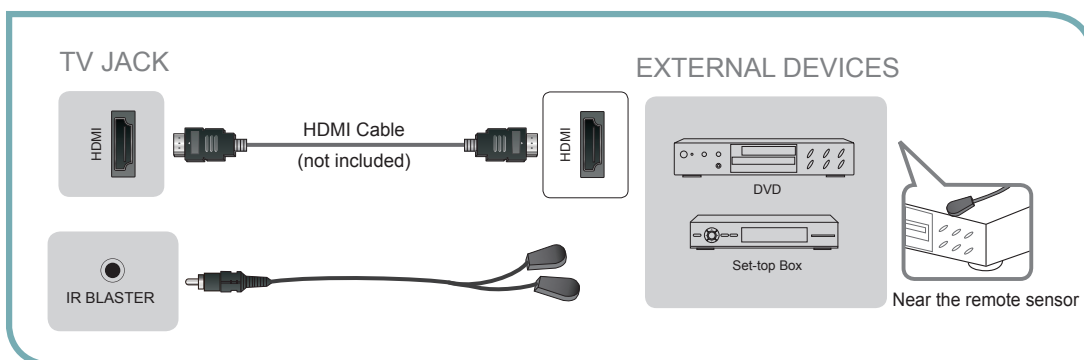
1. Connect the IR Blaster to the TV via the rear panel connector and place it properly on the device to be controlled.
2. Press  button, go to **Settings > Video input**.
3. Enter **Video input** option, Select **Add device manually**, then follow the on-screen instructions.
4. When the setup is finished, press [INPUT] button to display the **Select Device** menu, Use the [**▲/▼**] button to select your add device, press [OK] button to set live TV.
5. Then, you can control the connected device with the remote control of the TV.

### - To control audio amplifier

1. Connect an IR Blaster to the TV and place it properly on the AV receiver.
2. Press  button, go to **Settings > Local settings > AVR**
3. Select **AV Receiver setting**, then follow the on-screen instructions.
3. Then, you can set the IR Blaster to control your audio amplifier.

## NOTE

Two or more video input devices or two or more audio amplifiers/AVRs cannot be controlled simultaneously with IR Blaster. If you want to control a video input device and an audio amplifier/AVR simultaneously, please place the two devices close to each other. or purchase on IR Blaster cable with multiple emitters.





# Getting Started

## Turning the TV on or off

**IMPORTANT:** If you have not yet paired the remote to the TV, please refer to the section titled **Pairing the Remote in this manual.**

To turn your TV on or off (standby mode):

1. Plug the power cord into an AC power outlet.
2. Press  button, your TV turns on.
3. Press  button again to turn off your TV. When you turn off your TV, it goes into standby mode.

### NOTES

- When your TV is in standby mode, it is still receiving power. To completely disconnect power, unplug the power cord.
- It may take 15-20 seconds for the TV to be ready after pressing the power button.

## Changing Channels / Volume

1. Press the [CH +/-] button on the TV/remote control to change the channel.
2. Press the [VOL +/-] button on the TV/remote control to adjust the volume.
3. Press the [...] button to display numeric menu, then select digit channel number to display the corresponding channels.


### NOTE

- [CH +/-] button can be used in ANT/CABLE mode only.

## Turning the TV On for the First Time

The Setup Wizard menu appears the first time you turn on the TV. The wizard will guide you step-by-step through the initial setup and configuration of your television.

**IMPORTANT:** Make sure that the antenna or cable is connected and a wired or wireless Internet connection is available.

1. Make sure that you have:
  - Installed the remote control batteries.
  - Connected an antenna, cable or CATV/SAT set-top-box PVR.
  - Connected the power cord.
2. Press [POWER ] button to turn on your TV.
3. The **Setup Wizard** menu displays. Follow Step 1 through 11 in the Setup Wizard menu procedure.

4. Set **IP settings** to **Dynamic**.  
Auto acquires and enters the needed Internet values automatically.

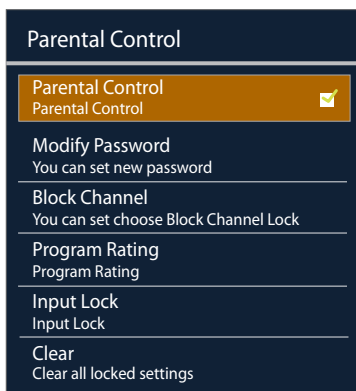
Use the Automatic Network Setup when connecting your TV to a network that requires a Static IP address. To get the network connection values on most windows computers, follow these steps:

### Getting the Network Connection Values

2. Go to **Settings > Ethernet > Static**.
3. Set **IP settings** to **Static**, then press [/] button to select item and press [/] button to move the cursor to the entry field. Then press 0~9 buttons to enter the numbers.

## Parental Control

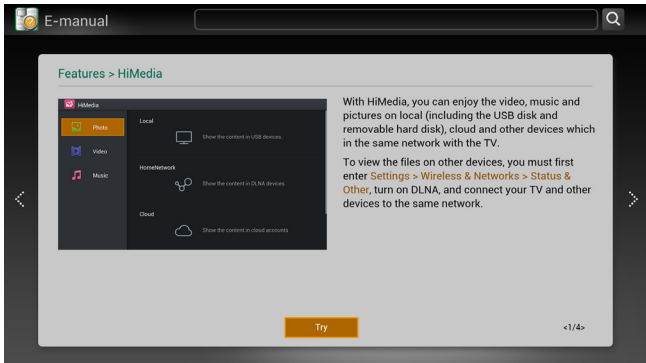

## DLNA Settings

DLNA Setting needs to be set on TV and computer Respectively.

### Network Setup

1. To use DLNA to enjoy movies, pictures, music, you have to connect the TV into a network first.
2. For more information on how to configure your network, refer to "Network".
  - It is recommended to locate both the TV and the PC in same subnet. The first 3 parts of the subnet address of the TV and the PC IP addresses should be the same and only the last part (the host address) should be changed.
3. Using a LAN cable, connect between the external modem and the PC onto which Windows Media Player Manager Program will be installed.

  - Download the Twonky Beam application using the link found on the Hisense website at [www.hisense-usa.com](http://www.hisense-usa.com).
  - Confirm the device is connected to the same local area network as the TV.
  - Launch the Twonky Beam application, select the video, music or picture you want to share and beam it to the TV.
  - You can control the playback using the TV remote or from the device application.
