



## 3. Before Use

## 3.1 Install the Cards

- Remove the battery cover.
- Insert the Nano SIM cards and the Micro SD card into the corresponding slots with the metal contacts facing 2. down.






To remove the Nano SIM card, slide the latch to eject the corresponding card.

## 3.2 Attach the Battery



#### **⚠** CAUTION

- Use the approved battery to avoid the risk of explosion.
- Dispose of the used battery according to "Precautions for Disposal" in the Safety Information Booklet.
- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- Align the contacts on the battery with those on the battery slot, and then slide the battery into the slot. 2.
- Put the battery cover back in place. 3.



## 3.3 Charge the Battery



#### CAUTION

- Use the approved charger to charge the battery.
- Read the Safety Information Booklet before charging.
- The remaining lithium-ion battery power is limited to 30% pursuant to the new lithium battery shipment regulation approved by the International Air Transport Association (IATA).

Connect the product to the power adapter, power bank, or PC through the USB data cable.

During charging, check the charging status through the battery icon or percentage on the touchscreen.

# 4. Basic Operations

#### 4.1 Turn On the Device

Long press the **On-Off** key until the startup screen appears.

#### 4.2 Turn Off the Device

Method 1

Long press the On-Off key, and then select Power off.

- Method 2
  - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
  - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
  - c. Tap
  - d. Tap Power off.

#### 4.3 Restart the Device

Method 1

Long press the On-Off key, and then select Restart.

- Method 2
  - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
  - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
  - c. Tap &
  - d. Tap Restart.

## **NOTE**

If the device fails to work and be powered off, you can long press the **On-Off** key for more than 10s to forcibly restart the device.

#### 4.4 Adjust the Volume



High sound pressure with hearing damage risk. Do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.

#### Through the Volume Key

Media Volume

Press the Volume Up key to increase the media volume, or the Volume Down key to decrease the media volume.

- Ring and Notification Volume
  - a. Press the Volume Up key or Volume Down key.
  - b. Do any of the following:
    - To vibrate the ring and notification, tap the upper icon on the volume bar, and then select  $\blacksquare$ .
    - To mute the ring and notification, tap the upper icon on the volume bar, and then select 🔌 .
    - To increase or decrease the ring and notification volume, tap the lower ••• icon on the volume bar, and then drag the slider corresponding with **Ring & notification volume**.
- Call and Alarm Volume
  - a. Press the Volume Up key or Volume Down key.
  - b. Tap the lower ••• icon on the volume bar.
  - c. To increase or decrease the call or alarm volume, drag the slider corresponding with Call volume or Alarm volume.

#### **Through the Sound Interface**

- 1. Tap
- 2. Tap **Sound**.
- 3. Drag the slider corresponding with **Media volume**, **Call volume**, **Ring & notification volume**, and **Alarm volume**.


#### 4.5 Use the SIMs

The device supports the Dual SIM Dual Standby feature, but cannot access voice services and data services simultaneously.

#### 4.5.1 Set the SIM Preference

You can set a SIM card as the default one for the Internet, calls, and messages.

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Tap Network & internet.
- 3. Select one SIM.
- 4. Do any of the following.
  - > Tap **Data preference**, and then select the SIM, of which the network you want to use.
  - > Tap Calls preference, and then select the SIM, which you want to use to make a call.
  - > Tap **SMS preference**, and then select the SIM, which you want to use to send a message.



#### 4.5.2 Enable or Disable the SIM Card

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Tap Network & internet.
- 3. Select one SIM.
- 4. Tap following Use SIM.



To custom the name and color of the SIM, tap / in the upper right corner.

#### 4.6 Manage the Battery

You can check the battery usage, enable Battery Saver to extend the battery life, and set whether to display the battery percentage in the status bar.

#### 4.6.1 Enable the Battery Saver

Battery Saver can reduce power consumption by decreasing the screen brightness or adjusting the sleep time.

- Manually enable the Battery Saver
  - > In the control center, tap Battery Saver, and then tap TURN ON.
  - > Tap , go to Battery > Battery Saver, and then tap following User Battery Saver.
- Automatically enable the Battery Saver
  - a. Tap Set a schedule.
  - b. Tap Based on percentage.
  - c. Drag the slider to a percentage you want.

The percentage displayed above the slider indicates the remaining battery. Once the battery reaches to the value, the Battery Saver will be automatically enabled

Automatically disable the Battery Saver

Tap following Turn off when charged.

When the battery is over 90%, the Battery Saver will be automatically disabled.

## **MOTE**

During charging, the Battery Saver cannot be enabled.

#### 4.6.2 Set the Remaining Battery Display

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Tap Battery.
- 3. Tap following **Battery percentage**.

The remaining battery percentage will be displayed in the status bar.

## 4.7 Manage the Storage

You can check the storage usage and free up space for better use.

To extend the storage space, install a Micro SD card in the device.

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Tap **Storage**.
- 3. Do either of the following:
  - > To manually free up the storage space, tap Free up space.
  - > To automatically free up the storage space regularly, tap following **Storage manager**.

#### 4.8 Check the Device Information

- 1. Tap 🙆.
- 2. Tap **About phone**.

You can see the device name, SIM, legal information, International Mobile Equipment Identity (IMEI), model, Android<sup>TM</sup> 12, and more.



#### **5.2 Understand Control Center**

The control center allows you to instantly access commonly used features by using shortcut switches, adjust the screen brightness, and view or clear the notifications.

To access the control center, swipe down from the status bar.

To view all shortcuts, swipe down from the control center.



## 5.3 Manage the Widget

The widget allows you to quickly access apps.

- To add a widget, do the following:
  - a. On the home screen, touch and hold the blank area, and then select Widgets.
  - b. In the app list, tap an app.

- c. Touch and hold a widget, and then drag it to the blank area on the home screen.
- To move the widget, drag it to a new location.
- To remove a widget, drag it to **Remove** at the top.

## 5.4 Capture the Screen

- 1. Press the **On-Off** key and the **Volume Down** key simultaneously.
- 2. To view the screenshot, tap **Photos**.

#### 5.5 Record the Screen

- 1. Swipe down from the status bar.
- 2. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
- 3. Tap Screen record.

#### 5.6 Cast the Screen

- 1. Swipe down from the status bar.
- 2. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
- 3. Tap Screen cast.

#### 5.7 Lock or Unlock the Screen

When the screen is not in use, you can lock it to avoid unintended operations, protect privacy, and increase battery life. When the screen is locked, you can still initiate emergency calls, answer calls, open the camera, and receive messages and notifications.

#### 5.7.1 Set the Pattern or Password Unlock

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Go to Security > Screen lock.
- 3. Tap Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password.

When the screen is locked, swipe up, draw the pattern, or enter the pin or password to unlock the screen.

#### 5.7.2 Set the Fingerprint Unlock

1. Tap .

- 2. Go to **Security** > **Fingerprint**.
- 3. Select Fingerprint + Pattern, Fingerprint + PIN, or Fingerprint + Password.
- 4. Set the pattern, pin, or password, and then tap **Next**.
- 5. Draw the pattern or enter the pin or password again, and then tap **Confirm**.
- 6. Select Show all notification content, Show sensitive content only when unlocked, or Don't show notification at all, and then tap Done.
- 7. Tap I agree.
- 8. Put your finger on the **On-Off** key until the device detects the fingerprint totally.
- 9. Lift and then put your finger on the **On-Off** key again.
- 10. Tap **Done**.
- 11. (Optional) to add another fingerprint, tap Add another.

## **NOTE**

If you change the screen lock method to **None** or **Swipe**, the recorded fingerprint will be deleted.

#### 5.7.3 Set the Face Unlock

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Go to **Security** > **Face Unlock**.
- 3. Select Face Unlock + Pattern, Face Unlock + PIN, or Face Unlock + Password.
- 4. Set the pattern, pin, or password, and then tap **Next**.
- 5. Draw the pattern or enter the pin or password again, and then tap **Confirm**.
- 6. Select Show all notification content, Show sensitive content only when unlocked, or Don't show notification at all, and then tap Done.
- 7. Tap I agree.
- 8. Tap Start.
- 9. Face the front camera until the device records the face.
- 10. Tap Done.



If you change the screen lock method to **None** or **Swipe**, the recorded face will be deleted.

#### 5.8 Set the Home Screen

- 1. On the home screen, touch and hold the blank area, and then select **Home settings**.
- 2. In the **Home settings** interface, do any of the following:
  - > To show or hide the notification dots, tap **Notification dots**, and then tap following **Notification dot** on app icon.
  - > To add app icons to home screen, tap following Add app icons to Home screen.
  - > To show Google app, tap following **Show Google App**.
  - > To set the app sort type, tap **App sort type**, and then select **Sort App by Name** or **Sort App by First Install Time**.

#### 5.9 Auto-Rotate the Screen

Auto rotate screen allows the device to automatically switch between portrait and landscape orientations when you rotate the device.

- Method 1
  - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
  - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
  - c. Tap Auto-rotate.
- Method 2
  - a. Tap 🙆.
  - b. Tap Display.
  - c. Tap following Auto-rotate screen.

#### 5.10 Enable the Glove Mode

The Glove Mode feature allows you to use the device when you wear gloves. With this mode, the sensitivity of the touch screen is increased.

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Tap **Display**.
- 3. Tap following **Glove Mode**.

## 5.11 Set the Display

#### 5.11.1 Switch Between Sleep and Wake Mode

Manual sleep or wakeup

Press the On-Off key.

- Automatic sleep
  - a. Tap 🔘 .
  - b. Go to **Display** > **Screen Timeout**.
  - c. Set the automatic sleep time.

When then screen is idle for the preset time, the screen automatically sleeps.

- Automatic wakeup
  - a. Tap 🔘.
  - b. Go to **Display** > **Lock screen**.
  - c. Tap following Wake screen for notifications.

In sleep status, if the device receives a notification, the screen will wake up.

#### 5.11.2 Adjust the Screen Brightness

Brightness allows you to adjust the brightness to make the screen brighter or dimmer in different situations.

- Manually adjust the brightness
  - a. Tap 🙆.
  - b. Go to **Display > Brightness Level**.
  - c. Drag the slider.
- Automatically adjust the brightness
  - a. Tap 🙆.
  - b. Tap Display
  - c. Tap following Adaptive brightness.

The device automatically adjusts screen brightness based on your current lighting conditions.

#### 5.11.3 Turn On the Night Light

In Night Light mode, the screen automatically turns amber to help reduce your eye strain and fatigue in low-light conditions.

- Method 1
  - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
  - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
  - c. Tap Night Light.
- Method 2
  - a. Tap 🔘.
  - b. Go to **Display** > **Night Light**.
  - c. Tap following Use Night Light.
  - d. To set the night light start time, tap Schedule, and then select None, Turns on at custom time, or Turns on from sunset to sunrise.
  - e. To adjust the color intensity, drag the slider under **Intensity**.

#### 5.11.1 Set the Dark Theme

In the dark, the Dark Theme helps reduce your eye strain and fatigue.

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Go to **Display** > **Dark theme**.
- 3. Tap following Use Dark theme.
- 4. To set the dark theme start time, tap **Schedule**, and then select **None**, **Turns on at custom time**, or **Turns on from sunset to sunrise**.

## 5.11.2 Set the Text Display

#### **Font Size**

- 1. Tap 🙆.
- 2. Go to **Display** > **Font Size**.
- 3. Drag the slider left to decrease or right to increase the font size.

#### **Display Size**

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Go to **Display > Display Size**.
- 3. Drag the slider left to decrease or right to increase the display size.

## 5.11.3 Set the Wallpaper

- 1. Enter the wallpaper gallery by either of the following:
  - > On the home screen, touch and hold the blank area, and then select Wallpapers.
  - > Tap , and then tap Wallpaper & style.
- 2. Tap CHANGE WALLPAPER.
- 3. Tap On-device wallpaper or My photos.
- 4. Select a wallpaper.
- 5. Tap ✓.
- 6. Select Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screen.


## 6. Contacts

The Contacts app allows you to manage your contacts information, such as phone numbers, e-mails, and addresses.

#### 6.1 Add the Contact

- 1. Tap
- 2. Tap +
- 3. Set the contact information including name, phone number, and email address.
- 4. Tap Save.

#### 6.2 Understand the Contact Interface



#### 6.3 Search for the Contact

- 1. Tap 🔼.
- 2. In the **Search contacts** field, enter the keywords.

The device displays the search results below the search box.

## 6.4 Share the Contact

- 1. Tap 🔼.
- 2. Tap and hold the contact.
- 3. (Optional) Tap other contacts you want to share.
- 4. Tap < .
- 5. Select a sharing method.

#### 6.5 Delete the Contact

- 1. Tap 🔼
- 2. Tap and hold the contact.
- 3. (Optional) Tap other contacts you want to share.
- 4. Tap :.
- 5. Select **Delete**.
- 6. Tap **Delete**.

#### 6.6 Set More

- 1. Tap 🔼
- 2. On the left of the upper search box, tap  $\blacksquare$ .
- 3. Do any of the following:
  - > To create a label and add contacts to the label, tap Create label.
  - > To set your information, accounts, edit or manage contacts, tap **Settings**.
  - > To ask help or give feedback, tap **Help & feedback**.

## 7. Calls

#### 7.1 Make the Call

After the device with a SIM has been registered with carrier network, you can use the Phone app to make and receive phone calls or emergency calls

#### **Through Manual Dialing**

- 1. Tap
- 2. Tap



- 3. On the dialpad, enter the phone number.
- 4. Tap \( \sigma\_{\text{call}} \).

#### **Through Contact List**

- 1. Tap
- 2. In the contact list, tap the phone contact.
- 3. Tap 🔽.

#### **Through Call Logs**

- 1. Tap
- 2. Tap **O**.
- 3. Select the phone contact or number.

4. Tap 🔽..

#### 7.2 Receive or Decline the Call

When a phone call is coming in, tap ANSWER to receive it or tap DECLINE to decline it.

#### 7.3 View the Missed Call

If there is a missed call, you can see  $\[ \]$  in the status bar.

Swipe down from the status bar.

You can see the missed call notification.

#### 7.4 End the Call

To end a phone call, tap .

## 7.5 Make the Emergency Call

If the device is within the network coverage of the carrier, you can initiate an emergency phone call even without the SIM installed. Do either of the following:

- On the unlocked main screen, tap  $\bigcirc$  >  $\bigcirc$  , enter the emergency number, and then tap  $\bigcirc$  .
- On the locked main screen, tap **EMERGENCY**, enter the emergency number, and then tap .

#### 7.6 Set More

- 1. Tap ...
- 2. On the right of the upper search box, tap
- 3. Select Settings.

You can set caller ID & spam, accessibility, blocked numbers, display options, nearby place, quick responses, sound and vibration, voicemail, and more.

With the Messaging app 

, you can send and receive text or multimedia messages.

## 8.1 Send the Message

- 1. Tap

## 8.4 Block the Message from a Contact

- 3. Tap 🛇.

## 8.5 Manage Messages

- 1. Tap
- 2. Tap a contact.
- 3. Touch and hold the message text, and do either of the following:
  - $\triangleright$  To copy and paste the test message, tap  $\Box$ .
  - To delete the message, tap .
  - > To forward the message, tap , and then tap **Forward**.
  - > To share the message, tap , and then tap **Share**.
  - > To view the message details, tap , and then tap **View details**.

## 8.6 Set More

- 1. Tap
- 2. On the right of the search box, tap .
- 3. Select **Settings**.

You can set the message tone, notification, and more.

# 9. Connectivity

#### 9.1 USB Connection

- 1. Connect the device with the PC through the USB data cable.
- 2. Swipe down from the top.
- 3. Tap Charging this device via USB.
- 4. Tap **Tap for more options**.
- 5. In the **USB Preferences** interface, select one of the following options:
  - > File Transfer: allows you to transfer files between the device and the PC.
  - > USB tethering: allows you to share the network of the PC.
  - > MIDI: allows you to use the device as a musical instrument digital interface (MIDI) input device and play music on the PC.
  - > PTP: allows you to transfer pictures to the PC.
  - > No data transfer: allows you to only charge the device by the PC.

#### 9.2 Mobile Network

#### 9.2.1 Enable the Mobile Network

Before accessing the cellular network services, ensure that you have properly installed the SIM. If the cellular network services are not in use, you can turn off it to decrease data usage and increase battery life.

To enable or disable the cellular network, do either of the following:

- Method 1
  - a. Tap
  - b. Go to Network & internet > Mobile network.
  - c. Tap following **Mobile data**.
- Method 2
  - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
  - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
  - c. Tap Mobile data.

#### 9.2.2 Set the Mobile Network



- 2. Go to **Network & internet** > **Mobile network**.
- 3. Do any of the following:
  - To enable data roaming, tap following Roaming.
     You can access data services when you are outside the service area of your carrier.
  - > To select the 2G, 3G, 4G, or 5G network, tap **Preferred network type**.

Only when 5G is enabled, you can select 5G network.

> To enable 5G, tap following **Enable 5G**.

Before accessing the 5G network services, ensure that you have installed the SIM card with 5G services enabled.

> To enable the Voice over LTE (VoLTE) feature, tap following **VoLTE**.

The device uses LTE services to improve voice communications.

- > To enable WLAN calling, tap WLAN calling, and then tap following Use WLAN calling.
- > To enable carrier video calling, tap following Carrier video calling.
- > To enable automatic network switch between dual SIMs, tap following Automatically select network.

## 9.2.3 Monitor the Data Usage

- 1. Tap 🔘 .
- 2. Go to Network & internet > Mobile network > App data usage.

You can see the data usage of every app.

## 9.2.4 Limit the Data Usage

- 1. Tap ( ...
- 2. Go to Network & internet > Mobile network > Data warning & limit.
- 3. Do either of the following:
  - > To avoid excessive data usage, tap **Mobile data usage cycle**, and then set the usage cycle reset date.
  - > To enable data warning, tap following Set data warning.

- > To set the threshold for data warning, tap **Data warning**, enter the threshold value, and then tap **SET**.
- To enable data limit, tap following Set data limit, and then tap OK.
- > To set the threshold for data limit, tap **Data limit**, enter the threshold value, and then tap **SET**

### **9.3 WLAN**

#### 9.3.1 Connect to the WLAN

With successful WLAN connection, you can visit the Internet or shared media from other devices in the network.

To enable or disable the WLAN, do as follows:

- 1. Tap ( ...
- 2. Go to **Network & internet** > **WLAN**.
- 3. Tap following **Use WLAN**.
- 4. Select a network from the list.
  - > If you select an open network, the device automatically connects to it.
  - > If you select a secure network, you need to enter a password before connection.
  - > If no network in the list, do as follows:
    - i. Tap Add network.
    - ii. Enter the network name or scan the QR code to add the network.

## 9.3.2 Setting the WLAN

- 1. Tap (4).
- 2. Go to **Network & internet > WLAN**.
- 3. Do either of the following:
  - > To check or delete saved networks, tap **Saved networks**.
  - > To receive a notification when a high-quality public network is available, tap **WLAN preferences**, and then tap following **Notify for public networks**.
  - > To automatically turn on the WLAN feature when a high-quality saved network is nearby, tap WLAN preferences, and then tap following Turn on WLAN automatically.

## 9.4 Hotspot and Tethering

The Hotspot and Tethering features allow the device to share the mobile network connection with nearby devices.



- 2. Go to **Network & internet** > **Hotspot & tethering**.
- 3. Do any of the following:

## 9.5 BT

The BT feature allows the device to exchange files with another BT-enabled device over short distances.

## 9.5.1 Pair a Peripheral BT Device

- 1. Enable the BT feature in either of the following ways:
  - > Tap , go to Connected devices > Connection preference > BT, and then tap following Use BT.
  - Swipe down from the top to enter the control center, and then tap BT.
     The device automatically detects available BT devices, and can be detected by other BT devices.
- 2. Tap Pair new device.
- 3. From the **Available devices** list, tap a device to pair.
- 4. Tap PAIR.
- 5. Wait for the BT device to respond to the BT pairing request.

After the peripheral BT device accepts the BT pairing request, the device can exchange files with the peripheral BT device.



Under the **Previously connected devices** list, you can tap following the device, and then tap **FORGET** to forget the paired device.

## 9.5.2 Share the File Through BT

Many apps allow you to transmit data to other devices through the BT. Take **Photos** as an example.

To send photos or videos through the BT, do as follows:

- 1. Tap 💤 .
- 2. Touch and hold the picture or video.
- 3. Tap  $\triangleleft$ , and then select  $\square$ .
- 4. Tap the peripheral BT device from the available BT device list.

When the peripheral BT device accepts the request, the device will send the send the file to the peripheral BT device.

## 9.5.3 Change the Device Name

The device name for BT connection is the device model by default.

1. In the Pair new device interface, tap Device name.

- 2. Enter new name.
- 3. Tap **RENAME**.

#### **9.6 VPN**

A virtual private network (VPN) extends a private network across a public network. Applications running across the VPN can benefit from the functionality, security, and management of the private network.



- Before setting up a VPN, you must enable the screen lock (pattern or password).
- For detailed configuration, consult your dealer.
- 1. Tap 🙆 .
- 2. Go to **Network & internet** > **VPN**.
- 3. Tap +.
- 4. Edit the VPN profile such as VPN name, server address, username, and password.
- 5. Tap **SAVE**.

## 9.7 Airplane Mode

When you are on an airplane or in an area with radio restrictions, you may be required to make the device enter the airplane mode. In airplane mode, you cannot use voice or data services. However, you can use services over WLAN network or BT, initiate narrowband services, and use apps that require no cellular data connection.

To enable the Airplane Mode feature, do either of the following:

- Method 1
  - a. Tap
  - b. Tap Network & internet.
  - c. Tap following **Airplane mode**.
- Method 2
  - a. Swipe down from the status bar.
  - b. Swipe down from the control center to unfold all shortcuts.
  - c. Tap Airplane mode.

## 10. Personalization

### 10.1 Set the Sound

#### 10.1.1 Turn on Do Not Disturb


The Do Not Disturb feature enables the device silent and the screen dark when the call or notification is coming in.



  - c. Tap Do Not Distrub.
- Method 2

  - b. Tap Sound.
  - c. In the Sound interface, tap Do Not Disturb.
  - d. Tap TURN ON NOW.
  - e. (Optional) To set the Do Not Disturb feature, do either of the following:
    - To block interruptions of people, app, alarm or others, respectively tap People, Apps, and Alarm & other interruptions.
    - To set the start time for Dot Not Disturb mode, tap **Schedules**.

#### 10.1.2 Set More

In the **Sound** interface, you can also adjust the volume, set vibration mode for calls, default notification and alarm sounds, or tone for various operations.







## 10.2 Enable the Location Services

The location service allows the device to determine its location information with WLAN, cellular network, BT, and GPS.

- 1. Tap
- 2. Tap Location.
- 3. Tap following Use location.
- 4. (Optional) Do any of the following:
  - > To enable or disable the app's permission to access the location information, do as follows:
    - i. Tap **App location permission**, and then tap the app.
    - ii. Under LOCATION ACCESS FOR THIS APP, select Allow all the time, Allow only while using the app, or Don't allow.
  - > To enable or disable the BDS, tap **Use beidou**, and then tap following **Use beidou**.
  - To enable or disable WLAN or BT scanning, tap **Location services**.

## 10.3 Set the Accessibility

## 10.3.1 Set the Text and Display



- 2. Go to Accessibility > Text and display.
- 3. Do any of the following:
  - > To adjust the font size, tap **Font size**, and then drag the slider.
  - > To adjust the display size, tap **Display size**, and then drag the slider.
  - > To enable bold text, tap following **Bold text**.
  - > To enable color correction mode, tap **Color correction**, and tap following **Use color correction**, and then select a correction mode.
  - > To enable color inversion, tap Color inversion, and then tap following Use color inversion.
  - > To remove animation effects, tap following **Remove animations**.
  - > To use large mouse cursor, tap following Large mouse pointer.
  - > To adjust the font outline and the background contrast, tap following **High contrast text**.

## 10.3.2 Set the Extra Dim Screen

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Go to Accessibility > Extra dim.
- 3. Tap following Make screen extra dim.
- 4. Do any of the following:
  - > To set the dim degree, drag the slider under **Intensity**.
  - > To keep extra dim after restart, tap following **Keep on after device restarts**.
  - > To add the shortcut of the extra dim switch to the lower right corner of the screen, tap following Extra dim shortcut.

## 10.3.3 Use the Magnifier

- 1. Tap
- 2. Go to **Display** > **Magnification**.
- 3. Tap following Magnification shortcut.

4. Tap **GOT IT**.

The magnifier shortcut is added to the lower corner of the screen.

- 5. Set the magnifier type.
  - a. Tap Magnification type.
  - b. Select Magnify full screen, Magnify part of screen, or Switch between full and partial screen.
  - c. Tap SAVE.
- 6. To use the magnifier, tap in the lower right corner of the screen.

## 10.3.4 Add the Accessibility Menu Shortcut

- 1. Tap .
- 2. Go to **Display** > **Accessibility Menu**.
- 3. Tap following Accessibility Menu shortcut.
- 4. Tap ALLOW.
- 5. Tap **GOT IT**.

The accessibility menu shortcut is added to the lower corner of the screen.

6. To use the larger buttons in the accessibility menu, tap **Settings**, and then tap

7. To unfold the accessibility menu, tap in the lower right corner of the screen.

# **11. Apps**

## 11.1 Manage the App

## 11.1.1 Close the Running App

You can close running apps in the background to release the memory.

- 1. At the bottom, tap
- 2. Swipe left or right to choose an app, and swipe up to end it.

## 11.1.2 Install the App



- To protect the device from malware or viruses, download the trusted applications only.
- To avoid personal information leakage or misuse, read the instruction carefully and operate with caution when installing an application.

If the pre-installed apps cannot meet your needs, you can download more third-party apps through the browser, computer, Micro SD card or BT. Open the installation package and follow the on-screen instructions to finish installation. After successful installation, the app icon appears on the home screen.

## 11.1.3 Uninstall the App

It is recommended to uninstall unused non-system apps to release the storage space and improve the system running speed.

- Method 1
  - a. Tap 🔣
  - b. Go to **Download** > **Installed**.
  - c. Select the app.
  - d. Tap Uninstall.
  - e. Tap **OK**.
- Method 2
  - a. Tap
  - b. Go to Apps > See all apps.
  - c. Tap the app.

- d. Tap UNINSTALL.
- e. Tap **OK**.
- Method 3
  - a. Touch and hold the app icon, and then tap **App info**.
  - b. Tap UNINSTALL.
  - c. Tap OK.

## 11.1.4 Force Stop or Reuse the App

- Method 1
  - a. Tap
  - b. Go to Apps > See all apps.
  - c. Tap the app.
  - d. Tap **FORCE STOP** to force stop the app or **OPEN** to reuse the app.
  - e. Tap **OK**.
- Method 2
  - a. Touch and hold the app icon, and then tap **App info**.
  - b. Tap **FORCE STOP** to force stop the app or **OPEN** to reuse the app.
  - c. Tap OK.

## 11.1.5 Manage the App Permission

When you open an app, the app may request access to a specific function or information. You can tap **ALLOW** or **DENY** to accept or deny the request.

To view or change the permission settings of the third-party apps, do as follows:

## **Through the Privacy Interface**

- 1. Tap
- 2. Go to **Privacy** > **Permission manager**.
- 3. Tap the permission type, and then select the app.
- 4. Select from **Allow** or **Don't allow**.

#### Through the Apps Interface





- Go to Apps > See all apps.
- 3. Tap the app.
- Tap Permissions.
- Do either of the following:
  - To deny a permission type, select the permission type under Allowed, and then select Don't Allow.
  - To allow a permission type, select the permission type under **Not allowed**, and then select **Allow**.



To set the special app access, in the Apps interface, tap Special app access.

## 11.1.6 Set the App Lock

The app lock service allows you to set a password to lock apps, therefore preventing unauthorized access.

To add a lock for an app, do as follows:

- 1.
- Go to **Security** > **AppLock**.
- Ether the password, and then tap Continue. 3.
- Enter the password again, and then tap Sure.
- Search the app you want to lock.
- Tap following the app.

In the AppLock interface, you can also do the following:

- To remove the lock from the app, tap following the app.
- To change the app lock password, tap Change the password, and then enter the new password twice.

## **11.1.7 Pin the App**

The App Pinning feature allows you to fix the current app interface so that you can focus on the current interface.

- Enable the App Pining feature.
  - Tap 🔕

- b. Go to **Security** > **App pinning**.
- c. Tap following Use app pining.
- d. Tap OK.
- 2. Pin the app.
  - a. Open an app.
  - b. At the bottom, tap
  - c. Tap the upper icon.
  - d. Tap Pin.
- 3. (Optional) To unpin the app, at the bottom, tap and simultaneously.







The device can automatically synchronize with the local date, time, and time zone over a mobile network. You can also manually set them.

## 12.4 Reset the Device



#### CAUTION

Before resetting the device, back up the data in advance to avoid data loss.

When the device runs slowly or the apps quit unexpectedly, you can reset the network, apps, or system to fix the problem.

## 12.5 Update the System

#### Manual upgrade

- When the System upgrade dialog box appears on the screen, tap OK to download the upgrade package.
  After the download is completed, the device starts to upgrade.

#### • Automatic upgrade

- > The device automatically downloads the upgrade package, and then starts to upgrade.
- > After you receive a system upgrade notification, the device automatically downloads the upgrade package, and then starts to upgrade.
