- EJECT [] button: Eject a disc.
- Ocd-IN indicator: When a disc is inserted, the indicator is illuminated.
- **BRESET** button for system rebooting

If the unit fails to operate properly, press this button with a pen tip or another pointed instrument.

OWER button with VOLUME [VOL] dial: Turn the power on and mute function on/off (press); turn the power off (press and hold); adjust the volume (rotate).

Getting started

- ► Turning on/off the unit
- 1 Press the smart ignition [ENGINE START/STOP] button to turn the unit on.



The drive safety message screen is displayed.



When you turn the unit off, press the **POWER** button or **MODE** button on the steering wheel remote control to turn the unit on.

To turn the power on directly

By inserting a disc, connecting the USB device or pressing the FM/AM, MEDIA, PHONE button (while the USB/AUX/ Bluetooth Phone is connected), you can also turn the power on and the unit plays. 2 Tap the Agree.

The previously selected station is received or the file/track/chapter is played.



3 To turn the unit off, press and hold the **POWER** [^(b)] button or **MODE** button on the steering wheel remote control.



When the unit is turned off, the clock and date are appear on the screen. You can turn the display off. (Refer to page 35: **SETUP** > **Display** > **Picture Frame**) • The unit memorizes the last mode that was last played. The last mode is saved in the memory even if ignition switch is placed in the OFF position. When the ignition switch is placed in the ACC or ON position, the mode is automatically recalled.

► Adjusting the Volume level

 Rotate the VOLUME [VOL] dial or push/full Volume +/- jog on the steering wheel remote control to increase/ decrease the volume level.



The volume level will be shown on the display. (Audio mode: 0 to 35 / Call mode: 0 to 15)

Muting the Sound quickly

1 Press the **POWER** button or **Mute** [\$7] button on the steering wheel remote control to set mute on.

'MUTE' message is displayed.

Rear view camera screen If fitted, a rear view camera displays the area behind the vehicle on the screen when the ignition is in the 'ON' position and reverse gear is selected.



Parking guidelines are displayed on the screen.

- The rear view camera function is in use by product as an aid to keep an eye on trailers, or when backing into tight parking spot. Do not use this function for entertainment purpose.

AVM System (optional)

► About AVM

- If equipped the AVM (Around View Monitoring System) refers to a system that allows you to see the front, rear, left and right sides through the 4 cameras installed within the vehicle.
- The Front AVM will operate automatically when the VIEW [C] button is turned on and the gear shifter is set to N, or D.
- The Rear AVM will operate automatically when the gear shifter is set to R.
- In the Front AVM operating state, If you accelerate to speeds above 20 km/h, the around view screen is turned off and the screen will switch to the previous mode.
- When the trunk, or the door is opened, a warning is displayed in the screen.

- The AVM display is not a substitute for proper and safe backing-up procedures.

- Preset station list: Show the preset station list.
- B ► Now playing: Return to the Now playing screen.
- Auto Store: Automatically store the strong broadcast frequencies.
- Storing/recalling the preset station You can easily store up to 6 preset stations for each band (FM1, FM2, and AM).
- 1 Select the band (FM1, FM2 or AM) and desired frequency you want to store a station into.
- 2 Tap and hold one of the **@** Preset station shortcut or **@** Preset station list on preset list screen.

The selected preset station has been stored in memory.

Repeat step $1 \sim 2$ to preset other stations.

- Note: If you try to store another station using the same preset number, the previously stored station will be erased.
- 3 Next time, if you tap the **2** Preset station shortcut or **2** Preset station list on preset list screen, the station is recalled from the memory.

Precautions for Handling USB/iPod

- When using an external USB device, make sure to keep the device disconnected and connect only sometime after turning on the vehicle ignition. The USB device may be damaged if the USB device is already connected when the ignition is turned on. (USB device is not an electronic automotive component)
- Some USB devices may not operate properly because of compatibility issues. Check that the external device is supported by the device before starting use.
- The device will only recognize USB devices formatted in FAT 16 or FAT 32. (NTFS format is not supported.) When you format the external USB device, this unit may not properly recognize a Byte/Sector selection other than 512 Byte or 2,048 Byte.
- Avoid contact of body parts and foreign substances with the USB connector.
- Repeatedly connecting/disconnecting the USB in a short period of time may cause damage to the device.
- When disconnecting the USB, an abnormal sound may occur occasionally.

Bluetooth wireless technology

Understanding Bluetooth Wireless Technology

The Bluetooth wireless technology establishes a wireless connection between two devices, such as your phone and media center of the car. The first time you use two devices together, you must connect them by establishing pairing via a Pass key. After the initial connection, the two devices can connect automatically.

- ✤ Note
- There may be restrictions on using Bluetooth technology in some locations.
- Because of the variety of Bluetooth devices and their firmware versions, your unit may respond differently when used via Bluetooth.

Bluetooth operation

To use the Bluetooth function, the following procedure is necessary.

1. Pairing

When connecting Bluetooth devices for the first time, mutual registration is required.

This is called "pairing". This registration (pairing) is required only for the first time, as this unit and the other devices will recognize each other automatically from the next time. (Depending on the device, you may need to input a pass code for each connection.) 2. Connection

Sometimes pairing allows automatic connection. To use the device after pairing is made, start the connection.

- Hands-free talk/Music streaming You can call a mobile phone and listen to music when the connection is made.
 - Some Bluetooth devices may not support specific functions.

Getting started with Navigation



► What is GPS?

The Global Positioning System (GPS) is a satellite-based navigation system made up of a network of 24 satellites placed into orbit by the U.S. Department of Defense.

GPS was originally intended for military applications, but in the 1980s, the government made the system available for civilian use.

GPS works in any weather conditions, anywhere in the world, 24 hours a day. There are no subscription fees or setup charges to use GPS.



About satellite signals

Your unit must acquire satellite signals to operate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, the unit cannot acquire satellites.

► Acquiring satellite signals

Before the unit can find your current location and navigate a route, you must do the following steps:

- 1. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions.
- 2. Turn on the unit.

Acquiring satellite signals can take a few minutes.

Initial navigation screen

After the ignition switch is p laced in the ACC or ON position, when you enter a navigation mode for the first time, the caution screen is displayed on the screen. Read the caution carefully and then touch [Agree].



► Cannot identify the current location. (GPS not receiving) GPS cannot be used indoors and must be connected to a power source with ACC in a vehicle in a location where the signal

from the sky can be received easily.

When initially connecting the GPS, it usually takes about 10 minutes to be working normally, but the connection speed can differ depending on the weather condition, and surrounding obstacles.

If the GPS connection is unstable for a long period of time, try the following.

- Check if the product is connected to a power source.
- Check if the back of the GPS product is in a location where the sky can be seen well.
- If there are high buildings or if you are under a tree, move to a location where there aren't any obstacles.

Cannot hear the voice guide.

The volume is not set correctly, or it is turned off. Adjust the volume of voice guidance.

There is a difference between the driving road and the road on the map in the product.

Even though GPS is usually very accurate, there is a small margin for error.

When the GPS receiver is installed, there can be an error of about 10 m. But for newly built roads, the problem could come from the data update to the map.



Getting started with Navigation

Cannot see the map.

Perhaps you cannot see the map even when you have executed the navigation menu.

This happens when the data within the memory is damaged. Delete all the data in the memory and install the data again.

If the issue persists after installation, contact the A/S center.

- ► The path guide can be different from the actual path. (Path guide error)
- When the road is closely parallel.
- When the splitting road angle is very small.
- When there is an adjacent road when turning.
- When driving on a road that is narrowing fast.
- When driving through the mountain or where the road is too curvy.
- When the starting, passing and arriving locations are too close within 1 km.
- When you have set the starting, passing or arriving location more than 1 km away from the road.
- When driving through the tunnel.

► Map matching

As mentioned, the GPS systems used by this Navigation System are susceptible to certain errors. Their calculations may on occasion place you in a location the map where no road exists. In this situation, the processing system understands that vehicles travel only on roads, and is able to correct your position by adjusting it to a nearby road. This is called map matching.

O Driver's temperature control dial

Controls the driver-side temperature.

AUTO button
