## 4 TEST METHODOLOGY

#### 4.1. DESCRIPTION OF TEST MODES

The EUT has been tested under operating condition.

Software used to control the EUT for staying in continuous transmitting and receiving

mode is programmed.

After verification, all tests were carried out with the worst case test modes as shown below except radiated spurious emission below 1GHz, which worst case was in normal link mode only, and power line conducted emission below 30MHz, which worst case was in normal link mode.

IEEE802.11b mode: Channel Low (2412MHz), Channel Mid (2437MHz) and Channel High (2462MHz) with 1Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

IEEE802.11g mode: Channel Low (2412MHz), Channel Mid (2437MHz) and Channel High (2462MHz) with 6Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

IEEE 802.11n HT20 MHz mode: Channel Low (2412MHz), Channel Mid(2437MHz) and Channel High (2462MHz) with 13Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

IEEE 802.11n HT40 MHz mode: Channel Low (2422MHz), Channel Mid (2437MHz) and Channel High (2452MHz) with 27Mbps data rate were chosen for full testing.

### **6.3. MEASUREMENT UNCERTAINTY**

Where relevant, the following measurement uncertainty levels have been estimated for tests performed on the EUT as specified in CISPR 16-4-2:

This uncertainty represents an expanded uncertainty expressed at approximately the 95% confidence level using a coverage factor of k=2.

The measured result is above (below) the specification limit by a margin less than the measurement uncertainty; it is therefore not possible to state compliance based on the 95% level of confidence. However, the result indicates that compliance (non-compliance) is more probable than non-compliance) with the specification limit.

## 7 FCC PART 15.247 REQUIREMENTS

#### 7.1. POWER LINE CONDUCTED EMISSIONS MEASUREMENT

#### 7.1.1. LIMITS OF CONDUCTED EMISSIONS MEASUREMENT

According to §15.207(a), except as shown in paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section, for an intentional radiator that is designed to be connected to the public utility (AC) power line, the radio frequency voltage that is conducted back onto the AC power line on any frequency or frequencies within the band 150 kHz to 30 MHz shall not exceed the limits in the following table, as measured using a 50  $\mu$ H/50 ohms line impedance stabilization network (LISN). Compliance with the provisions of this paragraph shall be based on the measurement of the radio frequency voltage between each power line and ground at the power terminal. The lower limit applies at the boundary between the frequency ranges.



#### **7.1.3. TEST PROCEDURES** (please refer to measurement standard)

• The EUT and Support equipment, if needed, was placed on a non-conducted table, which is 0.8m above the ground plane and 0.4m away from the conducted wall.

- The test equipment EUT installed received AC main power, through a Line Impedance Stabilization Network (LISN), which supplied power source and was grounded to the ground plane. All support equipment power received from a second LISN. The two LISNs provide 50 ohm/ 50uH of coupling impedance for the measuring instrument.
- The EUT test program was started. Emissions were measured on each current carrying line of the EUT using an EMI Test Receiver connected to the LISN powering the EUT.
- The frequency range from 150 kHz to 30 MHz was searched. The test data of the worst-case condition(s) was recorded. Emission levels under limit 20dB were not recorded.





#### 7.2. SPURIOUS EMISSIONS MEASUREMENT

#### 7.2.1. CONDUCTED EMISSIONS MEASUREMENT

#### 7.2.1.1. LIMITS OF CONDUCTED EMISSIONS MEASUREMENT

§15.247(d)specifies that in any 100 kHz bandwidth outside of the authorized frequency band, the power shall be attenuated according to the following conditions:

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If the peakoutput power procedure is used to measure the fundamental emission powerto demonstrate compliance to 15.247(b)(3)requirements, then the peak conducted output power measured within any 100 kHz outside the authorized frequency bandshall be attenuated by at least 20 dB relative to the maximum measured in-band peak PSD level.

If the averageoutput power procedure is used to measure the fundamental emission powerto demonstrate compliance to 15.247(b)(3)requirements,then the power in any 100 kHz outside of the authorized frequency band shall be attenuated by at least 30 dB relative to the maximum measuredin-band average PSD level.s

In addition, radiated emissions which fall in the restricted bands, as defined in §15.205(a), must also comply with the radiated emission limits specified in 15.209(a) (see Section 15.205(c)).

#### **7.2.1.3. TEST PROCEDURE** (please refer to measurement standard)

Conducted RF measurements of the transmitter output were made to confirm that the EUT antenna port conducted emissions meet the specified limit and to identify any spurious signals that require further investigation or measurements on the radiated emissions site.


The transmitter output is connected to the spectrum analyzer. The resolution bandwidth is set to 100 kHz. The video bandwidth is set to 300 kHz.


Measurements are made over the 10MHz to 26GHz range with the transmitter set to the lowest, middle, and highest channels. No emission found between lowest internal used/generated frequency to 10MHz, it is only recorded 10MHz to 26GHz.










## IEEE 802.11b mode (Antenna 1)










## IEEE 802.11g mode (Antenna 0)









## IEEE 802.11g mode (Antenna 1)












# IEEE 802.11n HT20 MHz mode (Antenna 0)









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#### 7.2.2. RADIATED EMISSIONS MEASUREMENT

#### 7.2.2.1. LIMITS OF RADIATED EMISSIONS MEASUREMENT

According to §15.209(a), except as provided elsewhere in this Subpart, the emissions from an intentional radiator shall not exceed the field strength levels specified in the following table:
