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4 Description of Tests

4.1 Conducted Output Power

Measurement Procedure: FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01 Section 5.2.1

The transmitter output was connected to a calibrated coaxial cable, attenuator and power meter, the other end of which was connected to a Base Station Simulator. The Base Station Simulator was set to force the EUT to its maximum power setting. The power output at the transmitter antenna port was determined by adding the value of the cable insertion loss to the power reading. The tests were performed at three frequencies (low channel, middle channel and high channel) and on the highest power levels, which can be setup on the transmitters.

Remark: Reference test setup 1



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4.2 Effective (Isotropic) Radiated Power of Transmitter

Measurement Procedure: FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01 Section 5.8.4

Calculate power in dBm by the following formula:

ERP (dBm) = Conducted Power (dBm) + antenna gain (dBi)

EIRP(dBm) = Conducted Power (dBm) + antenna gain (dBi)

EIRP=ERP+2.15dB



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4.3 Occupied Bandwidth

Measurement Procedure: FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01 Section 4.2 & 4.3

The occupied bandwidth, that is the frequency bandwidth such that, below its lower and above its upper frequency limits, the mean powers radiated are each equal to 0.5 percent of the total mean power radiated by a given emission shall be measured. The transmitter output was connected to a calibrated coaxial cable, attenuator and Spectrum analyser, the other end of which was connected to a Base Station Simulator. The Base Station Simulator was set to force the EUT to its maximum power setting. The tests were performed at three frequencies (low channel, middle channel and high channel). The span of the analyzer shall be set to capture all products of the modulation process, including the emission skirts. The resolution bandwidth shall be set to as close to 1 percent of the selected span as is possible without being below 1 percent. The video bandwidth shall be set to 3 times the resolution bandwidth. Video averaging is not permitted. Where practical, a sampling detector shall be used since a peak or, peak hold, may produce a wider bandwidth than actual. The trace data points are recovered and are directly summed in linear terms. The recovered amplitude data points, beginning at the lowest frequency, are placed in a running sum until 0.5 percent of the total is reached and that frequency recorded. The process is repeated for the highest frequency data points. This frequency is recorded. The span between the two recorded frequencies is the occupied bandwidth.

Remark: Reference test setup 1

Test Settings

- 1. The signal analyzer's automatic bandwidth measurement capability was used to perform the 99% occupied bandwidth and the 26dB bandwidth. The bandwidth measurement was not influenced by any intermediate power nulls in the fundamental emission.
- 2. RBW = 1 5% of the expected OBW
- VBW ≥ 3 x RBW
- Detector = Peak
- Trace mode = max hold
- Sweep = auto couple
- The trace was allowed to stabilize
- 8. If necessary, steps 2 7 were repeated after changing the RBW such that it would be within
 - 1 5% of the 99% occupied bandwidth observed in Step 7



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4.4 Band Edge at Antenna Terminals

Measurement Procedure: FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01 Section 6.0

The transmitter output was connected to a calibrated coaxial cable, attenuator and Spectrum analyser, the other end of which was connected to a Base Station Simulator. The Base Station Simulator was set to force the EUT to its maximum power setting. The tests were performed at two frequencies (low channel and high channel).in the 1MHz bands immediately outside and adjacent to the frequency block a resolution bandwidth of 100kHz or 1% of the emission bandwidth of the fundamental emission of the transmitter may be employed. The EUT emission bandwidth is measured as the width of the signal between two points, outside of which all emission are attenuated at least 26dB below the transmitter power. The video bandwidth of the spectrum analyzer was set at thrice the resolution bandwidth. Detector Mode was set to rms.

Remark: Reference test setup 1

Test Settings

- 1. Start and stop frequency were set such that the band edge would be placed in the center of the plot
- 2. Span was set large enough so as to capture all out of band emissions near the band edge
- 3. RBW ≥ 1% of the emission bandwidth
- VBW > 3 x RBW
- 5. Detector = RMS
- Number of sweep points ≥ 2 x Span/RBW
- Trace mode = trace average for continuous emissions, max hold for pulse emissions
- 8. Sweep time = auto couple
- 9. The trace was allowed to stabilize



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4.5 Spurious And Harmonic Emissions at Antenna Terminal

Measurement Procedure: FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01 Section 6.0

The transmitter output was connected to a calibrated coaxial cable, attenuator and Spectrum analyzer, the other end of which was connected to a Base Station Simulator. The Base Station Simulator was set to force the EUT to its maximum power setting. The tests were performed at three frequencies (low channel and high channel). The level of the carrier and the various conducted spurious and harmonic frequencies is measured by means of a calibrated spectrum analyzer. The spectrum is scanned from the lowest frequency generated in the equipment up to a frequency including its 10th harmonic. On any frequency outside a licensee's frequency block, the power of any emission shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) by at least 43 + 10 log(P) dB. Compliance with these provisions is based on the use of measurement instrumentation employing a resolution bandwidth of 1 MHz or greater. However, in the 1 MHz bands immediately outside and adjacent to the frequency block a resolution bandwidth of at least one percent of the emission bandwidth of the fundamental emission of the transmitter may be employed. The emission bandwidth is defined as the width of the signal between two points, one below the carrier center frequency and one above the carrier center frequency, outside of which all emission are attenuated at least 26 dB below the transmitter power.

Remark: Reference test setup 1

Test Settings

- 1. Start frequency was set to 9kHz and stop frequency was set to at least 10* the fundamental frequency(Separated into at least two plots per channel)
- 2. Detector = RMS
- 3. Trace mode = trace average for continuous emissinos, max hold for pulse emissions
- 4. Sweep time = auto couple
- 5. The trace was allowed to stabilize
- 6. Please see test notes below for RBW and VBW settings



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4.6 Peak-Average Ratio

Measurement Procedure: FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01 Section 5.7.2

A peak to average ratio measurement is performed at the conducted port of the EUT. For WCDMA signals, the spectrum analyzers Complementary Cumulative Distribution Function (CCDF) measurement profile is used to determine the largest deviation between the average and the peak power of the EUT in a given bandwidth. The CCDF curve shows how much time the peak waveform spends at or above a given average power level. The percent of time the signal spends at or above the level defines the probability for that particular power level. For GSM signals, an average and a peak trace are used on a spectrum analyzer to determine the largest deviation between the average and the peak power of the EUT in a bandwidth greater than the emission bandwidth. The traces are generated with the spectrum analyzer set to zero span mode.

Remark: Reference test setup 1

Test Settings

- 1. The signal analyzer's CCDF measurement profile is enabled
- 2. Frequency = carrier center frequency
- 3. Measurement BW > Emission bandwidth of signal
- 4. The signal analyzer was set to collect one million samples to generate the CCDF curve
- 5. The measurement interval was set depending on the type of signal analyzed. For continuous signals (>98% duty cycle), the measurement interval was set to 1ms. For burst transmissions, the spectrum analyzer is set to use an internal "RF Burst" trigger that is synced with an incoming pulse and the measurement interval is set to less than the duration of the "on time" of one burst to ensure that energy is only captured during a time in which the transmitter is operating at maximum power



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4.7 Field Strength of Spurious Radiation

Measurement Procedure: FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01 Section 5.8

Below 1GHz test procedure as below:

- 1). The EUT was powered ON and placed on a 80cm high table in the chamber. The antenna of the transmitter was extended to its maximum length.
- 2). The disturbance of the transmitter was maximized on the test receiver display by raising and lowering from 1m to 4m (for the test frequency of below 30MHz, the antenna was tuned to heights 1 meter) the receive antenna and by rotating through 360° the turntable. After the fundamental emission was maximized, a field strength measurement was made.
- 3). Steps 1) and 2) were performed with the EUT and the receive antenna in both vertical and horizontal polarization.
- 4). Test the EUT in the lowest channel, the middle channel ,the Highest channel.
- 5). The radiation measurements are performed in X, Y, Z axis positioning. And found the X axis positioning which it is worse case, Only the test worst case mode is recorded in the report.
- 6). Repeat above procedures until all frequencies measured was complete.

E (dB μ V/m) = Measured amplitude level (dB μ V) + (Cable Loss (dB) + Antenna Factor (dB/m) – AMP(dB)) EIRP (dBm) = E (dB μ V/m) + 20 log D – 104.8; where D is the measurement distance in meters

Above 1GHz test procedure as below:

- 1) Different between above is the test site, change from Semi- Anechoic Chamber to fully Anechoic Chamber
- 2) Calculate power in dBm by the following formula:

 $E (dB\mu V/m) = Measured \ amplitude \ level \ (dB\mu V) + (Cable \ Loss \ (dB) + Antenna \ Factor \ (dB/m) - AMP(dB)) \\ EIRP (dBm) = E (dB\mu V/m) + 20 \ log \ D - 104.8; \ where \ D \ is the measurement \ distance \ in meters$

- 3). Test the EUT in the lowest channel, the middle channel the Highest channel
- 4). The radiation measurements are performed in X, Y, Z axis positioning. And found the X axis positioning which it is worse case, Only the test worst case mode is recorded in the report.
- 5). Repeat above procedures until all frequencies measured was complete

Remark1: Reference test setup 2

Remark2: The emission below 18G were measured at a 3m test distance, while emissions above 18GHz were measured at a 1m test distance. At a measurement distance of 1 meter the limit line was increased by 20*LOG(3/1) = 9.54 dB.

Remark:

1) The field strength is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor, Cable Factor & Preamplifier gain. The basic equation with a sample calculation is as follows:

Level = Reading Level(dBuV) + AF(dB/m) + Factor(dB)

AF = Antenna Factor(dB/m)

Factor = Cable Factor(dB) - Preamplifier gain (dB)

Margin = Limit(dBm) - Level(dBm)

dBuV=dbm+95.26

- 2) Scan from 9kHz to 40GHz, The disturbance between 9KHz to 30MHz and 18GHz to 40GHz was very low, and the harmonics were the highest point could be found when testing, so only the harmonics had been displayed. The amplitude of spurious emissions from the radiator which are attenuated more than 20dB below the limit need not be reported.
- 3) All modes have been tested, but only the worst case data displayed in this report.



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4.8 Frequency Stability / Temperature Variation

Measurement Procedure:

Frequency stability testing is performed in accordance with the guidelines of FCC KDB 971168 D01 V03r01; Section 9

- . The frequency stability of the transmitter is measured by:
- a.) **Temperature:** The temperature is varied from $-30\,^{\circ}$ C to $+50\,^{\circ}$ C in $10\,^{\circ}$ C increments using an environmental chamber.
- b.) **Primary Supply Voltage:** The primary supply voltage is varied from 85% to 115% of the nominal value for non hand-carried battery and AC powered equipment. For hand-carried, battery-powered equipment, primary supply voltage is reduced to the battery operating end point which shall be specified by the manufacturer.

Specification – The frequency stability shall be sufficient to ensure that the fundamental emission stays within the authorized frequency block. The frequency stability of the transmitter shall be maintained within $\pm 0.00025\%$ (± 2.5 ppm) of the center frequency.

Time Period and Procedure:

- 1. The carrier frequency of the transmitter is measured at room temperature (20°C to provide a reference).
- 2. The equipment is turned on in a "standby" condition for fifteen minutes before applying power to the transmitter. Measurement of the carrier frequency of the transmitter is made within one minute after applying power to the transmitter.
- 3. Frequency measurements are made at 10 °C intervals ranging from -30 °C to +50 °C. A period of at least one half-hour is provided to allow stabilization of the equipment at each temperature level.

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


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

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
