APPLICATION

Telemedia International USA, Inc. ("TMI-USA" or "Applicant"), by its undersigned counsel, hereby requests global facilities-based authority and global resale authority, under Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"), 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Section 63.18 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.18, to provide international telecommunications services between the United States and international points, except San Marino and Serbia.

I. The Applicant

TMI-USA is an international telecommunications provider organized under the laws of the State of Delaware. By this application, TMI-USA seeks to expand its current Section 214 authorization. As discussed in greater detail below, TMI-USA is affiliated with Telecom Italia S.p.A. ("Telecom Italia"). In the Spring of 1999, Olivetti S.p.A. ("Olivetti"), through its

subsidiary Tecnost S.p.A, made an unsolicited takeover bid for Telecom Italia that proved successful. In conjunction with this transaction, the Commission approved Olivetti's application to transfer control of TMI-USA's Section 214 authorization from Telecom Italia to Olivetti.^{1/}

TMI-USA is not a foreign carrier, but is affiliated, within the meaning of Section 63.09(e) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.09(e), with several foreign carriers authorized to provide telecommunications services, including Telecom Italia, Telecom Argentina S.A. ("Telecom Argentina"), Telekom Austria A.G. ("Telekom Austria"), Tele Centro Sul Participacoes S.A. ("Tele Centro Sul") (Brazil), Entel S.A. ("Entel"), Empresa de Telecomunicaciones de Cuba S.A. ("Empresa de Telecomunicaciones de Cuba"), Intelcom San Marino S.p.A. ("Intelcom San Marino"), and Telekom Serbia A.D. ("Telekom Serbia"). Given that Intelcom San Marino and Telekom Serbia are dominant carriers in countries that are not Members of the World Trade Organization ("WTO"), TMI-USA does not seek to provide service on the US-San Marino and US-Serbia routes. However, since Telecom Italia, Telecom Argentina, Telekom Austria, Tele Centro Sul, Entel, and Empresa de Telecomunicaciones de Cuba are dominant carriers in countries that are Members of the WTO, TMI-USA accepts dominant carrier classification with respect to the US-Italy, US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia and US-Cuba routes, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date.

TMI-USA also has several other foreign affiliates^{2/}, but none of them are dominant providers of telecommunications services in a relevant market in a destination country. Therefore, TMI-USA lacks sufficient market power on the foreign end of these routes to affect competition adversely in the U.S. telecommunications market. Accordingly, given that TMI-USA: (1) does not seek to provide international service on the US-San Marino and US-Serbia routes; (2) accepts dominant carrier classification on the US-Italy, US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia and US-Cuba routes; and (3) qualifies for the presumption of non-dominance under Section 63.10(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.10(a)(3), with respect to its other foreign affiliates, TMI-USA's application is eligible for streamlined processing.

II. Public Interest Considerations

TMI-USA believes that the added competition its entry will bring to the market will benefit the consumers of United States-overseas services. These benefits include competitive pricing and increased availability of a variety of innovative service options. Therefore, a grant of this Application will further the public interest.

III. Information Required by Section 63.18

TMI-USA submits the following information, as required by Section 63.18 of the Commission's Rules, in support of its request for Section 214 authorization:

TMI-USA certifies that it will comply with the terms and conditions contained in Section 63.21 and 63.23 of the Commission's Rules.

- Pursuant to Sections 63.22(a) and 63.23(a)(1) of the Commission's Rules, TMI-USA requests authorization to provide international facilities-based and resold services between the United States and China, Russia and the Ukraine, non-WTO Member countries in which TMI-USA has non-dominant foreign affiliates as described in greater detail in Section (1) of this Application. Moreover, pursuant to Section 63.23(a)(2) of the Commission's Rules, TMI-USA seeks authority to provide switched or private line services over resold private lines to the destination markets indicated in Attachment A where TMI-USA is affiliated with foreign carriers that the Commission has not yet classified as non-dominant. TMI-USA's affiliates listed in Attachment A lack market power in their

respective markets as described in further detail in Section (1) of this Application, and thus should be classified as non-dominant.

TMI-USA certifies that it will comply with the terms and conditions contained in Sections 63.21, 63.22 and 63.23 of the Commission's Rules, as appropriate.

(f) TMI-USA seeks the authority to provide only the services referenced under paragraph (e) of Section 63.18 of the Commission's Rules.

(g) TMI-USA submits that an authorization of the facilities requested pursuant to Section 63.18(e)(4) of the Commission's Rules is categorically excluded as defined by Section 1.1306 of this chapter.

(i) TMI-USA certifies that it is not a foreign carrier. However, TMI-USA certifies that it is affiliated with Telecom Italia and several other foreign carriers, which are currently licensed or are in the process of obtaining licenses to provide international telecommunications services in Italy and other countries. Section (l) of this Application provides the countries in which TMI-USA has a dominant foreign affiliate, and Attachment A provides the countries in which TMI-USA has a non-dominant foreign affiliate.

(j) TMI-USA certifies that it seeks to provide international telecommunications services to several countries in which the Applicant has an affiliation with a foreign carrier as described in Section 63.18(j) of the Commission's Rules. Section (l) of this Application lists TMI-USA's dominant foreign affiliates and their respective countries, and Attachment A lists TMI-USA's non-dominant foreign carrier affiliates and their respective countries.

(k) With the exception of China, Russia and the Ukraine, the foreign carriers listed in Section (l) of this Application and in Attachment A are based in countries that are Members of the WTO. As described in greater detail in Section (l) of this Application, TMI-USA's affiliates in China, Russia and the Ukraine lack market power in their respective markets, and thus are non-dominant.

(l) TMI-USA proposes to resell the international switched services of an unaffiliated U.S. carrier for the purpose of providing international telecommunications services to other countries in which it is affiliated with a foreign carrier.

Dominant Foreign Affiliates: TMI-USA is affiliated with the following dominant foreign carriers:

Argentina: Telecom Argentina

Austria: Telekom Austria

Brazil: Tele Centro Sul

Bolivia: Entel

Cuba: Empresa de Telecomunicaciones de Cuba

Italy: Telecom Italia

TMI-USA is also affiliated with Intelcom San Marino, the dominant carrier operating in San Marino and Telekom Serbia, the dominant carrier operating in Serbia. Since Intelcom San Marino and Telekom Serbia are the current incumbents in non-WTO Member countries, TMI-USA does not seek to provide international service on the US-San Marino and US-Serbia routes. However, TMI-USA reserves the right to seek such authorization from the Commission in the future.

TMI-USA submits that Tele Centro Sul is dominant with respect to the local and long distance sector in Southern Brazil. With the exception of Tele Centro Sul, the Commission's *List of Foreign Telecommunications Carriers that are Presumed to Possess Market Power in Foreign Telecommunications Markets*, released June 18, 1999, deems the foreign carriers listed above as dominant foreign carriers. Accordingly, TMI-USA agrees to be classified as dominant with respect to the US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba and US-Italy routes, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date. Accordingly, TMI-USA agrees to file quarterly traffic reports pursuant to Section 43.61(c) of the Commission's Rules with respect to these routes.

Other Foreign Affiliations:

With the exception of the US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba, US-Italy, US-San Marino, US-Serbia routes, TMI-USA should be classified as non-dominant pursuant to Section 63.10(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules. None of the TMI-USA affiliates identified in Attachment A are listed of the Commission's *List of Foreign Telecommunications Carriers that are Presumed to Possess Market Power in Foreign Telecommunications Markets*, released June 18, 1999. In addition, these TMI-USA foreign affiliates are relatively new market entrants offering services in competition with dominant foreign carriers and others. At this time, these TMI-USA foreign affiliates each hold significantly less than a 50 percent market share in the international transport and local access markets in the countries where they operate. Moreover, these TMI-USA foreign affiliates do not have the ability to discriminate against unaffiliated U.S. international carriers through the control of bottleneck services or facilities to exercise market power in the countries where they operate. Accordingly, TMI-USA's foreign affiliates lack sufficient market power on these U.S.-international routes to affect competition

adversely in the U.S. market. Therefore, with the exception of the US-Italy, US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba, US-San Marino, US-Serbia routes, TMI-USA and its foreign affiliates should be presumptively classified as non-dominant carriers on all international routes.

(m) As described in Section (l) above, TMI-USA qualifies for non-dominant treatment for the provision of all U.S. international telecommunications services with the exception of the US-Italy, US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba, US-San Marino, and US-Serbia routes, pursuant to Section 63.10 of the Commission's Rules.

(n) TMI-USA certifies that it has agreed not to accept special concessions, as defined in Section 63.14(b) of the Commission's Rules, directly or indirectly from any foreign carrier where the foreign carrier possesses market power on the foreign end of the route and will not enter into such agreements in the future.

(o) TMI-USA certifies, pursuant to Sections 1.2001 through 1.2003 of the Commission's Rules (implementing the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. § 853a), that no party to its application is subject to a denial of Federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

(p) TMI-USA qualifies for streamlined processing pursuant to Section 63.12(c)(1)(v) of the Commission's Rules. As set forth above in Section (l), TMI-USA agrees to be classified as a dominant carrier with respect to the US-Argentina, US-Austria, US-Brazil, US-Bolivia, US-Cuba, US-Italy routes, without prejudice to its right to petition for reclassification at a later date. Moreover, given that its foreign affiliates in San Marino and Serbia, two non-WTO Member countries, are dominant, TMI-USA does not seek authority to provide international service on the US-San Marino and US-Serbia routes. In addition, TMI-USA qualifies for streamlined processing pursuant to Section 63.12(c)(1)(ii), because, as set forth above in Section (l), TMI-USA qualifies for the presumption of non-dominance under Section 63.10(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules with respect to its other foreign affiliations.

IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, Telemedia International USA, Inc. respectfully submits that the public interest, convenience, and necessity would be furthered by a grant of this Section 214 Application.
