



### 13. Radio Frequency Exposure

#### 13.1 Applicable Standards

The measurements shown in this test report were made in accordance with the procedures given in FCC Part 2 (Section 2.1093)

**LIMIT**

KDB 447498 D01 § 4.3(a)

For 100 MHz to 6 GHz and test separation distances ≤ 50 mm, the 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds are determined by the following:

$[(\text{max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW}) / (\text{min. test separation distance, mm})] \cdot [\sqrt{f(\text{GHz})}] \leq 3.0$  for 1-g SAR, and  $\leq 7.5$  for 10-g extremity SAR, where

\*f(GHz) is the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz

\* Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation

\*The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison

\*The values 3.0 and 7.5 are referred to as numeric thresholds in step b) below

The test exclusions are applicable only when the minimum test separation distance is ≤ 50 mm, and for transmission frequencies between 100 MHz and 6 GHz. When the minimum test separation distance is < 5 mm, a distance of 5 mm according to 4.1 f) is applied to determine SAR test exclusion

**Remark:**

1. The maximum output power is 4.47 dBm (2.799mW) at 2441MHz (with 0.9dBi antenna gain.)
2. DTS device is not subject to routine RF evaluation; MPE estimate is used to justify the compliance.
3. For mobile or fixed location transmitters, no SAR consideration applied.



13.3 TEST RESULTS

According to the KDB447498:

The SAR test exclusion thresholds Level:

[(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW) / (min. test separation distance, mm)] \* sqrt (freq. in GHz) < 3

Calculation

Table with 7 columns: Modulation Mode, Channel Frequency (MHz), Max. Conducted output power (dBm), Max. Tune up power (dBm), Max. Tune up power (mW), Distance (mm), SAR test exclusion thresholds (mW). Rows include GFSK, π/4-DQPSK, and 8DPSK.

Since the source-based time-averaging conducted output power is well below the SAR low threshold level, so the EUT is considered to comply with SAR requirement without testing
