STREAMLINED SECTION 214 APPLICATION

FT Networks L.L.C. hereby requests authority, pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. Section 214 (1994 & Supp. II 1996), and Section 63.18(e)(4) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. Section 63.18(e)(4) (1999), to acquire facilities and to operate as an international facilities-based and resale carrier, and to provide switched services over private lines, between the United States and France¹.

Pursuant to Section 63.12(c)(1)(v), FT Networks L.L.C. respectfully requests that this application be granted streamlined processing because France is a member of the World Trade Organization and FT Networks L.L.C. agrees to be

classified as a dominant carrier for the route between the United States and France, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date.

By granting this application, the Commission will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity by allowing FT Networks L.L.C. to provide services on the route in question, thereby promoting competition in the provision of international services with the attendant benefits to consumers.

SECTION 63.18 INFORMATION

The following information is submitted, as required by Section 63.18 of the Commission's Rules, in support of FT Networks L.L.C.'s request for authorization.

(d) FT Networks L.L.C. has not previously received authority under Section 214 of the Communications Act.

(e) FT Networks L.L.C. requests Section 214 authority, pursuant to the terms and conditions of Section 63.18(e)(4) of the Commission's Rules, to acquire and operate facilities and to operate as an international (i) facilities-based and (ii) resale carrier, and (iii) to provide ISR between the United States and France. FT Networks L.L.C. will provide services between the United States and France using authorized cables and/or satellite facilities. FT Networks L.L.C. certifies that it will comply with the terms and conditions contained in 47 C.F.R. Sections 63.21, 63.22, and 63.23, as appropriate.

(g) FT Networks L.L.C.'s request for Section 214 authorization is categorically excluded as defined by 47 C.F.R. Section 1.1306. Therefore, FT Networks L.L.C. is not filing an environmental assessment with this application.

(h) FT Networks L.L.C. is an indirectly held, wholly owned subsidiary of France Télécom S.A. (the intermediate holding companies are Compagnie Générale des Communications S.A. –“Cogecom”, a wholly owned subsidiary of France Télécom S.A. and a French law company, which is the sole shareholder of France Telecom Participations U.S. Inc. –“FTP”, a Delaware corporation which in turn is the sole member and holds a 100 percent interest in the applicant). (i) FT Networks L.L.C. certifies that it is affiliated with the foreign carriers identified in the Exhibit 1.

(j) FT Networks L.L.C. is controlled by France Télécom SA, a French carrier.

(k) France is a member of the World Trade Organization.

(l) FT Networks L.L.C. states that it will file the quarterly reports as required by 47 C.F.R. Section 43.61(c).

(m) Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Section 63.12(c)(1)(v), this provision is not applicable because FT Networks L.L.C. hereby agrees to be classified as dominant on the international route between the United States and France without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date.

(n) FT Networks L.L.C. hereby certifies that it has not agreed to accept “special concessions”, as defined by 47 C.F.R. Section 63.14, directly or indirectly from any foreign carrier with respect to any U.S. international route where the foreign carrier possesses market power on the foreign end of the route and will not, to the

extend the FCC's special concession rules remain applicable, enter into such agreements in the future.

(o) FT Networks L.L.C. certifies, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Sections 1.2001 through 1.2003, that no party to the application is subject to a denial of Federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

(p) This Application qualifies for streamlined processing under 47 C.F.R. Section 63.12 because the affiliated destination market, France, is a WTO Member country and FT Networks L.L.C. has agreed to be classified and treated as dominant carrier to the affiliated country under 47 C.F.R. Section 63.10, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date.

CONCLUSION

For these reasons, FT Networks L.L.C. respectfully requests that the Commission grant this application.
