2. System Test Configuration

2.1 EUT Configuration

The EUT configuration for testing is installed on RF field strength measurement to meet the Commissions requirement and operating in a manner which intends to maximize its emission characteristics in a continuous normal application.

2.2 EUT Exercise

The Transmitter was operated in the normal operating mode. the Tx frequency was fixed which was for the purpose of the measurements.

2.3 Test Procedure

2.3.1 Conducted Emissions

The EUT is a placed on as turn table which is 0.8 m above ground plane. According to the requirements in Section 13.1.4.1 of ANSI C63.4-2009.Conducted emissions from the EUT measured in the frequency range between 0.15 MHz and 30MHz using CISPR Quasi-Peak and average detector mode.

2.3.2 Radiated Emissions

The EUT is a placed on as turn table which is 0.8 m above ground plane. The turn table shall rotate 360 degrees to determine the position of maximum emission level. EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna which varied from 1m to 4m to find out the highest emission. And also, each emission was to be maximized by changing the polarization of receiving antenna both horizontal and vertical. In order to find out the max. emission, the relative positions of this hand-held transmitter(EUT) was rotated through three orthogonal axes according to the requirements in Section 13.1.4.1 of ANSI C63.4-2009.

After sirfdemo330R1 send the command to EUT, it can be removed, and the EUT keep hopping. 79 Channels are provided by EUT. The 3 channels of lower, medium and higher were chosen for test.






(A) Radiated Emission Test Set-Up, Frequency Below 30MHz

- b. Turn on the EUT and connect it to measurement instrument. Then set it to any one convenient frequency within its operating range. Set a reference level on the measuring instrument equal to the highest peak value.
- c. The center frequency of the spectrum analyzer is set to the fundamental frequency and using proper RBW and VBW setting.
- d. Measure the captured power within the band and recording the plot.
- e. Repeat above procedures until all frequencies required were complete.



The EUT'S antenna is met the requirement of FCC part 15C section 15.203 and 15.240.

FCC part 15C section 15.247 requirements:

Systems operating in the 2402-2480MHz band that are used exclusively for fixed, point-to-point operations may employ transmitting antennas with directional gain greater than 6dBi provided the maximum peak output power of the intentional radiator is reduced by 1dB for every 3dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6dBi.

12.2. Result

The EUT's antenna used a chip antenna and integrated on PCB, The antenna's gain is 1.87dBi and meets the requirement.
