RF Exposure Compliance Requirement

1. Standard Requirement

15.247(b)(4) requirement:

The conducted output power limit specified in paragraph (b) of this section is based on the use of antennas with directional gains that do not exceed 6dBi. Except as shown in paragraph (c) of this section. if transmitting antennas of directional gain greater than 6dBi are used. the conducted output power from the intentional radiator shall be reduced below the stated values in paragraphs (b)(1). (b)(2). and (b)(3) of this section. as appropriate. by the amount in dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6dBi.

2. Limits

Approximate SAR Test Exclusion Power Thresholds at Selected Frequencies and Test Separation Distances are illustrated in the following Table.

<u>Note</u>: 10-g Extremity SAR Test Exclusion Power Thresholds are 2.5 times higher than the 1-g SAR Test Exclusion Thresholds indicated above. These thresholds do not apply, by extrapolation or other means, to occupational exposure limits.

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3. EUT RF Exposure

The Max Peak Output Power is 1.82dBm(1.52mW) in Low channel, According to the formula. calculate the EIRP test result: EIRP = 1.52mW ① SAR requirement: Limit = 10mW @ 5mm ② ; ① < ②. So the SAR report is not required.
