APPLICATION

SeeComm Network Services Corporation (SeeComm), hereby requests authority, pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Section 63.18 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.18, to provide global international facilities-based and resale services between the United States and international points.

SeeCom is a U.S. company organized to provide domestic and international telecommunications services. SeeCom proposes to serve customers throughout the United States. By granting this application, the Commission will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity by promoting competition in the international services market. Competition will benefit U.S. consumers by increasing service options and lowering prices. Thus, the public interest will be served by the grant of Section 214 authority to SeeCom.
