






2 Basics

2.1 Activating

1. Insert ARETE POP RFID Reader to your Phone's headphone jack.




- 2. Turn volume up to 100%.
- 3. Switch the button to "On" in App.
- 4. LED indicator will be turned on in blue color.

3.3 Inventory


- 1. Switch the button to "On"

- 3. Touch **Stop** button to finish inventory tag




4 How to use Android application

- 2. Search "ARETE POP" and touch install.





3. ARETE POP app touch your phone.



4.3 Inventory


- 1. Touch On/Off switch to power on the reader

- 3. Touch Stop Read button to finish inventory tag




1. Setting for output power

Read on: 400ms, Read off: 100ms




4. Save the RCP log Mod

You can save the RCP log data into a .csv(EXCEL) file


