The Department of Justice (DOJ), including the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), with the concurrence of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) (collectively, the Agencies), does not object to the FCC's grant of Puerto Rico Telephone Company, Inc.'s (PRTC) request that the FCC extend its existing declaratory ruling under section 310(b)(4) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 USC Section 310(b)(4), to cover the Advanced Wireless Services (AWS) licenses PRTC won in Auction No. 78, provided that the FCC conditions its consent on compliance by PRTC with the commitments set forth in the December 15, 2006 Security Agreement between América Móvil, S.A. de C.V. (América Móvil), on behalf of itself and the subsidiaries through which it will hold its interest in Telecomunicaciones de Puerto Rico, Inc. (TELPRI), TELPRI, DOJ, and DHS. Accordingly, based on the information provided to the Agencies by PRTC and analysis by the Agencies of potential national security, law enforcement and public safety issues, the Agencies hereby notify the Commission that they have no objection to the petition.
