

Additional Supplemental Data for Section 214 Application for Traffic to Cuba by Telecuba, Inc. ("Telecuba")

The Signal will be leaving Telecuba's switch at 444 Brickell Ave, Suite 700, Miami, FL 33131 via a T-1 interconnection, going to Iron Link Communications Teleport located at 277 SW 33 St Ft. Lauderdale, FL 33315. The signal will be uplinked to Satmex 5 on C Band and it will be downlinked by Etecsa's Teleport Caribe in Havana, Cuba. The capacity is 3 Megs.

Telecuba currently has a license from the U.S. Department of the Treasury to travel to Cuba and negotiate telecommunication agreements. The company is in the process of negotiating the contract between Etecsa, the Cuban telephone company and Telecuba. Etecsa will not sign a contract until Telecuba has been issued a license by the Federal Communications Commission. Because we are still working out the minor details of the contract this pending license is important in order to have the opportunity conclude these negotiations. The contract will be drawn up as per the rules and regulations of the United States Department of the Treasury and the FCC. A copy will be forwarded to the FCC immediately after it has been signed. The following are the essential terms of the contract:

\$.60 per minute maximum (50/50 split of \$1.20 settlement rate)
\$1.00 surcharge per message maximum
30 days net payment terms
