GLT Trust surrendered assets and customers to Level 3, including the international Section 214 authorization ITC-214attached. As explained in that letter, Genuity assigned out of bankruptcy substantially all of its surrendering certain international authorizations previously held by Genuity, a copy of which is 19990708-00391. The letter also explained that even though it was assigned to Level 3, Genuity On March 5, 2004, counsel to GLT Trust submitted a letter to the Commission
