Global Crossing Telecommunications, Inc. ("GC Telecom") (FRN: 0002850519), by its attorney and pursuant to Section 63.19(a)(2) of the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC's" or "Commission's") Rules, hereby submits this notice of discontinuance of international service. GC Telecom currently provides international service pursuant to the Section 214 authority granted to its parent company, Global Crossing North America, Inc., in File No. ITC-214-19980520-00334.<sup>1</sup> GC Telecom seeks to discontinue its provision of "dial-around" long distance calling service in the State of New York.

GC Telecom is a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Michigan and is a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of Global Crossing North America, Inc. GC Telecom is authorized by the Commission to provide both interstate and international telecommunications services. Among the telecommunications services the company offers, GC Telecom provides a dial-around long distance service in New York.

As of September 30, 2010, GC Telecom will discontinue its provision of its dial-around service in New York. The proposed discontinuance will not result in harm to its

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customers. For its dial-around service, GC Telecom does not enter into contracts with or have other ongoing commitments to provide service to the customers who use that service. Rather, GC Telecom's dial-around customers are presubscribed to another long distance carrier and "dial-around" their presubscribed carrier to reach GC Telecom's long distance service on an as-needed basis. All calls are billed through third-party billing services on the customer's local exchange carrier ("LEC") telephone bill. The discontinuance of GC Telecom's dial-around service in New York will not impact the ability of these customers to receive service from their existing LEC or presubscribed long distance carrier. Additionally, the dial-around services provided by many other carriers – e.g. Dial-Around Telecom, Inc., Telecom North America, Inc., and Total Call International, Inc., etc. – will still be available to customers.

Given the nature of GC Telecom's dial-around business, GC Telecom does not have customer contact lists or other information regarding customers who use its dial-around services. Therefore, written notification by GC Telecom to each affected customer is not possible. As such, pursuant to Section 63.19(a)(1) of the Commission's Rules, good cause exists for using an alternate form of notice to customers. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 63.19(a)(1).

As an alternative to written notice, GC Telecom has recorded an automated audio message on its long-distance access code number to notify customers of the discontinuance of its dial-around services in New York. An automated recorded message should serve as sufficient notice under the Commission's Rules to inform customers of the discontinuance. In the related context of domestic discontinuances, *see* 47 C.F.R. § 63.71, the Commission has previously granted an application for discontinuance where an audio recording served as a form of notice when individual written notification was impossible given customer anonymity.<sup>2</sup> GC Telecom will play the automated announcement for a period of 60 days before the discontinuation of service – from July 30, 2010 to September 30, 2010. Considering the nature of GC Telecom's dial-around service, customers and the public are adequately protected by this form of notice.

The Applicant provides the following information pursuant to Section 63.19(a)(2) of the Commission's Rules:

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1. Geographic Areas of Planned Discontinuance: The Applicant proposes to discontinue dial-around service in the State of New York.
2. Reduction or Impairment of Service: The Applicant proposes to discontinue its provision of dial-around long-distance telephone services in New York on September 30, 2010, or as soon thereafter as any necessary regulatory approvals are obtained.
3. Carrier Authorization: The Applicant is authorized under Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934 to operate as an international telecommunications carrier pursuant to the authority granted to its parent company, Global Crossing North America, Inc., in File No. ITC-214-19980520-00334.

In accordance with Section 63.19(a)(2) of the Commission's Rules, a copy of this Notice is being emailed to the Chief of the International Bureau, concurrently.
