


# **Safety Notes:**

The DVD video display of the in-dash unit will not operate while the vehicle is moving. This is a safety feature to prevert driver distraction. In-dash DVD video functions will only operate when vehicle is in Park and the parking brake is engaged. It is illegal in most states for the driver to view video while the vehicle is in motion.

# **WARNING**

Upon installation of this Monitor/DVD player ("unit") into a vehicle, the driver of the vehicle must not operate this unit by watching videos or playing video games while driving. Failure to follow this instruction could lead to driver distraction which could result in serious injury or death to the vehicle's occupants or persons outside the vehicle and/or property damage.

Several states prohibit the installation of monitors/DVD players if the screen is visible from the driver's seat. If you reside in a jurisdiction which has enacted such a law, this unit must not be installed so that the screen is visible from the driver's seat. When installing this unit in the front console/dashboard, the unit must be positioned so that it is facing the front passenger seat only. Failure to follow this instruction could lead to driver distraction which could result in serious injury or death to the vehicle's occupants or persons outsides the vehicle and /or property damage.

This unit is designed so that it may be operated only when the vehicle is in "Park" and the parking brake is fully engaged. When installing this unit, the installer must connect the parking brake detect wire ("Yellow-Blue Lead") to the parking brake mechanism in order to make the parking brake lock-out feature could lead to driver distraction which could result in serious injury or death to the driver's occupants or persons outside the vehicle and/or property damage.

Once the parking brake lock-out feature is installed, the owner/user must not attempt to disrupt/neutralize the parking brake lock-out feature by (a) partially engaging the parking brake and/or (b) purchasing/using any device or unit designed to send necessary brake signals to the unit. Failure to follow these instructions could lead to driver distraction which could result in serious injury or death to the driver's occupants or persons outside the vehicle and/or property damage.

When operating this unit, keep the unit's volume level low enough so that the vehicle's occupants can hear traffic-related sounds such as police and emergency vehicles. # **Safety Information**

#### Please read all instructions carefully before attempting to install or operate.

Due to its technical nature, it is highly recommended that your DUAL XDVDN9131 is installed by a professional installer or an authorized dealer. This product is only for use in vehicles with 12VDC negative ground only.

### To prevent damage or injury:

- Make sure to ground the unit securely to the vehicle chassis ground.
- Do not remove the top or bottom covers of the unit.
- Do not install the unit in a spot exposed to direct sunlight or excessive heat or the possibility of water splashing.
- Do not subject the unit to excessive shock.
- When replacing a fuse, only use a new one with the prescribed rating. Using a fuse with the wrong rating may cause the unit to malfunction.
- To prevent short circuits when replacing a fuse, disconnect the wiring harness first.
- Use only the provided hardware and wire harness.
- You cannot view video while the vehicle is moving. Find a safe place to park and engage the parking brake.
- If your experience problems during installation, consult your nearest DUAL dealer.
- If the unit malfunctions, reset the unit as described on page 11first. If the problem still persists, consult your nearest DUAL dealer or call tech assistance @ 1-866-382-5476.
- To clean the monitor, wipe only with a dry silicone cloth or soft cloth. Do use a stiff cloth, or volatile solvents such as paint thinner and alcohol. They can scratch the surface of the panel and/or remove the printing.
- When extending the ignition, battery or ground cables, make sure to use automotive-grade cables or other cables with an area of 0.75mm (AWG18) or more to prevent voltage drops.
- Do not touch the liquid crystal fluid if the LCD is damaged or broken. The liquid crystal fluid may be hazardous to your health or fatal. If the liquid crystal fluid from the LCD contacts your body or clothing, wash it off with soap immediately.

# **Preventing Accidents**

The video appears only after you park the car and set the parking brake.

When the car is in motion, the video will automatically prompt a "Caution" screen for your safety.

### **DVD Region Management**

Some DVD discs can be played only in certain playback modes according to the intentions of the software. As the unit plays discs according to their intentions, some functions may not work as intended. Please be sure to read the instructions provided with each disc. This player has been designed to play back DVD software that has been encoded for specific region areas. It cannot play back DVD software encoded for other region areas than the region areas for which it has been designed.

# **Preparation**

**IMPORTANT NOTICE**: It is very important that you read the **WARNINGS** and **NOTES** in this manual to ensure correct installation and use of your unit.

# **Tools and Supplies**

- 18 gauge wire for power connections
- 16 18 gauge speaker wire
- · Heat shrink tubing
- · Soldering iron and solder

#### Warning

- 1. Only connect the unit to a 12-volt negative ground system.
- 2. Never install this unit where operation and viewing could interfere with safe driving conditions.
- 3. To reduce the risk of a traffic accident (except when using the backup camera feature) never use the video display function while driving the vehicle. This may be in violation of local laws.
- 4. Never disassemble or adjust the unit without the assistance of a professional. For details, please consult your local car stereo/specialty shop.
- 5. To prevent injury from shock or fire, never expose this unit to moisture or water.
- 6. Never use irregular discs, the only recommended disc size is a 12cm round disc.
- 7. To prevent damage to the mechanism inside this unit, avoid dropping the unit.
- 8. To ensure the touch screen is functioning properly please avoid hard impact to the TFT monitor.
- 9. Do not change the fuse on the power wire without professional guidance. Using an improper fuse may cause damage to the unit and result in a fire.

#### **Disconnecting the Battery**

To prevent a short circuit, turn off the ignition and remove the negative (-) battery cable prior to starting the installation.



# **TFT Monitor Operation**

#### **Rear Camera Mode**

When the vehicle is placed in "Reverse", and a rear camera is connected to the unit, the monitor will automatically switch to the camera input source. Please make sure the reverse wire is connected.

## **Screen Adjustment**

"COLOR" "CONTRAST" and "BRIGHTNESS" can be adjusted.

#### **Screen Adjustment Procedure**

1. Enter the Screen adjustment mode:

Press the PIC button on the remote or go to main menu, then Set-up, then press Screen.

2. Select settings:

Press the ( ) buttons on the remote or on the screen when in Set-up Screen, adjust the selected feature to the desired setting.

3. To Exit do not press any button on the remote for 5 seconds or in Set-up Screen press the top left corner to exit:

## **Parking Brake**

- 1. When the vehicle is stopped and the parking brake is on, the "PARKING Brake" wire must be connected to the parking brake (-) switch in order for the monitor to display video.
- 2. The Parking brake does not apply when using the reverse backup camera feature.
- 3. When the "parking brake" is off, the front monitor will display a "Caution" with blue background, preventing the driver from watching video while driving. This is for your safety and to reduce the risk of a traffic accident.

Please see "INSTALLATION SECTION" for installation on the parking brake wire.



# **Operation Instruction**

#### Power On / Off

Press the **POWER /VOL** button to turn the unit on. You can also turn on the unit by pressing the button (0) on the remote.

Press and hold the **POWER/VOL** button on the front panel or press the **POWER** button (  $\odot$  ) on the remote to power off the unit.

#### **Source Selection**

Press the **MENU** Button on the front panel to change sources: TUNER, DISC, NAVI, CARD, FLASH DRIVE, BT-TEL, F-AUX, R-AUX, SETUP, and STANDBY. The source is displayed on the top left of the screen.

#### **Volume Adjustment**

To increase or decrease the volume level, turn the **POWER/VOL knob** on the front panel or press the **VOL+/ VOL-** buttons on the remote control. The volume ranges from "0" to "40".

## **Equalizer Setting**

The Equalizer Setting allows you to easily adjust your audio system to meet your sound needs. To get the best possible sound quality from your new system, be sure to adjust the settings for the speakers as well.

#### **Accessing the EQ Settings**

Press the (SEL) button on the remote control or at the bottom of the menu the "EQ" icon.

## Selecting an EQ for Adjustment

Press the (**A**/**V**) buttons on the remote or press the **icons on the** front panel once to select an audio setting to be adjusted.

# **Adjusting an Audio Setting**

Press the ( ) buttons on the remote or use the touch screen to adjust the selected feature.

**NOTE**: The Bass and Treble levels are only adjustable when EQ is on "User" mode. The Loudness function increases the sound ranges from low levels to high levels.

# **Exiting the Equalizer Setting**

Touch the return arrow on the top right of the screen.

Press the (SEL) button on the remote control to exit the Equalizer setting.



### **System Reset**

To reset the system in case of a halt or other unusual operation, use the tip of a pen to press the **RESET** button located on the front top-left corner of the unit. After the system resets, the unit will restores the settings before it was last powered off.

#### Mute

The volume can be mute by the following:

- 1. Press the MUTE button ( ) on the remote to mute the volume from the unit.
- 2. Press the **U/VOL** knob on the panel.
- 3. Turning the extstyle extstyle

**NOTE**: Press the **MUTE** button on the remote again to restore the volume. Adjusting the volume or using any of the audio set-up features will cancel the mute function.

#### **Standby**

- 1. On the Main menu press the press the Standby icon.
- 2. In standby mode, the screen is turned off with audio output only.
- 3. In standby mode, touch the screen or press Menu/Navi button to return the screen to normal.

- Press the **MENU** button on the front panel.
- Press the **MENU** button on the remote control.
- •Touch the A area (Top left corner) on the touch-screen.

# Tuner (AM/FM) Operation

**Tuner Display** 



- : Press to turn on or off the volume.
- Press to seek down. Touch and hold for 3 seconds to scan the previous station.
- Press to seek up. Touch and hold for 3 seconds to scan the next station.
- AM: Press to change between FM and AM.
- FM: Press to change between FM and AM.
- Press to activate the DX function
- Press to scan and store all stations in current band automatically.
- : Page down.
- Page up.
- PS: Press to scan the stations in the 12 preset channels in the current band.
- : Press to enter iPod menu.
- : Press to enter USB menu.
- : Press to enter SD menu.
- : Press to enter DISC menu.

#### **Switch to Radio Tuner Source**

Press the "SRC" control to switch to the TUNER source.

## Select AM/FM Band

Touch the AM or FM button on the screen, or press the BAND button (BAND) on the remote control to change between FM and AM.

# **Auto Tuning**

Press the button (>>) on remote control or press and hold the button on the screen to seek up the next available station. Press the button again to stop searching.

Press the button (◄) on the remote control or press and hold the button on the screen to seek down the next available station. Press the button again to stop searching.

## **Manual Tuning**

Press the button on the remote control or press the button on the screen to up the tuning frequency one step at a time.

Press the down the tuning frequency one step at a time.

#### **Using Preset Stations**

12 preset buttons are used to save your favorite stations for each band. First 6 saved stations (P1-P6) for the current band appear on the screen.

You can touch the arrow buttons or under the screen to see the other 6 stations.

# **Saving a Station**

- 1. Select a band (AM/FM), and then select a station.
- 2. Press and hold a present (P1-P40) on the right side of the screen for three seconds. The station will then be saved on the selected preset number.

#### Select a Station

- 1. Select a band (AM/FM).
- 2. Touch a preset from (P1-P6) on the right side of the screen.

## **Auto Store (AS)**

Press the AS button on the screen to automatically scan and save all stations in current band.

# **Program Scan (PS)**

Press the PS button on the screen to scan through the stations in the 12 preset channels in the current band.

Press any button to stop scanning and listen to the selected station.

#### DX

When the Local function is on, only radio stations with a strong signal are found. When the Local function is active, "LOC" appears on the screen.

Press DX to activate the DX function.



# **DVD Player Operation**

**NOTE**: When properly installed, DVD video cannot be displayed on the main screen unless the parking brake is applied. If you attempt to play a DVD while the vehicle is in motion, the screen will display "caution" with a blue background. Rear video output, (if used) will operate normally.

#### **Insert/Eject Disc**

# **Inserting a Disc**

When inserting a DVD disc, DVD mode will be enabled and disc will begin to play.

**NOTE**: If Parental Lock (Rating) is activated and the disc inserted is not authorized, a 4-digit code must be entered or the disc will not play (see "RATING (Parental Lock) Menu").

You cannot insert a disc if there is already a disc in the unit or if the power is off.

NOTE: CD-R/RW, DVD-R/RW, DVD+R/RWs will not play unless the recording session is closed.

## **Ejecting a Disc**

Press the button \_\_\_ on the unit to eject the disc. The unit will automatically revert to Tuner mode at the same time.

# **Reset the Loading Mechanism**

If the disc loads abnormally or does not play properly, press and hold the button  $\triangle$  on the unit to reset the loading mechanism. The disc should ejected and resume to normal operation.

# **Accessing DVD Source**

To switch to DVD source when a disc is already inserted, press the "**SRC**" button on the remote control until the DVD source appears on the top of the screen. On the front panel press Menu and select the "Disc" icon.

# **Controlling Playback**

### Stop Playback

Press the stop button on the screen or press the (BAND) button on the remote control to stop the DVD playback; press the play/pause button on the screen or the (OK) button on the remote control to resume play.

#### Pause Playback

Press the play/pause button on the screen to pause or to resume play.

### **Accessing the DVD Menu**

- 1. You can touch the area E (middle of screen), and then press the MENU area to access the main DVD menu.
- 2. Use the arrow buttons on the remote control to select a title from the menu.
- 3. Press the (TITLE) button on the remote control to select a different title for playback.
