



# Amulet Remote Product Guide

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## Getting started with your Amulet remote

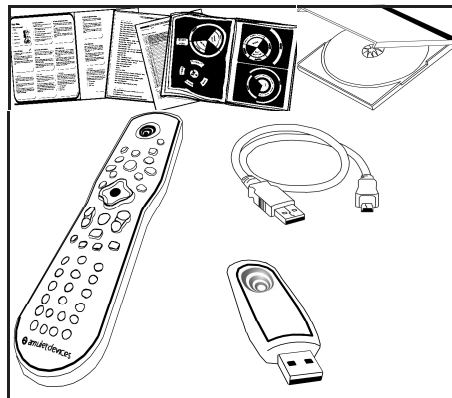
*This chapter will introduce your Amulet remote and allow you to get going straight-away.*

### Installing your Amulet Voice Remote.

You will find an Installation Guide and Getting Started guide in the shipping box. The details within the Installation guide and quick start guides are reiterated here for reference. If you have already installed and run through the getting started guide you may want to skip this section of the guide.

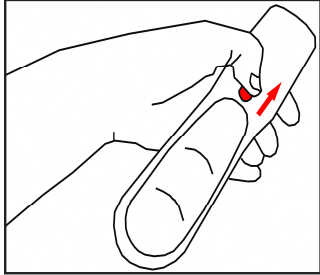

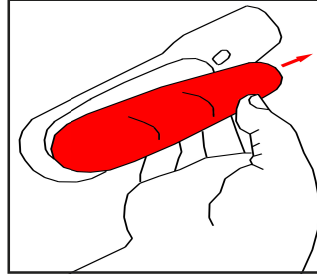

## 2a. Putting in the battery

The rechargeable battery for your remote has been removed for shipping. To insert the battery:



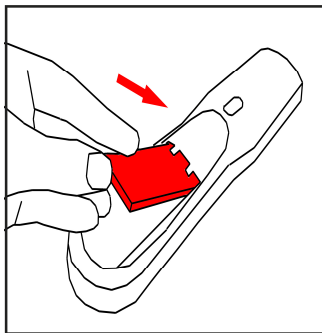
Hold the remote with the battery cover facing down. Slide the release clip towards the top to release the cover.



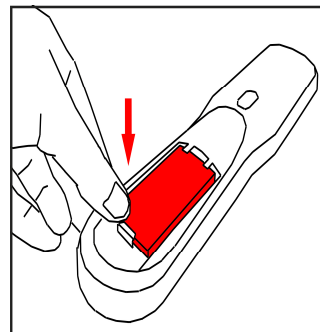
The battery cover falls downwards and can then be removed.

## 2b. Putting in the battery

Insert the battery with the metal contacts face down and facing the top of the remote.



Push down on the back of the battery to clip it in place. Replace the cover.

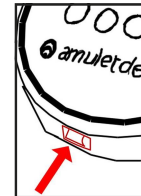


### 3. Putting the Remote On Charge

The battery shipped with the remote is partially charged so that you can use your remote right away.

#### Note:

While not necessary, if you want to charge your remote before use, remove the rubber cover on the bottom end and plug the small end of the charging cable into the connector. Plug the other end of the cable into any spare USB port on your Media Center. A **FLASHING GREEN** logo at the top of the remote means that it is charging. The logo changes to **SOLID GREEN** when fully charged.

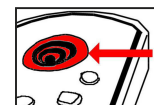


### 4. Link the Media Center to the Remote

To allow you to use voice commands, the remote is linked to the Media Center through the USB dongle. The dongle can be plugged into any free USB port. When you plug in the dongle it will be recognised as a new audio device. There is no need to install drivers in advance.

You can check the connection between the remote and the USB dongle by tilting the remote vertically as if speaking into a microphone. When the link is active the logo will go solid red and the USB dongle will display a solid light.

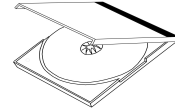

### 5a. Install the Software

To allow spoken commands to be recognised within Windows Media Center you must install the software from the CD. Before installing the CD close Windows Media Center if it is running. To begin installing the software, insert the CD.

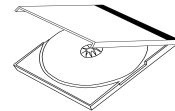
The CD will automatically start and prompt you to run Setup. Click on the Setup icon to begin installation. If this does not happen run Setup.exe from the CD. The software supports both 32-bit and 64-bit versions of Windows; Setup will select the correct version. If you see a requester asking if you want to allow the software to make changes to your computer, click Yes.



### 5b. Install the Software

After installation is finished, a demonstration video plays to show you some of the ways you can use your Voice Remote. While the video is playing, Amulet performs a quick initial scan of your media. (A full scan continues in the background, and may take up to an hour to complete.)

When the video is over, Media Center will restart. Soon afterwards, you will hear the message "Welcome to Amulet". This means Amulet is ready to respond to your voice commands.





## First Switch On

In normal use, the Amulet Voice Remote behaves like a standard remote. When you lift it up to your mouth to speak into it, however, the microphone turns on, indicated by the logo at the top of the remote lighting solid red. If you move beyond the range of the remote's ability to transmit voice commands, the logo shows Flashing Red when elevated. You will then need to move closer to the Media Center.

If you lift up your remote to speak into it and the logo lights up, you can talk to the Media Center. When you are finished speaking commands, simply lower the remote.

When Media Center starts, the Amulet software loads automatically. Once you hear the "Welcome to Amulet" voice prompt, Amulet is ready and waiting for your commands.

A useful speech command to check that everything is working correctly is: "**WHAT TIME IS IT?**". If you hear a spoken response, then everything is working correctly. The installation video will have given you some insight into the use of your Voice Remote.

Remember that while the Amulet remote allows you to do most things via voice, the remote is designed to allow you to do things via voice or the buttons on the remote. Some things such as volume adjustment may feel more natural to do via the buttons but can also be done via voice. Other things such as selecting an artist or TV channel are natural operations for the power of voice.

### Tips for using the remote

- Wait until the logo lights solid red before speaking.
- Hold the remote 6-8 inches from your mouth.
- Lower the remote between commands.
- Speak clearly and distinctly to allow the software to learn your voice.
- Watch the microphone level displayed on Amulet screens to ensure you are being heard.
- Use the recognition indicator on Amulet screens to confirm that your commands are recognized with 70%+ confidence.
- If you make a mistake, pause before trying again to allow the software to recognize a new command.

### *User Guide*

This User Guide is designed as a drop-in guide for guidance on complex operations that are not covered elsewhere. If you need to do something just look it up in the contents page and go to the step by step instructions for that operation. This guide also provides help in setting up your system to get the best from your Amulet Remote. Finally, if you get into difficulty, this guide is the place to come for troubleshooting advice.

### *Quick Reference Cards*

The quick reference cards included in the box will help you get started. Keep these handy to try out some commands.

### *Video guides*

You can access the Amulet user interface pages using the **Amulet menu strip** available on the Media Center start page. Introductory videos demonstrating how to use the software are located under **Help Videos** on the Amulet menu strip. The following Videos are available:

### *On-Line Help*

While using the system you can always ask for help to get a set of commands to try. The on-line help provides both general command listings and media specific commands.

### *What you will not find in this guide.*

The guide does not provide a detailed explanation of all areas of Windows Media Center but rather provides key information to allow the efficient operation of Windows Media Center using your voice.

The keystroke sequences used to achieve operations within Windows Media Center are not cover. For these sequences refer to your Windows Media Center Documentation.

*Where should you start if you want to understand it all?*

It is recommended that you read the **Common Commands** section first to be familiar with these before looking at particular media types. You can also read in sequence if you want to be familiar with all operations before starting. If something is not doing what you expect, check the troubleshooting topics.

*What are all the red bits?*

The command descriptions within the guide have the following syntax:

Curved **()** brackets around a set of words means that only one of these can be said following a command word

Square **[]** brackets around a word or words means that the words are optional

Curly **{ }** brackets around a set of words indicates that the enclosed words should be substituted by an appropriate phrase, such as **"Black Eyed Peas"**, to make a selection

*What can I say and when?*

Within the guide commands are grouped by Media type. This is for ease of understanding. In general all commands can be spoken at all times. For example, you do not need to be in the music screen before you can select an artist. Similarly, you do not need to be in the Recorded TV screen to select a TV program. You can speak commands at any time.

## Working with media

*This chapter will explain how to access and control each of the key media elements of the system.*

## Common commands

The following commands are common to all areas.

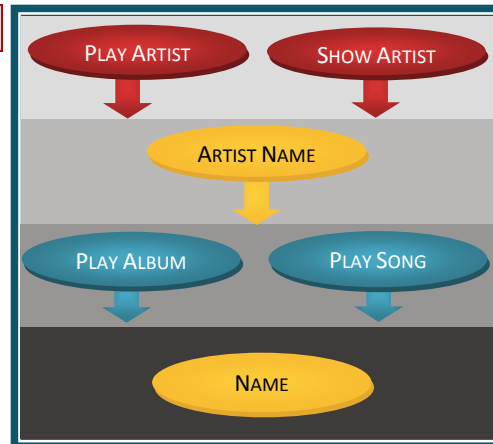

## Playing Music

To get an overview of how Amulet allows you to work with music watch the Video “Music Help” from the help video icon on the Amulet Strip in Windows Media Center.

To see your music collections just say:

**GO TO MUSIC**



## Artists, Albums & Songs

The screen shows a view of your music collection, to remind you of albums you may not have heard in a while. To play a particular artist, just say the name of the artist you want to listen to.

### ARTIST

PLAY ARTIST **{artist}**  
PLAY ARTIST **{artist number}**

### DESCRIPTION

Begins playing music by the selected artist. Loads the selected Artist’s albums and songs for selection. Selection can be made either by the artist name or the associated number.

#### **artist**

The name of an artist or band stored in your music library. By default, band names which begin with the word ‘The’ may be spoken with our without using ‘The’. For example, “Play Artist Beatles” and “Play Artist The Beatles” will both work. The ‘ProcessThe’ setting turns this on and off.

#### **ARTIST NUMBER**

The number of a musical artist in your music library, using the numbering scheme displayed by the command Show Artists.

#### **EXAMPLES**

PLAY ARTIST **Crowded House**

SHOW ARTIST **{ARTIST NAME}**  
SHOW ARTIST **{NUMBER}**

Displays albums and songs by the selected artist so that they can be selected for play.

PLAY SOMEONE ELSE  
SHOW ANOTHER ARTIST

Begins play of music by a randomly selected artist. Loads the selected artist's albums and songs for selection. Selection can be made either by the artist name or the associated number.

SHOW SOMEONE ELSE

Loads the selected artist's albums and songs for selection. Selection can be made either by the artist name or the associated number.

SHOW / HIDE ARTISTS

Show or hide song name display. This display automatically appears when an Album is selected.

## ALBUM

## DESCRIPTION

PLAY ALBUM {ALBUM}  
PLAY ALBUM {ALBUM NUMBER }

Loads the selected Album and displays the song list for the album.

### ALBUM

The name of an album in your music library by the most recently selected musical artist or band. For example, in order to listen to Voodoo Lounge by the Rolling Stones, you first select the artist with "Play Artist Rolling Stones" and then select the album, "Play Album Voodoo Lounge". When the Recognize Partial Song & Album Names setting is enabled, saying only part of the album name is enough to select it.

### ALBUM NUMBER

The number of an album in your music library by the most recently selected musical artist or band. Album numbers are displayed in the album strip on the right-hand edge of the Amulet Music page.

### EXAMPLES

**PLAY ALBUM CROWDED HOUSE**

**PLAY ALBUM NUMBER 2**

SHOW ALBUM {ALBUM NAME}  
SHOW ALBUM {NUMBER}

Displays songs by the selected artist so that they can be selected for play.

### EXAMPLES

**SHOW ALBUM CROWDED HOUSE**

**SHOW ALBUM NUMBER 2**

PLAY ANOTHER ALBUM

Begins play of another randomly selected song by the active artist.

**SONG**

PLAY SONG {SONG NAME}  
 PLAY SONG NUMBER {SONG NUMBER}

**DESCRIPTION**

Plays the selected Song by the currently displayed artist.

**SONG**

The name of a song in your music library by the most recently selected musical artist or band. For example, in order to listen to Beautiful Day by U2, you first select the artist with “Play Artist U2” and then select the song, “Play Song Beautiful Day”. When the Recognize Partial Song & Album Names setting is enabled, saying only part of the song name is enough to select it.

**SONG\_NUM**

The number of a song in your music library by the most recently selected musical artist or band. Song numbers are shown in the song window on the Amulet Music Page, displayed when you say “Show Songs”.

**EXAMPLES**

**PLAY SONG SOMETHING SO STRONG**

**PLAY SONG NUMBER 6**

SHOW SONG {SONG NAME}  
 SHOW SONG {SONG NUMBER}

Displays a song by the selected artist.

Plays the selected Genre.

### GENRE NAME

The name of a musical genre in your music library, used to categorize music by type.

### GENRE\_NUM

The number of a musical genre in your music library, using the numbering scheme displayed by the command **Show Genres**.

SHOW GENRE { **GENRE NAME** }  
SHOW GENRE { **GENRE NUMBER** }  
SHOW SOME { **GENRE NAME** }

Show the song list for the selected Genre.

SHOW / HIDE GENRES

Show or hide genre name list.

## FAVOURITES

SHOW FAVOURITES

## DESCRIPTION

Show the favourites song list based on your selected start ratings.

PLAY FAVOURITES

Start playing songs from your favourites List the favourites song list based on your selected start ratings.

### STAR\_RATING

A musical star rating of the form 1-5 stars, or 0 stars, or no stars or unrated. For example, "1 star" and "5 stars" are both valid star ratings, as is "no stars".

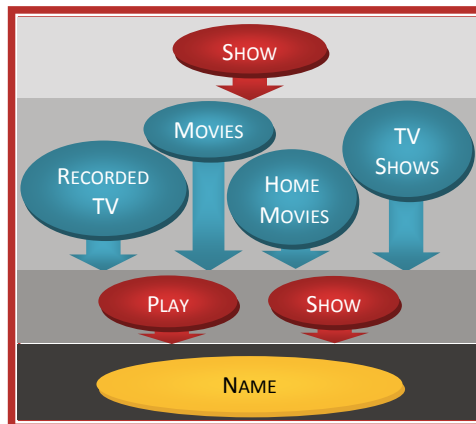
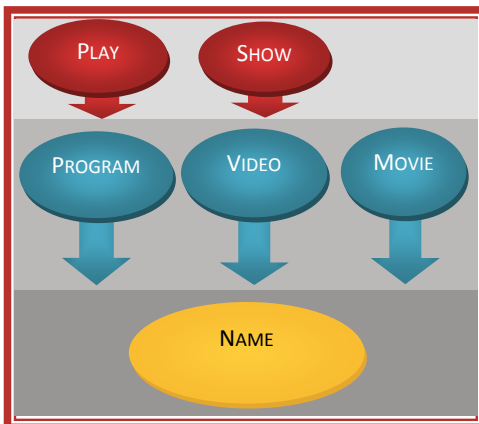

{POSITION} IS A TIME POSITION WITHIN A MOVIE OR PIECE OF MUSIC. THIS CAN BE IN SECONDS, MINUTES AND SECONDS, OR HOURS, MINUTES AND SECONDS.



## Troubleshooting

*This chapter will explain how to overcome typical issues you may experience.*

### What to do if Amulet does not respond to commands correctly.

The Amulet Remote is designed to recognize 98% of people at installation time. If you experience issues with Amulet recognizing your particular voice then there are several things you can do. The Amulet program group gives you access to the relevant tools. Select Start Menu->All Programs->Amulet Devices ->Speech Setup. This gives access to three tools which should be used in the following order:

#### Audio Output settings

This option allows you to confirm that the recording levels are correct to get good voice recognition.

If you select this option you will see a tabbed display for the playback and recording devices on the system. Select recording devices and speak into the amulet remote. Check that the green level meter fills a significant part of the slider. If this is not the case you will need to run the setup wizard again to reset the recording level. Try speaking more quietly during the setup to allow your system to boost recording levels.

#### Sound Recorder

This option allows you to confirm that there are no external interference sources interfering with voice recognition.

If you select this option you will invoke the Microsoft voice recorder. Start the recorder and speak several commands. Stop the recording, saving the recorded speech to your desktop or another convenient place. Now replay this recording to confirm there are no distortions in the playback. If the recording is distorted try to identify interference sources close to the media center and re-run the setup wizard to reset the remote's input levels to remove this distortion.

#### Speech Training

This option allows you to do training of the voice recognition software to better operate with your voice.



The voice recognition software can operate in learning mode to learn your voice as you use the system or remain in a multiple voice mode to allow it to be used by many users. When you select this option you will be able to train the voice recognition software to better recognize your voice. Create a new profile to allow you to return to the base profile later. Click on “Train Profile” to train the system to your voice. You should not need to train more than once. A second training session can be done if desired. If you have completed the steps above and are still having problems please mail [support@amuletdevices.com](mailto:support@amuletdevices.com).

## Troubleshooting Installation

### Logo not lighting up at all

Check the battery installation and place the remote on charge. See the installation section of this document and the Amulet Remote Hardware video for guidance.

### Microphone Level not going up when Speaking

Check that the Amulet Voice Remote is the default audio input device. Restart Media Center after this is corrected.

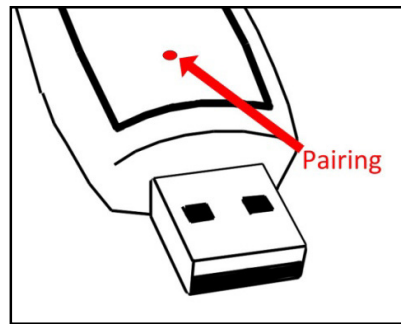
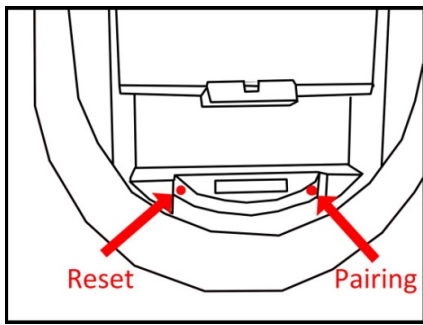
### Logo flashing red while tilted

Move the remote close to the USB dongle. Check that a solid or flashing blue LED can be seen on the dongle. If not, plug the dongle into a different USB port. If the dongle light remains flashing blue when the remote's logo is flashing red, try recharging your remote. If the problem persists, check out the PAIRING section below.

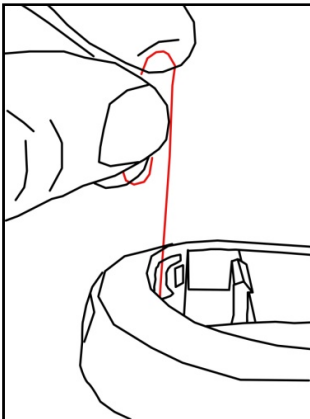
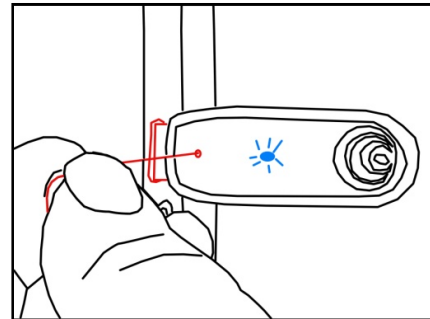
## Re-pairing the remote to the USB dongle.

During the manufacture process a particular USB Dongle is linked to a particular Voice Remote. In the unlikely event that the link established between the USB Dongle and the Voice Remote is broken or you need to pair to a new USB Dongle please follow the following procedure.

To complete this procedure you will need a paper clip or similar thin piece of metal to reach the pairing buttons on the USB dongle and Voice Remote. The diagrams below show the locations of the pairing buttons on the USB Dongle and the Voice Remote. To access the pairing button on the voice remote you will need to remove the battery compartment cover. Follow the instruction in section to do this. If you are having difficulties watch the [Amulet Remote Hardware](#) video to see this done.



Place the USB Dongle in pairing mode. This is done by slotting the USB Dongle into the Media Center and then pushing and holding the pairing button on the USB dongle, until it starts to flash rapidly. At this point remove the paper clip. The USB Dongle is now ready to receive the pairing request from the Voice Remote.



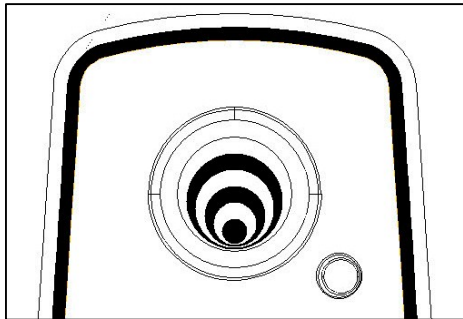
To get the Voice Remote to issue the pairing request you must push the pairing button on the remote until the light on the USB goes solid. At this point the USB dongle and Voice Remote have been paired.

You can now retry the operation you have an issue with previously.

## All the Buttons Explained.

*This chapter will explain what all the Buttons do and how you can control stuff beyond your Media Center.*

### The Amulet Logo



The circular logo at the top of the Amulet remote lights in different colors, to show what the remote is doing:

RED	
ON	Microphone on, listening for speech commands
FLASHING	Unable to establish wireless microphone link: check USB dongle is plugged in, and remote hasn't moved out of range

GREEN	
ON	Remote is plugged in to USB socket and fully charged
FLASHING (SLOW)	Remote is plugged in to USB socket and currently charging

## Media Center Buttons

This conceptual remote control represents the required set of functionality that must be provided by the Windows Media Center remote control. OEM partners can add additional functionality; however, this functionality must not interfere with or displace the required functionality.

The Windows Media Center remote can be separated into the functional areas described in the following list. The buttons in each functional area on the remote control should remain clustered together in the final remote control design because the buttons provide related functionality in terms of how the user interacts with and controls Windows Media Center. Microsoft will provide localized text for the remote control. These text strings must be used to maintain consistency between the program's user interface text and the remote control.

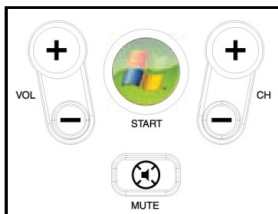
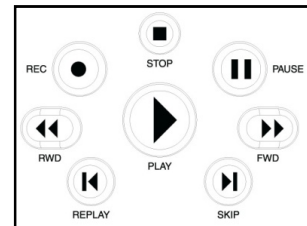


### *Navigation controls.*

The navigation controls form the main interaction point with the user interface. These controls enable the user to control Windows Media Center easily. This interface is based on a focus point that can be moved around the screen to perform a function or task in Windows Media Center. This “tab interface” lets the user to navigate through the user interface when they are sitting farther away from their display (compared to where they are sitting in a typical computer scenario).

### *Transport controls.*

The transport controls are used to manage and play digital media content in Windows Media Center. This includes playing digital audio and video files and streams, playing and recording TV, playing CDs and DVDs, and playing slide shows. All buttons in the transport control cluster must be grouped together on the remote control, and additional buttons cannot be placed in the middle of the cluster of transport control buttons.



### *Audio and video controls.*

The audio and video (A/V) controls enable the user to do tasks such as adjust the volume and change channels. The Standby button is included in this functional group even though the button is placed on a different part of the remote control (to prevent the user from accidentally pressing the button when using the remote control).

*Sleep Toggle*

This button performs the action the user has configured for the Windows Sleep button.



Typically, that action puts the Windows Media Center computer into standby or sleep mode if the computer is running. If the computer is in sleep mode, the computer wakes from sleep mode.

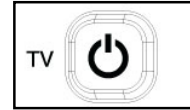
*Numeric keypad.*

The numeric keypad is used to enter numbers in Windows Media Center.

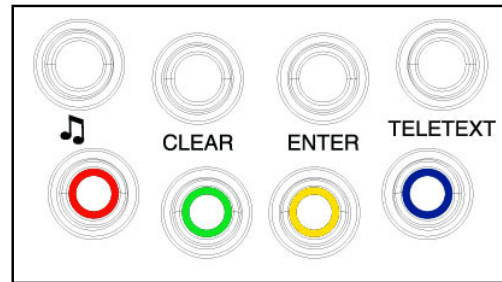

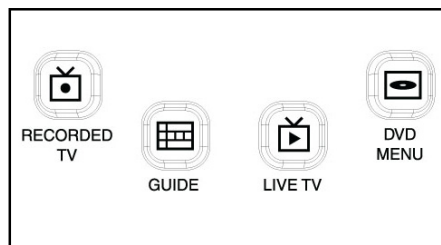
*Interactive TV buttons.*

The Interactive TV buttons are dedicated to starting and navigating TV experiences such as Teletext or Broadcast Markup Language (BML).



*Short Cut buttons.*

Media Center shortcut buttons allow you to quickly go to an experience—such as to play or record TV, display the Guide, or play a DVD—by pressing a single button.

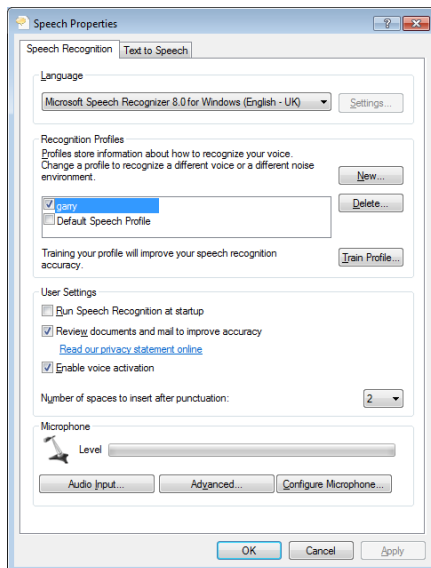
## Working with Multiple speakers.

*This chapter will explain how to use Voice profiles to support multiple speakers with your Amulet Voice remote.*

The Amulet Remote is designed to recognize 98% of people at installation time. It uses a learning algorithm to learn your voice as you use it. If several people with very different voices will be using your Amulet Remote you should consider the use of voice profiles to improve each individuals experience rather than using the same profile for everyone.

Speech profiles allow multiple speakers to be supported. Watch the video “[Speech Profile Help](#)” to see how to use and setup voice profiles. At installation a single “Default” profile is created but additional profiles can be created and.

Once setup, Speech profiles can be selected via voice or if the individuals using the remote are too diverse via the Profile Button on the Remote. When the Profile Button is pressed, the name of the current profile is spoken. Each subsequent button press will select an alternative profile.



To setup a voice profile you will need to access the speech properties page. The simplest way to get there is to use Amulet. Simply say, “**GOTO PROFILE EDITOR**” The Amulet program group also gives you access to this.

Use the “new “ to create a new profile with your name associated with it. You may want to run the configure microphone after you have created your profile as this will associate a particular microphone level with your profile.

While not necessary you can take this opportunity to run a traing session for your profile. One you are finished close the dialog and return to media center. Ask Amulet who it is listening too to activate your

profile.

You are now ready to use your profile and use amulet commands and the profile to move between profiles.

## *The Voice Profile Button and Voice Profile Commands*

When the Profile Button is pressed, the current profile is identified as "THIS IS <speaker>" while newly loaded profiles are just referred to as "<speaker>".

If you want to know what profile is active simply ask Amulet :

WHO IS THIS? or WHO ARE YOU LISTENING TO?

If you want to know what profiles are available simply ask Amulet :

WHAT PROFILES DO I HAVE? or WHAT PROFILES CAN I SAY?

To select a profile say :

THIS IS <PROFILENAME> or SELECT PROFILE <PROFILENAME>

Details of the other variants of these commands are described in the commands section.

## Optimizing your Media setup

*This chapter will give some guidance and tips on how best to setup your Media to allow voice selection.*

One of the critical elements in getting the best from your Voice Remote is to arrange your media to make it available for voice selection. Amulet identifies three forms of video files:

- DVDs (stored in VIDEO\_TS folders on the hard drive)
- Videos (stored in .avi, .mkv, .wmv, and other files)
- Recorded TV programs (stored in .dvr\_ms or .wtv files)

Amulet uses a combination of filename, foldername, embedded metadata and online databases to determine where each video file should be grouped in the Amulet media hierarchy, and what is the most appropriate spoken vocabulary name to use. Generally, an item's title is used as its vocabulary name, though for episodes, both the series title and episode title are recognised.

### *Movies:*

- Anything recorded from TV, where the TV guide metadata says its a movie
- Any video files or DVD folders where the filename gives a successful result at TheMovieDB.org
- Movies grouped according to genre, as reported by TheMovieDB.org

### *TV Series:*

- Anything recorded from TV which is marked as episodic in the TV guide
- Any video filenames containing the phrase S##E##, e.g. S03E12
- Any video filenames containing the phrase #x##, e.g. 3x12
- Series name for qualifying video filenames is taken as the parent folder name
- If series name present on TheTVDB.com, then additional metadata for episodes is downloaded

### *TV Programs:*

- Anything recorded off TV
- Programs are grouped according to episode, and by title
- Additional metadata fetched from TheTVDB.com

### *DVDs:*

- Any DVD contained inside a VIDEO\_TS sub-folder

## COMMAND REFERENCE

- DVD title is taken from the parent name folder, or from a dvdid.xml file if present
- Additional metadata is downloaded from TheMovieDB.org

### *Home Movies:*

- Any video filename of the form abcd#### (e.g. DSCF1234.AVI)
- Any video filename of the form MOV##### (e.g. MOV00123.AVI)
- Any video stored using motion JPEG compression internally
- Videos are grouped according to parent folder name

### *Unsorted:*

- All other videos or DVD
- Videos are grouped according to parent folder name

## Controlling other bits of equipment

*This chapter will explain how to program your remote to control other bits of equipment.*

The Amulet Voice Remote is a learning remote. You can teach it IR codes for any of your additional devices.

### Normal Media Center Learning

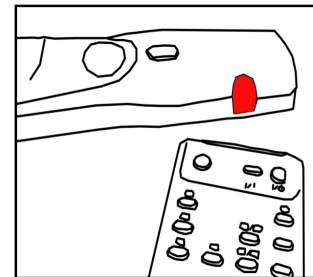
As with other Media Center Remote controls, the TV, VOL +, and VOL – buttons on the remote control for can “learn” IR commands from other remote controls. This allows you to turn on your TV and adjust volume on an audio receiver as well as controlling your media center from a single remote.

#### Notes

- By default, the VOL + and VOL - buttons on the remote control for Media Center PC control the system volume on your computer, and the TV button has no command assigned to it until it “learns” one.
- Do not perform this procedure in bright natural or artificial light.

To program buttons on the remote control by using the learning feature

1. Place the Amulet Voice Remote control with its learning lens, 2 to 3 inches apart from the remote control from which it is learning.
2. On the Amulet Voice Remote, press and hold the DVD MENU and OK buttons at the same. The Logo on the remote will start to flash slow blue to indicate it is in learning mode.
3. On the Amulet Voice Remote, press and release the TV, VOL +, or VOL – button, depending on which command you want it to learn. The Logo on the voice remote will show a solid blue to indicate it is ready to learn.
4. If you delay too long in completing the next step the logo on the Voice remote will flash green and go off to indicate it timed out.
5. Test the button. If the Voice Remote did not learn the command, repeat steps 1 through 3.



To restore the default remote control settings:

1. Press and hold the DVD MENU button and LEFT navigation button at the same time until the Logo on the Voice Remote flashes Blue.

2. Press the OK button twice. The logo on the remote will go a solid Blue for a few seconds and then flash and go off.

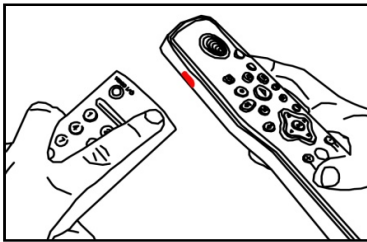
Following this operation, the TV button will have no command assigned to it and the VOL + and VOL – buttons will adjust the Media Center PC system volume.

## Additional Learned Key Combinations

In addition to the standard Media Center programmable buttons the Amulet Voice Remote allows up to 4 remapping schemes for the buttons on the remote to control more devices and more functions.

### *Learn a Key*

OK+DVD -> Enters learning mode. Then press TV/Power, Vol+, Vol-, or MusicNote



immediately to train that button in Media Center mode.

Alternatively, press a coloured button (red, green, yellow, blue) followed by any other button to train that button when the appropriate coloured keymap is selected. Once selected, the LED will flash Cyan; point the slave remote towards the Amulet IR learning window on the side, then press the slave button being taught to the Amulet until the flashing LED goes solid.

### *Remove a Learned Key*

LEFT+DVD -> delete a keymap entry. Press the key to be deleted (possibly with a colour prefix) followed by OK to confirm.

### *Remove all Learned Keys*

The sequence LEFT+DVD / OK / OK will delete all keymap entries.

### *Switching between Key Maps*

(Red, Green, Yellow, Blue) -> Activate one of four custom keymaps. Unprogrammed keys default to their normal Media Center behavior. Press the Green Button to return to the media center key map.

## Special Key Combinations

TV+DVD -> Enter deep sleep (Press Media Center button to exit)

Gesture+DVD -> Type firmware version as <major> \* <minor> to Notepad.
