The following topics describe the basics of using this guide and your new phone.

About the user guide

Thank you for purchasing your new U680AC Smartphone. The following topics explain how best to use this guide to get the most out of your phone.

Before using your phone

Read the Safety Information Guide that came with your device thoroughly for proper usage.

Accessible services may be limited by subscription contract conditions.

Descriptions in the user guide

Note that most descriptions in this guide are based on your phone's setup at the time of purchase. Unless otherwise noted, instructions begin from the phone's Home screen, which is displayed by pressing the **Home** button . Some operation descriptions may be simplified.

Screenshots and key labels

Screenshots and other illustrations in this user guide may appear differently on your phone. Key labels are simplified for description purposes and differ from your phone's display.

Other notations

In the user guide, the phone may be referred to either as "phone," "device," or "handset." A microSD[™] or microSDHC[™] card is referred to as an "SD card" or a "memory card."

Set up your phone

The following topics give you all the information you need to set up your phone and wireless service for the first time.

Parts and functions

These topics illustrate your phone's primary parts and key functions.



Note: Your phone's screens and app layouts are subject to change. This user guide uses sample images only.

Part	Description
Front camera	Take pictures and record videos while facing the screen.
Headset port	Plug in a headset (sold separately) to listen to music or for convenient, hands-free conversations.
Microphone	Transmit your voice electronically for a call, voice recording, or Google Assistant.
Receiver	Hear the caller and automated prompts.
Touch screen	 View information needed to operate your phone. Access your phone's features and applications.
USB Type-C charging & accessory port	Connect the USB cable (included) for charging, or connect other accessories.
Speaker	Listen to calls, automated prompts, and music.
SIM tray	Insert your Nano SIM card and microSD for service and additional storage.
Eject SIM tray	Insert the included SIM tray pin into the tray slot and remove the SIM tray.

Part	Description
Volume keys	Adjust the volume for ringtones, media, notifications, and system sounds.
Power/Lock key & Fingerprint sensor	 Power/Lock key Press to turn the screen on or off. Press and hold to turn the phone on. Press along with the Volume up key to turn the phone off. Press along with the Volume down key to take a screenshot.
	Fingerprint sensor Unlock your phone with a touch of your finger.
Rear cameras	 Take pictures and record videos with a 50+5+2 MP lens. Use features such as the beauty mode, slow motion, time lapse, panorama mode, and more.
Flash	Brighten photos taken indoors or at night.Use as a flashlight to see in dark areas.

CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect port may damage the phone.

Battery use

The following topics explain how to care for your phone's non-removable battery.



Battery cautions

Avoid storing or leaving the phone with no charge remaining. Saved information and settings may become lost or changed, or the battery may become unusable. Charge once every six months before storing or leaving unused for a long period of time.

Charge the battery

Follow these instructions to charge your phone's battery using either the included AC adapter or via USB connection on your computer.

Charge using the AC adapter

1. Connect one end of the data cable to the USB port located on the bottom of your phone.




- 2. Connect the other end to the power adapter.
- 3. Connect the power adapter to an electrical outlet to fully charge your phone.
 - Use the power adapter that comes with your phone; using other adapters may damage your phone.
 - Charging your phone with a USB cable connected to a laptop will take longer than with the power adapter.
 - The phone will power off automatically when the battery is too low. Charge the battery if this happens. When the battery is critically low, the phone may need a few minutes to build a charge before turning back on. Playing games or performing other activities while charging may drain the battery and cause it to power off.
 - The battery will gradually discharge if it is left unused for an extended period. Before using the battery again, you must recharge it in order to power on and use your phone normally.

Install a SIM/SD card

Insert a Nano SIM/microSD card

- 1. Insert the included SIM tray pin into the tray slot and remove the SIM tray.
- 2. Place the Nano SIM card and microSD card (optional) with metal contacts facing down into the tray.
- 3. Gently slide the SIM tray back into the slot.



First Time Setup after Inserting an SD Card

When you insert an optional SD card for the first time, it is recommended that you set up and format it on your phone.


Note: Formatting your SD card will erase all files on the card. Make sure to back up your files in another location before formatting.

Set up an SD card

- 1. Swipe down on the Status bar.
- 2. Tap the SD card notification.
- 3. Select Phone storage or Portable storage.

Note: Setting your SD card as portable storage will allow you to transfer files (videos, music, and photos) from your device to another device.

4. Tap Done.



Note: During the setup process, you may be prompted to format the SD card. Follow the prompts to finish the formatting. You can also setup and format your SD card via **Settings** menu, refer to the steps described below.

Format an SD card

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕

2. Tap Storage

3. Tap This device > SD CARD > Menu

4. Select Format, then tap FORMAT SD CARD to confirm.

All data on the SD card will be erased, and the card will be formatted for use on your phone.







Turn your phone on and off

The instructions below explain how to turn your phone on and off.


Turn your phone on

Press and hold the **Power/Lock** key until the device turns on.

Turn your phone off


There are two ways you can use to turn your phone off.

- Press the **Power/Lock** key and the **Volume up** key at the same time, and tap **Power off**.
- Swipe down on the Status bar twice to enter Quick Settings panel, and tap
 Power icon U > Power off.



Use the touch screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.



Tap or touch

Tap or touch with your finger to type characters into the on-screen keyboard, select and open applications and settings, or press on-screen buttons.

Touch and hold

Touch and hold an item to view available options (for example, a contact or link in a Web page), or to move icons or widgets.

Swipe or slide

Quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen to swipe or slide.

Drag

Touch and hold your finger with slight pressure, then move your finger slowly across the screen to drag. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.



Rotate

Rotate the phone sideways to change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape automatically. When entering text, you can turn the phone sideways to bring up a bigger keyboard. See <u>"Portrait and landscape screen orientation" on page 28</u> for more details.

Note: To enable or disable Auto-rotate mode, swipe up from Home screen to access Apps and tap Settings () > Display () > Auto-rotate screen, and slide the switch to the On () or Off () position. You can also activate it by dragging the Status bar down twice and tapping Auto-rotate ().



Pinch and spread

Use your thumb and forefinger in a pinching motion on your screen to zoom out, or spread them to zoom in when viewing a picture or a web page. (Move fingers inward to zoom out and outward to zoom in.)

Complete the setup screens

Once your service has been activated, you will need to run Setup. The Setup Wizard will appear to guide you through the basic settings on your device.

You will be prompted to select the language you want to use, set up your Wi-Fi connection, set a screen lock method, sign in to your GoogleTM Account, select location services, and more.

Follow the remaining instructions to finish your phone setup.

Basic operations

The following topics outline basic features and operations of your phone.

Home screen and Apps list

Most of your phone's operations originate from the Home screen or the **Apps** (applications) list.

- 1. From any screen, press the **Home** button **(**) to display the Home screen.
- 2. From the Home screen, swipe up to access the **Apps** list.



For information about using the Home screen, see <u>"Home screen basics" on</u> page 42.


Select options and navigate screens

Tap icons, on-screen buttons, and other items to open or activate the assigned function.

• Tap the **Back** button < to return to the previous screen.


Recent applications

View your recently used applications by tapping the **Recent Apps** button On recent applications screen, tap **Screenshot** to take a screenshot of the currently-displayed card.



Switch between recently opened apps

You can easily switch between the apps you've recently opened. Tap the **Recent Apps** button to see your recently opened apps.




- 1. Swipe right or left through the cards to find an app and tap it.
- 2. To close an app, swipe up on it.
- 3. To close all of the apps and clear the list, slide to the far left of the list and tap **CLEAR ALL**.

You can tap the **Recent Apps** button twice to switch between the two most recently used apps quickly.

Phone settings menu

You can customize your phone's settings and options in the Settings menu. There are two ways to access the Settings menu:


- From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings (2)
- From any screen, swipe the Status bar down twice to access Quick Settings Panel and tap **Settings** (a) at the bottom right corner.

Portrait and landscape screen orientation

The default orientation for your phone's screen is portrait (vertical), but many apps will change to landscape orientation (horizontal or widescreen) when the phone is rotated sideways.



Note: Not all screens can be used in landscape orientation.

Turn screen rotation on or off

Drag the Status bar down twice and tap **Auto-rotate** \bigotimes to turn it on or off. You can also set the rotation option from the Settings menu.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings [

2. Tap Display () > Auto-rotate screen and slide the switch to the On or Off position to activate or deactivate screen rotation.

Capture screenshots

To capture a screenshot, press the **Power/Lock** key and **Volume down** key at the same time to capture a screenshot of the current screen.

Your screenshots will be stored in the Screenshots folder in the Photos app. From the Home screen, tap **Photos** > Library > Screenshots.

Applications

Launch apps

All installed apps can be accessed and launched from the **Apps** list.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access the **Apps** list.

2. Tap an app icon to launch the app.

Group app folders

- 1. From the Home screen, tap a group app folder to open and tap an app shortcut to launch the app.
- 2. To add more apps to the folder, drag each app over to the folder.

App shortcuts

Tap and hold an app icon on the Home screen or Apps list to display a shortcut menu that lets you quickly access common app functions.



Note: Not all apps support the App shortcuts feature.

Control app permissions

The first time you open an app, you'll be asked to grant permissions to access certain data or features. This ensures that you have full control of which apps have authorized access.

If you don't want to grant access to an app, choose **DENY**. If you choose **DENY** in a trusted app, you may not be able to use the app or access all the functions.

To modify permission settings, follow the steps below:

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕
- 2. Tap **Apps ::::** > **See all apps**, and tap the app you want to modify permissions for.
- 3. Tap Permissions to view the apps you've allowed or haven't allowed
- 4. Tap an app and select **Allow only while using the app, Ask every time,** or **Don't allow** to adjust the permission settings.

Tip: You can also access permission settings by touching and holding the app on the Home screen or **Apps** list, tapping **App info** (i) to access the app info screen, and then tapping **Permissions**.

Set default apps

You can choose default apps for web browsing, text messages, and more.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯.
- 2. Tap Apps ::: > Default apps.
- 3. Choose your default web browser, phone app, messages app, and more.

Choose default apps

Some actions can be performed with more than one app. When performing an action for the first time, you may be prompted to choose an app. You can choose to use an app only this time by tapping **JUST ONCE**, or tap **ALWAYS** to set that app as the default.

You can change the default app at any time in the Settings menu.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯

2. Tap Apps > Default apps.

To change the default app for opening links, continue with the steps below:

- 1. Tap Apps > Default apps > Opening links.
- Tap the app you want to set and tap **Open supported links** to allow the listed verified web links to open in this app.

Disable an app

You can disable some default apps which can't be uninstalled to avoid them running in the background and downloading data.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕

2. Tap **Apps** > See all apps.

3. Tap the app you want to disable to access App info screen.

4. Tap DISABLE.

Tip: You can also disable apps by touching and holding the app on the Home screen or in the Apps list, tapping **App info** to access the App info screen, and tapping **DISABLE**.

Phone number

Follow the instructions below to view your phone number.

- From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings (2).
 Tap About phone 1.
- 3. You will see the phone number listed under Phone number.

Airplane mode

Airplane mode turns off all functions that emit or receive signals while leaving your phone on so you can use apps that don't require a signal or data.

To turn on/off Airplane mode

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯
- 2. Tap Network & internet 🛜 > Airplane mode.
- 3. Slide the switch to the **On** \bigcirc position to activate Airplane mode. You will see the Airplane mode icon \checkmark in the Status bar.
- 4. To turn off Airplane mode, slide the switch to the **Off** position to deactivate Airplane mode. Your phone's wireless connection features will be restored.

Tip: You can also access Airplane mode through the Quick Settings menu. Swipe the Status bar down twice to access the Quick Settings menu, swipe to the right to locate **Airplane mode**, and tap it to enable or disable data transmissions.

Enter text

You can type on your phone using one of the available touch screen keyboards or Google Voice Typing.

Touch screen keyboards

Your phone offers Google touch screen keyboards for entering text. The keyboard appears automatically on-screen when you tap a text entry field, and can be used in either portrait or landscape mode.

Note: Keyboard layouts and options may change depending on the app currently in use. For example, if you're entering text into a web search, a **Search** icon may appear instead of an **Enter** icon.

Google keyboard

The Google keyboard offers a traditional QWERTY keyboard setup for entering text by tapping keys (like on a computer), along with options that allow you to enter text faster and more accurately, such as continuous key input, personalized usage dictionaries, and more.

Access Google keyboard settings

From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings (2).
 Tap System (1) > Languages & input > On-screen keyboard > Gboard.

Google Voice Typing

Google Voice Typing uses Google Voice recognition to convert speech to text. From Messages screen, tap \bigcup and speak.

Tips for editing text

Your phone has many options to make entering text easier, including copying, cutting, and pasting text, using voice-to-text input, customizing the user dictionary, using predictive text, and more.

To edit text you have already entered

- 1. Touch and hold or double-tap the text you would like to edit.
- 2. Drag the tabs to adjust the highlighted selection.
- The following options will appear: Cut, Copy, Paste (if you have text copied on the clipboard), Share, and Select all (if there is more than one word available to select).

To insert new text

- 1. Touch where you want to type, the cursor and tab will appear. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- 2. Tap the tab to view the pop-up menu, then tap **Paste** to insert any text you have previously copied.

Google Account

You will need a Google Account to access several phone features, such as Gmail, Google Maps, Google Meet, and Google Play Store. Enter your Google Account information to access Google apps. These apps sync between your phone and your online Google Account.

Create a Google Account

If you do not already have a Google Account, you can create one online or using your phone.

Note: You can also create and sign into your Google/Gmail account from the Settings menu.

Create a Google Account online

- 1. Using a computer, visit *google.com*.
- 2. On the main page, click **Sign in > Create account > For myself**.
- 3. Follow the prompts to set up your account:
 - a. Enter your first and last name, a desired username/Gmail address, and create and confirm a password.
 - b. Add a phone number or secondary email for security (optional).
 - c. Enter basic personal information.
- 4. Tap **I agree** to accept Google's Privacy and Terms and finish your Google Account setup.

Create a Google Account using your phone

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯

2. Tap Passwords & accounts <a>> Add account.

3. Tap **Google** and then tap **Create account** > **For myself**.

- 4. Follow the prompts to set up your account. Tap **Next** to proceed between steps, which may include:
 - a. Enter your basic information such as first and last name.
 - b. Enter a desired username/Gmail address.
 - c. Create and confirm a password.
 - d. Add a phone number for security or tap Skip.
 - e. Review your account info. Tap **Next** to confirm.
- 5. Tap **I agree** to accept Google's Privacy and Terms and finish your Google Account setup.

Sign in to your Google Account

If you have a Google Account but have not yet signed in with your phone, follow these instructions to sign in to your Google Account.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯

2. Tap **Passwords & accounts** > **Add account** > **Google**.

- 3. Enter your email address or phone number and tap Next.
- 4. Enter your password and tap Next.
- 5. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the process.
- To sync your account information, follow the below steps:
- 1. From the Password & account screen, tap your account > **Account sync**.
- 2. Select the apps you would like to sync with your phone.
- 3. Tap Menu > Sync now.

Important: Cricket policies often do not apply to third-party applications. Thirdparty applications may access your personal information or require us to disclose your customer information to the third-party application provider. To find out how a third-party application will collect, access, use, or disclose your personal information, check the application provider's policies, which can usually be found on their website. If you aren't comfortable with the thirdparty application's policies, do not use the application.

Lock and unlock your screen

You can quickly turn your phone screen off when not in use, and unlock it when you need it.

Turn the screen off when not in use

To quickly turn the screen off, press the **Power/Lock** key.

Pressing the **Power/Lock** key again or receiving an incoming call will turn on your phone screen and display the lock screen.

To save battery power, your phone screen will automatically turn off after being idle for a period of time. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone's screen is off.

Turn the screen on and unlock it

1. To turn the screen on, press the **Power/Lock** key.

2. Swipe up from the bottom of the screen to unlock it.

If you have set up a screen lock, you will be prompted to unlock your phone. See <u>"Screen lock" on page 138</u> for details.


The following topics describe how to use and customize your phone's home screen, understand the Status bar, and use the Notification panel.

Home screen basics

The Home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your Home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more.

Home screen layout

Your Home screen extends beyond the initial screen. Swipe right to display additional screens.



Item	Description
App icons	Add shortcuts to your favorite apps to the home screen.
Back button	Tap to return to the previous screen.
Home button	Tap to display the main Home screen.
Recent Apps button	 Tap to display a list of recently used apps. Double-tap to swap between your last two used apps.
Notification area	View notifications for incoming messages, missed calls, application updates, and more. Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
Status area	View phone and service status information such as signal strength, battery status, Wi-Fi and data connectivity, and ringer status.
Status bar	Icons indicate your phone's status (on the right side) and notifications (on the left side).
Widgets	Add customizable quick access to app functions on your phone's Home screen.

Extended home screens

In addition to the main Home screen, your phone features extended Home screens to provide more space for adding icons, widgets, and more.

Press the **Home** button **()** to display the main Home screen, then swipe to the left or right to move from the main screen to an extended screen.

Tip: While on an extended screen, press the **Home** button **(b**) to return to the main Home screen.



Status bar and Notification panel

Quickly view your phone's status and notifications at the top of the screen.

Status bar

The Status bar at the top of the Home screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left. To view the Notification panel or access the Quick Settings menu, drag the Status bar down from the top of the screen.

Note: Additional notification icons may appear. All notifications may be accessed through the Notification panel.

Notification panel

- 1. Swipe down on the Status bar to open the Notification panel.
- 2. To check notifications, tap an item in the list.
- 3. Swipe left or right on a notification to delete it, or tap **Clear all** to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).
- 4. To close notification panel, swipe up or tap the **Back** button

Quick Settings panel

- 1. Swipe down on the Status bar again from the Notification panel.
- 2. Tap a setting to turn it on or off.



Customize the Home screen

Learn how to set the wallpaper and add, move, or remove shortcuts, widgets, and folders from the Home screen.

Operations for rearranging the Home screen

- To move widgets and app shortcut icons, touch and hold an app or widget on the Home screen and drag it to the desired location.
- To delete widgets and app shortcut icons, touch and hold an app or widget on the Home screen, and drag it to **X Remove** at the top of the screen to delete from the Home screen.

Add shortcuts to the Home screen

Add shortcuts for quick access to favorite apps from the Home screen.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Touch and hold an app icon, then drag to move it.
- 3. Drag the icon to an empty location on one of the Home screens. The shortcut will be added to the Home screen.

Add widgets to the Home screen

Widgets are self-contained apps on the Home screen. Unlike a shortcut, which will open an app, widgets can perform certain functions without navigating away from the Home screen. You can create widgets for a specificcontact, for bookmarks to web pages, your calendar, email, and more.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch and hold an empty space, and then tap **Widgets** in the Home screen menu.
- 2. Touch and hold a widget, then drag it to an empty location on one of the Home screens. The widget will be added to the Home screen.

Add App folders to the Home screen

You can group Home screen shortcuts into folders for convenient access.

- 1. Drag an app icon and release it over another app icon on the Home screen to create a folder.
- 2. Type a name for the folder, and then tap \checkmark .
- 3. To add more app shortcuts to the folder, touch and hold an app icon and drag it on top of the new folder.

Change folder names

Once you have added folders, you can change the name easily from the folder display.

- 1. Tap the folder to open it.
- 2. Tap the folder name, type a new name, and then tap </

Remove folder

Touch and hold a folder and drag it to **Remove** at the top of the screen.

Remove apps from a folder

- 1. Tap a folder to open it.
- 2. Touch and hold an app in the folder and drag it to the Home screen or to **Remove** at the top of the screen.

Change the wallpaper

1. From the Home screen, touch and hold an empty space, then tap **Wallpapers & style** on the Home screen menu.

Tip: You can also access the Wallpapers menu from the Settings menu. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Settings** > **Wallpaper** .

- 2. Tap **CHANGE WALLPAPER**, select the wallpaper from your photos or standard wallpapers folders.



Make a call with Wi-Fi Calling

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Phone (**,
- 2. If the keypad does not appear on the screen, tap (III) to open it. Enter a phone number in the keypad to make a call.
- 3. Tap 🕓 to make the call.

4. During a call, you can tap 😣 at the bottom of the screen to hang up.



Note: You must have an active Wi-Fi connection and have Wi-Fi Calling service activated on the device before it can be used. To turn on Wi-Fi Calling, you will need to set up an emergency address to help emergency services find you if you make an emergency call (911).

Receive a call

The Incoming Call screen is displayed when a call is received, along with the caller's number and other information you've entered for that contact. When you receive a phone call from someone who is not stored in Contacts, only the default caller ID icon and phone number appear on the Incoming Call screen.



- To answer a call, swipe () up.
- To reject a call, swipe (\mathbf{V}) down.
- Press any side key to mute the ringer.



Reject a call and send a text message

You can reject an incoming call and automatically send a quick response text message to the caller.

1. When a call arrives, swipe 🗐 up from the bottom left corner of the screen. The ringtone or vibration will stop, and you will see a list of quick preset responses.



Tap one of the messages or write your own to send to the caller.

You can edit the preset quick responses from the Call Settings menu. From the Phone app, tap **Menu** > **Settings** > **Quick responses** and edit the quick responses.







- Enter phone numbers, contact names, or email addresses directly in the **To** field. If you're sending the message to several contacts, separate the phone numbers with a comma. As you enter information, any matching phone numbers from your contacts list are displayed. Tap the matching contact to add them as a recipient.
- Scroll to find and select the contacts to whom you want to send the message. You can also create contact groups as recipients.
- 3. Tap the text box and compose your message.





Display your current country.

Suggestions

Enable or disable smart reply, suggested actions, suggested stickers, etc.

Automatic previews

Enable or disable automatic preview cards for links, places, and other content that the Messages app is able to recognize over time.

Spam protection

Enable or disable spam detection function and report to Google.

Swipe actions

Choose Archive or Delete, to the right or left, or turn off swiping.

Advanced

- **Group messaging:** Enable or disable the ability to send MMS messages to multiple recipients in a group.
- Auto-download MMS: Enable or disable the ability to automatically retrieve and download incoming MMS messages.
- Use simple characters: Convert the text's special characters into a simple message.
- Show iPhone reactions as emoji: Show iPhone reactions as emoji or texts.
- Wireless emergency alerts: View alert messages you've received.
- SIM card messages: View messages saved on your SIM card.
- Phone number: View your phone number.

Transfer files between your phone and a computer

Tips: If you want to save data to an SD card on your phone, make sure the SD card is installed and active. For more information, see <u>"First Time Setup after</u> Inserting an SD Card" on page 18.

Important: Avoid removing the SD card while transferring data.

- 1. Connect your phone to your computer using the USB charging cable.
 - Insert the end of the cable to the charger/accessory jack at the bottom of the phone.
 - Insert the USB end of the cable into an available USB port on your computer. You may need to remove the USB cable from the AC adapter to access it.
- 2. Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel, and tap **Charging this device via USB** to access USB Preferences screen.
 - You can also access USB Preferences screen via Settings menu (Settings > Connected devices > USB)
 - 3. Tap File Transfer. You can also select other options available.
 - 4. On your computer, navigate to the detected device (such as through the My Computer menu) and open it.
 - 5. If available, select a drive (Internal shared storage or SD card).
 - 6. Select a folder and copy files from your computer to your phone or from your phone to your computer.
 - 7. When done, disconnect your phone from your computer.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet. To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or hotspot.

Turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕

- 2. Tap Network & internet 🗢 > Wi-Fi.
- 3. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to enable Wi-Fi.
 - To disable Wi-Fi, slide the switch to the **Off OD** position.
- 4. Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect, enter the password (if applicable), and then tap **CONNECT**.

Your phone will be connected to the Wi-Fi network. You will see \P in the status bar. For more information on Wi-Fi, see <u>"Wi-Fi" on page 106</u>.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones. The communication range for Bluetooth is approximately 30 feet.

There are different options and functions available with certain Bluetooth accessories.

- Audio output: Wirelessly listen to music, podcasts, etc.
- Hands-free calls: Call hands-free, using Bluetooth-capable hands-free devices and headsets.
- Data exchange: Exchange data with Bluetooth devices.

Enable Bluetooth

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Settings (0)**.



2. Tap **Connected devices Connection preferences** > **Bluetooth**.

3. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to enable Bluetooth.

 You can also enable it from Quick Settings panel. Swipe the Status bar down twice to access the Quick Settings panel and tap **Bluetooth**.

Tip: Turn off Bluetooth when not in use to conserve battery power.

Pair Bluetooth devices

1. From the Bluetooth screen, tap **Pair new device**.

- 2. Tap a device under Available devices and follow the on-screen instructions to pair with the device.
 - Make sure the device you want to connect with is discoverable via Bluetooth.

Connect to a paired Bluetooth device

From the **Connected devices** screen, tap a paired device to connect.

When the device is connected to your phone, you can then use the headset or car kit to listen to music or make and receive phone calls.

You can also use Bluetooth to transfer files between your phone and another Bluetooth-enabled device, such as a phone or computer. Send photos, videos, calendar events, contacts, and more.

Apps and entertainment

The topics in this section will explore the features that make your phone so much more than a phone, from the camera and productivity apps to music, entertainment, and more.

Camera

You can use the camera or video camera to take and share photos and videos.



Camera cautions

If the lens is dirty: Fingerprints and smudges on the camera lens may result in blurry photos or videos. If this happens, wipe the lens with a soft, dry cloth.

Avoid exposure to direct sunlight: Do not expose the lens to direct sunlight for long periods, as this can affect the color filter and distort the color of photos and videos.


From the Home screen, tap **Camera O**. You can also access the Camera with one of the following methods:

- From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Camera (O).
- Press the **Power/Lock** key twice quickly.
- From the Lock screen, swipe up from the bottom right corner of the screen.

Note: If you have an SD card installed, set up, and formatted, photos and videos will automatically be saved to the SD card. See <u>"First Time Setup after</u> <u>Inserting an SD Card" on page 18</u> for more details. If no card is installed, photos and videos will be saved to your phone's memory.

- 3. Tap (to hold the recording and tap (\bullet) to resume. Tap (\bullet) to stop recording and save your video. To take a picture during the recording, tap

Scan a OR Code

Your phone's rear camera has a build-in QR code reader that will automatically scan codes for restaurant menus, calendar events, Wi-Fi networks, etc.

1. From the Home screen, tap **Camera** 💽



- 2. Aim your camera at the QR code you want to scan.
- 3. Your phone will recognize the code and display the relevant information. Usually a notification will appear at the top of the screen, then tap it to trigger the code's action.

Camera settings

You can adjust your camera's settings using the icons on the main camera screen and the full camera settings menu.


Using the **Photos** *d* app, you can view photos and watch videos that you've taken, downloaded, or copied onto your storage card or phone memory. For pictures that are on your storage card or phone memory, you can do basic editing such as rotating and cropping. You can easily assign contact photos or wallpapers and share photos with your friends.

From the Home screen, tap **Photos**

You can tap an image or video to view.

Zoom in or out on a photo or video

Tap the screen twice or pinch the screen to zoom in or out on a photo or video.



Edit photos

Rotate and save a photo

- 1. From the Photos screen, tap the photo you want to rotate.
- 2. Tap **Edit E** to access the Edit screen.
- 3. Tap **Crop** and adjust the slider to rotate the photo.
- 4. Tap **Save copy** to save a copy of your photo.





Crop a picture

- 1. From the Photos screen, tap the photo you want to crop.
- 2. Tap Edit 📑 to access the Edit screen.
- 3. Tap **Crop**. A crop box appears on the photo.
- 4. To adjust the crop box size, drag the corners inward or outward to resize the crop box.
- 5. Tap **Save copy** to apply the changes to the photo and save.

The cropped photo is saved in the album as a copy. The original photo will remain unedited.





Share pictures and videos

The **Photos** \checkmark app allows you to send photos and videos using email or MMS messages. You can share photos and videos on your social networks, or send them to another phone or your computer via Bluetooth.

1. From the Photos screen, tap the photos or videos you want to share.

Tip: To select multiple items, touch and hold an image to turn on Multiselect mode. Tap to select the items you want to share.

2. Tap **Share**, then select to share using Bluetooth, Gmail, Meet, Messages, and more. Follow the on-screen prompts to send the photo or video.





Productivity

Use your phone to stay productive and organized with calendar, navigation, alarm, office, and more productivity apps.

Calendar

Use the **Calendar** by to create and manage events, meetings, and appointments. Your Calendar helps organize your time and reminds you of important events.

In order to sync with your Google calendar, you must sign in to a Google Account on your phone. See <u>"Google Account" on page 39</u> for more information on signing in or creating a Google Account.

Calendar view

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Calendar** [1].
- 2. Tap **Menu \equiv** .
- 3. Select from one of the following calendar views:
 - Schedule: Display all events.
 - **Day:** Display today's schedule by hour. Slide the screen to the left and right to display the previous and the next day, respectively.
 - **3 days:** Display the previous day, today, and the next day. Slide the screen to the left and right to view the previous and next three days.
 - Week: Display the current week. Slide the screen to the left and right to view the previous and next week, respectively.
 - **Month:** Display the current month. Slide the screen to the left and right to view the previous and next month, respectively.

Add an event

- 1. From the Calendar screen, tap **Add** + > **Event** to add an event.
- 2. Set the event details, such as title, time, location, people to join in, notification, and more.
- 3. When finished, tap Save.

View calendar events

From the Calendar screen, tap a date and an event to view the details.

Edit an event

1. From the Calendar screen, tap a date and an event to view the details.

- 2. Tap **Edit** 🖉 to edit the event.
- 3. When you are done editing, tap Save.

Delete an event

1. From the Calendar screen, tap a date and an event to view the details.

2. Tap **Options** > **Delete** to delete the event.

Calendar settings

1. From the Calendar screen, tap Menu \equiv > Settings > General.

^{2.} Tap an option to adjust Calendar settings.

Google Maps

Use the Google Maps app to determine your location, get directions, browse local businesses and attractions, rate and review places, and more.

Enable location services on your phone

Before using Google Maps, you must enable your phone's location feature. For information about setting your phone's location options, see <u>"Location"</u> on page <u>144</u>.


Search for destinations

Use Google Maps to locate and map a specific address or destination.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Maps ?**. You can also access Maps from the Google folder on the Home screen. If prompted, follow the on-screen instructions to accept terms of use.

2. Tap Search here.

3. Enter an address, city, facility name, etc., then choose a search result. You will see your location on the map.



Google Maps operations

- View current location: Tap 🧿 to find your current location on the map.
- Explore nearby venue categories: Browse nearby venues by selecting a category such as restaurants, parks, hotels, and more.
- Select map types for different views: Tap Map Type 🛞 and choose your map view, or select to view map details such as traffic, street view, etc.
- Find a route to your destination: Tap GO <a>, enter your desired start location and destination, and tap a method of transportation (car, public transit, or on foot) for a list of step-by-step directions to your destination.

Google Search

Search for information saved on the phone, in apps, and on the Internet.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap the Google Search widget.
 - You can also access Google Search by swiping up on the Home screen to access **Apps** and tapping **Google (G)**.
- 2. Type your search keywords and tap **Search** (**Q**).
- 3. To search by voice, tap **Google Voice Search** \bigcup in the search bar and say your search terms.

Tip: To quickly access Google Voice Search from any screen, press and hold **Home**.

4. Search results will appear.



Calculator

Your phone's convenient built-in calculator lets you perform basic and advanced mathematical equations.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Calculator
- 2. Enter the first number.
- 3. Tap a mathematical function key, then enter the second number.
- 4. Tap \blacksquare to view the result.
- 5. Tap AC to clear the results.

View calculator history

- From the Calculator screen, tap Menu > History, or drag down on the History bar to view the calculator history.
- 2. To clear the calculator history, tap **Menu** > Clear.
- 3. To return to the calculator, drag the **History** bar back up or tap the **Back** button .

Clock

The Clock app allows you to set alarms, view different world times, use a stopwatch, set a timer, manage your bedtime, and use your phone as a desk clock.

Set the date and time manually

Your phone uses the wireless network to receive the current date and time automatically. You can also set the date and time manually.

- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Clock 丫.
- 2. Tap Menu > Settings > Change date & time > Set time automatically > Off.
- 3. Set the date and time manually.

Create a new alarm

- 1. From the Clock screen, tap **Alarm** \bigcirc > + to add a new alarm.
- 2. Set the time for the alarm and tap **OK**. You can also tap (B) to enter the time directly.
- 3. Set more alarm details, if desired.
 - Add label: Enter a name for the alarm.
 - Repeat: Select the days to repeat the alarm.
 - Schedule alarm: Set start date and end date of the alarm.
 - Alarm sound: Select a sound to play for the alarm.
 - Vibrate: Activate alarm vibration.
 - **Google Assistant Routine:** Add the current alarm to your Google Assistant Routine.
 - Delete: Delete the current alarm.

Turn an alarm off

- 1. To turn an alarm off, drag the **Alarm Clock** 🛈 to **Stop**.
- 2. To snooze the alarm for 10 minutes, drag the Alarm Clock 0 to Snooze.

Delete an alarm

- 1. From the Alarm screen, tap the alarm you want to delete from the alarm list.
- 2. Tap Delete.

World clock

The World clock lets you keep track of the current time in multiple cities around the globe.

- 1. From the Clock screen, tap **Clock** (S) > + to access the World clock screen.
- 2. Type to enter a city name and select the city you want to add from the list.
 - To remove a city, swipe the city to the left side.

Timer

- 1. From the Clock screen, tap **Timer T** to access the Timer screen.
- 2. Enter the amount of time into the Timer.
- 3. Tap to begin timing.
- 4. Tap to pause timing.
 - Tap again to resume timing.
 - Tap \bigcirc to reset the timer back to the original amount of time.
 - Tap 🗙 to delete the timer.

• Tap + to add another timer. Swipe up and down to view other active timers.

Stopwatch

- 1. From the Clock screen, tap **Stopwatch** (O) to access the Stopwatch screen.
- 2. Tap to begin the stopwatch.
- 3. Tap to stop the stopwatch.
 - Tap again to resume timing.
 - Tap \bigcirc to reset the stopwatch to zero.
 - Tap $\overline{(1)}$ to add lap splits.

Bedtime

- 1. From the Clock screen, tap **Bedtime (**) to access the Bedtime screen.
- 2. Tap **Get started** and set your sleep time and wake-up time.

There are the following options for you to manage your sleep:

- See recent bedtime activity: Keep track of your screen time and see estimates of time spent in bed. This is based on when your phone remained motionless in a dark room.
- Listen to sleep sounds: You can play soothing music to help you fall asleep. Sleep sounds don't play automatically.
- See your upcoming events: To make sure your alarm is set before any events, allow **Clock** to access your calendar.

Note: You can add **Bedtime mode** to the Quick Settings Panel to enable or disable this mode quickly and easily.

Entertainment and activities

The following topics provide an overview of your phone's entertainment apps.

YouTube

View videos uploaded to YouTube and upload your own videos.

View YouTube videos

Note: You can use the YouTube app to view videos on YouTube even if you aren't signed in to a YouTube account.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **YouTube (D)**. **Note:** You can also access YouTube from the Google folder on the Home screen.

- If you are prompted to provide confirmation to use the on-screen instructions to continue.
- 2. Browse YouTube channels and tap a video to view.
- 3. The video will play on your phone screen. Tap the screen to pause or resume play while watching.

Post a video to YouTube

You can post videos to your YouTube account from your phone. Before posting, you must set up a YouTube account and sign in on your phone.

1. From the YouTube screen, tap **Record/Post Video** + > **Upload a video**. **Note:** You may be prompted to allow access to your photos, camera, and microphone. Tap **ALLOW ACCESS** to continue.

2. Select a video to upload, record a new video to upload, or stream a live video. Enter a title, description, and tags, and select a privacy setting.

Settings

The topics in this section will cover your phone's settings and options.

Basic settings

From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Settings** (2) to access your phone's Settings menu. You can also access the Settings menu from the Status bar. Swipe the Status bar down twice and tap **Settings** (2). The table below outlines the Settings categories.

Wi-Fi

Connect your device to a Wi-Fi network


- 1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🙆
- 2. Tap Network & internet 🗢 > Wi-Fi.
- 3. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to turn it on.

Your phone will automatically search for available networks and you will be able to see the names and security settings of in-range Wi-Fi networks.

- To disable Wi-Fi, slide the switch to the **Off ()** position.
- Tap the Wi-Fi network you want to connect to, enter the password (if applicable), and tap **CONNECT**. Your phone will be connected to the selected Wi-Fi network.
 - The password for a household wireless LAN router is sometimes found on a sticker on the router (WEP, WPA, KEY, etc.) or QR code. Contact the router manufacturer for information. For the password for a public wireless LAN, check with user's service provider.
 - Entering a password is not required if an access point is not security protected.

Manually connect to a Wi-Fi network

- 1. From the Wi-Fi screen, slide the switch to the **On O** position to turn Wi-Fi on.
- 2. Scroll down and tap Add network.
- 3. Enter the required information and tap **SAVE** to continue.



- Network name: Enter the network name.
- Security: Select a security option and enter your password.
- Advanced options: Show advanced options, such as IP settings and Proxy settings.

Wi-Fi preferences

Create and manage wireless access points.

- **Turn on Wi-Fi automatically:** Wi-Fi will be turned on automatically when you are near high-quality saved networks, like your home network.
- Notify for public networks: Receive notifications about open networks when Wi-Fi is turned on.
- Passpoint: Enable or disable the function of seamlessly connecting to Passpoint[™] enabled Wi-Fi access points without needing a password.
- Install certificates: Allow authentication to access files.
- Wi-Fi Direct: Connect to devices with Wi-Fi Direct.

Saved networks

Tap to view your saved Wi-Fi networks.

Wi-Fi data usage

Tap to view the Wi-Fi data used by each app.

Wi-Fi Calling

1. From the Network & internet screen, tap Wi-Fi Calling.

2. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to enable **Wi-Fi Calling**.

Note: To use Wi-Fi Calling, you will need to set up an Emergency Address. When the Emergency Address is successfully set, you will see the Wi-Fi Calling icon **1** in the Status bar.

- About Wi-Fi Calling: Tap to view more information about Wi-Fi Calling.
- Network preference: Select the preferred network.
- Emergency Address: Update your emergency address. This address will be used by Emergency services as your location if you make an emergency call (911) over Wi-Fi from this phone within the U.S.

Note: You must have an active Wi-Fi connection to send or receive calls and messages with Wi-Fi Calling.

Mobile network

From the Network & internet screen, tap Mobile network.

- Mobile Data: Enable data access on your mobile network.
- International Data Roaming: Enable international data roaming.
- App data usage: View the mobile data usage of each app.
- Data warning & limit: View the following data management options:
 - Mobile data usage cycle: Set the date the data usage cycle resets.
 - Set data warning: Enable alerts when your mobile data usage reaches the amount set.
 - **Data warning:** Set the data usage amount. Your phone will notify you when it reaches the amount set. Data usage measured by your phone

is an approximate amount, and it may differ from the actual amount.

- Set data limit: Enable data limits.
- Data limit: Set a data limit. Your phone will turn off mobile data when it reaches the limit set.
- Advanced:
 - Access Point Names: Select or add APNs.

Airplane mode

Disable all network communication.

- 1. From the Network & internet screen, tap Airplane mode.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to activate Airplane mode. You can directly enable or disable Airplane mode via Quick Settings Panel.

Hotspot & tethering

Share your phone's internet connection with other devices.

From the Network & internet screen, tap Hotspot & tethering

Note: Using your phone as a mobile hotspot increases battery consumption and data usage.

Mobile hotspot

Use your phone as a Mobile hotspot.

- 1. From the Hotspot & tethering screen, tap Mobile Hotspot.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to activate the mobile hotspot.
 - Hotspot name: Set the hotspot name.
 - Security: Turn hotspot security on or off.

- Hotspot password: Tap to set a hotspot password.
- AP band: Select Access Point band, 2.4 GHz or 5GHz.
- **Turn off hotspot automatically:** Turn off the hotspot automatically if no devices are connected.
- Mobile Hotspot turn off timer: Set a timer for the hotspot to automatically turn off.
- Maximum connections: Tap to set the maximum number of users allowed to connect to the hotspot.
- Connected users: View your connected users.
- Blocked users: View your blocked users.

USB tethering

Share your phone's internet connection via USB.

- 1. Connect your phone to the device that you want to share your internet with using a Type-C USB cable before continuing to the next step.
- 2. From the Hotspot & tethering screen, tap USB tethering.
- 3. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to enable USB tethering.

Bluetooth tethering

Share your phone's internet connection via Bluetooth.

- 1. From the Hotspot & tethering screen, tap Bluetooth tethering.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to enable Bluetooth tethering.

Data Saver

To help reduce data usage, Data Saver prevents some apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

From the Network & internet screen, tap Data Saver.

- Use Data Saver: Enable the data saving feature.
- Unrestricted data: Set apps to be allowed to use restricted data when Data saver is on.

VPN (Virtual Private Networks)

Note: You need to set a screen lock PIN or password before you can use a VPN.

Add a VPN profile

- 1. From the Network & internet screen, tap VPN.
- 2. Tap + on the top right corner of the VPN screen to add a VPN profile.
- 3. Follow the prompts to set up a VPN.

Edit and delete a VPN

1. From the VPN screen, tap 😥 next to the VPN you want to edit or delete.

2. Edit the VPN and tap **SAVE**, or tap **FORGET** to delete the VPN.

Connect to a VPN

From the VPN screen, tap the VPN you want to connect, enter your login information, and tap **CONNECT**.

• To disconnect, tap the VPN, and tap **DISCONNECT**.

Private DNS

1. From the Network & internet screen, tap **Private DNS**.

2. Select your Private DNS mode.

Wireless Emergency Alerts

From the Network & internet screen, tap Wireless Emergency Alerts.

- Allow alerts: Receive wireless emergency alert notifications.
- National alerts: National warning messages. Can't be turned off.
- Extreme threats: Enable to receive extreme threats to life and property.
- Severe threats: Enable to receive severe threats to life and property.
- AMBER alerts: Enable to receive AMBER alerts (child abduction emergency bulletins).
- **Public safety messages:** Enable to receive public safety messages (recommended actions that can save lives and property).
- State and local tests: Enable to receive test messages from state and local authorities.
- Emergency alert history: View all the alerts you've received before.
- Vibration: Enable vibration when receiving an alert.
- Alert reminder: Set alert reminder.
- Spanish: Enable to receive emergency alerts in Spanish when possible.

Connected devices

Manage settings for connected devices.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕

2. Tap Connected devices .

USB

Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable to transfer data, share network connectivity, or charge your phone.

From the Connected devices screen, tap USB.

- USB controlled by:
 - Connected device: Set the connected device to control the USB.
 - This device: Set your phone to control the USB.
- Use USB for:
 - File Transfer: Select to transfer files between your phone and your computer.
 - **USB tethering:** Select to set the USB tethering mode.
 - MIDI: Select to set this device as MIDI.
 - PTP: Select to transfer PTP photos.
 - No data transfer: Select to set No data transfer mode.

Connection preferences

Manage various connection preferences.

From the Connected devices screen, tap **Connection preferences**.

Bluetooth

Wirelessly hear calls, connect speakers, transfer data, and more.

Activate Bluetooth

- 1. From the Connection preferences screen, tap Bluetooth.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to turn it on. You can directly enable or disable Bluetooth via Quick Settings Panel.

Rename this device

- 1. From the Bluetooth screen, tap **Device name**.
- 2. Enter a new name and tap **RENAME** to save.

Pair a Bluetooth device

- 1. From the Bluetooth screen, tap Pair new device.
- 2. All the available devices are listed out.
- 3. Select the device you want to connect to within the Available devices list and follow the prompts to connect.
 - Make sure the device you want to connect with is discoverable via Bluetooth.
 - Depending on the device, you may be required to enter or accept a passkey.

Rename a paired device

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap **Settings** (2) next to a paired device name.
- 2. Tap **Edit** *O*, enter a new name, and tap **RENAME** to save.

Connect/Disconnect to/from a paired device

- 1. From the Connected devices screen, tap **Settings** (i) next to a paired device name.
- 2. Tap CONNECT or FORGET.

Receive data via Bluetooth

When a device attempts to send a file to your phone using Bluetooth, you will be prompted to accept or decline the request.

- 1. Tap **ACCEPT**.
- 2. To view the file received, swipe the Status bar down and tap **Bluetooth share: Received files**, or locate the file from Bluetooth settings menu.

NFC

Allow data exchange when the phone touches another NFC-capable device.

- 1. From the Connection preferences screen, tap **NFC**.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to turn it on.

Cast

Scan for nearby devices to connect to and set them up. A notification will appear when there are available devices to connect to.

1. From the Connection preferences screen, tap Cast.

2. Tap Menu > Enable wireless display.

3. Tap a device to connect.

Printing

Connect your device to a printer on the same Wi-Fi network.

Add printer

1. From the Connection preferences screen, tap Printing.

2. Tap Add service.

3. Tap an option to add a printer by IP address or by Wi-Fi Direct.

Chromebook

1. From the Connection preferences screen, tap **Chromebook**.

2. Tap to manage connections with your Chromebook.

Nearby Share

Nearby Share allows the rapid short-range exchange of images, videos, text, contact info, directions, YouTube videos, and other data via Bluetooth.

- 1. From the Connection preferences screen, tap **Nearby Share**.
- Slide the switch to the **On O** position to enable this function. You can directly enable or disable Nearby Share feature via Quick Settings Panel.

Device name

Rename your device. Enter a new name and tap **RENAME** to save.

Device visibility

Set your device's visibility. You can make yourself visible to **Everyone** or some people from **Contacts**, or **Hidden**.

Data

Set data usage method. You can choose **Data**, **Wi-Fi Only**, or **Without internet** (Files shared offline).

Show notification

Slide the switch to the **On O** position to show notification when devices are sharing nearby.

Note: Nearby Share requires both sender and recipient devices' Bluetooth and Location to be turned on, both devices are unlocked, and close together.

If the content can be sent, a bottom sheet will appear with a list of available contacts to share with.

Android Auto

Use Android Auto app to control your phone's maps, media and messages functions, with the Google Assistant while you drive.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯.

- 2. Tap Connected devices **Connection preferences > Android Auto**.
- 3. Tap **CONNECT A CAR** button to view connection details.
- 4. Plug your phone into this car's Android Auto-compatible USB port.
- 5. When connected, supported apps will be mirrored from your phone to your car's display.

Note: Hands-free operation through voice commands is encouraged to minimize driving distraction.

Apps

View current running applications, manage permissions, and more.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯

2. Tap **Apps** .

Recently opened apps

View detailed information. Tap **OPEN** to access this app, tap **DISABLE** to disable this app, or tap **FORCE STOP** to stop this app.

Default apps

You can set the default app for the browser, phone, messages, etc. You can also set default apps for opening links.

Screen time

You can tap Ξ on the right side of most apps to set daily timers. When the app timer ends, the app is paused for the rest of the day.

Unused apps

View apps that you have not used for a long time. You can un-install them to free up some space.

Special app access

View app access for special functions, such as display over other apps, unrestricted data, usage access, etc.

Notifications

Manage the settings on notifications.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯.

2. Tap Notifications 🗘.

App settings

Control notifications from individual apps.

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap **App settings**.
- 2. Apps were categorized into four types: **Most recent**, **Most frequent**, **All apps**, **Turned off**. Select a category from the drop-down list, and choose the app you want to adjust the notification settings for.

Notification history

View your recent and snoozed notifications.

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Notification history.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to turn it on.
- 3. Your recent and snoozed notifications will appear.

Conversations

View priority and modified conversations.

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap **Conversations**.
- 2. Your priority and modified conversations are displayed.
- To change conversation settings, follow the below steps:
- 1. Swipe the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- 2. Touch and hold a conversation.

Bubbles

Enable message conversations display as bubbles, floating on top of other apps. 1. From the Notifications screen, tap **Bubbles**.

2. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to allow apps to show bubbles.

Device & app notification

Control which apps and devices can read notifications.

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Device & app notifications.
- 2. You can see the devices and apps that allowed and not allowed to access notifications.

Notifications on lock screen

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Notifications on lock screen.
- 2. Select how you want notifications to be displayed on the lock screen.

Do Not Disturb

1. From the Notifications screen, tap **Do Not Disturb**.

- 2. Tap TURN ON NOW to enable Do Not Disturb mode.
- 3. You can set What can interrupt Do Not Disturb, Schedules, etc.

Wireless emergency alerts

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Wireless emergency alerts.
- 2. Slide the **Allow alerts** switch to the **On O** position to allow alerts.
- 3. Slide the alert switches to turn them on or off. For more information, see <u>"Wireless Emergency Alerts" on page 113</u>.

Hide silent notifications in status bar

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Hide silent notifications in status bar.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to hide silent notifications in status bar.

Allow notification snoozing

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Allow notification snoozing.
- Slide the switch to the **On O** position to allow temporarily snoozing certain notifications.

Notification dot on app icon

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Notification dot on app icon.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On (** position to allow the display of notification dots on an app icon.

Enhanced notifications

- 1. From the Notifications screen, tap Enhanced notifications.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to automatically show suggested actions and replies.

Battery

Monitor your phone's battery usage through the Battery settings menu. Check the battery consumption and percentage.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕

2. Tap Battery

Battery usage


View battery usage from last full charge.

1. From the Battery screen, tap Battery usage.

2. You can view the battery percentage that each apps used.

Battery Saver

From the Battery screen, tap Battery Saver.



- Slide the **Use Battery Saver** switch to the **On ()** position to turn the battery saver mode on. The **Battery Saver** will automatically turn off when the phone is plugged in.
- Set a schedule: Tap Based on percentage and drag the slider to the percentage you need. The Battery Saver will turn on automatically when your phone reaches that battery percentage.

Battery Manager

- 3. Monitor the amount of battery being used by apps. If battery usage increases too much, your phone will suggest actions you can take.

Battery percentage

From the Battery screen, slide the **Battery percentage** switch to the **On ()** position to show the battery percentage in the Status bar.

Storage

The Storage settings menu allows you to manage internal storage on your phone and provides menu choices for an optional SD card (not included). Note: The descriptions of this section are based on the scenarios that an SD card is inserted in your phone.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔯



- 2. Tap Storage
- 3. Tap (This device \rightarrow > **This device**, then tap a category to view the storage amount used by each app.
- 4. Delete backed up files by tapping **Free up space**.

Storage manager

Storage manager removes backed up photos and videos from your device.

From the Storage screen, slide the **Storage manager** switch to the On \bigcirc position to enable the storage manager.

SD card

From the Storage screen, tap \neg > **SD card** to view files stored on your SD card.

Tap **Menu** to access the following options:

- Rename: change the SD card name.
- Eject: eject the SD card to allow for safe removal.
- Format: format the SD card.
- Format as internal: set the SD card as internal storage.

Sound & vibration

Control your phone's audio, from ringtones and alerts to tap tones and notifications.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕.

2. Tap Sound & vibration (1).

3. Drag the slider to adjust the volumes.

- Media volume: Adjust the media and alert notification volume.
- Call volume: Adjust the call volume.
- Notification volume: Adjust the notification volume.
- Ring volume: Adjust the ring volume.
- Alarm volume: Adjust the alarm volume.

Do Not Disturb

1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap **Do Not Disturb**.

- 2. Tap **TURNON NOW** to enable Do Not Disturb mode. Some notifications will be silenced when Do Not Disturb is turned on.
- 3. You can set What can interrupt Do Not Disturb, Schedules, etc.

Phone ringtone

- 1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap Phone ringtone.
- 2. Select a ringtone for incoming phone calls. You can customize your own ringtone by tapping **Add ringtone**.

Live Caption

Live Caption detects speech on your device and automatically generate captions.

- 1. From the Sound & vibration screen, tap Live Caption.
- 2. Slide the Use Live Caption switch to the **On O** position to enable this function.
- 3. You can adjust settings for the following aspects:
 - Languages: English only for now. More languages coming soon.
 - Hide profanity: Enable to replace profanity with asterisk symbol.
 - Show sound labels: Enable to include sounds like laughter, applause and music.
 - Live Caption in volume control: Enable Live Caption in volume control.
 - Help: Get detailed instructions on how to use Live Caption.

Media

From the Sound & vibration screen, tap Media.

- **Pin media player:** Have media player stays open in the Quick Settings Panel when the media session has ended.
- Show media recommendations: Show media recommendations basing on your activities.

Advanced

- Vibrate & haptics: Enable or disable vibration for calls, notifications, and alarms. Enable or disable interactive haptics.
- Shortcut to prevent ringing: Press the Power/Lock key and the Volume up key together to activate Vibrate or Mute mode. Slide the switch to the On oposition to enable the Prevent ringing function.
- **Default notification sound:** Select the default notification sound. You can customize your own notification sound by tapping **Add notification**.
- **Default alarm sound:** Select the default alarm sound. You can customize your own alarm sound by tapping **Add alarm**.
- DTS Audio Processing: Enable or disable high resolution audio processing.
- Dial pad tones: Enable dial pad tones.
- Screen locking sound: Enable screen locking sounds.
- Charging sounds and vibration: Enable the charging sounds and vibration.
- Touch sounds: Enable touch sounds.
- Always show icon when in vibrate mode: Enable to always display vibrate icon on status bar when in vibrate mode.

Display

Use the phone's Display settings menu to adjust items such as wallpaper, brightness, screen timeout, and more.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access Apps and tap Settings 🔕.

2. Tap Display 🚯.

Brightness level

- 1. From the Display screen, tap **Brightness level**.
- 2. Drag the slider to adjust the brightness level manually.

Adaptive brightness

- 1. From the Display screen, tap Adaptive brightness.
- 2. Slide the switch to the **On ()** position to enable Adaptive brightness.
- 3. When turned on, your phone will automatically adjust screen brightness based on the lighting conditions.

Lock screen

- 1. From the Display screen, tap Lock screen.
- 2. Manage what to show and when to show on the lock screen.

Screen timeout

- 1. From the Display screen, tap Screen timeout.
- 2. Set screen timeout interval. Your screen will automatically go to sleep after the set amount of time.
- 3. You can slide the **Screen attention** switch to the **On O** position to prevent your screen from turning off if you're looking at it.

Dark theme

From the Display screen, slide the **Dark theme** switch to the **On ()** position to enable the dark theme.

Display size and text

1. From the Display screen, tap **Display size and text**.

 Drag the sliders to adjust the font size and display size, slide the switches to enable bold text and high contrast text. You can also tap **Reset settings** to reset display size and text to phone's original settings.

Night Light

From the Display screen, slide the **Night Light** switch to the **On O** position to enable Night Light. When enabled, you can set a Night Light schedule and intensity. You can also enable automatic Night Light until sunrise.

Auto-rotate screen

From the Display screen, slide the **Auto rotate screen** switch to the **On C** position to enable screen rotation.

Screen saver

From the Display screen, tap **Screen Saver** to set the screen saver, adjust screen saver settings.

Lift to wake

From the Display screen, slide the Lift to wake switch to the **On O** position to turn on the phone display by simply lifting your phone from a table or removing it from your pocket.

Accessibility

The Accessibility settings menu allows you to manage accessibility-related apps. Accessibility services are special features to make the device easier to use for those with certain physical disabilities.

Real-Time text call

From the Accessibility screen, tap Real-Time text call.

- RTT call button: Select Always Visible to always have access to the RTT call button.

From the Accessibility screen, tap **Display size and text**.

- Font size: Drag the slider to adjust the font size.

- Bold text: Bold the texts displayed on your screen.
- **High contrast text:** Change text color to black or white, maximizes contrast with the background.
- **RESET SETTINGS:** Reset the display size and text preferences to the phone's original settings.

Color and motion

From the Accessibility screen, tap Color and motion.

- **Color correction:** Enable color correction. This may affect performance.
- **Color inversion:** Enable color inversion. This may affect performance.
- Dark theme: Enable dark theme mode.
- **Remove animations:** Enable or disable animations.
- Large mouse pointer: Enable the large mouse pointer function.

Extra dim

From the Accessibility screen, slide the Extra dim switch to the **On** position to dim screen beyond your phone's minimal brightness.

Dark theme

From the Accessibility screen, slide the switch to the **On** \bigcirc position to access dark theme mode. You can set dark theme schedule.

Magnification

From the Accessibility screen, tap Magnification.

• Magnification shortcut: Slide the switch to the **On O** position to enable magnification shortcut. Tap the magnification icon bottom right corner of the screen to magnify your screen.

- Magnification type: Choose magnification type.
- Magnify typing: Magnifier follows text as you type.

Timing controls

From the Accessibility screen, tap **Timing controls**.

- Touch & hold delay: Set the touch & hold delay to Short, Medium, or Long.

- Autoclick (dwell timing): Enable automatic clicking when using a mouse and adjust the amount of time between the mouse stopping and the click.

- Audio balance: Drag the slider left or right to adjust the audio balance from the speaker.

Accessibility shortcuts

From the Accessibility screen, tap Accessibility shortcuts.

- \bullet Accessibility button: Mange the settings on accessibility button $\rarrow T$, such as location, size, etc.
- Shortcut from lock screen: Allow feature shortcut to turn on from the lock screen.

Text-to-speech output

From the Accessibility screen, tap Text-to-speech output.

- **Preferred engine:** Set the text-to-speech engine (Google is default). Tap 😥 to manage text-to-speech settings.
- Language: Set the language for this function.
- Speech rate: Drag the slider to adjust speech rate.
- Pitch: Drag the slider to adjust pitch.
- Tap **PLAY** to play the example.
- Tap **RESET** to reset all Text-to-speech settings to the default settings.

Security

The Security settings will help you to secure your device, protect your data, and keep your privacy.

1. From the Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps** and tap **Settings** 🔯.

2. Tap Security 🔒 .

Google Play Protect

Google will regularly check your device and prevent/warn you of potential harm. Only apps from Play Store will be checked.

From the Security screen, tap Google Play Protect.

- Tap **Scan** to start scanning your device for harmful apps.
- Tap **Settings** 🔯 to view Play Protect settings:
 - Scan apps with Play Protect: Enable regular scanning for harmful apps on your device.

Find My Device

Find My Device helps you locate your device remotely, keeping your data safe if your phone is lost.

1. From the Security screen, tap Find My Device.

2. Slide the switch to the **On O** position to activate Find My Device.

• There are several ways available to locate your device.

Security update

Check for new software updates for your device.

- 1. From the Security screen, tap **Security update**.
- 2. Tap Check for update to check for updates.

Google Play system update

Check if a Google Play system update is available.

- 2. Follow any steps on the screen.

Screen lock

1. From the Security screen, tap Screen lock.

- None: Disable any screen lock.
- Swipe: Set swipe to unlock.
- Pattern: Set an unlock pattern. Follow the prompts to finish the settings.
- PIN: Set a PIN code as the screen unlock method.
- Password: Set a password as the screen unlock method.

Important: To protect your phone and data from unauthorized access, it is recommended that you use the highest security level available (Password protection). It is also recommended you frequently change your password to ensure the safety of your phone and personal data. If you failed to enter the correct pattern, PIN, or password, after five attempts, you will be prompted to wait for 30 seconds before you can try again.

2. Tap 😥 next to Screen lock to adjust some settings on screen lock.

- Make pattern visible: Slide the switch to the On

Troubleshooting

Check below for solutions to common problems you may experience.

Problem: The phone freezes or operations are unstable.

Solution: Restart the device. Press and hold the **Power/Lock** key and the **Volume up** key, then tap **Restart**.

Note: Data that was being edited will be erased when the device is restarted.

Problem: The device starts freezing after installing a new app.

Solution: The newly-installed app may be causing the device to freeze. Uninstall the app in Safe mode.

To enable Safe mode:

- Press and hold the **Power/Lock** key and the **Volume up** key, then touch and hold **Power off**. Read the disclaimer for Safe mode, and then tap **OK**.
 - After turning the phone on in Safe mode, "Safe mode" will appear at the bottom left corner.
 - After restarting in Safe mode, your phone can be powered on as usual.
 - Before enabling Safe mode, it is recommended that you back up important data.
- To exit Safe mode, restart the device. Press and hold the **Power/Lock** key and the **Volume up** key, then tap **Restart**. The phone will reboot in normal mode.

RF Exposure Information (SAR)

This mobile phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves. If is in Hotspot mode, please place the phone at least 1cm away from the body when it is turned on.

If you do not use a body-worn accessory and are not holding the phone at the ear, position the handset a minimum of 1.5 cm from your body when the phone is switched on.

Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) for Wireless Telecommunication Devices

What is hearing aid compatibility?

The Federal Communications Commission has implemented rules and a rating system designed to enable people who wear hearing aids to more effectively use these wireless telecommunications devices. The standard for compatibility of digital wireless phones with hearing aids is set forth in American National Standard Institute (ANSI) standard C63.19. There are two sets of ANSI standards with ratings from one to four (four being the best rating): an "M" rating for reduced interference making it easier to hear conversations on the phone when using the hearing aid microphone, and a "T" rating that enables the phone to be used with hearing aids operating in the telecoil mode thus reducing unwanted background noise.

How will i know which wireless phones are hearing aid compatible?

The Hearing Aid Compatibility rating is displayed on the wireless phone box. A phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for acoustic coupling (microphone mode) if it has an "M3" or "M4" rating. A digital wireless phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for inductive coupling (telecoil mode) if it has a "T3" or "T4" rating.

Warranty
