# EXHIBIT 1 GENERAL DESCRIPTION

### 1.0 **General Description**

### 1.1 Product Description

The Equipment under Test (EUT) is a control unit for the PS3 OPP WIRELESS CONTROLLER model: 1427441-01 operating at 2.4GHz band. It is powered by DC 4.5V (3 x 1.5V AAA batteries).

The Models: 1427441-02, 1500220-01, 1500220-02 are same as the model: 1427441-01 in hardware and electrical aspect. Their difference in appearance, product name and model number only.

Antenna Type: Integral antenna

Type of modulation: GFSK modulation

For electronic filing, the brief circuit description is saved with filename: descri.pdf.

### 1.2 Related Submittal(s) Grants

This is an application for certification of a transceiver for the Controller unit, and the corresponding USB Dongle unit (2.4GHz transceiver) is subjected to FCC certification with FCC ID: YFK-1427441B01FR.

### 1.3 Test Methodology

Radiated emission measurements were performed according to the procedures in ANSI C63.10 (2013). Radiated Emission measurement was performed in a Semi-anechoic chamber. Preliminary scans were performed in the Semi-anechoic chamber only to determine worst case modes. All Radiated tests were performed at an antenna to EUT distance of 3 meters, unless stated otherwise in the "Justification Section" of this Application.

### 1.4 Test Facility

The Semi-anechoic chamber facility used to collect the radiated data is Intertek Testing Services Shenzhen Ltd. Kejiyuan Branch and located at 6F, D Block, Huahan Building, Langshan Road, Nanshan District, Shenzhen, P. R. China. This test facility and site measurement data have been fully placed on file with the FCC (Registration Number: 242492).

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# EXHIBIT 2 SYSTEM TEST CONFIGURATION

### 2.0 **System Test Configuration**

### 2.1 Justification

The system was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it), and in the confines as outlined in ANSI C63.10 (2013).

The EUT was powered by three new DC 1.5V AAA batteries. Only the worst case data was reported.

For maximizing emissions below 30 MHz, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the centre of the loop antenna was placed 1 meter above the ground, and the antenna polarization was changed. For maximizing emission at and above 30 MHz, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the antenna height was varied from 1 meter to 4 meters above the ground plane, and the antenna polarization was changed. This step by step procedure for maximizing emissions led to the data report in Exhibit 3.0.

The unit was operated standalone and placed in the centre of the turntable with 0.8m height up to 1GHz and placed in the centre of 1.5 m turntable above 1GHz.

The equipment under test (EUT) was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it). The EUT was mounted to a plastic stand if necessary and placed on the styrene turntable, which enabled the Senior Engineer to maximize emissions through its placement in the three orthogonal axes.

### 2.2 EUT Exercising Software

There was no special software to exercise the device.

### 2.3 Special Accessories

No special accessories used.

### 2.4 Equipment Modification

Any modifications installed previous to testing by BENSUSSEN DEUTSCH & ASSOCIATES, INC. will be incorporated in each production model sold / leased in the United States.

No modifications were installed by Intertek Testing Services Shenzhen Ltd. Kejiyuan Branch.

# 3.0 **Emission Results**

Data is included worst-case configuration (the configuration which resulted in the highest emission levels).

#### 3.1 Radiated Test Results

A sample calculation, configuration photographs and data tables of the emissions are included.

### 3.1.1 Field Strength Calculation

The field strength is calculated by adding the reading on the Spectrum Analyzer to the factors associated with preamplifiers (if any), antennas, cables(when specified limit is in average and measurements are made with peak detectors). A sample calculation is included below.

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG$$

Where  $FS = Field Strength in dB\mu V/m$ 

RA = Receiver Amplitude (including preamplifier) in dBµV

CF = Cable Attenuation Factor in dB

AF = Antenna Factor in dB AG = Amplifier Gain in dB

In the radiated emission table which follows, the reading shown on the data table may reflect the preamplifier gain. An example of the calculations, where the reading does not reflect the preamplifier gain, follows:

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG$$

Assume a receiver reading of 62.0 dB $\mu$ V is obtained. The antenna factor of 7.4 dB and cable factor of 1.6 dB is added. The amplifier gain of 29 dB is subtracted. The net field strength for comparison to the appropriate emission limit is 42 dB $\mu$ V/m. This value in dB $\mu$ V/m was converted to its corresponding level in  $\mu$ V/m.

RA =  $62.0 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V}$ AF = 7.4 dBCF = 1.6 dBAG = 29.0 dBFS =  $62 + 7.4 + 1.6 - 29 = 42 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m}$ 

Level in  $\mu$ V/m = Common Antilogarithm [(42 dB $\mu$ V/m)/20] = 125.9  $\mu$ V/m

# 8.0 <u>Miscellaneous Information</u>

This miscellaneous information includes details of the measured bandedge and the test procedure.

### 8.1 Bandedge Plot

For electronic filing, the plot shows the fundamental emission when modulated is saved with filename: be.pdf. From the plot, the field strength of any emissions outside of the specified frequency band are attenuated to the general radiated emission limits in section 15.209. It fulfils the requirement of 15.249(d).

#### **Peak Measurement**

Bandedge compliance is determined by applying marker-delta method, i.e (Bandedge Plot).

### (i) Lower channel 2402.000MHz:

Peak Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (peak value) - delta from the bandedge plot

=  $99.8 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m-}46.1 \text{ dB}$ =  $53.7 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m}$ 

Average Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (Average value) – delta from the bandedge plot

=  $76.7 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m-}46.1 \text{ dB}$ =  $30.6 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m}$ 

# (ii) Upper channel 2480.000MHz:

Peak Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (peak value) - delta from the bandedge plot

=  $100.1 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m-46.4 dB}$ =  $53.7 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m}$ 

Average Resultant field strength = Fundamental emissions (Average value) – delta from the bandedge plot

 $= 77.0 \text{ dB}\mu\text{V/m-46.4 dB}$ 

 $= 30.6 dB\mu V/m$ 

The resultant field strength meets the general radiated emission limit in section 15.209, which does not exceed 74dB $\mu$ V/m (Peak Limit) and 54dB $\mu$ V/m (Average Limit).

# 8.1 Bandedge Plot (cont'd)

Pursuant to FCC part 15 Section 15.215(c), the 20dB bandwidth of the emission was contained within the frequency band designated (mentioned as above) which the EUT operated. The effects, if any, from frequency sweeping, frequency hopping, other modulation techniques and frequency stability over excepted variations in temperature and supply voltage were considered.

### 8.2 Discussion of Pulse Desensitization

Pulse desensitivity is not applicable for this device. The effective period ( $T_{eff}$ ) is approximately 358.6µs for a digital "1" bit, as shown in the plots of Exhibit 8.3. With a resolution bandwidth (3 dB) of 100 kHz, the pulse desensitivity factor was 0 dB.

### 8.3 Calculation of Average Factor

Averaging factor in  $dB = 20 \log (duty \text{ cycle})$ 

The specification for output field strengths in accordance with the FCC rules specify measurements with an average detector. During testing, a spectrum analyzer incorporating a peak detector was used. Therefore, a reduction factor can be applied to the resultant peak signal level and compared to the limit for measurement instrumentation incorporating an average detector.

The time period over which the duty cycle is measured is 100 milliseconds, or the repetition cycle, whichever is a shorter time frame. The worst case (highest percentage on) duty cycle is used for the calculation. The duty cycle is measured by placing the spectrum analyzer in zero scan (receiver mode) and linear mode at maximum bandwidth (3 MHz at 3 dB down) and viewing the resulting time domain signal output from the analyzer on a Tektronix oscilloscope. The oscilloscope is used because of its superior time base and triggering facilities.

A plot of the worst-case duty cycle as detected in this manner are saved with filename: af.pdf

The duty cycle is simply the on-time divided by the period:

The duration of one cycle = 10.2609ms Effective period of the cycle = 358.6µs x 2 = 0.7172ms

DC = 0.7172 ms / 10.2609 ms = 0.0699 or 6.99%

Therefore, the averaging factor is found by  $20 \log_{10} 0.0699 = -23.1 dB$ 

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#### 8.4 Emissions Test Procedures

The following is a description of the test procedure used by Intertek Testing Services in the measurements of transmitters operating under Part 15, Subpart C rules.

The test set-up and procedures described below are designed to meet the requirements of ANSI C63.10 - 2013.

The transmitting equipment under test (EUT) is placed on a styrene turntable which is four feet in diameter and approximately 0.8 meter up to 1GHz and 1.5 meter above 1GHz in height above the ground plane. During the radiated emissions test, the turntable is rotated and any cables leaving the EUT are manipulated to find the configuration resulting in maximum emissions. The EUT is adjusted through all three orthogonal axes to obtain maximum emission levels. The antenna height and polarization are varied during the testing to search for maximum signal levels.

Detector function for radiated emissions is in peak mode. Average readings, when required, are taken by measuring the duty cycle of the equipment under test and subtracting the corresponding amount in dB from the measured peak readings. A detailed description for the calculation of the average factor can be found in Exhibit 8.3.

The frequency range scanned is from the lowest radio frequency signal generated in the device which is greater than 9 kHz to the tenth harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or 40 GHz, whichever is lower.

### 8.4 Emissions Test Procedures (cont'd)

The EUT is warmed up for 15 minutes prior to the test.

AC power to the unit is varied from 85% to 115% nominal and variation in the fundamental emission field strength is recorded. If battery powered, a new, fully charged battery is used.

Conducted measurements are made as described in ANSI C63.10 - 2013.

The IF bandwidth used for measurement of radiated signal strength was 10 kHz for emission below 30 MHz and 120 kHz for emission from 30 MHz to 1000 MHz. Where pulsed transmissions of short enough pulse duration warrant, a greater bandwidth is selected according to the recommendations of Hewlett Packard Application Note 150-2. A discussion of whether pulse desensitivity is applicable to this unit is included in this report (See Exhibit 8.2). Above 1000 MHz, a resolution bandwidth of 1 MHz is used, RBW 3MHz used for fundamental emission.

Transmitter measurements are normally conducted at a measurement distance of three meters. However, to assure low enough noise floor in the restricted bands and above 1 GHz, signals are acquired at a distance of one meter or less. All measurements are extrapolated to three meters using inverse scaling, but those measurements taken at a closer distance are so marked.
