

The international telecommunications services to be resold by USAT will be obtained from other common carriers currently authorized by the Commission to provide such services. USAT does not seek authority herein to resell the international services of a carrier in which USAT or an affiliate has any ownership interest or affiliation under the Commission's Rules. USAT is not affiliated or commonly-owned, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly through any of its shareholders, by any foreign carrier.

In accordance with § 63.18 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.18, USAT represents the following:

- d. USAT holds no Section 214 authorizations at this time. By the grant of this application, USAT will become a carrier subject to Section 214 of the Communications Act.
- e. By this application, USAT requests authority to provide international service by reselling the services of authorized facilities-based international common carriers or other resellers of those services pursuant to the terms and conditions of Section 63.18(e)(2) of the Commission's Rules. USAT proposes to offer switched services, obtaining international switched services capacity pursuant to tariffs and contracts from underlying carriers. Pursuant to Section 63.10(a)(1) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.10(a)(1), USAT should be deemed a non-dominant carrier for the reasons set forth herein.
- Pursuant to Section 63.18(e)(2)(ii), USAT agrees that it shall comply with the following terms and conditions:
- USAT may resell the international services of any authorized common carrier, except affiliated carriers regulated as dominant on a route to be served, pursuant to that carrier's tariff or contract duly filed with the Commission, for the provision of international basic

switched voice, data and business services to all authorized international points as described herein.

- USAT shall be subject to all Commission rules and regulations and any conditions stated in the Commission's public notice or order that serves as USAT's Section 214 certificate.

f. USAT does not seek Section 214 authority in the instant application to resell international switch-based services to any destination in which it has an affiliate as defined by the Commission. Therefore, this application is subject to streamlined processing under Section 63.12 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.12.

g. Not applicable since USAT is not applying for facilities-based authority under Section 63.18(e)(6) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.18(e)(6).

h. Pursuant to Section 63.18(h)(1) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. 63.18(h)(1), USAT hereby certifies that it is not itself and is not affiliated with a foreign carrier in any country. For reasons set forth herein, USAT qualifies to provide international switched services through resale of other unaffiliated carriers' facilities-based and resold services, and for streamlined processing and non-dominant regulation.

Pursuant to Section 63.18(h)(3), USAT certifies that it is not affiliated with any U.S. carriers whose facilities-based services it proposes to resell in order to provide the services for which authorization is sought herein.

i. USAT hereby certifies that it has not agreed to accept special concessions directly or indirectly from any foreign carrier or administration with respect to traffic or revenue flows between the United States and any foreign country in which USAT may serve pursuant to the authority requested in this application, and has not agreed to enter into any such agreement in the future.

j. USAT further certifies that, in accordance with 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.2001-1.2003, no party to the application has been denied Federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. § 853a.

k. For the reasons discussed above, USAT should qualify for streamlined processing, and hereby requests such processing. In short, USAT qualifies for streamlined processing because it:

- Has no affiliation within the meaning of §63.18(h)(1)(i) with a foreign carrier in a destination market;
- Has no affiliation within the meaning of §63.18(h)(1)(i) with a dominant U.S. carrier whose international switched or private line services USAT seeks authority

to resell (either directly or indirectly through the resale of another reseller's services); and

- Does not seek authority to provide switched basic services over private lines.

Thus, for the reasons stated above, the public interest, convenience and necessity would be furthered by a grant of this application under streamlined procedures.
