ITC-95-402 Business Telecom, Inc. applies for authority to resell international private lines interconnected at both ends, and at one end only, for the provision of public switched traffic between the United States and Canada and the United States and the United Kingdom.

Pursuant to Section 63.12 of the rules, the applications listed above will be granted 45 days after the date of this public notice (see Section 1.4(b)(4)), and the applicant may commence operations on the 46th day, unless the application is formally opposed within the meaning of Section 1.1202 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. Section 1.1202, or the Commission has informed the applicant in writing, within 45 days of the date of this public notice, that the application, on further examination, has been deemed ineligible for streamlined processing. In these instances, the application will be acted upon only by formal written order of the Commission, and operation may not commence except in accordance with such order.

- ITC-95-403 Globalcom International, Inc. applies for authority to operate as international resale carrier, to acquire and operate capacity in private submarine cable systems for the provision of authorized direct facilities-based international services between the United States and various points; and to establish channels of communications with INTELSAT, and with various separate and transborder satellite systems between the United States and various international points.
- ITC-95-404 Business Telecom, Inc. applies for authority to establish channels of communications with INTELSAT, and various separate and transborder satellite systems, for the provision of International Data, Video and Voice Services.
