**PETITION TO ADOPT CONDITIONS TO
AUTHORIZATIONS AND LICENSES**

The Department of Justice (DOJ), including the Federal Bureau of Investigation, with the concurrence of the Department of Homeland Security (collectively, the “Agencies”), submits this Petition to Adopt Conditions to Authorizations and Licenses (Petition) pursuant to Section 1.41 of the Federal Communications Commission (Commission) rules.¹ The Commission has long recognized that law enforcement, national security, and public safety concerns are part of its public interest analysis, and has accorded deference to the views of other U.S. government agencies with expertise in those areas. *See In the Matter of Comsat Corporation d/b/a Comsat Mobile Communications, etc.*, 16 FCC Rcd. 21,661, 21707 ¶ 94 (2001).

Through this Petition, the Agencies advise the Commission that they have no objection to the grant of this declaratory ruling conditioned upon Great American Broadband Inc. assigning the applicable licenses to AT&T as described in its Petition for Declaratory Ruling and assignment application within 60 days. If the transaction does not occur as described within that

timeframe, the Agencies would require an opportunity to review the Petition for Declaratory Ruling for national security, law enforcement and public interest concerns.
