Authorization Pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of
1934, as Amended

Dear Ms. Salas:

Pursuant to Section 63.24(b) of the Commission's Rules, SBC Communications Inc. ("SBC") hereby notifies the Commission of the *pro forma* assignment of derivative international Section 214 authorization from Radiofone, Inc. to Radiofone Holdings, Inc.

At the time of this *pro forma* assignment, Radiofone, Inc. and Radiofone Holdings, Inc. were both wholly owned subsidiaries of SBC Communications Inc. ("SBC").¹ Radiofone, Inc. holds several wireless licenses and an international Section 214 Authorization (File No. **ITC-214-20000516-00426**). Radiofone, Inc. assigned two of its wireless licenses (call signs KNKN866 and WPOL319) and the accompanying derivative international Section 214 authorization, to Radiofone Holdings, Inc. on October 2, 2000. This was a *pro forma* assignment done as part internal restructuring within SBC relating to the joint venture with BellSouth Corporation.

¹ Radiofone, Inc. (and all of the remaining wireless and international authorizations held by Radiofone, Inc. and its subsidiaries) was transferred to ALLTEL Communications, Inc. on October 2, 2000, after the *pro forma* assignment of the derivative 214 authorization.

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
