

## 4. CALIBRATION AND UNCERTAINTY

#### 4.1. MEASURING INSTRUMENT CALIBRATION

The measuring equipment utilized to perform the tests documented in this report has been calibrated in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, and is traceable to recognized national standards.

## 4.2. SAMPLE CALCULATION

Where relevant, the following sample calculation is provided:

Field Strength (dBuV/m) = Measured Voltage (dBuV) + Antenna Factor (dB/m) + Cable Loss (dB) – Preamp Gain (dB) 36.5 dBuV + 18.7 dB/m + 0.6 dB – 26.9 dB = 28.9 dBuV/m

#### 4.3. MEASUREMENT UNCERTAINTY

Where relevant, the following measurement uncertainty levels have been estimated for tests performed on the apparatus:

Uncertainty figures are valid to a confidence level of 95%.

## 5. EQUIPMENT UNDER TEST

#### 5.1. DESCRIPTION OF EUT

The EUT is a CDMA/LTE Phone + Bluetooth & DTS/UNII a/b/g/n + NFC.

#### 5.2. MAXIMUM OUTPUT POWER

The testing was performed at 1meter. The transmitter maximum E-field at 30m distance is 12.28 dBuV/m which convert from the 1 meters data.

#### 5.3. WORST-CASE CONFIGURATION AND MODE

The NFC function was tested at its' fundamental and only operational frequency of 13.56 MHz. The fundamental of the EUT was investigated in three orthogonal orientations X, Y and Z. It was determined that the Y-orientation was the worst-case orientation; therefore all final radiated testing was performed with the EUT in the Y-orientation while generating continuous emissions.

#### 5.4. MODIFICATIONS

No modifications were made during testing.





#### LIMIT

§15.225 IC RSS-210, Annex 2, Section A2.6 (Transmitter) IC RSS-GEN, Section 6 (Receiver)

- (a) The field strength of any emissions within the band 13.553-13.567 MHz shall not exceed 15,848 microvolts/ meter at 30 meters.
- (b) Within the bands 13.410–13.553 MHz and 13.567–13.710 MHz, the field strength of any emissions shall not exceed 334 microvolts/meter at 30 meters.
- (c) Within the bands 13.110–13.410 MHz and 13.710–14.010 MHz the field strength of any emissions shall not exceed 106 microvolts/meter at 30 meters.
- (d) The field strength of any emissions appearing outside of the 13.110-14.010 MHz and shall not exceed the general radiated emission limits in § 15.209 as follows: §15.209 (a) Except as provided elsewhere in this subpart, the emissions from an intentional radiator shall not exceed the field strength levels specified in the following table:

§15.209 (b) In the emission table above, the tighter limit applies at the band edges.

Formula for converting the filed strength from uV/m to dBuV/m is: Limit  $(dBuV/m) = 20 \log \lim (uV/m)$ 

#### In addition:

§15.209 (d) The emission limits shown the above table are based on measurements employing a CISPR guasi-peak detector except for the frequency bands 9-90 kHz, 110-490 kHz and above 1000 MHz. Radiated emissions limits in these three bands are based on measurements employing an average detector.

§15.209 (d) The provisions in §§ 15.225, measuring emissions at distances other than the distances specified in the above table, determining the frequency range over which radiated emissions are to be measured, and limiting peak emissions apply to all devices operated under this part.

# **TEST PROCEDURE**

ANSI C63.4-2009

The EUT is an intentional radiator that incorporates a digital device. The highest fundamental frequency generated or used in the device is 13.56 MHz. The frequency range was investigated from 0.15 MHz to the 10<sup>th</sup> harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency, or 1000 MHz. whichever is greater (1000MHz)



# 8. AC MAINS LINE CONDUCTED EMISSIONS

# **LIMITS**

§15.207 IC RSS-GEN, Section 7.2.2

(a) Except as shown in paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section, for an intentional radiator that is designed to be connected to the public utility (AC) power line, the radio frequency voltage that is conducted back onto the AC power line on any frequency or frequencies, within the band 150 kHz to 30 MHz, shall not exceed the limits in the following table, as measured using a  $50\mu$ H/50 ohms line impedance stabilization network (LISN). Compliance with the provisions of this paragraph shall be based on the measurement of the radio frequency voltage between each power line and ground at the power terminal. The lower limit applies at the band edges.





# 9. FREQUENCY STABILITY

#### LIMIT

 $\S15.225$  (e) The frequency tolerance of the carrier signal shall be maintained within  $\pm 0.01\%$  of the operating frequency, over a temperature variation of -20 degrees to +50 degrees C at normal supply voltage, and for a variation in the primary supply voltage from 85% to 115% of the rated supply voltage at a temperature of 20 degrees C. For battery operated equipment, the equipment tests shall be performed using a new battery.
