Uniradio Corporation ("Uniradio") of San Diego, California represents Mexican radio station XHTY-FM in the United States. The station operates on 30 kW daytime and 30 kW night-time.

Uniradio Corporation ("Uniradio") of San Diego, California represents Mexican radio station XHTY-FM in the United States. The Station operates on 30 kW daytime and 30 kW night-time.

This permit is issued on the permittee's representation that statements contained in the permittee's application are true and that the undertakings therein contained, so far as they are consistent herewith, will be carried out in good faith.

This permit shall not vest in the permittee any right to operate beyond the term hereof nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the permittee nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. B) This RADIO STATION AUTHORIZATION is granted subject to the additional conditions specified below:

This authorization is issued on the grantee's representation that the statements contained in the application are true and that the undertakings described will be carried out in good faith.

This authorization shall not be construed in any manner as a finding by the Commission on the question of marking or lighting of the antenna system should future conditions require. The grantee expressly agrees to install such marking or lighting as the Commission may require under the provisions of Section 303(q) of the Communications Act. 47 U.S.C. § 303(q).

Neither this authorization nor the right granted by this authorization shall be assigned or otherwise transferred to any person, firm, company or corporation without the written consent of the Commission. This authorization is subject to the right of use or control by the government of the United States conferred by Section 706 of the Communications Act. 47 U.S.C. § 706. Operation of this station is governed by Part 25 of the Commission's Rules. 47 C.F.R. Part 25.

This authorization shall not vest in the licensee any right to operate this station nor any right in the use of the designated frequencies beyond the term of this license, nor in any other manner than authorized herein.

This authorization is issued on the grantee's representation that the station is in compliance with environmental requirements set forth in Section 1.1307 of the Commission's Rules. 47 C.F.R. § 1.1307.

This authorization is issued on the grantee's representation that the station is in compliance with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requirements as set forth in Section 17.4 of the Commission's Rules. 47 C.F.R. § 17.4.

The following condition applies when this authorization permits construction of or modifies the construction permit of a radio station.

This authorization shall be automatically forfeited if the station is not ready for operation by the required date of completion of construction unless an application for modification of authorization to request additional time to complete construction is filed by that date, together with a showing that failure to complete construction by the required date was due to factors not under control of the grantee.

Licensees are required to pay annual regulatory fees related to this authorization. The requirement to collect annual regulatory fees from regulatees is contained in Public Law 103-66, "The Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993." These regulatory fees, which are likely to change each fiscal year, are used to offset costs associated with the Commission's enforcement, public service, international and policy and rulemaking activities. Dear Ms. Dortch:

Uniradio Corp. ("Uniradio") of San Diego, California is re-filing this request for Special Temporary Authority to make cross-border transmissions of broadcast programs to FM station XHTY in Tijuana, Mexico pursuant to Section 325(c) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Section 25.120 of the Commission's rules. Uniradio is a California corporation that represents Mexican radio station XHTY in the United States. This request and a related Form 308 for regular authority to make cross-border transmissions of broadcast programs to FM station XHTY were originally filed in May, but were returned by your office on June 3, 2009 because the necessary operating parameters for XHTY were not on file.

This STA requests a narrow and temporary authorization to allow Uniradio to deliver to XHTY for cross border broadcasts two highly rated Spanish language programs that originate in the United States. The first is the "Don Cheto" show, which is syndicated by Liberman Media. The show originates in Los Angeles and is currently the top rated morning drive radio program among Hispanics in that market. The second is the "El Vacilon del Mandril," an afternoon drive time show which originates from Los Angeles as well, and is currently the number one show among Hispanics for that time slot. "El Vacilon" is syndicated by Spanish Broadcasting Systems (SBS). Uniradio will deliver the programs in their entirety to XHTY. Each show will consist of 4-5 hours of programming per day, Monday through Saturday.

In addition to filing this STA request, Uniradio is filing an application for a permit under Section 325(c). The nature of the programming for which the STA is sought is narrower than that covered by the Section 325(c) application. The 325(c) application, a copy of which is attached, requests authorization to deliver additional



programs in such formats as news, talk, play by play broadcasts of major league and other professional sports, and entertainment, among others, and to do so at various times between 5 a.m. and midnight seven days a week throughout the year.

Granting the STA will be in the public interest. If the STA is granted, the more than 900,000 Spanish-speaking potential listeners in the XHTY San Diego metro listening area will be able to hear broadcasts of the "Don Cheto" and "El Mandril" shows immediately. Many of these listeners are not able to understand English language broadcasts. The public interest benefit from the broadcasts flows not just to underserved Hispanic listeners, but extends to the San Diego community as a whole. Shows such as Don Cheto's and El Vacilon are an important facet of the assimilation process for non-English speaking Hispanic immigrants, as such programming ties together their experiences from their country of origin and their new home in the U.S. in unique ways. For example, the shows address topical issues such as immigration, health care, politics, and volunteer opportunities. They provide practical advice that assists listeners in making the transition to the U.S. an easier and more positive process. The STA will also directly benefit the U.S. economy because advertisers' payments to Uniradio stay in the U.S.

Any delay in the granting of the STA and the initiation of the requested temporary operations would seriously prejudice these public interest benefits. On the other hand, there will be no harmful or deleterious effects from granting the STA. Therefore, this STA will most certainly be in the public interest and it should be granted.
