
# 10"tablet

#### Attention:

This manual contains important instructions about the correct use of the tablet. Please make sure to read the manual carefully before using the tablet for the first time.

- Avoid using the tablet in areas of high temperature, moisture or very dusty places
- Avoid leaving the tablet in areas of high temperature.
- Do not drop or hit the tablet as this may cause damage to the tablet or the screen.
- Please choose an appropriate volume on the tablet and when using headphones avoid having the volume too high.
- You will need to charge your tablet in the following situations:
  - The battery power icon shows you have no power.
  - The system automatically shuts off or when you start up the tablet it powers off automatically.
  - The Power On button has no response.
  - The tablet has a red icon in the top right corner.
- When the tablet is in the process of formatting, resetting, or during a file
  upload or download, please do not suddenly disconnect or shut down
  the tablet. This can cause an application error.
- Do not disassemble the tablet.
- Do not use alcohol, thinner or benzene to scrub or clean the tablet.
- Do not use the tablet in any places that prohibit the use of electronic equipment (such as a plane).
- Do not use the Tablet when you are driving or walking down the street.
- The micro-USB input can only be used for data transmission.

## **Password Recovery**

If you forget your password, then please follow these steps:

- turn off your tablet
- when the tablet has been powered off, then press and hold down the Volume+ button, and then press and hold down the power button (hold down both buttons for a few seconds and then the tablet will start to boot up)
- when the tablet starts to boot up, then release the Power button (but keep holding the Volume + button)
- when the Robot screen appears on the tablet, then you can release the Volume + button
- press and hold the Power button again, and then press the Volume + button
- the tablet will now go to the Android™ Recovery screen
- select Wipe data/factory reset
- the tablet will then reset and reboot. This will take a few minutes to complete.

Please note: this will reset your tablet and do a clean install of Android, and you will lose any stored data, files and settings.

#### **GETTING STARTED**

## Turning the Tablet On or Off

Turn on the tablet: Press and hold the power button to start device. Turn off the tablet: Press and hold the power button to power off the interface. Touch the "Power off" button to turn off the device.



## Turning the Screen On or Off

When the screen is bright, briefly press the power key to turn off the screen. Brieffy press the power key again to turn on screen.

To conserve battery power, the screen can be set to turn off automatically when the tablet is not in use (between 1 minute and 30 minutes). This "Screen timeout" option can be found in the Display menu.

## Unlocking the Screen

When the screen turns off, you will have to unlock the screen when you turn it back on. To unlock the screen, drag the lock icon upward across the screen



### **APPLICATIONS**

To open an application, touch the application icon on the home screen or in the Launcher where you can tap the icon right up on the home screen to get in.

## **Preinstalled Applications**

Some applications have been installed on your tablet for your convenience. These applications include:



Photos: View your stored images.



YouTube Go: Watch online videos.



Gmail: Check your e-mail.



Chrome: Browse the Web.



Sound Recorder: Record voice notes.



Calculator: Perform simple mathematical operations.



Maps Go: Check your location.

Calendar: Mark dates or events.

Camera: Take pictures or videos.

Play Store: Download Apps and Games.

Files: View your stored files.

## **Installing Applications**

You can also download and install additional applications from the device's applications marketplace, the web browser, or other sources.

The tablet must be set to allow installation of applications from non-Market sources. The "Unknown Sources" option can be set in the Application Settings menu.

## **Quick Settings & Notifications**

Swipe down from the top of your home screen to view your Notifications.



Use two fingers to swipe from the top of your home screen or swipe down again from notifications to view your Quick Settings.




## **Managing Notifications**

Tap on "Sounds & Notifications" in the Settings Menu. You can manage what notifications you see, set notification priority level by app, and see what apps have access to your notifications. You can set up your device so that notifications only appear on at certain times, for certain types of notifications, and from specific contacts.

## Widgets, Wallpapers, and other Settings

Tap and hold your finger on any open space on your home screen. A list of options appears. Here, you choose to add widgets, such as calendars, clocks, music, and more. Change your wallpaper and other home settings here.



## **CONNECTING TO A WI-FI NETWORK**

## 1)Turn on W-Fi:


Turn on the Wi-Fi button in the settings menu.

The tablet will search and display a list of the available Wi-Fi networks.




## 2)Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

Choose the wifi network you wish to join, then input the password to be connected.



## 3) Other Functions

Scan, WPS pin entry, Wi-Fi direct, and advanced functions in the Wi-Fi menu.



## 4) Add a Network


Press the "Add" button in the Wi-Fi screen to add a network. Input the SSID, choose the security, then input the password.

## **Connecting to a Computer**

- 1. Connect your tablet to the computer. With the included USB cable, plug the small end of the cable into the USB 2.0 high-speed connector of the tablet. Plug the large end of the cable into an available USB 2.0 high-speed port on the computer.
- 2. When your tablet is connected, slide up the USB icon right on the screen and then touch the "USB connected" icon.
