Dear Mr. Gillen:

This letter dismisses an application filed by WTI, LLC on June 19, 2007 for an International Section 214 Authorization to provide facilities-based and resale services in accordance with Sections 63.18(e)(1) and 63.18(e)(2)of the Commission's rules. We dismiss this application without prejudice to refiling because of WTI, LLC's failure to pay its delinquent debts to the Commission.

Pursuant to Section 1.1910(a)(1) of the Commission's rules, the Commission examines each application to determine whether the applicant is delinquent in any non-tax debt owed to the Commission. On July 2, 2007, your application became red lighted because of delinquent debts owed to the Commission. On March 20, 2008, the Commission notified WTI, LLC by email that it was delinquent on the payment of debts owed to the Commission. The e-mail stated that if full payment or satisfactory arrangement to pay the delinquent debt was not made within 30 days of the date of the e-mail, WTI, LLC's application would be dismissed pursuant to Section 1.1910(b)(3) of the rules. The Commission has not received payment of the debt identified in the e-mail, nor has WTI, LLC made other satisfactory payment arrangements with the Commission.
