

# Introduction

Thank you for purchasing our LCD TV / PC Monitor.

We hope you have many years of trouble free enjoyment from it.

Please ensure you read this user manual prior to attempting to operate the TV and keep it safe for future use.

## **INSTALLATION AND SAFETY WARNINGS**

- 1) Position the unit on a flat surface avoiding anywhere which may be subject to vibration.
- It is advisable to un-plug both the power and aerial during a storm to avoid damage.
   Electrical surges causing damage to the TV are not covered under the manufacturer's warranty.
- 3) Avoid rapid changes in environmental or temperature conditions. Allow the TV to reach room temperature and avoid locating near heat sources, i.e radiators/fires.
- 4) Do not place naked flames, such as candles or night lights near to the TV.
- 5) Do not place ornaments or vases near the TV where liquid spillages could cause a danger.
- 6) Do not locate the TV directly against a wall where it could restrict ventilation to the rear of the TV
- 7) Do not place the TV on or near appliances which may cause electromagnetic. interference (such as TV or Hi-Fi Speakers) as these could cause a distorted picture or sound.
- 8) Batteries are a potential choking hazard. Do not allow young children to remove the battery compartment cover on the remote control.
- 9) There are no user serviceable parts inside this TV. Do not remove any of the covers, front or rear, that could expose high voltages from within the TV set.
- 10) If you intend to leave the TV for long periods of time, in the interests of energy consumption, do not leave the TV in standby mode, instead, unplug the TV from the power supply.
- 11) Never display the same image on the TV for long periods of time as this could cause a permanent after-image to remain on the screen. This is called 'screen-burn'. This may also be caused by some channels displaying a static logo in the corner of the screen. Be sure that your chosen channels have constantly moving images to avoid this irreparable damage.


Do not drop or push objects into the television cabinet slots or openings. Never spill any kind of liquid on the television receiver



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# **Example of outdoor antenna grounding**

## If an outdoor antenna is connected, follow the precautions below

- > An outdoor antenna should not be located anywhere that can be in contact of overhead power lines, or any other electric light or power circuits.
- > When installing an outdoor antenna system, extreme caution should be taken to prevent contact with power lines. Direct contact with power lines may be fatal and should be avoided at all costs.

Section 810 of National Electrical Code (NEC) provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead in wire to an antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.





# Cable TV (CATV) connection

## NOTE TO CATV SYSTEM INSTALLER

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installers attention to Article 820-40 of the National Electrical Code ( NEC ) that provides guidelines tor proper grounding and , in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building accurately, or as close to the point of cable entry as possible, use of this TV for o-ther than private viewing of programs broadcasted on UHF, VHF or transmitted by cable companies for the use of the general public may require authorization from the broadcast/cable company, and/or program owner.

- ➤ A 75-ohm coaxial cable connector is built into set for easy hookup. When connecting the 75-ohm coaxial cable to the set, place the 75-ohm cable into the ANT terminal.
- > Some cable TV companies offer premium pay channels. Since the signals of these premium pay channels are scrambled, a cable TV converter/descrambler is generally provided to the subscriber the cable TV company. This converter/descrambler is necessary for normal viewing scrambled channels. (Set your TV to channel 3 or 4, typically one of these channels are used. If this is unknown, consult y-our cable TV company.) For more specific instructions on installing cable TV, consult your cable TV company, one possible method of utilizing the covered /provided by your cable TV company is explained below.




Please note: the RF switch is required to provide two inputs (A and B). (not included), A position on the RF switch (not included); you can view all unscrambled channels by using the TV channel keys. B position on the RF switch (not included); you can view all scrambled channels via the converter/descrambler by using the converter channel keys.




# **Outdoor antenna**

The antenna requirements for a color TV reception are more important than those for a black & white TV reception. For this reason, a good quality outdoor antenna is strongly recommended.

A 75-ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connector that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools (not included).




Connect the outdoor antenna cable lead-in the ANT. Terminal located on the rear of the equipment.

# **Installing Batteries**

- 1.Slide to the direction show as the arrow to open the cover of the batteries on the back of the remote control.
- 2.Load two AAA alkaline batteries in the compartment.
- 3. Replace the cover of the batteries.



## **Precautions**

Make sure that there is no obstacle between the remote control and television set.




Keep the remote control away from heat source or humid area to ensure effective performance of the remote control.

As strong light may interfere the signals, change your position to operate the remote control if the television cannot be turned on or off as you expect.




Make sure that two AAA 1.5V alkaline batteries are loaded. The batteries must be installed properly.



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# **Remote Operation**



POWER: Press to turn TV set on or off.

MUTE: Press to mute sound, press again to restore sound.

0-9: Press any number of 0~9 buttons to select a TV channel.

-: Press more than median to select the channel.

C⊃: Back to the previous watching channel.

VOL-/VOL+: Adjusts the volume.

CH-/CH+: Changes the channels up and down.

MTS: Multi channel audio switch, switch MONO and SAP.

CC.: Press for Close Captions.

**DISPLAY:** Press to display the source and channel's information.

**THUMBSTICK** (▲ ▼/ ◆ ▶): Allows you to navigate on-screen menus and adjust system settings to your preference.

**ENTER:** Press to confirm selections.

EXIT: Press EXIT to exit menu or sub menu of TV.

MENU: Brings up the main menu to the screen.

**INPUT:** Press to select various input sources.

PMODE: Press to select picture modes.

SMODE: Press to select sound modes.

**SLEEP:** Press to set the sleep timer.

FAV/LIST: Press this button to enter "Favorite list" menu

ADD/ERASE: Press ADD/ERASE to add or delete Favorite channel.

FAV+: Press this button can select of down in "Favorite list" menu.

FAV -: Press this button can select of up in "Favorite list" menu.

CH LIST: Press CH LIST to display channel list.

**EPG:** Press to show the Electronic Program Guide menu.

(Note: In order to ensure the perfect picture and stable system, in the state of Ypbpr and HDMI, ASPECT will be not available when the input signals is 1080p,ZOOM is unchanged.)

**ASPECT:** Press to select the aspect ratio.

FREEZE: Press this botton to make pictures static.
