The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”), with the concurrence of the U.S. Department of Justice (“DOJ”), hereby notifies the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) of DHS’ intention to withdraw from the 16 January 2013 Letter of Assurance proffered by TrustComm, Inc. and Global Secure Networks, Inc. to DHS and DOJ in connection with file number ITC-T/C-20120531-00145 for the transfer of underlying Section 214 authorization, ITC-214-19990211-00083. This has no effect on the validity of the LOA, and the assurances made therein, with respect to TrustComm and DOJ.
