Verizon International Communications Services ("VICS"),<sup>1</sup> by its attorney, hereby surrenders the following five international Section 214 authorizations:

1. ITC-214-20030312-00130
2. ITC-214-19991220-00781
3. ITC-214-19990303-00103
4. ITC-214-20020705-00345
5. ITC-214-20020912-00482

VICS is a reseller of international prepaid calling card services in Florida, New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island. These international Section 214 authorizations collectively authorize the company to provide facilities-based and resold service to all international points, including Cuba.

Pursuant to Section 63.19(a) of the Commission's rules,<sup>2</sup> VICS notified distributors of its international prepaid calling cards in February 2007 that the company planned to discontinue providing this service beginning March 7, 2007. VICS also began an extensive effort to collect all prepaid cards from distributors that had not been sold to end users. Specifically, VICS determined how many cards had been distributed but not activated or did not yet have any usage attributed to them. VICS has been collecting those cards and has undertaken an auditing process to ensure that as many of the distributed but unsold cards are collected as possible. Once collected, these

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
cards are shredded and distributors are refunded for their activated stock which did not have any usage.

Because of the nature of prepaid calling cards, VICS is unable to identify end users who purchased the cards. Consequently, VICS has developed a detailed plan to ensure that purchasers receive the value of the cards in their hands. A customer service number is available on all cards sold to end users. A customer service representative will be available to inform all card purchasers that VICS is no longer providing service and provide the purchaser with instructions for obtaining a refund. The customer service representative will provide the purchaser with an address to which unused cards can be sent in order to receive a refund check. VICS will respond within 14 days of receipt of such unused cards.<sup>3</sup>

This process will continue until December 31, 2008, at which time all cards that have been purchased or distributed will expire by their original purchase terms. After December 31, 2008, the cards will have no value, and no refund will be owed.
