Re: Surrender Of Genuity Telecom Inc.'s International Section 214 Authorizations.

Dear Ms. Dortch:

GLT Liquidating Trust ("GLT Trust"), the successor-in-interest to Genuity Telecom Inc., Debtor-in-Possession ("Genuity"), surrenders the international Section 214 authorizations listed below, effective immediately. As discussed below, Genuity has had no international telecommunications customers since February 2003 when it consummated the sale of substantially all of its assets to certain affiliates of Level 3 Communications, Inc. (collectively, "Level 3").

Genuity Telecom Inc. filed for bankruptcy protection under Chapter 11 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code in November 2002, entered debtor-in-possession status, and notified the Commission accordingly.¹ Genuity assigned out of bankruptcy substantially all of its telecommunications assets and customers to Level 3, including a global international Section 214 authorization and all of its international telecommunications customers.² Pursuant to the plan of

liquidation of Genuity and certain of its affiliates, Genuity ceased doing business, its remaining assets were transferred to GLT Trust for liquidation and GLT Trust was authorized to resolve all remaining claims against Genuity.³ Accordingly, GLT Trust became the successor-in-interest to Genuity and is surrendering Genuity's remaining international Section 214 authorizations on its behalf.

The international Section 214 authorizations that are being surrendered, effective immediately, are:

When Genuity assigned its global international Section 214 authorization to Level 3, Genuity retained residual authority to provide international services under that authorization in the event that any of its international common carrier customers were not transferred to Level 3. Accordingly, the following residual authority also is being surrendered, effective immediately:

ITC-214-19990708-00391 (residual authority)	Global facilities-based service and global resale service.
