**Re: CNCS Inc. and Call-Net Enterprises Inc. Relinquishment of International Bureau**

**International Section 214 Authority**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

CNCS Inc. (“CNCS”), a Delaware corporation and wholly owned subsidiary of Call-Net Enterprises Inc. (“Call-Net”), a Canadian corporation, by its attorneys, hereby relinquishes effective immediately any authority held by CNCS pursuant to Section 214 to provide international telecommunications services. A description of the authority that CNCS currently holds and a list of the relevant file numbers is attached to this letter as Appendix A.

CNCS is the current holder of two authorizations issued pursuant to Section 214 to “CNE Inc.,” the name by which CNCS was known prior to adopting its current name. By letter dated and filed on June 9, 2005 (the “Call-Net Letter”), Call-Net confirmed to the Commission that CNE Inc. changed its name to CNCS Inc. effective January 23, 2001. Attached to the Call-Net Letter was a copy of the Certificate of Amendment from the Office of the Secretary of State of Delaware, confirming the name change described herein. The Commission’s records reflect that two authorizations issued pursuant to Section 214 continue to be held by CNE Inc. The Call-Net Letter demonstrates that this same entity continues to hold the authorizations in question, but that the entity changed its name to CNCS Inc. after the initial grant of those authorizations in 1998.


By this letter, CNCS relinquishes any and all authority that it may have from the Commission to provide international telecommunications services. The relinquished authorizations granted CNCS authority to operate as a facilities-based carrier, in accordance with 47 C.F.R. § 63.18(e)(1) of the Commission’s rules; and to provide resale-based service, in accordance with 47 C.F.R. § 63.18(e)(2). CNCS certifies, however, that it does not provide telecommunications

services in the United States. CNCS further certifies that it does not offer or provide international common carrier services pursuant to the relinquished authorizations. Therefore, there are no “affected customers” within the meaning of the Commission’s international discontinuance rule, 47 C.F.R. § 63.19(a).
